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The Minister of Justice, Prisons Affairs and Constitutional Reforms,— Amendments to the Standing Orders of the Parliament,— That the following amendment to the existing Standing Orders of the Parliament made in terms of Standing Order 137 of the Parliament be agreed to:—

That the following new Standing Order be inserted as Standing Order 113 A of the Parliament immediately after the existing Standing Order 113 of the Parliament thereto:—

New Standing Order 113 A,—

COMMITTEE ON POST-LEGISLATIVE SCRUTINY

113 A (1) There shall be a Committee to be designated the “Committee on Post-Legislative Scrutiny” consisting of twenty one Members nominated by the Committee of Selection.

(2) It shall be the duty of the Committee on Post- Legislative Scrutiny to examine the existing legislation and to propose necessary amendments to the Parliament to ensure the reforms, which are necessary for the purpose of achieving the expectations of the people.

(3) The Committee on Post-Legislative Scrutiny is empowered to engage in researches, if necessary, with the assistance of the experts to ascertain the legislative reforms needed from time to time.

(4) The Committee on Post-Legislative Scrutiny shall in every six months (06) report to the Parliament of the duties and functions performed by it to achieve the said goal.

Hon. Piyankara Jayaratne,— Select Committee of Parliament to look into and to make suitable recommendations in relation to the issues which have arisen in respect of the game of cricket in Sri Lanka at present,—Whereas the multitude of issues that have arisen in respect of the game of cricket in Sri Lanka at present has triggered widespread concern among passionate cricket enthusiasts;

That this Parliament resolves that a Select Committee of Parliament be appointed to look into the reasons for the defeats that Sri Lanka Cricket Team experienced during Cricket World Cup 2023 after winning all the matches during the tournament conducted for qualifying for the Cricket World Cup; to look into allegations levelled against Sri Lanka Cricket by Members of Parliament including the Minister in-charge of the subject of sports and the Leader of the Opposition; to look into the ban on Sri Lanka's cricket which was imposed by the International Cricket Council grounding on the clash between the Minister in-charge of sports and Sri Lanka Cricket and to explore remedial action that can be adopted by Parliament in this regard; and to recommend measures aimed at uplifting cricket and school cricket in Sri Lanka.

2. (a) that the Chair and Members of the Committee shall be appointed by the Speaker; and
(b) that in terms of the provisions of Standing Order 101 of Parliament, the Committee shall consist of Ten (10) Members.
3. That the Committee shall have the power to—
 - (a) fix its quorum;

(4)

- (b) summon any person to appear before it, to require any person to procure any document or record, to procure and receive all such evidence, written or oral, as the Committee may think it necessary for the fullest consideration of the matters referred to above;
 - (c) obtain the services of specialists and experts in the relevant fields to assist the Committee; and
 - (d) make interim reports from time to time and to sit notwithstanding any adjournment or prorogation of Parliament.
4. The Committee shall present its report to Parliament within a period of two months (02) from the first meeting of the Committee or within such further period as Parliament may grant.
