Vice-Chancellor's Review



Brief Introduction

The Year 2021 was marked as a significant year for the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka since all developments were done even with the COVID 19 pandemic.

Most of the vacancies of academic and a few vacancies of non-academic staff have been filled and requests have been made to the Treasury for next year man power requirements. Most of the academic programmes were concluded on online basis.

Achievements

1. Amidst Covid 19 waves of infection epidemics, online and in-person academic activities continued with minimum delays in academic calendars.
2. The two new Faculties, Medicine and Technology got established well.
3. Faculty of Medicine could increase student intake from 75 to 135 (80% increment) going by H.E. the President's pledge.
4. Hospital based training of Medical Students commenced for the first time in Teaching Hospital, Kuliypitiya.
5. AHEAD funded lecture halls were ceremonially commissioned by the Chairman and Vice-Chairperson - University Grants Commission in January, 2021.





6. AHEAD funded University Business Linkage - Technology Transfer Office was ceremonially commissioned by the Vice-Chairperson - University Grants Commission in January, 2021.

7. Foundation Stones were laid and constructions commenced for Stage II of Faculty of Technology

8. Wayamba University Township Development Project activities were expedited and foundation stones laid by His Excellency Mr. Sultan Al-Marshad, CEO, Saudi Fund for Development, in December 2021.



9. Wayamba University Township Development Project funded equipment and furniture procurement started to see the supplies arriving at the University

10. The following annual events were successfully conducted amidst pandemic interruptions:

- The 19th Agricultural Research Symposium (AGRES) was held on 07th June 2020 of the Faculty of Agriculture & Plantation Management.
- The 5th Wayamba University Research Congress (WURC) was held on 12th February 2021.
- Faculty Awards Ceremony of the Faculty of Applied Sciences was held on 20th February 2020.

- 7th Undergraduate Research Symposium (UReS) of the Faculty of Livestock, Fisheries & Nutrition was held on 3rd February 2021.

1. Introduction – Wayamba University of Sri Lanka



The Wayamba University of Sri Lanka was birthed as the Affiliated University College of the North Western Province in 1991 with two academic areas, namely, Home Science & Nutrition and Agricultural Sciences. These sections were affiliated to the University of Kelaniya and University of Peradeniya respectively. Subsequently, it became the Wayamba Campus of the Rajarata University of Sri Lanka in 1996 with two Faculties - Faculty of Agricultural Sciences

and Faculty of Applied Sciences.

After that the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka was established with effect from 01st of October, 1999 for the purpose of providing, promoting and developing higher education in the branches of learning of Applied Sciences, Business Studies & Finance, Agriculture & Plantation Management and Livestock, Fisheries & Nutrition. Accordingly, four Faculties and 16 Departments of Study were assigned to the Wayamba University by the Government Notification in the Extraordinary Gazette No. 1093/8 issued on Tuesday, 17th of August, 1999.

A new department has been established in the year 2016 in the Faculty of Agriculture & Plantation Management under the name of Biosystems Engineering to offer a new degree programme in Bachelor of Bio Systems Technology (BBST) and two new departments have been established in the year 2016 in the Faculty of Applied Sciences under the names of Engineering Technology and Nano Science Technology.

After that by two Extraordinary Gazettes of the Government No.1954/43 issued on 19th February 2016 and No. 2037/17 issued on 21st September 2017, the Faculty of Medicine with 15 departments and Faculty of Technology with 04 departments have been added to the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka respectively. Now there are 06 faculties and 37 departments in the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka.







19.1.1 Background Information

The Library of the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka consists of three Libraries. One is serving for Faculties of Applied Sciences, Business Studies & Finance, Technology at Kuliypitiya premises and other two are serving for Faculty of Medicine at Labuyaya premises and for Faculties of Agriculture and Plantation Management and Livestock, Fisheries & Nutrition at Makandura Premises in sequence.

The Library at Kuliypitiya

The Library at Kuliypitiya was established in left side of the first floor of old administrative building. After shifting the administrative office of the University at the end of year 2008, the Library received other part of the building which expanded to the present Library. Now entire floor area of the Library building has 7326 square feet approximately and capacity of seating is 70 seats.

The Library at Makandura is situated in the middle of two Faculties and closer to the main road of the premises. The Library has a new separate two story building, the floor area of 7200 square feet approximately and capacity of seating is 70 seats. The building was opened on 27th July 2006.

The Library at Labuyaya is situated between the Administration Building and Computer Lab. The Library has a new separate two story building, the floor area of 5,000,000 square feet approximately and capacity of seating is 134 seats. The building was opened on 07th April 2021.


19.2.2 Vision

19.3.4 Objectives


The CGU has set wide spectrum of objectives;

19.4 Information Communication Technology Center – Kuliypitiya Premises

19.4.1 Introduction

Information Communication Technology (ICT) Center is the primary provider of computing and information technology and multimedia, video and photography resources, services, and support to Kuliypitiya Premises of Wayamba University of Sri Lanka. It provides IT training programs for students, staff, and external professionals and students to improve on the demanding IT skills. It is committed to the support of academic activities by promoting on-campus information literacy, and by providing a suitable information technology environment. To ensure the smooth proceeding of educational and research activities, the center also offers comprehensive services using the latest advances in information technology. These services include running servers (web, Intercom and LMS), maintaining the networks that form the university's IT infrastructure, promoting e-learning initiatives such as computerization of teaching materials and the use of learning management systems, and providing support to departments and units in order make their information and data available online.

19.4.2 Training /Awareness Programmes

19.4.5 Progress during the year

- Update and maintain the University website.

19.4.6 Constrains if any

- Lack of capital allocation for providing infrastructure facilities for the staff members.
- Insufficient space to expand the Laboratory space in par with increase in both internal students due to establishment of new faculties and external student members.
- The center is located in an extremely old building that is not suitable for the IT center and the vital and expensive equipment it contains.
- Since the building is beyond the point of repairing, it largely prevents the expansion of proper service provisions and hinders the services provided by the staff members and their safety and wellbeing.

19.4.7 Suggestions for further development

- Since the current building is very old and not suitable for the purpose, a new building is required for the ICT Center, Kuliyaipitiya.
- Increase the number of academic staff with the increase in student demand due to establishment of new faculties.
- As the ICT infrastructure is expanded in the Kuliyaipitiya premises from only two faculties to four, the on-time maintenance and services requires additional office staff such as Technical Officers, System Developers, and Web Developers.
- Workshops for outsiders.
- Expand the laboratory area to compensate the increase in the internal and external student intake.
- Expand the wireless network.
- Staff Training.
- Training students for General ICT Certification Test.
- Setting up a Student-Based company which undertakes external projects in software development / computer networking and information systems development.
- Increase the services and knowledge areas offered to the internal as well as the external students in keeping up with the demand.

19.4.8 Any other relevant information

As there are vast number of opportunities and demand for ICT knowledge and services, work towards transforming the ICT center as an ICT Knowledge and Services Center for Wayamba University of Sri Lanka as well as for the general public. The ICT center is one of the key points for public engagement as well as providing an educational interface to the public. To enhance these interfacing activities, it is highly recommended to reallocate the ICT center to a new building facility to expand its services, community engagement as well as to protect its equipment.

19.5 Information Communication Technology Center – Makandura Premises

19.5.1 Introduction

The ICT Centre of Wayamba University of Sri Lanka, Makandura premises was established to cater the knowledge on Information Technology for students to meet the challenges in rapidly developing communication system in their relevant field. It will facilitate to acquire computer literacy and to perform their career hereafter.

The ICT Centre is continued to offer courses on Information Technology and Advanced Computer Applications to the Faculty of Agriculture and Plantation Management and course on Information Technology to the Faculty of Livestock Fisheries and Nutrition. For statistics related courses conducted by the Departments are supported by the ICT Centre especially for practical. Further, two courses, Information Technology and e-Commerce and Management Information Systems are conducted to the students of External Degree of Plantation Management. The Centre now expands its services by offering several IT related course for the benefits of the people in North-Western Province.

The ICT Centre is opened from 8.00 am to 8.00 pm in week days, 8.00 am to 5.00 pm on weekends. In examination period, opening duration is 8.00 am to 10.00 pm on week days.

19.5.2 Training /Awareness Programmes

Training sessions on Moodle for Faculty of Agriculture and Plantation Management and Faculty of Livestock Fisheries and Nutrition were conducted by the ICT center.

- Zoom facility was implemented in the Makandura premises.
- OFFICE365 was offered for staff and students of the premises.
- Network phase III of the Faculty of Livestock Fisheries and Nutrition (FLFN) was completed.
- Wi-Fi facility was provided to new dean's room of Faculty of Agriculture and Plantation Management (FAPM).
- Main entrance security office was networked and it was connected to the campus Local Area Network.
- Hosting facilities were provided for faculty web (FLFN and FAPM), <https://aeb.wyb.ac.lk/> and <http://sdc.wyb.ac.lk>.

19.6 Medical Center



There are two functioning medical centers in Wayamba University of Sri Lanka. One Medical Center is situated in Kuliypitiya and the other Medical Center is in Makandura. Both Medical Centers have played a key role in providing healthcare facilities to students and other staff members of the University throughout the year 2021.

While the Medical Center in Kuliypitiya had all the basic facilities required for treating the students and the other staff members, Medical Center in Makandura was still under construction during the year 2021.

The staff of the Kuliypitiya medical center in 2021 comprised of a nursing officer, a public health inspector, one pharmacist, a stenographer; an attendant and works aid. The staff of Makandura Medical center in 2021 comprised of a nursing officer, one Pharmacist, Public Health Inspector and an attendant. Two Medical Officers covered up the duties in both Medical Centers in 2021.

The medical certificates of newly appointed University staff and newly entered students for the year 2020/2021 were certified by the Medical Officer. Medical Examinations were done for the students who were selected for sports events and for Canteen workers.

Other than treating minor ailments of students and staff medical center played a major role in prevention of diseases and enhancing health education among University students. There were many health promotion programmes done in year 2021.

3. Sterilization Programme for Stray Dogs and Cats
4. Anti-Rabies Vaccinations Programme

8. Fogging programme as a Mosquito control measures.
9. Health Education Programmes related to, Covid 19 disease prevention.
10. Providing Sanitary facilities required for prevention of Covid 19.

In addition to above all the health related activities of Covid 19 positive University students and staff members and the close contacts of them were guided by the University Medical Center including providing prehospital treatment, arranging hospital care, activities related to quarantine process and documentation, providing health statistics and monitoring their clinical outcome. With great effort, our unit was able to prevent spread of Covid 19 among the University students and other staff, facilitating the smooth functioning of the academic activities of the University during the year 2021.

In general, the medical staff as a team was able to help the entire University within their limits during the year 2021.



a. Closing balances of the Bank Accounts maintained by the University as shown in the Statement of Financial Position have been reconciled with the relevant cash books. The respective Banks were requested to send their confirmation of balances direct to the Auditor General. This amount is equal to the short term commitments.

b. The stock value shown in the Statement of Financial Position amounting to Rs.29,039,018 was arrived on physical verification of stores. This verification was done in order to establish the ownership, existence and the value of the items including the manner in which the accounting records are maintained for stock items. Verified balances of Stocks have taken into Books of Accounts

c. The value of capital work in progress as shown in the Statement of Financial Position was Rs. 699,107,954. Valuation of capital work in progress was also carried out in keeping with the Sri Lanka Accounting Standards.

d. The balance shown in the Accumulated fund for the year 2021 is Rs. (275,959,365) when compared to Rs. (277,131,706) for the year 2020 and it is necessary to note the following information in respect of the depreciation for the year 2021.

Application of the concept of depreciation in Annual Accounts, as given in the UGC Circular No.649 of 5th October, 1995 is followed in the year under review. The total Depreciation value for the year 2021 is Rs.686,222,367.

e. The provision of Rs.365,150,597 is made for retirement gratuity as at 31st December 2021. The provisions are made according to the gratuity act and the



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SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Reporting Entity

Wayamba University of Sri Lanka has been incorporated under the Universities Act No.16 of 1978, and located at the Kanadulla, Kuliypitiya, Sri Lanka.

1.1. Date of Authorization for Issue

The Financial Statements of the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka were authorized for issue by the Council dated on 24th February 2022.

1.2. Reporting Period

The financial period of the University represent from 01st January 2021 to 31st December 2021.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

2.1 Statement of Compliance

The Financial Statements of the University have been prepared and presented in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards (SLPSAS's). However Sri Lanka Accounting Standards also have been used in the areas where no Public Sector Accounting Standards are available. These Financial Statements comprise the statement of Financial Position, Statement of Financial Performance, Statement of Cash flows, Changes in equity and Notes to the Financial Statements.

2.2 Basis of measurement

The Financial Statements of the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka have been prepared on the historical cost basis and apply consistently. When there are material deviations of the cost from the fair value, fair value has been used as measurement basis.

2.3 Materiality and Aggregation

Each material class of similar items have been presented separately in the financial statements. Items of dissimilar nature or function have been presented separately unless they are immaterial.

2.4 Offsetting

Assets and liabilities, revenue and expenses have not been offset unless required or permitted by SLPSAS and Sri Lanka Accounting Standards.

2.5 Comparative Figures

Comparative figures have been adjusted to confirm to changes in presentations in these financial statements where required according to the Sri Lanka public sector accounting standards.

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- 2.6 **Functional and Presentation Currency**
The financial statements are presented in Sri Lanka Rupees, which is the University's functional and presentation currency.
- 2.7 **Going Concern**
The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis.
- 2.8 **Events after the Reporting Period**
All material events after the reporting date has been considered and where appropriate adjustments or disclosures wherever necessary have been made in the Financial Statements.
- 2.9 **Transaction of Foreign Currencies and Balances**
Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the exchange rates prevailing at the dates of the transactions. Foreign exchange gains and losses resulting from the settlement of such transactions and from the translation at year end exchange rates of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are recognized in the statement of financial performance.
- 2.10 **Rounding**
The amounts in financial statements have been rounded-off to the nearest rupee, except otherwise indicated as permitted by the Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards.
- 2.11 **Property, Plant & Equipment**
- (a). Recognition and Measurement**
Property, Plant & Equipment are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation.
- (b). Initial Cost**
The cost of Property, Plant & Equipment comprises its purchase or construction cost and any directly contributable cost of bringing the asset to working condition for its intended use.
- (c). Subsequent Cost**
Under the recognition principle of cost, the University does not recognize in the carrying amount of an item of property, plant and equipment the cost of the day-to-day servicing of the item.

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Rather these costs are recognized in surplus or deficit as incurred. Costs of day-to-day servicing are primarily the costs of labour and consumables, and may include the cost of small parts. The purpose of these expenditures is often described as for the “repairs and maintenance” of the item of property, plant and equipment.

(d). Depreciation

Depreciation is charged to the statement of financial performance on the straight line basis at the following rates per annum in order to write off the cost of such assets over their estimated useful lives.

Depreciation of an asset begins when it is available for use and ceases at the date that the asset is de-recognized or fully depreciated.

Depreciation is provided on pro rata basis on the assets purchased/ constructed/ disposed during the year.

(e). Measurement after recognition

(i) Revaluation model

After initial recognition all the property, Plant & Equipment except library books have been carried at revalued amount, being fair value at the date of revaluation less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and impairment loss.

Revaluation surplus may be transferred to the general reserve proportionately as the assets are used by the university. In such a case, the amount of the surplus transferred would be the difference between depreciation based on the revalued carrying amount of the assets and depreciation based on the assets original cost.

(ii) Cost model

Due to practical issues revaluation model cannot be used for library books, Therefore library books are shown at cost & written off on the straight line basis over period of five years.

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2.12 **Capital Work- in - Progress**

Capital expenses incurred which are not completed as at the reporting date are shown as Capital Work - in -Progress and Capital Work - in - progress would be transferred to Property, Plant and Equipment when it is available for use.

Even though some constructions were concluded during the year they were shown as work in progress as the total commitments were not settled and they were not taken over by the University.

2.13 **Investments**

Investments represent investment in fixed deposits and savings accounts. These investments have been accounted in compliance with SLFRS 09. The investment in fixed deposits and savings accounts have been classified as financial instrument measured at amortized cost as per SLFRS 09

They are initially measured at fair value and subsequently measured at amortized cost by using effective interest rate as required by SLFRS 09.

2.14 **Assets**

Assets are resources controlled by the University as a result of past events and from which future economic benefits or service potential are expected to flow to the University.

2.15 **Current Assets**

An asset shall be classified as current when it satisfies any of the following criteria:

- (a). It is expected to be realized in, or is held for sale or consumption in, the University's normal operating cycle;
- (b). It is held primarily for the purpose of being traded;
- (c). It is expected to be realized within twelve months after the reporting date; or
- (d). It is cash or a cash equivalent (as defined in SLPSAS 2) unless it is restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least twelve months after reporting date.

All other assets shall be classified as non-current assets.

2.16 **Inventories**

Inventories are stated at cost and determined on First in First out (FIFO) basis and the verified stock values were taken in to the statement of financial position. Physically verified stock schedules of all the stores are sent separately.

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- 2.17 **Trade & Other Receivables**
Receivables are stated at the amounts they are estimated to be realized.
- 2.18 **Advances to Staff**
Advances to staff comprise Festival advances, Salary advance and Special advances.
- 2.19 **Cash & Cash Equivalent**
Cash & cash equivalents comprise cash in hand, Cash at bank and investments in money market instruments..

2.20 **Accounting for Government Grants**

- 2.20.1 **Recurrent Grant**
Recurrent grants are recognized in the Statement of Financial Performance on cash basis. Cost of rehabilitation of PPE and capital grants for construction and new work are recognized either as work in progress or Capital Assets where necessary.

- 2.20.2 **Capital Grants**
Government Grants for the Capital expenditure has presented in the Financial Statements in accordance with the LKAS 20. According to the LKAS 20 Capital Grants have been recognized as deferred income in the statement of financial position and amortized over the useful life of the asset as follows.

Since the land has an unlimited useful life, it has not been considered for amortization.

- 2.21 **Liabilities & Provisions**
All known liabilities as at the reporting date are included in the Financial Statements. Further adequate provisions are made for situations and events when the university has present

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obligations as a result of post event, with probable outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of obligation.

Obligations payable on demand or within one year of the financial position date are treated as current liabilities in the statement of financial position. Liabilities payable after one year from the financial position date are treated as non-current liabilities in statement of financial position.

2.22 Endowment Fund

Endowments funds include restricted donations received by the University and investment returns generated from endowments fund are used in accordance with the various purpose established by the donors.

2.23 (a) Defined Contribution Plans

Employees of the University are entitled for Universities Provident Fund (UPF) and Employees Trust Fund (ETF) in line with respective statutes and regulations. The University contributes 7% and 3% on gross emoluments of the employees to the Universities Provident Fund and to the Employee's Trust Fund respectively. Further University contributes 8% on gross emoluments of the employees to the Universities Pension Fund as a retirement benefits. These are recognized as expense in the statement of financial performance as incurred.

(b) Defined Benefit Plans

A defined benefit plan is a post-employment benefit plan other than a defined contribution plan. The defined benefit is calculated by independent actuarial valuer using projected unit credit method as recommended by SLPSAS 19 "Employee benefits". The present value of the defined benefit obligation is determined by discounting the estimated future cash outflows using interest rates that are denominated in the currency in which the benefits will be paid and that have terms to maturity approximating to the terms of the related liability. The present value of the defined benefit obligations depends on a number of factors that are determined on an actuarial basis using number of assumptions about discount rate, future salary increments & mortality rates. The rates used in determining the defined retirement benefit obligations are given in Note 18. Any changes in these assumptions will impact the carrying amount of defined benefit obligations.

Provision has been made for retirement gratuities from the beginning of service for all employees, in conformity with

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SLPSAS 19 on employee benefits. Provision are made to all employees those who become eligible under the Gratuity Act No.12 of 1983, the liability to an employee arises only on

completion of 5 years of continued service. This provision is not fully externally funded. However an external fund of Rs.5Mn was established as per the UGC, Audit Committee decision. (Minutes of the 4th meeting of the Accounting Treatment Committee - Paragraph No.09)

2.24 Current Liabilities

Current Liabilities are those, which fall due for payment on demand or within one year from the financial position date. Non-Current Liabilities will fall due for payment one year or more after the financial position date.

The goods delivered and the payments made in 2022, in respect of purchase orders placed during the year 2021 were not considered as accrued expenses for 2020 as per Treasury Circular No.111.

2.25 Taxation

The University is exempt from Income Tax under the Inland Revenue Act No.24 of 2017.

2.26 Contingent Liabilities and Contingent assets

A contingent liability is a possible obligation that arises from past events whose existence will be continued by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events beyond the control of the programme or a present obligation that is not recognized because it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation.

A contingent liability also arises in extremely rare cases where there is a liability that cannot be measured reliably. The uncertainty does not recognize a contingent liability but disclose its existence in the financial statement.

A contingent asset is a possible asset that arises from past events whose existence will be confirmed by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events beyond the control of the university. The university does not recognize contingent asset but discloses its existence where inflow of economic benefits are probable but not virtually certain.

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2.27 Income & Expenditure Recognition.

2.27.1 Revenue

(a) Government Grant for Recurrent Expenditure, Student Bursaries and Mahapola, etc. are recognized in the Statement of Financial Performance on Cash basis.

(b) Interest Income from outside investments is recognized based on the effective rate of interest.

(c) Interest Income from Staff Loans is accounted based on the effective rate of interest.

(d) Revenue Generated from internal sources such as Income from Student Registration, Examination, Tuition & Library fees, Fee levying income, Medical fees. etc. are accounted on cash basis.

(e) Rent from properties; staff quarters, home rent, electricity & water charges are accounted on accrual basis.

(f) Hostel fees are accounted on accrual basis.

2.27.2 Expenditure

a. All Expenditure incurred in the running of the University and in maintaining the Capital Assets in a state of efficiency has been charged to the revenue in arriving at surplus/ deficit for the year.

b. All expenditure incurred in the acquisition, extension or improvement of assets of a permanent nature in order to carry on or increase the serving capacity of the University has been treated as Capital Expenditure.

2.28 Cash Flow Statement

The Cash Flow Statement has been prepared using the indirect method.

**2.29.1 Present status of sub-projects won by Wayamba University of Sri Lanka
Accelerating Higher Education Expansion and Development Operation
(AHEAD)**

The development of the higher education sector is of central importance to enable Sri Lanka to make the transition from a Lower-Middle Income Country (LMIC) to an Upper Middle-Income Country (UMIC). Recognizing this, the Government of Sri Lanka (GoSL) and the World Bank have agreed to support the higher education sector through a World Bank funded project titled “Accelerating Higher Education Expansion and Development (AHEAD) operation.” The AHEAD operation is organized in two components. The first is a Program Component that supports the national Higher Education Development Program. The second is a systems strengthening, capacity building and technical assistance component that will assist GoSL to strengthen the higher education sector and achieve the objectives of the AHEAD program by monitoring and evaluation, policy analysis, program coordination and communication. The implementing agency of the project is the Ministry of Education. (ME) There is an “Operations Monitoring and Support Team” (OMST) which coordinate and support all AHEAD activities among the ME, UGC, and the universities.

The AHEAD has three Results Areas (RA):

Results Area 1: Increasing Enrolment in Priority Disciplines for Economic Development

Results Area 2: Improving the Quality of Higher Education

Results Area 3: Promoting Research, Development and Innovation.

Grants under RA2 and RA3 are awarded under competitive basis. The units of the universities (faculties and departments, and research teams) got opportunity to submit proposals. During the last couple of years, the OMST called proposals for such awards and the updated list of awards received to WUSL is given in the table.

The Operations Technical Secretariat (OTS) established by the university to assists the faculties, departments and other units in implementation of their subprojects, particularly in handling financial and procurement activities and advising them in timely implementation of their projects. The OTS is operated by a staff comprising both fulltime staff and part time staff.

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2.29.2 Wayamba University Township Development Project

The project is designed to develop academic facilities and infrastructure of the university as well as re enforce the livelihood of the people who live in immediate surrounding area of the university. The major objective of the above project is to establish a knowledge based self-reliant and sustainable community interactive system for the Wayamba University, Sri Lanka and covers Kuliypitiya premises and Makandura premises The project is implemented by the Ministry of Education.

The Saudi Fund for Development (SFD) has agreed to provide a concessional loan of SAR 105 Million (USD 28 Million) for the above project, as the loan charge 2% per annum and includes term of loan of 25 years including 5 year grace period.

The project started on 24th October 2017 as the agreement signed with Saudi Fund For Development & Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka. Initial project period is 3 years to implement the project. Period of project extended up to 31.12.2022 and 2nd extension up to 31.05.2023 has been requested from SFD.

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2.29.3 Revaluation of Property, Plant & Equipment

- (a). Land have been revalued by valuation department as at 31/12/2013 and revalued value of Kuliypitiya Premises is Rs: 285,750,000/- & Makandura Premises Rs: is Rs: 40,000,000/-.
- (b). Buildings, Electricity Supply and Water supply System revalued as at 31.12.2016, Other Fixed Asset categories except Library Books & Periodicals purchased up to 31.12.2013 revalued to the date of 31.12.2013 and Revaluation surplus has been transferred to revaluation reserve. If there is revaluation loss, it may be transferred to statement of financial performance. Motor Vehicles have been revalued by Automobile Association of Ceylon. The rest of the items have been revalued by internally appointed committees.
- (c). List of Property, Plant & Equipment as at 31/12/2019 has been given to the Valuation Department for revalue Property, Plant & Equipment. No adjustments made to the Financial Statements in year 2021 as the finalized valuation report has not yet been sent to the University by the Valuation Department.

2.29.4 Land for Faculty of Medicine

Action are being proceeded to acquire a land of 28 acres and 12.84 perches of land called “Mahanugalanda Watta” for the Faculty of Medicine.

The said land had been valued for Rs: 77,872,750.00 by the Department of Valuations. Administrative charges for the acquisition was Rs: 467,762.51 and a deposit of Rs: 16,500,000.00 has been made earlier by the University. Accordingly a sum of Rs: 61,840,512.21 has to be paid to the Divisional Secretary (Kuliypitiya- West) to proceed the acquisition. The Chairman of UGC was requested through secretary, Ministry of Higher Education by the Vice-Chancellor of the University to allocate above funds and revise the original allocation of Rs. 70 Mn to 91 Mn for the acquisition process.

The amount to be paid to the “Mahanugalanda Watta” Land can not be calculated exactly, because the land should be valued by the Valuation Department and according to section 38/38(a) of Land Acquisition Act, 7% annual interest (from 23.03.2016 to 31.12.2021 amounting to Rs: 29,981,008.75) is payable at the settlement of purchase consideration.

As informed by the Divisional Secretariat – Kuliypitiya (western) there is a court case at District Court – Kuliypitiya to seek the ownership of “Mahanugalanda Watta” Land. Until the decision of the District Court – Kuliypitiya is given, the payment can not be done by the University.

Proposal for Sustainable Development

Wayamba University of Sri Lanka

1. The Wayamba University of Sri Lanka admits approximately 1500 students annually under its six Faculties. Further, each year around 900 graduands are produced by these Faculties, providing the human resources required for the economic development of the country. Through this process, the University has the ability to produce the human resources necessary for the eradication of poverty in Sri Lanka.
2. The Faculties of Agriculture & Plantation Management and Livestock, Fisheries & Nutrition located at Makandura Premises of the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka, continuously engage in research to introduce diverse species of crops and various types of food which supports the poverty alleviation efforts of the country.
3. The Faculty of Medicine at Wayamba University of Sri Lanka was established as the 10th Faculty of Medicine in Sri Lanka. The Faculty of Medicine consists of fifteen Departments and the objective of the University is to provide the facilities to produce physicians required to improve the health conditions the country.
4. The University is making every effort to offer an education of the highest quality to the students through quality assurance programmes, so that the education of Sri Lanka, a developing country, can be enhanced. A Quality Assurance Unit has also been established in the University. In addition, the University also provides technical and industrial training to improve the quality of education.
5. In all events organized by the University gender equity and equality is maintained.
6. With regard to sanitation and water, the total water consumption requirement of the University is provided by tube wells and the water is filtered for the use of the students and staff. The quality of the water is checked regularly. In collaboration with the University Medical Centre, Public Health Inspectors, Cleaning Service and the Landscape Division, action is being taken to offer better sanitation for the staff and the students.

7. For the conservation of power and energy, the following actions have been taken by the University :
 - Using only CFL Bulbs wherever lighting is required.
 - Proposals have been submitted for generating electricity through solar power
 - Buildings have been constructed with glass covers to allow sunlight into the building.

8. All courses offered by the University include an industrial training component and when new programmes are evolved and existing programmes are revised, the University aims to resolve the question of unemployment. Further, the University expects to establish a Faculty of Engineering, and through this Faculty it is hoped to provide the human resources required by the country in the field of engineering.

9. The Faculty of Technology is a newly established Faculty in the University and priority is given in this Faculty for innovations. The infrastructure requirement for this purpose is developed by the University.

10. The BREAD Centre and Business Incubation Centre of the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka, provides incentives for new inventions and also introduces the market for such new products.

Through the above, the technical and entrepreneurial knowledge requirements of the community too are provided.

11. Action is being taken for the maximum use of resources and the following are some of them :
 - Recycling of once used water at the Faculty of Medicine
 - Garbage is collected separately categorized into degradable material - glass, polythene/plastic and paper, and disposed appropriately

12. In all Premises of the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka green concept is maintained and the Landscape Division of the University takes care of tree planning, their security and maintenance.

13. The University consists of students and staff belonging to different nationalities and religions and in all activities University acts with a view to developing mutual conviviality. Conducting religious activities of all religions on the 1st of January, attending to decorations and activities of different religious festivals by all, etc. contributes to the mutual geniality.

14. The Wayamba University of Sri Lanka seeks to establish interactions with other educational and financial institutions within the country and in foreign countries through Memoranda of Understanding. This allows students and staff to develop national and international relations.

Report of the Auditor General on the Financial Statements of the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka for the year ended 31 December 2021 and Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements in terms of the Section12 of National Audit Act No.19 of 2018

1. Financial Statements

1.1 Opinion

The audit of financial statements of Wayamba University of Sri Lanka for the year ended 31 December 2021 comprising the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2021 and the statement of comprehensive financial performance, statement of equity changes and cash flow statement for the year then ended, and relevant notes to the financial statements, including the summary of significant accounting policies, was carried out under my direction in pursuance of Provisions Article 154 (1) of Constitution of Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka read in conjunction with provisions of the sub section 107 (5) of the University Act No 19 of 2018 and the National Audit Act , No 19 of 2018. My comments and observations which I consider should be reported to Parliament appear in this report. My report to Parliament in pursuance of provisions in Article 154(6) of the Constitution will be tabled in due course.

In my opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the Financial position of the Wayamba University of, Sri Lanka as at 31 December 2021 and of its Financial performance and its cash flow for the year ended in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards.

1.2 Basis for Opinion

I conducted my audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards (SLAuSs). My responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of my Report. I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion.

1.3 Other information included in the 2021 Annual Report of the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka

The other information comprises the information included in the University 2021 Annual Report but does not include the financial statements and my auditor's report thereon, which I have which is expected to be made available to me after the date of this auditor's report. Management is responsible for the other information.

My opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and I do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with my audit of the financial statements, my responsibility is to read the other information becomes available and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or my knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

When I read the University's 2021 Annual Report, if I conclude that there are material misstatements therein, I am required to communicate that matter to those charged with governance for correction. If further material uncorrected misstatements are existed those will be included in my report to Parliament in pursuance of provisions in Article 154 (6) of the Constitution that will be tabled in due course.

1.4 Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of Financial Statements that gives a true and fair view in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards, and for such internal control as the management determine is necessary to enable the preparation of Financial Statements that are free from material misstatements, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the University's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the University or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the University's financial reporting process.

As per Sub-section 16(1) of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018, the University is required to maintain proper books and records of all its income, expenditure, assets and liabilities, to enable annual and periodic financial statements to be prepared of the University.

1.5 Responsibility of Auditor on audit of Financial Statements

My objective is to provide a fair assurance on the financial statements that they are free from material misstatements whether due to fraud or error as a whole and to issue the Auditor's Report comprising my opinion. Although fair assurance is a high quality assurance, it does not confirm that it would always expose quantitative misstatements when auditing is implemented in accordance with Sri Lanka Audit Standards. It is expected that individual or collective impact of fraud or error may result in material misstatements and it may have an effect on the decisions taken by the users based on these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards, I exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. I also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the University's internal control.

- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by the management.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of the management’s use of the going concern basis of accounting and based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the University’s ability to continue as a going concern. If I conclude that a material uncertainty exists, I am required to draw attention in my auditor’s report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify my opinion. However, future events or conditions may cause the University to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

I communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that I identify during my audit.

2. Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

- 2.1 National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018 includes specific provisions for following requirements.
 - 2.1.1 I have obtained all the information and explanation that required for the audit and as far as appears from my examination, proper accounting records have been kept by the University as per the requirement in section 12 (a) of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018.
 - 2.1.2 The University’s financial statements presented is consistent with the preceding year as per the requirement of section 6 (1) (d) (III) of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018.
 - 2.1.3 The financial statements presented includes all the recommendations made by me in the previous year as per the requirement of section 6 (1) (d) (IV) of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018.
- 2.2 Based on the procedures performed and evidence obtained were limited to matters that are material, nothing has come to my attention.

2.2.1 To state that any member of the governing body of the University has any direct or indirect interest in any contract entered into by the University which are out of the normal cause of business as per the requirement of section 12 (d) of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018.

2.2.2 To state that the University has not complied with any applicable written law, general and special directions issued by the governing body of the University as per the requirement of section 12 (f) of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018 except for;

2.3 Other Audit Observations

- (a) A sum of Rs. 206,847 had been spent for the publication of newspaper advertisements in Tri Languages for the extension of Department of Nanoscience Technology industry in the Kuliapitiya Campus of the University. However, after receiving the report of the Technical Evaluation Committee, the Head of the Department of Nanoscience and Technology decided that the industry was not necessary, so the expenditure on newspaper advertisement was an idle expenditure.
- (b) 15 construction industries with a contract value of Rs. 514,303,211 awarded during the period from 2013 to 2017 were not completed and handed over by the respective contractors within the stipulated time. But the university had not paid enough attention in this regard.
- (c) The building constructed under Phase III of the Faculty of Agriculture and Plantation Management with a contract value of Rs. 176,000,000 was handed over to the university on 01 March 2019, but the head of the faculty and the engineer of the university informed the contractor to correct the defects that were identified later on 02 December 2019. But, they had not been corrected even by the date of this report.
- (d) Although the number of students planned to be enrolled in the university for the academic year 2019/2020 was 1,880, the number of students enrolled was only 1,730. Accordingly, it was failed to enroll an equivalent number of 08 percent students.
- (e) The dropout percentage of the students enrolled for the academic years 2016/2017, 2017/2018 and 2018/2019 was 12.05, 05 and 3.59 percent respectively. This was due to the fact that the high dropout percentage of students who were enrolled for the Faculty of Applied Sciences and the Faculty of Livestock Fisheries and Nutrition.
- (f) A sum of Rs. 2,003,150 received from the World Bank for the Improving Relevant & Quality of Under Graduate Education project was not used and invested in a fixed deposit since 2014.
- (g) Only the plans of the academic departments were included in the action plan prepared by the university for the year under review, but the plans of the non-academic departments were not included. Furthermore, the budget allocation for each activity was not included, and 13 activities which were to be completed during the year under review were not started.

- (h) Action had not been taken to recover a sum of RS. 21,721,842 from the year 2008 due from 06 lecturers of the university for breaching their contractual obligations to go abroad for further education. Furthermore, Rs. 17,520,686 collected in the years 2020 and 2021 were kept in a current account without investing in fixed deposits.
- (i) Although all the assets belonging to each category should be revalued simultaneously in an asset revaluation, due to the fact that the University had not submitted information about correct asset categories and all fixed assets to the Valuation Department, the Valuation Department had not assessed the present values of the asset categories other than vehicles and laboratory equipment belonging to the University during the year under review. Also, vehicles and laboratory equipment were revalued for Rs. 59,797,000 and Rs. 250,679,200 respectively, but those revalued amounts were not accounted for.
- (j) The useful lifetime of non-current assets was not reviewed annually and Non-current assets costing of Rs. 778,570,309 were fully depreciated but continued to be used.

2. Report on other Legal and Regulatory requirements

2.2.2 Reference to the Laws, Rules, Regulations and Management Decisions

(a) (i) Paragraph 3.1 of the Chapter XXVI

Board of Survey reports as at 31.12.2021 have been submitted to the government audit on 28th September 2022.

(ii) Paragraph 3.1 and 3.2 of the Chapter XXVII

State Logo, Name and Address of the University have already been printed on all the vehicles attached to the university.

(b) Paragraph 2.2 of Chapter IX of the Establishment Code of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka

The suggestion made by the Assistant Internal Auditor to the Vice-Chancellor from the letter dated 23.08.2022, to make arrangements to charge 10% from the fee levying courses of the University and other allowances related in terms of the paragraph 2.2 of the Chapter IX of the Establishment Code, was submitted to the 33rd Strategic Planning and Management Committee which was held on 08.09.2022 and accordingly the committee decided to implement the aforesaid suggestion along with the related payments with effective from 09.09.2022. Actions will be taken accordingly.

(c) Financial Regulations of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka

(i) Financial Regulations 770

Non-issued Stocks

Supply Store

The value of the inquired list of non-issued and damaged stock is Rs. 731,308.30 and the items listed from serial No. 01 to 09 which is amounting to Rs. 74,907.76 belong to the supply store. The actions taken regarding such items are mentioned below.

1. Printed University Flag – The relevant item has been already issued from the store.
2. Printed District Flag - The relevant item has been already issued from the store.
3. Lantern - The relevant item has been already issued from the store.

4. Printer Toner 1300, 1313A – Further steps are being taken to dispose this toner which is in unusable condition
5. Calculator paper roll - Due to the shortage of printing papers in the country, it has been decided to keep them in the store to be used in future.
6. Cash receipt book small - The relevant item has been already issued from the store.
7. Belt - As per the Belt inventory book, the balance is 8 and out of that 3 items can be used. Though the 5 Belts which have been questioned are in usable condition, those can't be used due to the insufficient length. Therefore, these items will be auctioned in the future.
8. Vote Ledger Book - The relevant item has been already issued from the store.
9. Envelop 9" × 4" air mail- Due to the shortage of printing papers in the country, it has been decided to keep them in the stores to be used in future.

Maintenance Stores

Items worth of Rs. 656,400.54 in the inquired list of non-issued and damaged stocks are belong to the maintenance store and they are stored for immediate maintenance works of the University.

(ii) Financial Regulations 1646

Running charts are forwarded to the Auditor General once in 06 months.

(d) Paragraph 4 of Public Finance Circular No. PED/RED/01/04/2014/01 dated 17th February 2014

It is expected to prepare the action plan in complying with provisions of the Public Circular No. PED/RED/01/04/2014/01 from next year onward.

2.3 Other facts

- (a) The Department of Nano Science Technology had only 02 lecture halls by 2021 and this was not sufficient for the under graduate students and so the Faculty has used 03 lecture halls attached to the Faculty of Applied Science. There was an urgent need of few other lecture halls for the Faculty of Technology and with the recommendation of the Works Engineer of the University a temporary solution was taken by converting the roof top of the Department of Nano Science Technology into two lecture halls by fixing a roof to the roof top and building walls surrounding the area, as the construction works of the new Faculty complex had not been commenced so far.

Although the newspaper advertisement was initially published on 30.07.2021 for the tender, due to the suspension of office works as a result of Corona pandemic and the curfew imposed simultaneously, news advertisements had to be published twice in order to extend the dates for calling tenders. But, the TEC had rejected the received tender which was the only tender, as the TEC had observed that quoted prices of the Tender were high, by 69% compared to the Engineer Estimate.

These construction works had not been completed even by month of May 2022 and the Faculty of Technology building complex was also under construction. Under the AHEAD project, the construction of 04 lecture halls, an auditorium and four storied building with 05 laboratories belongs to the Faculty of Technology have been substantially completed by now. Hence it was decided that it was not necessary to call the tenders at high prices as the construction works of the proposed Faculty building complex will be completed and as the limited number of students are being called to the University physically.

The progress report of this project was submitted to the University Procurement Committee and it was decided that this contract was no more required.

- (b) The approval was granted to the extension, subsequent to the recommendation given by the Engineer on the reasons for the delay of the project which are beyond the control of the contractor.

The arrangements will be made to grant extensions for the reasons beyond the control of the contractor upon the agreement of the procurement entity in the future.

- (c) The defects of this construction are being corrected by the relevant contractor and the supervision is done by the Acting Works Engineer of the University.
- (d) When enrolling the new students for a new academic year of the University, the Faculties take every steps to enrol all the students as informed by the University Grant Commission for the Faculty.

We have made a request to the University Grants Commission to make necessary arrangements to nominate another group of students until the number of students expected to enroll is met with.

- (e) **Faculty of Applied Science**
Faculty of livestock, Fisheries and Nutrition

It has been found that while the majority of the students who enter the Faculty of Applied Sciences leaves the University after completing the degree and only the minority of students drop out due to their personal reasons (Going abroad, finding a job and some illnesses). However, the University was able to minimize the dropout percentage by conducting the induction programmes and by directing the students for the student counsellors at the very beginning when they entered the University.

- (f) Although a strategy had been developed to grant provisions for the students under the project “Improving Relevant and Quality of Under Graduate Education”, the amount was invested in a fixed deposit as none of the students have applied for this. The mechanism prepared for this project has been submitted to the 231st Council held on 28.07.2022 and it is scheduled to be implemented accordingly.
- (g) The key objective of a University is to provide higher education for the students and to make them graduates. The main contribution to achieve the said objective is given by the academic divisions of the Faculties of the University. For the said purpose, the annual action plan of the Wayamba University of Sri Lanka is being based on below 5 basic goals.

Key goals of the university

1. Enhance the graduate programmes according to the national and international standards of undergraduate, postgraduate and professional levels.
2. Increased the student access according to the increasing demand for higher education in Sri Lanka.
3. Produce entrepreneurial graduates with high employability to meet the legitimate expectations of the stakeholders.
4. Create a conducive environment for research, innovations, scholarships and outreach / commercialization. (RISOC)
5. Committed University community serving the mankind.

Accordingly, main objectives of the University are to provide the higher education for the students and the research activities of the students and the academic staff.

While the strategies have been developed to achieve each objectives and strategies have been prepared annually to achieve those. The academic divisions basically contribute to accomplish the above said strategies and non-academic divisions indirectly contribute to achieve those. Non-academic divisions are rendering their service to complete the above strategies depicted in the action plan.

It is anticipated to include the activities of the non-academic divisions in the annual plan from year 2022 onward and further, it was difficult to identify definite allocation for the relevant activities during the preparation of action plan for year 2021 due to the Corona pandemic. It is anticipated to include those allocations for the next year action plan too.

- (h) The University has taken every step to recover the money from bond violations of academic staff. Some applications of bond violated lecturers were sent to the UGC to recover the bond values from their UPF and legal actions have been taken for some cases. At the meantime, there are some lecturers who are making the relevant payments to the University according to a plan.

Continuous discussions are ongoing at the Audit Committee of the University regarding the bond violations. As per the advices and recommendations of the University Audit Committee, the names of those who have breached the obligations and the names of the guarantees have also been published in the University website. Those names have been informed to the Embassies of the respective countries through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Accordingly, the University is trying its best to recover the money due from these bond violations. As per the decision taken on the 229th Council, which was held on 26.05.2022, it was decided to deposit the money recovered from bond violations, in a fixed deposit.

- (i), (j) Though the all assets under the assets category should be revalued according to the Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards No. 07, due to the defects noticed in the revaluation report No. CV/CA/UOW/KG/02 dated 03/11/2023 issued by the Government Valuation Department, those amount could not be accounted.

The revaluation process of the University has already been commenced and actions will be taken to rectify these errors in the financial statements in year 2022.
