The Ranaviru Seva Authority is tasked with addressing the needs of war heroes who have sacrificed their lives and limbs in defense of the nation's sovereignty. Established under Parliament Act No. 54 of 1999, the authority operates under the Ministry of Defence. A permanent staff, including the Chairman, Deputy Chairman, Directors of the Board of Management, and officers from the Tri-forces, provide services to the beneficiaries. The next of kin of war heroes who became disabled in operations are the stakeholders entitled to benefits under the Ranaviru Seva Authority Act.

The Ranaviru Seva Authority, as the principal government institution dedicated to promoting the welfare of the families of war heroes who sacrificed their lives in operations, as well as disabled war heroes and their next of kin, has been providing invaluable services for 23 years. The Authority unites war heroes through an island-wide network of war hero forums, diligently addressing their needs and offering comprehensive aftercare services.

The Ranaviru Seva Authority implements a number of projects and programs in alignment with the national mandate assigned to it by the Ranaviru Seva Authority Act. These initiatives are designed to support the provision of medical facilities to beneficiaries, access to education and higher education for the children of war heroes, housing and related assistance, assistance in securing gainful employment, and aftercare and rehabilitation services for war heroes.

The Ranaviru Seva Authority is financed by central government funds and donations, with the primary financial contributions made by the National Lottery Board. The treasury's imprest and the income generated from the authority's deposits are utilized for the implementation of projects. Consequently, the income from deposits and the donations received have been used for the majority of the projects executed in 2023.

Given that the responsibility for the rehabilitation of Armed Forces and Police personnel is entrusted to the Ranaviru Seva Authority, special priority should be accorded to the aftercare and rehabilitation process. The health condition of disabled war heroes is deteriorating daily, and considering the complications they face in adulthood, the Ranaviru Seva Authority must address their rehabilitation needs comprehensively.

Many years have passed since the end of the war; however, we, the Sri Lankan people, must not forget the dedication shown by our heroic war heroes. The Ranaviru Seva Authority, whose vision is to extend the gratitude of the nation towards the war heroes, provides invaluable services to the war hero community. It aims to continue serving the war heroes for many more years as a professional and official institution.

 - ii. Dependents of personnel of the Armed Forces and Police Force who have been killed or declared missing in action
- C. Provision of medical facilities and related assistance to
 - i. Personnel of the Armed Forces and Police Force who have become disabled in action; and
 - ii. Dependents of personnel of the Armed Forces and Police Force who have been killed or declared missing in action.
- D. Provision of access to education and higher education through scholarships and other forms of assistance to
 - i. Personnel of the Armed Forces and Police Force who have become disabled in action; and
 - ii. Dependents of personnel of the Armed Forces and Police Force who have been killed or declared missing in action.
- E. Provision of assistance to secure gainful employment to
 - i. Personnel of the Armed Forces and Police Force who have become disabled in action; and
 - ii. Dependents of personnel of the Armed Forces and Police Force who have been killed or declared missing in action.
- F. Establishment of industrial, agricultural or commercial ventures with a view to providing employment to personnel of the Armed Forces and Police Force who have become disabled in action; and
- G. Doing such other acts and things as may be necessary or conducive to the discharge of the functions of the Authority.

Message from the Chairman of the Ranaviru Seva Authority



The Ranaviru Seva Authority was established by Parliament Act No. 54 of 1999 to promote the welfare of war heroes retired on medical grounds, their next of kin, and the families of war heroes who sacrificed their lives and limbs for the sovereignty and dignity of the country.

The Ranaviru Seva Authority received lower allocations from the Treasury in 2023 compared to the previous year for the implementation of welfare programs. However, it is gratifying that we were able to execute projects and programs by utilizing donations and income from fixed deposit interest.

This year, we primarily focused on fulfilling the needs of the children of disabled war heroes and awarding scholarships to enhance their educational opportunities. The physical condition of disabled war heroes is deteriorating due to complications associated with long-term disabilities. Consequently, providing aftercare services has become one of our principal responsibilities as an institution.

Our primary focus this year was the provision of electric motorcycles to disabled war heroes to facilitate their mobility. We also placed significant emphasis on the rehabilitation of war heroes declared disabled, through the provision of assistive equipment. Additionally, attention was directed towards granting aid for the enhancement of sanitary facilities tailored to the needs of disabled war heroes.

We made a significant contribution by awarding scholarships to students who achieved high results in the G.C.E. (O/L), alongside our existing scholarship program aimed at facilitating the education of war heroes' children. We directly engaged local and international donors to secure financial support, aiming to recognize and encourage educational achievements among children of disabled war heroes or those whose fathers have perished in action.

Loans were disbursed to war heroes through the housing loan scheme and self-employment loan scheme. However, managing finances within the institution to facilitate these loans proved to be a challenging task compared to the previous year, 2023.

We were pleased to address issues faced by war heroes through the District Mobile Service programme. Introducing new entrepreneurship programmes also marked a significant achievement in leveraging the contributions of war heroes towards economic stability.

I am pleased that the Ranaviru Seva Authority has been able to deliver high-quality services to the war hero community. I take this opportunity to express my sincere gratitude to the

Secretary of the Ministry of Defence, its staff, and the personnel of the Ranaviru Seva Authority for their unwavering support in achieving our mission successfully.

PROVISION OF ASSISTIVE DEVICES TO DISABLED WAR HEROES

1.1. Project Introduction

Assistive devices are used in daily activities to enhance the remaining functional capacity of war heroes who became disabled in operations. The technologically high quality of the equipment that is currently used to overcome the disabled condition of the war heroes helps to maintain the health of the war hero at a satisfactory level.

Under this project, the disabled war heroes are provided with prosthetic limbs, prosthetic arms, wheelchairs, forearm crutches, elbow crutches, spectacles, clinical shoes, hearing aids, white canes, walking canes, commodes, roho cushion covers, air mattresses, gel socks, gel liners, electric tricycles and other assistive devices with a view to enhancing their functional capacity.

The disabled war heroes have been housed at their residences under the community rehabilitation system and these devices are provided with them as assistance to overcome the difficulties that arise in their daily routines. The assistive devices can be considered not only technical devices but also parts of the war hero's body. Accordingly, the aim of the project is to prevent disabled war heroes from potential side effects caused by interruptions in the continuous receipt of required assistive devices and the use of damaged and low-quality assistive devices by way of providing assistive devices.

1.2. Benefit Disbursement Procedure of the Project

- i. Inform the war heroes regarding projects at war hero forums through the Provincial Deputy Director and District Programme Officers
- ii. Issue the application and receive the duly filled applications by the District Officers
- iii. Forward the requests and requirements prioritized based on the criteria for provision of assistive devices by the District Officers and Provincial Deputy Director, to the Head Office based on
- iv. Forward the request received by the Section to the Committee for Provision of Assistive Devices with the Reports for pre-benefit claims
- v. Prepare lists of beneficiaries for each of the devices
- vi. Inform the no. of devices to be purchased to the Procurement Division based on the recommendation of the Committee for Provision of Assistive Device
- vii. Carry out procurement activities and select the purchasing company
- viii. Direct the war heroes to give relevant measurements to the respective institutions
- ix. Inspect devices manufactured and other assistive devices
- x. Provide the beneficiaries with prosthetic limbs and arms

1.3.1. Provision of Wheelchairs

Based on the criteria for providing assistive devices for the disabled in 2023, the wheelchairs were provided to the war heroes considering the condition of the wheelchairs (dilapidated, worn-out, damage, corroded) currently used and as well as medical urgencies (surgeries, accidents and physical impairment) they suffered.

Accordingly, a total no. of 18 wheelchairs comprising no. of 01 motivation active commode wheelchairs, no. of 2 motivation active wheelchairs, no. of 2 commode wheelchairs, no. of 1 active wheelchairs, no. of 12 normal wheelchairs were distributed. Also no. of 02 normal wheelchairs were given to war heroes from the donations received considering the urgent situations. Distribution of wheelchairs district wise is as follows.

1.3.2. Provision of Hearing Aids

Kelani Cables PLC donated no. of 25 hearing aids needed for 18 war heroes and expenditure for hearing assessment and preparation of the other parts was incurred by the Ranaviru Seva Authority. A pair of hearing aids was given to a war hero additionally. Also, a pair of hearing aid batteries and a hearing aid device have been repaired.

1.3.3. Provision of Forearm Crutches

No. of 262 forearm crutches were purchased and distributed to no. of 131 war heroes who had made requests in 2021.

1.3.4. Provision of Prosthetic Limbs and Entrusting Repairs

Upon the requests of 03 war heroes in Nuwara Eliya, Kegalle , Kaluthara Districts, repairs were entrusted to the used artificial limbs through the respective manufacturing company using the provisions allocated for the year 2023 by incurring an amount of Rs.171,570.00. No. of 2 pairs of forearm crutches purchased in 2021 were distributed to the war heroes in 2023.

1.4. Provision of Assistive Devices from Donation Received

1.4.1. Prosthetic Limbs

Arrangements were made to donate a prosthetic limb to Sergeant Major R.P.C. Dharmapriya (Retd) who lost his right leg due to landmine while being attached to the Akunu Pahara Operation in Welioya area, representing the Biyagama war hero forum with the sponsorship of the family members of the Secretary to the Ministry of Defence, General Kamal Gunaratne (Retd), specially wife and daughter, on his birthday.



Upon the request made to the Ranaviru Fund functioning in the United Kingdom by the Ranaviru Seva Authority, a prosthetic limb amounting to Rs. 157,200.96 was donated to W.V.D. Dahamka, the son of W.R. Manoj (WO2) S/511152 who became disabled in operation.



1.4.2. Provision of LN4 Prosthetic Arms

Upon a special request of the former Chairman of Ranaviru Seva Authority, Major General Nandana Senadeera (Retd), Mr. Muhammad Samoon, the Barnd Ambassador for LN4 prosthetic arms in Sri Lanka, donated LN4 prosthetic arms for the disabled war heroes. In previous instances, prosthetic arms have been produced for those who have lost their arms at the ankle and such arms were used as copy of a hand but cannot be use for getting work done. Accordingly, two war heroes from Gampaha and Ampara districts were given LN4 prosthetic arms.

The LN4 prosthetic arm with new technology, which is made in America, can be operated with the help of other arm. The fingers of the artificial arm can be stretched with the help of other hand. In that manner, it is easy to touch, hold and write something. The artificial arm is light in weight and user friendly as it designed to wear without taking measurements. Provision of this type of prosthetic arms can be considered as an initiative for providing assestive devices with new technology instead of the current traditional rehabilitation methods.

PROJECT FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF RESIDENTIAL SANITARY FACILITIES OF DISABLED WAR HEROES

2.1. Project Introduction

Providing necessary facilities for the physical and mental empowerment of war heroes who sacrificed their body parts in operations is one of the key functions which lies with the Ranaviru Seva Authority.

Bathrooms at residences of permanently disabled war heroes are seldom remodeled to 'accessible' standards. This lag in refurbishment was mainly identified during field visits. Daily use of inaccessible/ordinary bathrooms creates a negative impact on the physical condition of the disabled war hero. Accordingly, the main objective of this project is to quickly identify the existing needs of disabled war heroes and build a wheelchair-accessible bathroom with a handrail to include required facilities in a manner that satisfy their requirements.

Financial assistance is thus provided under this project for constructing accessible bathrooms with required features for the improvement of sanitary facilities for disabled war heroes.

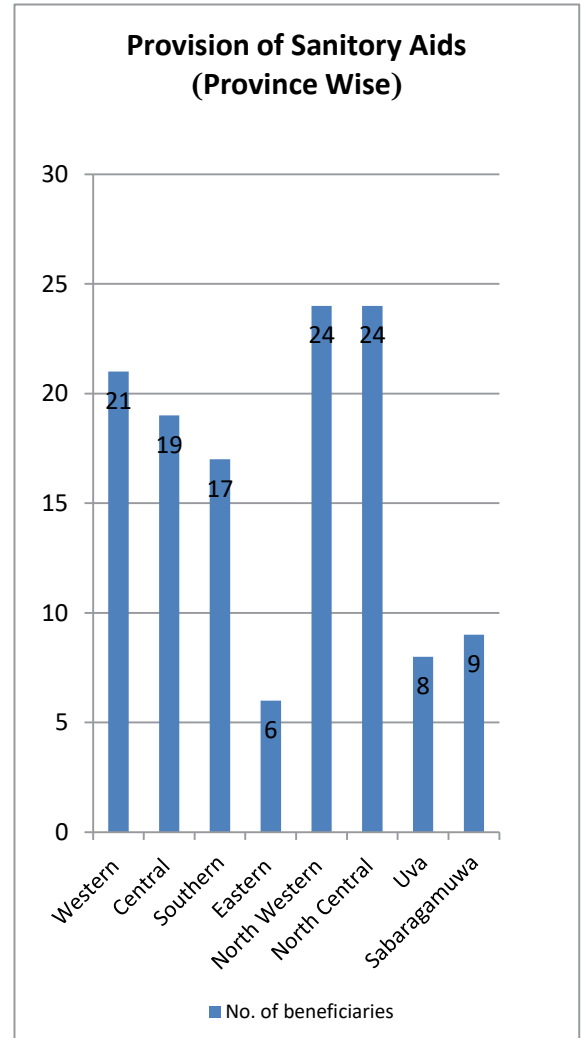
Herein, a sum of Rs. 100,000.00 is granted as financial aid to each war hero who has become disabled in operations for the construction of a bathroom with a commode and other components to upgrade their existing sanitary facilities, and Rs. 50,000/= for alterations of the existing facility to each war hero who has completed 10 years after having obtained the respective financial aid previously from the Ranaviru Seva Authority.

2.2. Sanitary Aid Disbursement Procedure

After the issue of application forms district wise, obtaining the relevant documents as stipulated in the application and completing the file is the main task. Then the duly completed applications are forwarded in compliance with the criteria, to the Sanitary Aid Recommendation Committee upon the receipt of recommendation of the Provincial Officers along with the recommendations from the Forum Officers, District Officers and Grama Niladhari. The money is credited to the war hero's account with relevant to the application for which the committee recommendation has been granted and follow up activities on the progress of the construction/ benefit are carried out through District and Provincial Officers.

The Sports Section is engaging in tasks such as conducting workshops/ training sessions for the selected players, encouraging the sportspersons to obtain national and international achievements, provision of energy supplements, and provision of sportswear, sports shoes and equipment, and provision of other required facilities for those in the war hero villages.

3.3. Programmes implemented in 2023

3.3.1. Conduct of workshops and training sessions

On 30.01.2023 and 31.01.2023, a two-day Badminton training program was conducted for disabled war heroes at Kandy Digana Indoor Stadium. The players belonging to the Ranaviru Seva Authority Sports Pool representing the districts of Kandy, Gampaha, Nuwara Eliya, Puttalam and Kegalle participated in this training programmes conducted by experienced sports instructors.



3.3.2. Directing players to the National and International Tournaments

The Ranaviru Seva Authority directs the players representing the sports pool of the Ranaviru Seva Authority to the national and international tournaments, encourages them and provides the necessary facilities for the same.

Accordingly, the players, Anil Prasanna Jayalath WO II (T42 100 m category), Sergeant Jayasinghe Ratnayake (T4 weightlifting category), Corporal MK Sanjeeva Perera (SL4 badminton category) who have qualified for this year's Asian Paralympic Games met the Honorable Chairman of the Ranaviru Seva Authority on 10.10.2023 and discussed their future sports activities.



3.3.3. Providing energy supplement needed for the players

Players who representing the Ranaviru Seva Authority's Athletics Pool and Badminton Pool, Anil Prasanna Jayalath WO II (T42 100m Category), Corporal MK Sanjeeva Perera (SL4 Badminton Category), and Sergeant Jayasinghe Ratnayake (T4 Weightlifting V Category) were provided with Energy drinks and nutritional supplements for their upcoming sports training.



3.3.4. Providing sports equipments to players

Under the programme conducted for the provision of necessary sports equipment to war heroes who have sacrificed their limbs for the country and become disabled but strive to bring honor to their country through their sports abilities, Corporal Suranga Wijeratne, who represents the Sri Lanka disabled cricket team was provided with sports equipment on 19.06.2023 and M.G. Chaturika Pramudita, the daughter of retired Staff Sergeant M.S, Anura, was given a pair of running shoes worth Rs. 42500.00 while a financial aid of Rs. 27100.00 was given to Dulani Ananya, a war hero's daughter on 20.04.2023.



3.3.5. Provision of Sports Facilities to the War Hero Villages

Under the programme of providing sports equipments to develop the sports abilities of the war heroes living in the War Hero Villages, sports equipments were distributed to no. of 19 War Hero Villages in 2013.

3.4. Special Accchievements in 2023

Anil Prasanna Jayalath WO II of the Ranaviru Seva Sports Pool is a player who represents the Sri Lankan National Team in Para Athletics tournaments. He won the gold medal in 100m event in T63 category in Para Athletics Grand Prix 2023 held at Dubai on 28.02.2023, the

“VIRU SAHANA” HOUSING LOAN PROJECT**4.1. Project Introduction**

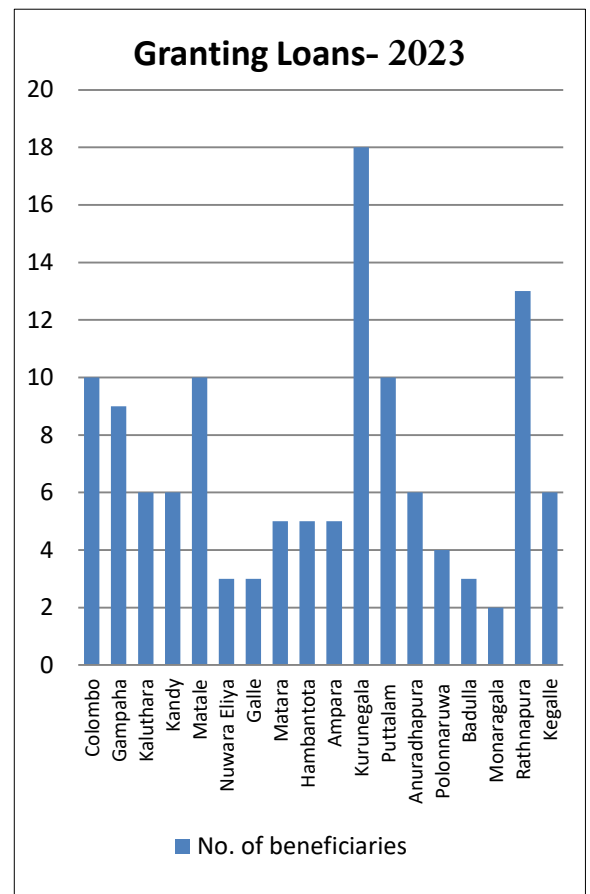
The ‘Viru Sahana’ Housing Loan Project has been launched by the Ranaviru Seva Authority to assist members of the war hero families of the deceased and disabled war heroes in realizing their dream of building a house, with a levy of only a service charge on a concessionary basis.

Loans are granted for the construction of a new house, refurbishment of a house, and renovation of a house, as per the requirement of the beneficiary. Upon the requirements of the beneficiaries, loan applications are issued annually through the Programme Officers from the Districts.

Loans up to a maximum of Rs 700,000.00 are granted under the ‘Viru Sahana’ Housing Loan Project per individual, to be repaid within a period of four years in installments, subject to an interest rate of 5%.

‘VIRUSUMITHURU’ HOUSING PROJECT**5.1. Project Introduction**

‘Virusumithuru’ Housing Project, jointly implemented by the National Housing Development Authority under the Ministry of Housing and Construction, and the Ranaviru Seva Authority under the State Ministry of Defence, was scheduled to be implemented from 2017 to 2022. This project is being executed to fulfill the housing needs of the war heroes rendered disabled in action and retired on medical grounds, and the next of kin of war heroes who have sacrificed their lives in service to the nation.

The ‘Virusumithuru’ Housing Project has been initiated to achieve the objectives of providing a sustainable national solution through government intervention in fulfilling the housing requirements of retired war heroes disabled in action and the next of kin of war heroes of the Sri Lanka Army, Navy, Air Force, Police, and Civil Defence Force to have sacrificed their life in service to the nation as well as recognizing the services rendered by the war heroes to the nation and fulfilling the obligations of the government and the nation in return towards war hero families by way of mediating total construction of houses and completing of semi-constructed houses.

Plans were underway to complete the total construction of 450 houses and 4000 semi-constructed houses within the period of 6 years from 2017 to 2022 and the total cost of the project amounts to Rs. 3192 Million. The grant comprises a financial contribution of Rs. 1,200,000.00 and labor assistance for total construction of a house and Rs. 500,000.00 for completion of a semi-constructed house. Funds will be received from the Treasury and granted to beneficiaries via the Housing Development Authority.

5.2. Role of the Ranaviru Seva Authority in the ‘Virusumithuru’ Housing Project

‘Virusumithuru’ Housing Project is a course of action administered jointly by the Housing Development Authority and the Ranaviru Seva Authority. The main responsibility of the Ranaviru Seva Authority herein, is to select suitable beneficiaries and refer them to the Housing Development Authority.

Applications for the ‘Virusumithuru’ Housing assistance are required to be submitted to the Project along with recommendations of the respective War Hero Forum, Grama Niladari, the Divisional Secretary, and District and Provincial Officers. Duly completed applications received are submitted to the committee appointed by the Director and, upon the receipt of the recommendation of the committee they are sent to the Sri Lanka Police and the Tri-forces to

obtain clearance certificates. The list of selected applicants so approved by the Chairman of the Ranaviru Seva Authority is submitted subsequently to the National Housing Development Authority for onward granting of financial subsidies.

Payments will be made to the beneficiaries in 4 installments by the Housing Development Authority. In the context of the total construction of a house, manpower is provided by the tri-forces by the intervention of the Ranaviru Seva Authority, and further, permission for required changes to house plans is granted subject to conformity to criteria.

LAND PROJECT

6.1. Project Introduction

In carrying out welfare activities for members of war hero families as well as considering assistance solicited by them, it is identified that they are faced with certain difficulties in securing permanent occupancy. Even though various projects are implemented to provide loans and assistance for house construction, they are faced with dire consequences due to a lack of own land for the purpose. It has been identified that the fact that they are not entitled to land has resulted in not receiving other welfare services.

The Land Project of the Ranaviru Seva Authority has been implemented with a view to providing solution for such difficulties and managing the task associated with their housing requirements. Under this project, they are provided with plots of land directly or the assistance they need where necessary.

6.2. Benefit Disbursement Procedure of the Project

1. Granting plots of lands

- i. Transferring the titles of land directly donated to the Authority, through a temporary permit or a deed to the war heroes
- ii. Coordinating with relevant parties to grant lands belonging to the Divisional Secretariats and Mahweli Authority where of which jurisdictions the war heroes are residing, as stipulated in the Circular 01/2021
- iii. Intervening to grant lands which belong to the Land Reforms Commission
- iv. Coordinating with the respective establishment and granting recommendations in respect of the lands which are claimed by the war heroes

2. Granting Recommendation for the Provision of Deeds/ Permits

Issuing pertinent recommendations for the provision of deeds/permits for the lands occupied by war heroes under 'The Ranaviru Sahana Foundation' as per the Land Commissioner General's Circular No. 2021/01.

3. Coordinating with the relevant institutions and providing necessary assistance to solve issues relating to lands occupied by the war heroes

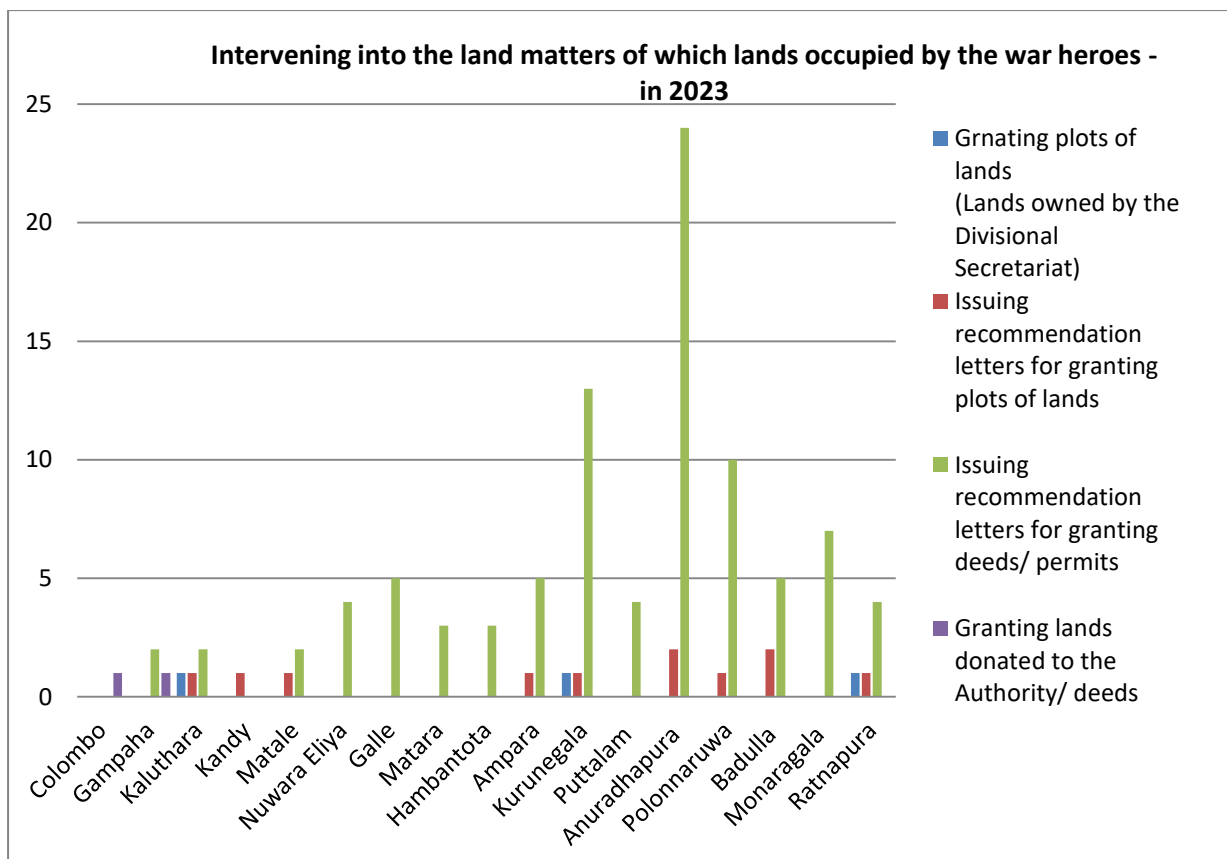

INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT IN WAR HERO VILLAGES

7.1. Project Introduction

Building infrastructure is the foremost challenge encountered by war hero families at their commencing to live in war hero villages. The Provincial and Special Projects Section mediates the making of arrangements in this regard with the central government and the responsible institutions functioning within its purview. Moreover, the development of essential infrastructure facilities of war hero villages including the construction of community halls, establishment of cultural centers, libraries, environmental centers, community water projects, and maintenance of internal roads and constructions, is implemented herein at the Provincial level on priority basis, whereby developing team spirit in view of improving their quality of life.

PROVISION OF MEDICAL ASSISTANCE AND LOANS

8.1. Provision of Medical Assistance

Retired war heroes who were rendered disabled in action, parents of married war heroes in the tri-services and Police who sacrificed their lives in service to the nation, who do not receive the full payment, and spouses and unemployed children below 26 years of age receiving only the pension/dependents' allowance through the tri-services and Police, are provided with medical assistance under this project.

Assistance is given for performing emergency surgeries, medical examinations, and purchasing medical equipment needed to overcome health conditions, and in assisting ailing disabled war heroes and the next of kin of war heroes confronted with financial difficulties, in receiving medical treatment.

They must be provided with adequate financial assistance for obtaining medical treatment and undergoing medical examinations or surgeries from a hospital with the required facilities. Therefore, financial assistance is provided under this project for expeditious reference and securing of required medical services from a medical institute with required facilities. A maximum of Rs.500,000.00 to a war hero and a maximum of Rs.75,000.00 to the next of kin of a war hero is provided under this scheme.

8.2. Provision of Medical Loans

A number of individuals representing the war hero community apply for medical loans annually based on various health problems confronted. A vast majority of requests are for emergency surgery and treatment, whilst most of the applicants are the ones who receive salaries or allowances. War heroes who retired due to medical reasons continue to fall ill due to the direct and indirect effects of the factors on their disability. Percentages of war heroes and the next of kin of war heroes contracting non-communicable diseases due to malnutrition remain high, whilst health problems caused by accidents too are inevitable.

Consequently, the war hero community seek medical treatments immediately from the government and private hospitals. Due to long-term wait under registration of patients at government hospitals, the war hero community is prone to exacerbation of health conditions and other side effects that could lead to even untimely death. As well as the inability to receive timely medical treatment for health conditions due to lack of financial means to meet incurred costs in obtaining the same from the private sector outside the treatment procedure in government hospitals can lead to exacerbation of health conditions

The main objective of this programme is to provide interest-free loans to the war hero community in need of urgent financial assistance for recommended medical treatment, in

such instances. Herein, financial assistance is extended to expedite obtaining of medical services from a medical institution which has enough facilities required for the treatment.

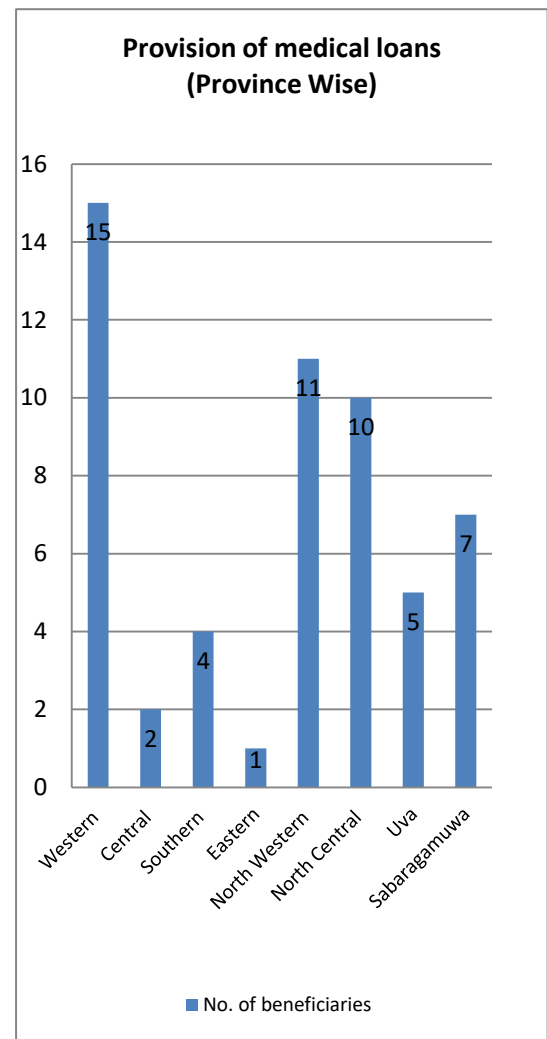
A maximum of Rs. 500,000.00 can be obtained as a medical loan. The loan will be recovered in a maximum of 36 installments. Service charges will not be levied for this loan and the loan amount is granted upon the requests received from the war hero community.

8.3. Procedure for Providing Medical Assistance and Loans

The Section issue applications island wide for the provision of medical assistance and loans. Duly perfected applications are forwarded seeking the medical recommendation upon the receipt of the recommendations of the Officer-in- Charge of the District and the Deputy Director – Province. After that, the payment approval is obtained having submitted the applications to the Medical Aid/ Loan Committee. The beneficiary is reimbursed for the expenses incurred and to be incurred for obtaining treatments by crediting the relevant amount to the account in favour of the beneficiary under the provision of medical assistance, and in case of the medical loan, the payment is made to the respective establishment.

EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS AND YOUTH AFFAIRS SECTION

9.1. Project Introduction

The prime objective of project is to empower a socially responsible and professionally qualified generation in the nation through providing children of war heroes who have sacrificed their life and limb in service and become disabled, with financial assistance to complete their educational requirements. Another objective of this project is to foster the development of efficient individuals in society by providing a platform for the children of war heroes, who may not have the opportunity to pursue higher education, to obtain professional qualifications and financial assistance.

The Education Scholarships and Youth Affairs Section administers scholarship schemes for children, offering three types of educational scholarships: Grade 6 to 11 Scholarship, G.C.E. (Advanced Level) Scholarship, and Higher Education Scholarship. Additionally, the Skill Development Loan project provides computers for educational purposes. The Foster Parent Scholarship Programme, funded by donor contributions, is also managed by this Section.

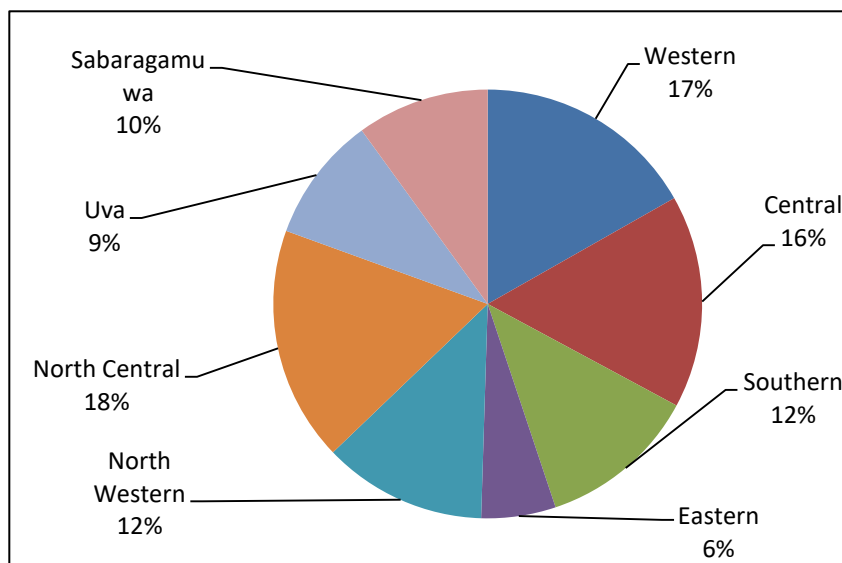
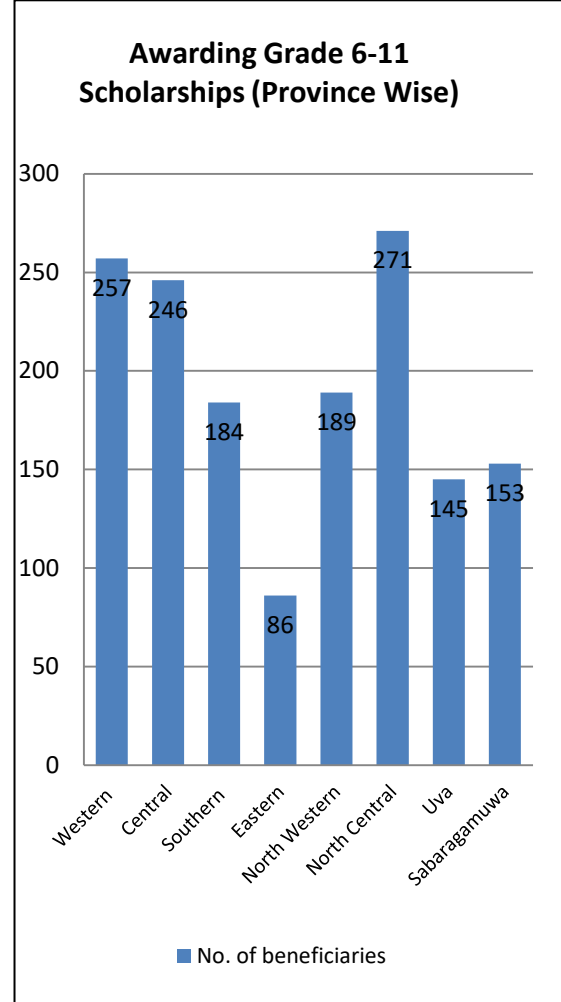
9.2. Grade 6 to 11 Scholarship Programme

This scholarship awarded for the benefit of school-going children of war heroes, provides a monthly allowance of Rs 500.00 for each student from Grade 6 to 11 in order to complete their education. The said monthly amount is transferred to a National Savings Bank Account opened in favour of the respective child and maintained under the custody of a parent/guardian.

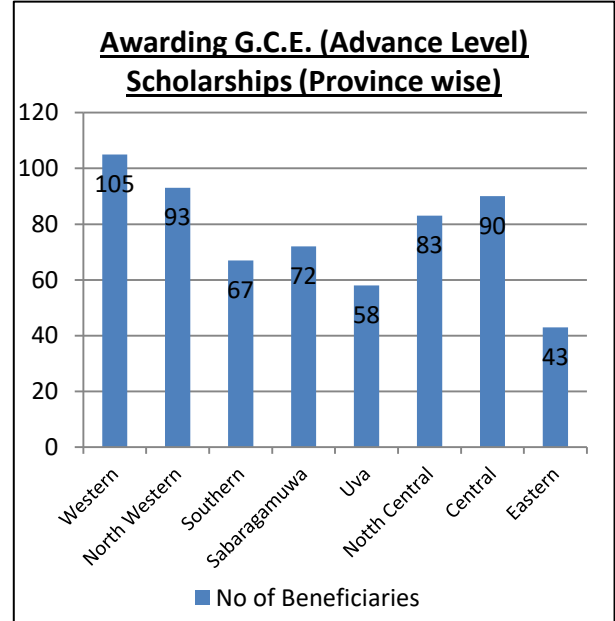
9.3. G.C.E. (Advance Level) Scholarship Programme

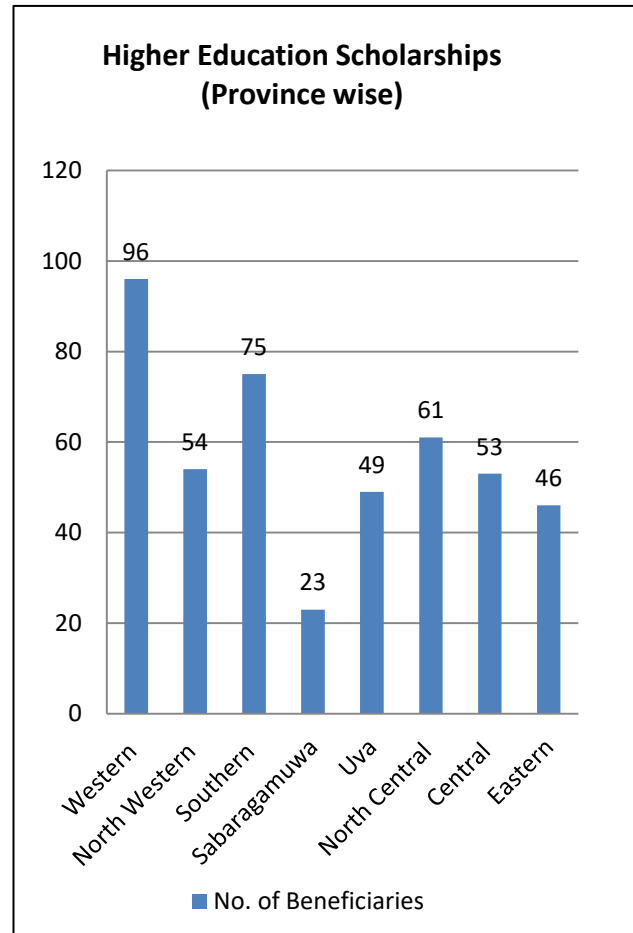

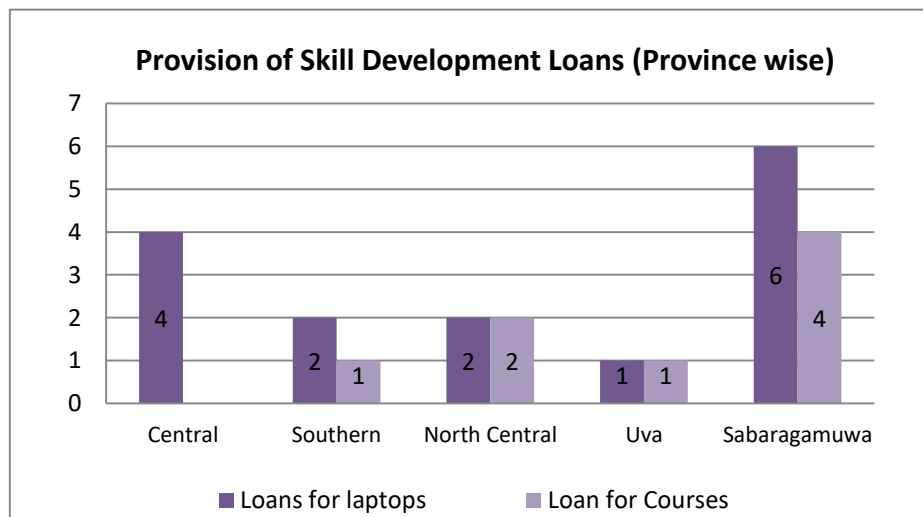

FOSTER PARENT SCHOLARSHIP PROJECT**11.1. Project Introduction**

Children of war heroes from the Tri-services and Police, who have become disabled or died due to non-combat reasons while on active service, are granted scholarships under this project to support their studies.

The objectives of this project are to honor the service of war heroes, provide financial support to their children who face economic difficulties in completing their education, and encourage them to continue their studies by providing scholarships. Bursaries are awarded to children from Grade 1 to G.C.E. Ordinary Level.

Since war heroes who died and were disabled due to non-combat reasons, do not belong to the beneficiary category of the Ranaviru Seva Authority established by Parliament Act No. 54 of 1999 provisions are not made for the project and scholarships are awarded through the contributions made by local and foreign sponsors. This project is financed by the contributions made by local and foreign sponsors.

11.2. Benefit Disbursement Procedure of the Project

After verifications of applications received by the Authority, such applications are forwarded to the sponsors at the time they express their consent. The selected applications are submitted to the Committee for selecting Beneficiaries of the Authority and upon the receipt of the recommendation of the committee, the approvals of the Director and Chairman are sought.

Measures are taken to credit the relevant amount to the respective bank accounts of the beneficiaries on a monthly basis after the sponsor credits the funds to the account maintained by the Ranaviru Seva Authority. The scholarship recipients are notified by letters, and arrangements are made to monitor their educational progress through term test marks and other educational activities.

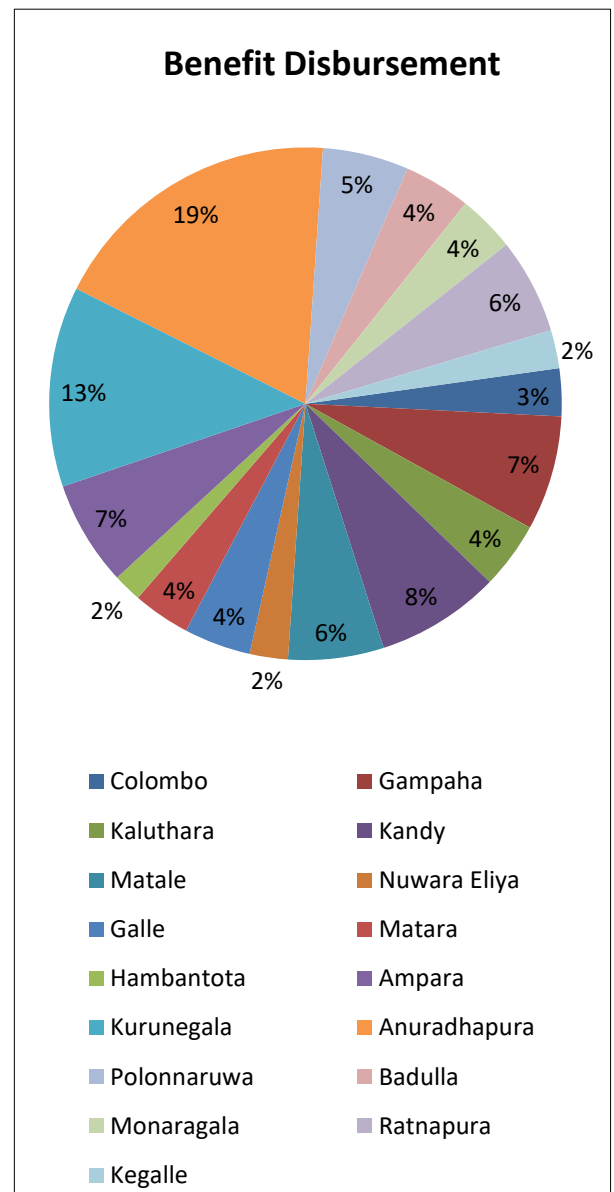

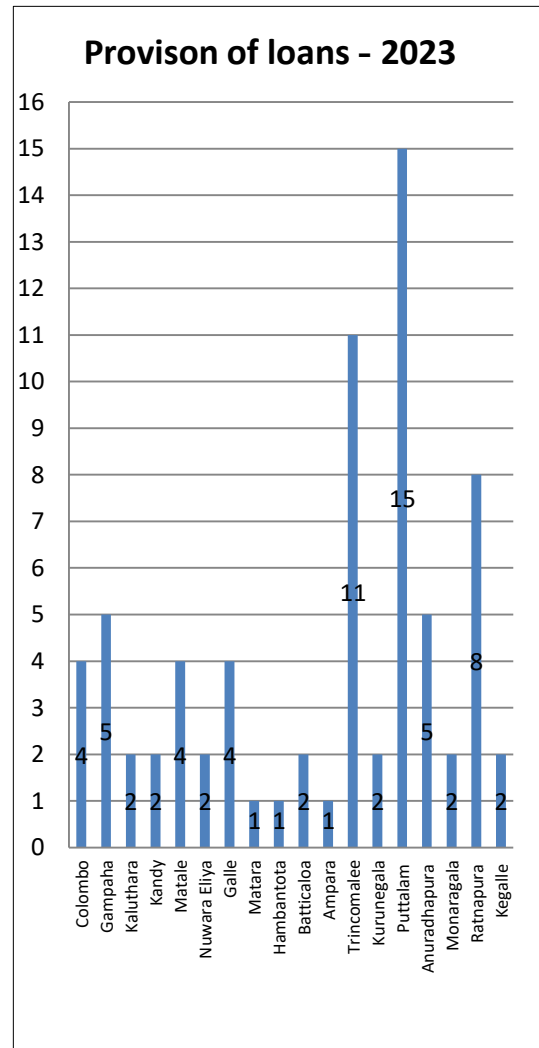
12.1. Project Introduction

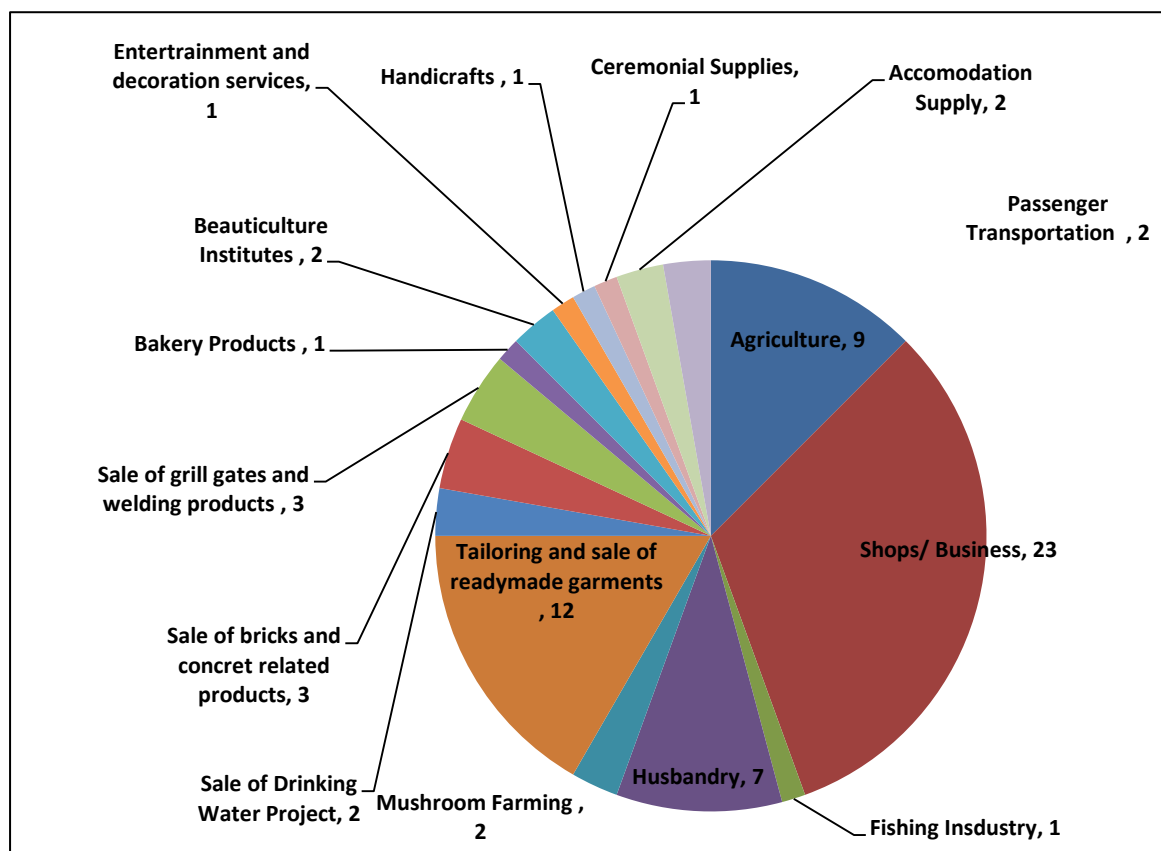

RETIRED WAR HERO WELFARE SECTION**13.1. Project Introduction**

Under the project to obtain the contribution of the Tri-forces for the country's development tasks, the primary objective is to establish a foundation for transforming retired war heroes, who have dedicated their youth to the country, into entrepreneurs in the agricultural and industrial fields. This aims to direct them toward employment opportunities utilizing the skills they have developed. The Enterprise Development Project is directly involved in guiding them and coordinating public and private sector institutions to conduct workshops and training sessions, provide counseling services, and distribute seedlings either free of charge or at affordable prices.

In 2023, the project conducted workshops on organic fertilizer production, organic gardening, mushroom farming, and beekeeping. Collaborators included the Ministry of Defense, Tri-Forces, Department of Agrarian Development, Department of Agriculture, Mahaweli Authority of Sri Lanka, District Secretariats, and Divisional Secretariats, in partnership with the Ranaviru Seva Authority.

13.2 . Benefit Disbursement Procedure of the Programme

Training workshops are conducted for a group selected based on criteria set by the Ranaviru Seva Authority and upon the recommendation of the District Programme Officer. The request is made by disabled war heroes and their family members interested in the respective projects and who have obtained membership in the respective War Hero Forums.

13.3.1. Training programmes on organic fertilizer and gardening

To change attitudes towards farming in districts with abundant paddy cultivation and to build a healthy and economically strong society through poison-free organic farming, a series of programs have been organized to encourage farmers to shift to organic cultivation, with war hero communities serving as exemplary models. Consequently, seven training programmes related to organic fertilizers and gardening were executed.

13.3.1.1. Workshop for the Nuwaragam Palath War Hero Forum in Anuradhapura, Central Province

The first training program of the year 2023 organized by the Retired War Hero Welfare Section was conducted at Pandulagama Sadaham Resort for 30 members of Nuwaragam Palath War Hero Forums in Anuradhapura district, Central province on 10.02.2023. They were made aware of the modern techniques related to organic fertilizer production and organic gardening and they were also made aware of the simple techniques used to get more harvest through organic farming.

The programme was conducted by Corporal Sumit Kumar (Rtd), the training officer of the War Hero Welfare Section upon the instructions given by the Ranaviru Seva Authority and the resources were provided by the Office of the Agriculture Instructors at Kandy Nuwaragam Palatha

13.3.1.2. Workshop - Damunumull, Galewela

The training program on organic fertilizer and gardening organized for the disabled war heroes of Matale district was conducted on 24.02.2023 in Damunumulla, Galewela with the participation of 35 war heroes and their next of kin and the resource contribution for this programme was provided by the Mahaweli Authority.

13.3.1.3. Training programme - Udagama, E/ Manampitiya

The training programme conducted for the war heroes in Manampitiya of Polonnaruwa district was conducted on 28.03.2023 at No. 7, Sinha Udagama, E/Manampitiya. No. of 31 war hero family members participated in this programme to which the resource contribution was provided by the Mahaweli Authority.

13.3.1.4. Training programme - Aselapura, Welikanda

A training programme on organic fertilizers and gardening was conducted on 29.03.2023 at Aselapura War Hero village, Welikanda for the disabled war heroes in Polonnaruwa district with the participation of 30 next of kin of war heroes. The resource contribution for this programme was provided by the Mahaweli Authority.

13.3.1.5. Training programme – Narammala

The training programme organized by the Retired War Hero Welfare Section of the Ranaviru Seva Authority was conducted at Visal Sewana, Udavilawatta, Dambadeniya, Narammala on 26.04.2020 for the disabled war heroes in Narammala, Kurunegala district. No. of 28 individuals including war heroes and their family members participated in this programme and resources were provided by the officers of the Agrarian Development Office, Narammala

13.3.1.6. Training programme – Galnewa War Hero Village

A training programme on organic fertilizers and gardening was conducted at Galnawa War Hero Village for the war heroes residing at Galnewa village in Anuradhapura district with the participation of 25 members of war hero families on 04.07.2023. The officer of the Agrarian Development Office, Galnewa was the resource person in this task.

13.3.1.7. Training programme – Ranajayapura War Hero Village

The training programme on organic farming was successfully conducted for war heroes at Kekirawa in Anuradhapura district at Ranajayapura War Hero Village on 12.07.2023 with the participation of 35 war heroes. Ms. I.D.M. Mihiri, the Agriculture Instructor – Ipalogama, provided the resource contribution for this task.

13.3.1.8. Training programme on mushroom farming - Ampara

On 22.06.2023, a training workshop on mushroom farming was conducted at the Ampara Divisional Secretariat, with 40 war hero family members participating. The Provincial Departments of Agriculture provided knowledge on modern mushroom farming techniques, aiming to build stable economic backgrounds for entrepreneurs within the war hero community.

13.3.1.9. Training programme on beekeeping - Ambagamuwa

An awareness programme on organic gardening and modern techniques used in beekeeping industry was conducted for the members of Ambagamuwa War Hero Forum in Nuwara Eliya District on 15.12.2023 at Asoka Warnasuriya, Sunila, Alagala, Ginigathhena. Also, they were provided with sufficient knowledge on dehydration of fruits and vegetables and resources were provided by the Agriculture Officer, Ginigathena.

MAPIYA SUREKUM PROJECT**14.1. Project Introduction**

Parents who do not receive any pay or pension, whose married sons/ daughters died before 21 November 2007 in operation, are given this allowance under the “Mapiya Surekum” project. A sum of Rs 1,500.00 per parent totaling Rs 3,000.00 is granted to both living parents, whereas Rs 2,250.00 is granted in the case of 1 living parent. The respective amount of money is transferred through bank accounts maintained in the National Savings Bank on monthly basis.

The Life Certificate (Certificate of Existence) for the beneficiary with the recommendation of the the Grama Niladari and the Divisional Secretary is required to be submitted in the month of November each year. They have given a period of 03 months to complete the document and submit the same to the authority. The accounts of those who have not submitted the relevant form on due date will be temporarily suspended in upcoming months.

However, the accounts so suspended will be reactivated if someone forwards the relevant form later.

14.2. Making a Payment of Rs. 1500

By December 2022, there were 305 beneficiaries whose accounts were credited with Rs. 1,500.00 monthly. These accounts were considered as the accounts maintained in the project at the beginning of the year 2023. Depending on accounts added for making the payment of Rs. 1500.00 from January to December and accounts suspended, the expenditure incurred for each month is as follows.

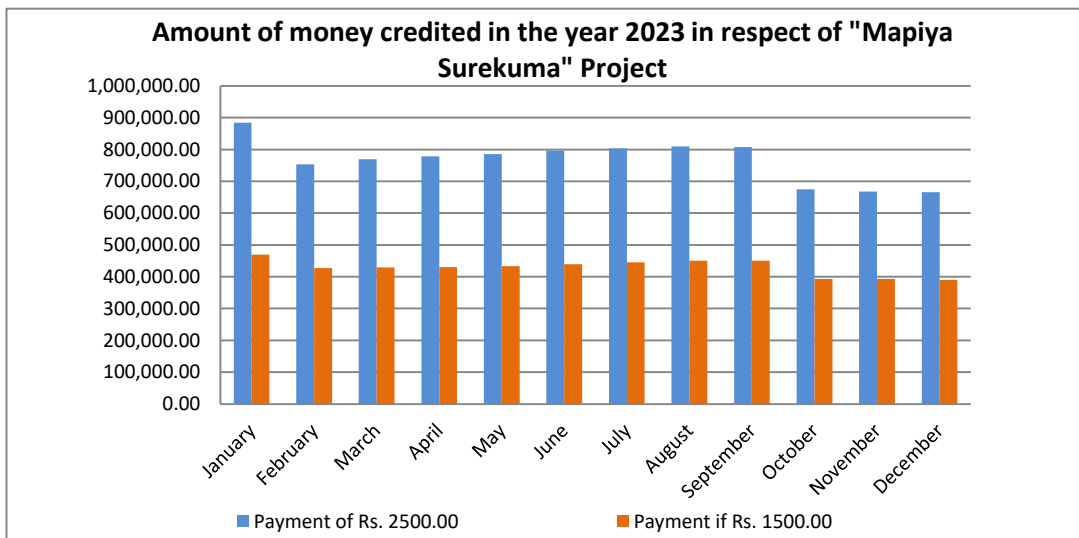

MAPIYA RAKAWARANA PROJECT

15.1. Project Introduction

The 'Mapiya Rakawarana' allowance of Rs. 750.00 is granted once a month by the 'Mapiya Rakawarana' Section of the Ranaviru Seva Authority to the living parents of war heroes who were disabled in action and retired on medical grounds, declared missing in action, or who sacrificed their lives in service to the nation. This is in accordance with the Ranaviru Seva Act. The allowance is credited only to 'Mapiya Rakawarana' accounts opened under state banks such as the Bank of Ceylon, People's Bank, National Savings Bank, and Regional Development Bank.

Irrespective of the number of war heroes in a family, the allowance granted is limited to the sum of Rs. 750.00 per living parent, per month. The allowance will be granted only for the lifetime of the mother and father and is not transferable to any other person. Immediately after the demise of a parent, the relevant passbook ought to be handed over to the bank concerned and a copy of the death certificate of the deceased is to be provided to the 'Mapiya Rakawarana' Section of the Ranaviru Seva Authority.

A Life Certificate (Certificate of Existency) for the beneficiary endorsed by the Grama Niladari is required to be submitted bi-annually, before 15 June and 15 December each year respectively, to the 'Mapiya Rakawarana' Section of the Ranaviru Seva Authority.

15.2. Eligibility Requirements for Allowance

This allowance is granted to parents of war heroes in the Tri-Forces and Police, killed by a terrorist attack and declared missing, and parents of war heroes in the Tri-Forces and Police who became disabled due to a terrorist attack and were sent on retirement on medical grounds.

Even though there are several war hero children, the living mother and father will receive Rs. 750.00 per month separately. For a family with a deceased war hero and a living war hero child, the allowance is paid in respect of the deceased war hero.

The beneficiary shall send a life certificate certified by the Grama Seva Nildhari once six months before June 15 and December 15 of each year to the Parent Care Section of the Ranaviru Seva Authority. The mother or father is entitled to this allowance until he/she is alive. This allowance cannot be transferred to anyone. After the death of the mother and father, the passbook should be returned to the concerned bank immediately and a copy of the

death certificate of the deceased should be given to the Parent Care Section of the Ranaviru Seva Authority.

15.3. Documents Required for Obtaining the ‘Mapiya Rakawarana’ Allowance

- i. Duly completed ‘Mapiya Rekawarana’ application
- ii. In the case of a deceased war hero, a true copy of the death certificate of the deceased
- iii. In case of a war hero sent on retirement on medical grounds and disabled due to a terrorist attack, the Disability Percentage Report of the war hero or letter received from the service station or a copy of the letter submitted to the A F Med 21 or board
- iv. A true copy of the war hero’s birth certificate
- v. Copies of the National Identity Cards of mother and father
- vi. Copies of the ‘Mapiya Rekawarana’ Accounts certified by the respective bank

The allowance of ‘Mapiya Rekawarana’ is paid to parents who fulfill the above requirements in the following order.

- i. The applications submitted every month by parents of the war heroes are verified by the clerk and check whether they are in compliance with the criteria. Then the applications are forwarded for computerization.
- ii. The application to which all other required documents are annexed is computerized by the computer operator and the details are again rechecked.
- iii. The details of the application entered into the database and other documents are verified and certified by the Head of the Division.
- iv. Upon the approval received from the Chairman for the computerized application form forwarded by the Head of Division, confirmation is granted identifying the said account as an active account.
- v. After the computerization process of applications, approval is obtained through a bank voucher for crediting monthly allowance under the ‘Mapiya Rekawarana’ project as follows.
- vi. Upon the receipt of Chairman or Director’s approval granted to payment summary submitted by the Head of the Division, the Assistant Director (Finance) proceeds banking the monthly ‘Mapiya Rekawaran’ allowance having confirmed the relevant payment.

'VIRUSARA' PRIVILEGE CARD PROJECT

16.1. Project Introduction

The 'Virusara' Privilege Card is granted by the Ranaviru Seva Authority under the direct supervision of the Ministry of Defence following the Government policy on the uplifting extension of welfare measures to war heroes and their families enabling them to obtain services and privileges with due honour and respect, in gratitude to the selfless contribution of war heroes of the Tri-services, Police and Civil Security Department, who sacrificed their lives and limbs on active duty to protect the sovereignty and territorial integrity of our motherland.

The privilege cards issued up to 28.04.2023 had a validity period of 05 years. The validity period expired after the lapse of 05 years, it was required to apply for a new privilege. However, the privilege cards issued from 28.04.2023 do not expire. The project of ‘Virusara Privilege Cards’ is executed under two phases.

Phase I - This phase is executed with the purpose of uplifting the welfare of the disabled war heroes and next of kin of war heroes of the Tri-services, Police, and the Civil Defence Force, who sacrificed their lives and limbs or were declared missing in action during the period of war. The card can be obtained by submitting the relevant document to the Ranaviru Seva Authority through the Officer-in-Charge of the District via War Hero Forums or by visiting the Ranaviru Seva Authority.

Phase II - Under this phase, 'Virusara' Privilege Cards are granted to retired personnel of the Tri-services, Police, and Civil Security Department who served with good conduct during the period of war from 1983 to 2009; all serving personnel of the Tri-services, Police, and Civil Security Department who were enlisted during the said period; serving or retired officers and civil staff who have completed 20 years of service; Other Ranks who have completed 22 years of service; Lady Officers/Woman Soldiers who have completed 15 years of service during the respective period; and the next of kin of personnel of the Tri-services, Police, and Civil Security Department who laid down their lives or were declared missing in action during the said period.

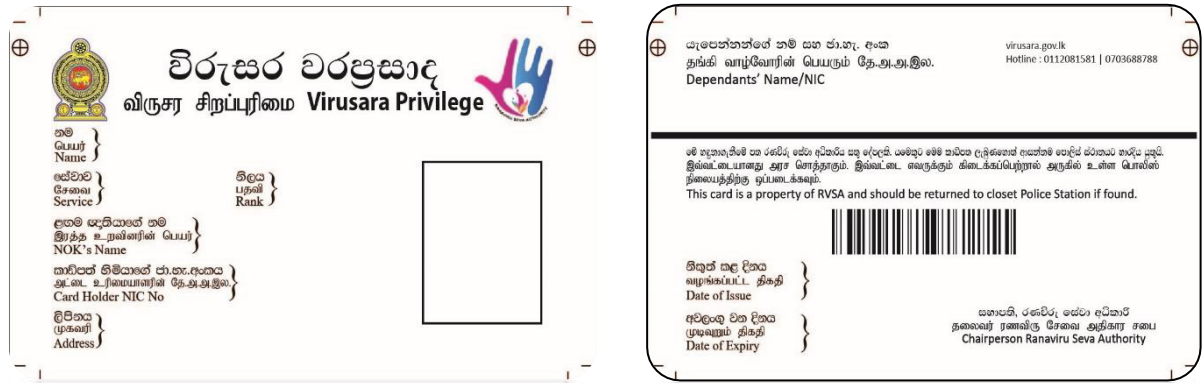

17.3. “Helaviru Suwa Dharani” Suwa Sayana Programme

The "Helaviru Suwa Dharani" Suwa Sayana programme is executed to foster the physical and mental well-being of war heroes who became disabled and the next of kin of those who sacrificed their lives. The Ayurveda Clinics provide services such as conducting lectures on nutrition and health, providing medicinal beverages under the patronage of the Ministry of Indigenous Medicine, and visiting patients identified for treatment, administering necessary care at their residences on a quarterly basis.

This programme aims to identify patients, provide counseling and medical treatment, and visit disabled war heroes at their residences to treat them until recovery. These programmes are conducted island-wide by the Ranaviru Seva Authority in cooperation with the Department of Ayurveda.

Emergency Relief Project is executed in order to provide relief for the next of kin of war heroes who sacrificed their lives in operation, and the disabled war heroes retired and being in the service in respect of the damages that occur due to emergencies such as floods, cyclones, landslides, fire, etc. and considering the death of the disabled war hero.

18.2. Benefit disbursement procedure

Financial aid of Rs. 100,000.00 is provided to the next of kin of war heroes who sacrificed their lives in operation and the disabled war heroes retired and being in the service in respect of the damages to the houses that occur due to emergencies such as floods, cyclones, landslides, fire, etc. and a financial aid of Rs. 10,000.00 is provided to the family members at a sudden death of the disabled war hero subject to the recommendation of the District Programme Officer in the respective district and Provincial Deputy Director.

WAR HERO COMMEMORATION PROJECT

19.1. Project Introduction

This project is executed to safeguard the honor, dignity, and respect of war heroes by performing acts necessary or conducive to the discharge of the functions of the Authority, as stipulated in the Parliamentary Act No. 54 of 1999. Programmes for commemorating the brave patriotic war heroes of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Police, and Civil Security Department, who sacrificed their lives and limbs for the country, are conducted through this project. These programmes extend the nation's gratitude towards them, safeguard their honor and respect, and fulfill their welfare needs.

19.2. War Heroes' Day Commemoration Ceremony

The 14th War Heroes Commemoration was held at the War Hero Memorial near the Parliament Complex, Battaramulla under the patronage of His Excellency the President Ranil Wickremasinghe, the Executive President of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka and the Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces on the 19th of May in 2023.

May 19, 2022, marks the 14th anniversary of the war victory over LTTE terrorism that lasted for three decades. A total of twenty-eight thousand (28,000) war heroes from the Army, Navy, Air Force, and Civil Security Department sacrificed their lives for the freedom of the motherland. More than twenty-seven thousand (27,000) soldiers became disabled in the battle. With the participation of representatives from all religious groups, disabled war heroes, next of kin of war heroes, political leaders, and war heroes from the Tri-Forces, Police, and Civil Security Department, this commemoration ceremony was conducted to pay national tribute to the war heroes of the motherland.

DEVELOPMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE MAILAPITIYA WAR HEROES' MEMORIAL PARK

Milapitiya National Remembrance Park is the first such War Heroes' Memorial to be established in Sri Lanka to commemorate war heroes who have made the supreme sacrifice to liberate the motherland from ruthless terrorism. The memorial raised on a tranquil landscape holds a remembrance park of serene beauty containing a monument dedicated to fallen war heroes and cenotaphs engraved with the names of all fallen war heroes. Pertinent costs for water and electricity of this National Remembrance Park are borne by the Ranaviru Seva Authority whilst security and maintenance requirements of the same are executed by the Sri Lanka Army.

20.1. Development and Maintenance of the Mailapitiya War Heroes' Memorial Park in 2023

In addition to expenditure incurred for water, electricity and maintenance tasks, money has been spent for the purchase of tableware and a national flag for the use of the Mailapitiya park in 2023.

Relating to the Notes to the Financial Statements
For the Year Ended 31.12.2023

1. Corporate Profile

1.1. Reporting Entity and Basis

The Ranaviru Seva Authority is a government body established by the Ranaviru Seva Authority Act No. 54 of 1999, enacted by the Parliament of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka by the Gazette Notification dated 23 December 1999. The Sub-section 3 of the Ranaviru Seva Authority Act No. 54 of 1999 was later amended by the Ranaviru Seva Authority (Amendment) Act No. 7 of 2009 and Act No. 20 of 2012 respectively.

1.2. The Prime Objective, Function and the Role

The prime objective is to promote the welfare of the target group identified by the Ranaviru Seva Authority Act. In order to accomplish this objective, the promotion of welfare is being done under the following six functions as stipulated in the Ranaviru Seva Authority Act.

- I. To provide, and to assist in the provision of, housing
- II. To provide for the after care and rehabilitation of members of the Armed Forces and the Police Force who have become disabled in action
- III. To provide, or assist in the provision of, medical care
- IV. To enable the target group to have access to education and higher education
- V. To secure gainful employment
- VI. To set up industrial, agricultural or commercial ventures with a view to providing employment to the members who have become disabled in action

1.3. Target Groups

Members of the Armed Forces and the Police Force who have become disabled in action and the dependents of members of the Armed Forces and the Police Force who have been killed, or are missing in action

1.4. Address of the Head Office

Head office is located at No. 443, Galle Road, Colombo 03.

1.5. Cadre Details

As per Letter No. DMS/C2/2/44 dated 16.10.2012 of the Department of Management Services, the approved cadre shall be 89 (not including the Chairman and Vice Chairman). The total number of employees deployed in service is 61 as of 31.12.2022.

Accounting Year

The accounting year of the Authority is a calendar year. These financial statements are for the accounting year from 01.01.2022 to 31.12.2022.

1.6. Date for Approving the Financial Statement

Approval should be granted within 60 calendar days from the end of the accounting year. The Board of Management approved these financial statements on 22 February 2024.

2. Basis of Preparation and Conformity

2.1. Basis of Preparation and Conformity

Financial Statements of the Authority have been prepared on the historical cost basis conforming to the accounting policies generally accepted, except for the following items of the balance sheet.

2.2. Statement of Conformity

These financial statements are comprised of the Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Financial Performance, Statement of Cash Flow and Total Net Assets/ Change of Equity Statement including the notes to the accounts.

These financial statements have been prepared in conformity to Sri Lanka Accounting Standards introduced in the year 2009 and 2012; Procurement Guidelines - 2006 (Goods and Work) and Inland Revenue Act No 24 of 2017. Actions are taken in line with the “Sri Lanka Statement of recommended practice for the not-for-profit Organization” introduced by the Institute of Chartered Accountants at an instance where a certain transaction is not covered by Sri Lanka Accounting Standards, International Accounting Policies for Public Institutions are used and in case it too doesn’t apply.

2.3. Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The Board of Management of the Ranaviru Seva Authority is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view in accordance with Paragraph 19 of Sri Lanka Accounting Standards No. 01.

2.4. Functional and Presenting Currency

Currency of the Authority is Sri Lanka Rupees and it has been used in the preparation of the Financial Statements.

3. Significant Accounting Policies

The additional information which is considered by the Board of Management as important in the understanding of the users is highlighted in this section.

The Accounting Policies set out below have been applied consistently to all period presented in the financial statements unless otherwise indicated. Accounting standards which were changed and the special standards which have an impact on the financial position of the Authority are briefly presented in this section.

3.1. Accounting for Government Grants

Recurrent Grants

Recurring grants received from the Government are adjusted to the Income and Expenditure Account.

Capital Grants

Capital grants received for the work of authority are accounted for in the government contribution (capital) account and capital grants received to transfer to other institutions are accounted for in the relevant accounts.

3.2. Assets and the Basis of Valuation of Assets

If the value of the assets purchased from the year 2022 is less than Rs. 10,000 and the life span is less than one year, they are included as consumer goods and indicated as an expense in this year. If the cost of the asset is more than Rs. 10,000 and the useful life is more than one year it is treated and accounted as a fixed asset.

In order to find the cost of the fixed assets received as donations, market values have been used.

3.2.1. Tangible Asset and Depreciation

Depreciation has been calculated according to the straight-line method at Cost Value as per the following percentages per annum.

Land	-
Building and Construction	5%
Furniture and Accessories	15%
Machinery and Equipment	15%
Vehicle	20%

3.3. Inventories

Merchandise Inventory, Stationary and Consumable stock is valued at the cost. The cost is calculated on the First in First out (FIFO) method.

3.4. Debtors and Other Receivable Values

Debtors and Other Receivables are stated at the estimated value of realization.

3.5. Liability and Provision

3.5.1. Current Liability

Current Liabilities are payables which need to be paid on the due dates or within one year from the Statement of Financial Position.

The operating cost related to the Virusara Cards project which was introduced by Ministry of Defense is borne by the sponsored funds received from the Three Forces and the Police. The balance amount of the sponsored funds which is left after bearing of relevant expenses is shown under Current Liabilities to the Three Forces and the Police.

Since it is the responsibility of the Authority to construct houses for the relevant beneficiaries from the funds donated by various parties for the Virusara Housing Scheme executed to construct houses for the war heroes, the amounts received have been taken into account under current liabilities.

3.5.2. Provision

In accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting standard No. 19, the provision for gratuity has been calculated based on below mentioned variables and assumptions.

Variables:

- Average salary for last three months
- Past service period
- Future service period (up to retirement)
- Annual Salary Increment Rate (Base on the salary scale as stipulated in the Scheme of Recruitment)
- Discount Rate (Treasury bill Interest Rate)

Assumptions:

- The employee remains in service until retirement age

- Employee is entitled only to the annual salary increments under the approved salary scales in the future service period (salary conversions by the government will not be applicable)
- The employee will not be promoted or demoted from the post during the next service period
- Zero employee turnover rate

The provision for gratuity payment is invested in treasury bills and as per decision of the Board of Management given in the 110th board meeting, the investment interest income is divided among employees.

The accounting policy for provisioning of doubtful debts is to make a provision of 1% of the outstanding debtor amount as at the balance sheet date.

3.5.3. Contingency Liabilities

The following parties have filed a case against the Authority as at 31st December 2023

Provisions have not been made for the above cases due to the fact that there is no grounds to determine whether will be a contingent liability arising from this case which is being heard at the relevant courts by the date of publishing the Financial Statements of the Authority.

There is a contingency liability for the payment to be made in respect of 80 Mapiya Rekawarana Accounts (with outstanding values) upon the receipt of accurate data. Such accounts have not been settled as at 31.12.2023 out of the 3917 Mapiya Rekawarana Accounts suspended by the Board of Management since September 2020.

3.6. Contingency Assets

There is a contingency asset in respect of the amount of Rs.530,380/- to be recovered from a Computer Assistant Officer who has resigned from service without following procedure after obtaining no-pay foreign leave for 02 year and breached the terms of the bond.

3.7. Income and Expenses

Income and expenses are accounted for on the accrual basis except for the following income.

3.7.1. Lottery Income

A percentage of the turnover received from the 'Supiri Vasana Sampatha' Lottery is credited to Government Consolidated Funds on behalf of the Ranaviru Seva Authority by the National Lotteries Board, and the said amount is accounted for as Lottery Income. The grants which are not released by National Lottery Board to the Authority are accounted for as Lottery Income Receivable.

The authority has made 100% allocations for the capital expenses incurred in respect of the project programs and written off through 'Income and Expenditure Accounts' and maintained them.

3.7.2. Donation

Local donors donate money to Ranaviru Seva Authority, and the money is granted for the educational purposes of the war heroes' children. In addition, this money is also given for the special tasks proposed by them.

3.7.3. Investment

The Ranaviru Seva Authority maintains fixed deposits in the National Savings Bank, People's Bank and Bank of Ceylon and the interest income is used to incur the administrative expenses of the authority.

Cash belonging to the current accounts of the Authority is invested in short-term deposits of 06 and 03 months and 07 days.

Amounts allocated in respect of gratuity payments are invested in the treasury bills of Bank of Ceylon.

Insurance claims are shown under the Other Income in the Statement of Financial Performance and expenses incurred for repairs are accounted for under the Expenses.

Note 70

1. Agrahara Insurance Scheme

Note 72

The total net assets of the authority have increased by Rs. 218,002,687.92 in the year 2023 compared to the year 2022. This has been shown in the Statement of Assets/Equity Changes on page No 04. With the increase in income in the year 2023 compared to the year 2022, the surplus for the current year shows a higher value.

Note 73

The income of The Ranaviru Seva Authority depended on the income sources which can be controlled by the Board of Management and the sources outside the control of the Board of Management. Out of these two sources, the sources outside the control of the Board of Management make a considerable contribution. Sources outside the control of the Board of Management of the Ranaviru Seva Authority are Government Contributions and the income received from Supiri Vasana Sampatha Lottery. Even though the amounts utilized for the welfare promotion tasks of the target groups were increased for a considerable

period, the income has been reducing since the income from the lotteries and the government contributions are not increasing.
