Hon. Mohamed Aslam,— To ask the Minister of Rehabilitation and Prison Reforms,—(2)

- (a) Will he state—
 - (i) the number of persons who were sentenced to death during the period from the year 1989 to 2013; and
 - (ii) the name and the address of each of the persons who were sentenced to death during the aforesaid period, the court by which the sentence was pronounced, the date and the case number of each of those cases?
- (b) Will he inform this House—
 - (i) out of the aforesaid persons who had been sentenced to death, of the names and addresses of those whose punishment has been reduced to life imprisonment by the President under the powers vested in him by the Constitution and the relevant dates of taking such action;
 - (ii) the names and addresses of those who were granted release under the presidential pardon during the periods from the year 1989 to 2005 and from 01.06.2012 to date and the relevant dates of granting release?
- (c) If not, why?
