Food Supplies (Amendment) Act, No. 7 of 1955

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AN ACT TO AMEND THE FOOD SUPPLIES ORDINANCE,
No. 30 of 1947.

[Date of Assent: March 10, 1955]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and the House of Representatives of Ceylon in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the Food Supplies (Amendment) Act, No. 7 of 1955.

Short title.

2. Section 5 of the Food Supplies Ordinance, No. 30 of 1947, is hereby amended, in sub-section (3) of that section, as follows:—

(a) by the substitution, for sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (a) of that sub-section, of the following sub-paragraph:—

“(ii) such amount, not exceeding ten per centum of the cost referred to in sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (a) of this sub-section, as may be determined by the competent authority as the profit which such owner might reasonably have been expected to make on a sale of that article immediately before the requisition if the supply of, and the demand for, that article were then normal;” and

(b) by the substitution, for sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (b) of that sub-section, of the following sub-paragraph:—

“(ii) such amount, not exceeding ten per centum of the price referred to in sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (b) of this sub-section, as may be determined by the competent authority as the profit which such owner might reasonably have been expected to make on a sale of that article immediately before the requisition if the supply of, and the demand for, that article were then normal,”.
