Parliament met pursuant to adjournment. The Speaker took the Chair.

1. Announcements by the Speaker : The Speaker made the following announcement:—

“I wish to make a ruling on the amendment to the No Confidence Motion which was handed over to the Secretary General of Parliament by Hon. Ranil Wickremasinghe, MP yesterday.

The No Confidence Motion which was given notice of by forty three Members of the Opposition is in respect of the Hon. Udaya Gammanpila, Minister of Energy and the notice relating to the motion was handed over to the Parliament Secretariat on the 22nd of June, 2021 and was included in the Order Book of Parliament on the 23rd of June, 2021. The Committee on Parliamentary Business on the 5th of July, 2021 decided to take up the Motion for debate on two consecutive days including a special sitting day on the 19th of July 2021 and the 20th of July, 2021. The notice of the substantive motion of no confidence had no indication that it could finally be converted as a no confidence motion on the Cabinet of Ministers which is the Government. The Committee on the Parliamentary Business was also not informed that an amendment would be moved to convert the No Confidence Motion against the Minister of Energy to be a No Confidence Motion against the Government. Furthermore the debate that took place yesterday in the House was very much focused on the No Confidence Motion against a single Minister namely, the Hon. Udaya Gammanpila.

The legal effect of the amendment handed over to the Secretary General of Parliament by Hon. Ranil Wickremasinghe is to convert the No Confidence Motion moved against the Hon. Udaya Gammanpila to assume a new status as a No confidence Motion against the Cabinet of Ministers which is the Government. This was not intended at any stage since notice was given on the Motion.

Standing Order 43 (4) states as follows; ‘An amendment to a question shall be relevant to the question to which such amendment is proposed’.

According to this principle, the proposed amendment must be relevant to the Motion and fall within the scope of the original motion moved in the House. According to the Indian authority 'Practice and Procedure of Parliament' by Kaul and Shakhder sixth edition page 705 'In order that an amendment to a motion may be admissible, it must satisfy the following conditions; An amendment should be relevant to, and within the scope of the motion to which it is proposed. It should not introduce new or foreign matter or widen the scope of the motion'. Accordingly, an amendment which seeks to convert a No Confidence Motion against a Minister to that of a No Confidence Motion against the Cabinet of Ministers is certainly not within the scope of the original motion and nor it is relevant to the original motion either.

The Standing Order 43 (5) states as follows; 'An amendment shall not raise any question which, by the rules of Parliament can only be raised by a substantive motion after notice'.

We are well aware that a No Confidence Motion against the Cabinet of Ministers could only be brought forward by a substantive motion after due notice is given. Any attempt to subvert this process by bringing an amendment to that effect to an existing No Confidence Motion against a Minister is out of order and contravenes the Standing Orders.

In the above circumstances, I rule that the proposed amendment to the No Confidence Motion against the Hon. Udaya Gammanpila, Minister of Energy handed over to the Secretary General of Parliament by Hon. Ranil Wickremasinghe, MP is out of order, and cannot be accepted."

2. Presentation of Papers : (1) The Minister of Highways presented the—

- (i) Annual Performance Report of the Department of Buildings for the year 2019;

- (iii) Performance Report of the Ministry of Defence for the year 2020.

Ordered that the said Reports do lie upon the **Table**.

(2) The Minister of Highways presented the Annual Performance Report of the Ministry of Irrigation for the year 2020.

Ordered that the said Report do lie upon the **Table**.

(3) The Minister of Highways presented present the Annual Performance Report of the Office of the Chief Government Whip of Parliament for the year 2020.

Ordered that the said Report do lie upon the **Table**.

(4) The Minister of Highways presented the Performance Report of the Department of Social Services for the year 2020.

Ordered that the said Report do lie upon the **Table**.

(5) The Minister of Trade presented the Annual Report of the National Institute of Co-operative Development—Polgolla for the year 2018 and moved that the Report be referred to the Ministerial Consultative Committee on Trade.

Question put, and agreed to.

(6) The Minister of Power presented the Annual Reports of the Sri Lanka Sustainable Energy Authority for the years 2017 & 2018 and moved that those Reports be referred to the Ministerial Consultative Committee on Power.

Question put, and agreed to.

(7) The Minister of Power presented the Report on the Submission of observations and steps taken in terms of the Standing Order 120(4) of the Parliament with regard to the matters mentioned on Lanka Coal Company (pvt) Ltd of the Ministry of Power in the report of the Committee on Public Enterprises which was presented to Parliament and moved that Report be referred to the Committee on Public Enterprises.

Question put, and agreed to.

(8) The Minister of Highways presented the Annual Report and Accounts of the Sri Lanka Social Security Board for the year 2019 and moved that the Report be referred to the Ministerial Consultative Committee on Finance.

Question put, and agreed to.

(9) The Minister of Highways presented the Regulations made by the Minister of Finance under Section 75 of the Value Added Tax Act, No. 14 of 2002 regarding Value Added Tax and published in the Gazette Extraordinary No. 2228/33 of 20th May 2021 and moved that those Regulations be referred to the Committee on Public Finance.

Question put, and agreed to.

(10) The Minister of Highways presented the Annual Report of the Central Environmental Authority for the year 2018 and moved that the Report be referred to the Ministerial Consultative Committee on Environment.

Question put, and agreed to.

(11) The Minister of Water Supply presented the Annual Performance Report of the State Ministry of Rural and Divisional Drinking Water Supply Projects Development for the year 2020.

Ordered that the said Report do lie upon the **Table**.

(12) The Minister of Highways presented the Annual Report of the Tea Small Holdings Development Authority for the year 2018 and moved that the Report be referred to the Ministerial Consultative Committee on Plantation.

Question put, and agreed to.

(13) The Minister of Highways presented the Performance Report of the Legal Draftsman's Department for the year 2020.

Ordered that the said Report do lie upon the **Table**.

3. Presentation of Reports from Committees : Hon. (Prof.) Tissa Vitarana, Chair of the Committee on Public Accounts presented the First Report of the Committee on Public Accounts for the First Session of the Ninth Parliament.

Ordered that the said Report do lie upon the **Table** and to be printed.

4. Presentation of Public Petitions :

Hon. Duminda Dissanayake presented a petition dated 15.09.2020 from Mr. S. Bandula Senarathna of Angunochchiya, Medawachchiya.

The Petition stood referred under Standing Order 30(10) of the Parliament, to the Committee on Public Petitions.

5. Finance : The Minister of Foreign on behalf of the Minister of Finance presented,—“Bill to enable persons to voluntarily disclose undisclosed taxable supplies, income and assets required to be disclosed under certain laws; to provide for the imposition of a tax on the taxable supplies, income and assets so disclosed; to indemnify the persons who voluntarily disclose any such taxable supply, income or asset against liability from investigation, prosecution and penalties under specified laws; to grant certain concessions to persons who had already disclosed taxable supplies, income and assets under specified laws; and for matters connected therewith and incidental thereto.”

The Bill was ordered to be read a second time on Tuesday, August 03, 2021, be printed and be referred to the Committee on Public Finance.

6. Business of the Parliament : The Leader of the House of Parliament moved,— That the proceedings on Item No. 1 of Public Business appearing on the Order Paper be exempted at this day's sittings from the provisions of Standing Order 8 of the Parliament and the motion agreed to by Parliament on 06th October 2020.

Question put, and agreed to.

7. Sittings of the Parliament : The Leader of the House of Parliament moved,— That this Parliament at its rising this day do adjourn until 10.00 a.m. on Tuesday, August 03rd, 2021.

Question put, and agreed to.

8. Leave to introduce Bill : Hon. Patali Champika Ranawaka seconded by Hon. J. C. Alawathuwala moved,— That leave be granted to introduce the following Bill:—

“Bill to define and limit the powers of certain courts in punishing contempt of courts and to regulate their procedure in relation thereto.”

Question put, and agreed to.

Bill accordingly read the first time and ordered to be printed.

The Bill stood referred under Standing Order 52(6) of the Parliament to the Minister of Justice for report.

9. Vote of No Confidence in the Hon. Udaya Gammanpila, Minister of Energy : Order read for resuming. Adjourned debate on question (19th July, 2021),— Motion made and question proposed [P. 90/2021] that “Whereas the Hon. Udaya Gammanpila, Minister of Energy, has taken action to raise fuel prices without the approval of the Cabinet of Ministers as stated in writing by the General Secretary of the Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna, which is the main party representing the Government, although the Cabinet of Ministers is collectively responsible and answerable to Parliament in terms of Article 43 (1) of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka;

And whereas has derogated from the principles guiding the state policy in contravention of Article 27 (1) of the Constitution and shirked the fundamental duties in contravention of Article 28 of the Constitution, thereby breaking the oath taken in terms of Article 53 of the Constitution;

And whereas has not informed Parliament and people of this country of the profit which the Ceylon Petroleum Corporation and the Government earned by not reducing prices of petroleum fuels but keeping the prices at a high level since January 2020, when petroleum prices fell excessively in the world market, up until now;

And whereas has not fulfilled the pledge given to people that the advantage of the falling prices of petroleum fuels in the world market will be given to people by reducing the prices of essential goods;

And whereas has not kept to the pledge given not to raise fuel prices within two years based on such price advantage;

And whereas has failed to inform this Parliament and people what happened to the Fuel Price Stabilization Fund, claimed to have been established by the Government to use the advantage of falling prices when oil prices rise;

And whereas has not fulfilled the pledge given to use the profit earned by the Government when prices were falling to rescue the Ceylon Petroleum Corporation from its indebtedness to state banks;

And whereas has through the raising of fuel prices, led to the rise of production cost in all consumer goods parallel to it and the accompanying escalation of inflation, thereby placing people affected by the COVID-19 Pandemic in further suffering economically;

And whereas has led to the possible adverse effects on exports and the overall economy due to the escalation of production cost;

And whereas has failed to fulfill promises given from time to time by directly and indirectly contravening the people's agenda given in being elected to the Government, the policies of the Government and the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka;

That this Parliament resolves that it has no confidence in the competence of Hon. Udaya Gammanpila, Minister of Energy to function as a Cabinet Minister any longer."

(At 1.48 p.m. the Deputy Chairperson of Committees took the Chair.)

The Minister of Plantation moved,— That Hon. Weerasumana Weerasinghe do take the Chair.

Question put, and agreed to.

(At 3.05 p.m. Hon. Weerasumana Weerasinghe took the Chair.)

The Minister of Education moved,—That Hon. Ajith Rajapaksa do take the Chair.

Question put, and agreed to.

(At 3.43 p.m. Hon. Ajith Rajapaksa took the Chair.)

(At 5.05 p.m. the Speaker took the Chair.)
