MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR GENERAL



It is with great pleasure and contentment; I would like to present the Annual Report of the Sri Lanka Institute of Advanced Technological Education (SLIATE) for the year 2022. The year 2022 was really a challenging year due to the economic crisis that the whole country faced. The economic crisis has affected our nation's entire personal and economic well-being and left us all in a devastating meltdown of our potential. Being a state-funded educational institution, SLIATE has faced many remarkable challenges in almost all spheres of development due to this economic crisis.

Many of the scheduled activities had to be either canceled or postponed due to the financial crisis and the gloomy environment of the country such as the fuel crisis. However, SLIATE was able to continue the academic activities through online mode and in-class mode. Examinations were also conducted in physical mode. SLIATE was able to conduct its 17th Annual convocation in August 2022 in a grand scale and 5735 diplomates were awarded diplomas at BMICH.

Under the financial support rendered by the AHEAD project, 34% of the construction work of the new building for Advanced Technological Institute, Nawalapitiya was able to be completed. At the same time, 48% of the construction work of the new building for Advanced Technological Institute, Mannar under the AHEAD project was completed.

The administration of SLIATE is committed continuously to the enhancement of staff capabilities in their related subject areas and also in their higher education. Accordingly, the Master's degree scholarship programmes for the academic staff members of SLIATE were continued in the year 2022 too. The recruitment process of the students for the academic year 2021 was carried on in August 2022 and the total number of student enrolment in the year 2022 was 29,493.

Creating and disseminating new knowledge are the two obligatory roles of any Higher Educational Institution. As such, we are steadfast to continue to develop in terms of scientific research. We are indeed proud to state that the second multidisciplinary Academic Session of ATI, Kegalle (ATIKAS 2022) was held successfully on 29th December 2022 in the virtual forum in view of the theme "*In pursuit of excellence together*". The Journal of the aforesaid Academic Session consisting of extended abstracts of the scholarly articles which were subjected to a double-blind peer review process was

published, providing the much-needed platform for exchanging and sharing knowledge, best practices, experience and innovations among prosperous young researchers.

In addition to all these momentous enhancements, we would also like to announce the continuance of the process of obtaining the degree awarding status for the institution. Accordingly, SLIATE Act needs to be revised. All ASM members agreed to the proposed amendment to the SLIATE Act and proceeded with the necessary actions. Approval was received from the Governing Council of SLIATE to the proposal and the request was sent to the Secretary Ministry of Education for further action.

This year has shown us that unity is our strength. When we work together, we can overcome tremendous challenges, adapt quickly to new realities and achieve great heights in research and education. Undeniably, 2022 is a year of slow progression. However, we fervently hope that with the immense support of the nation and our stakeholders, we would record a steady phase of headway in the years to come. We were, we are and we will be committed to providing a quality alternative higher education for the younger generation of the mother nation.

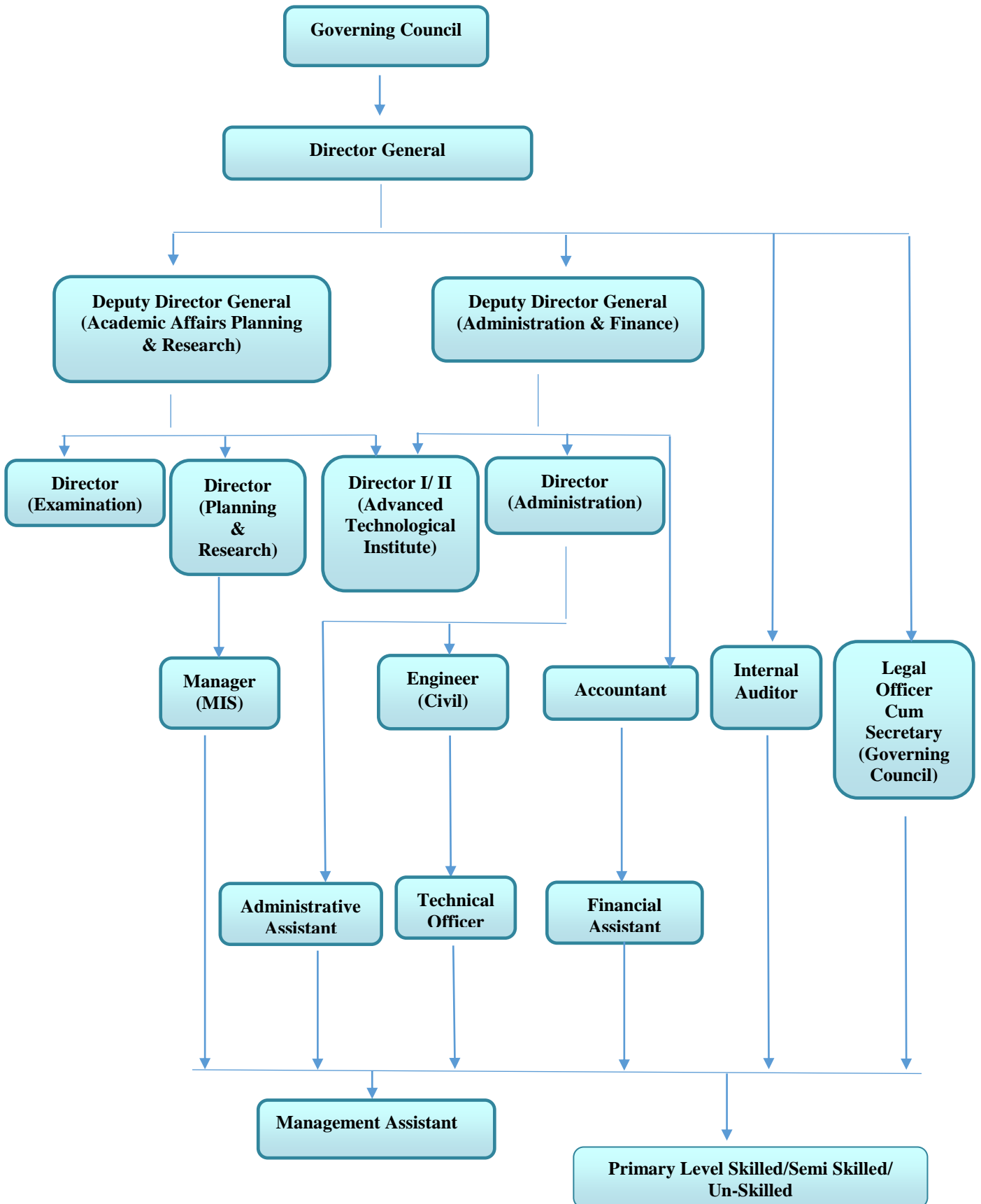

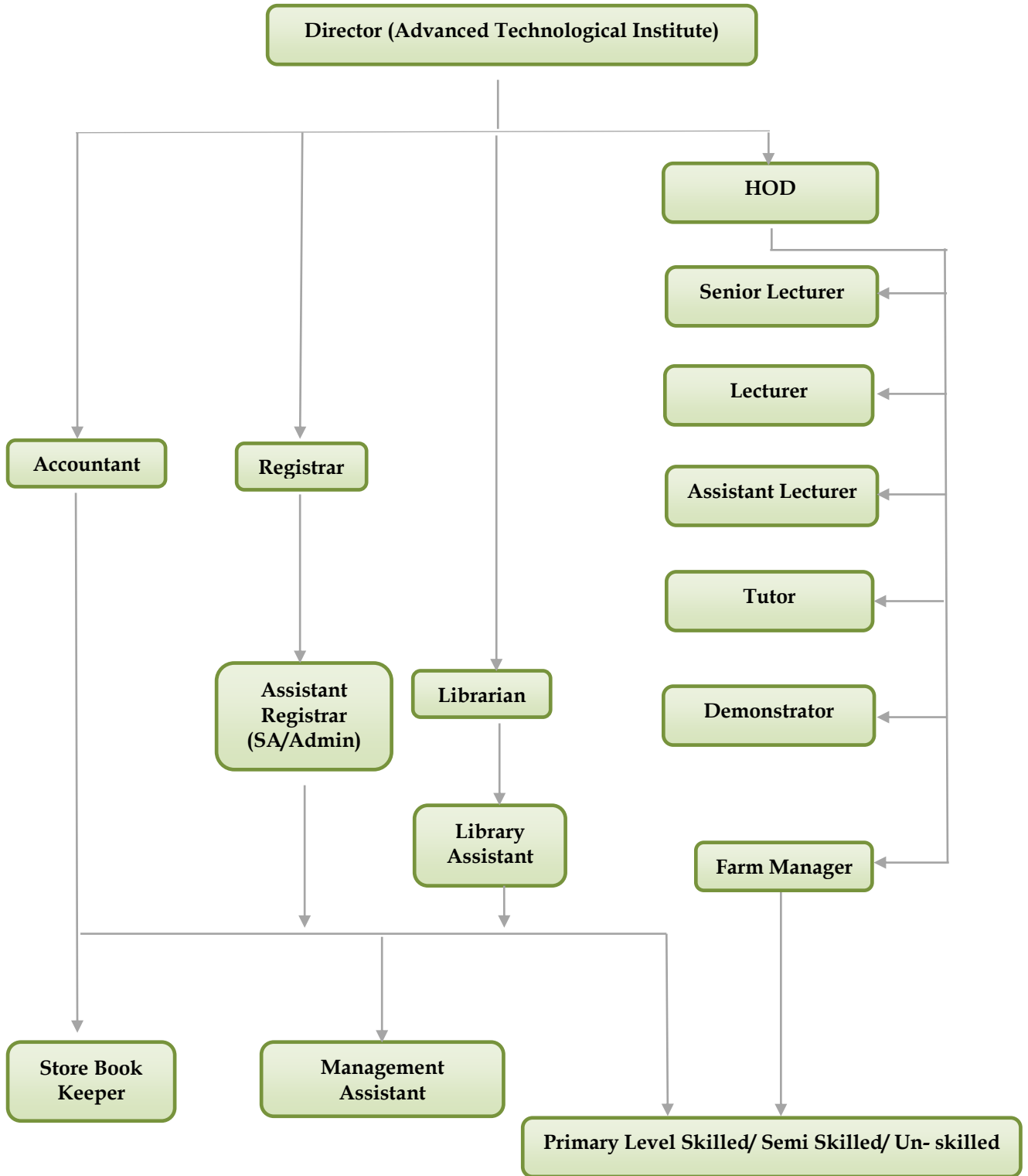

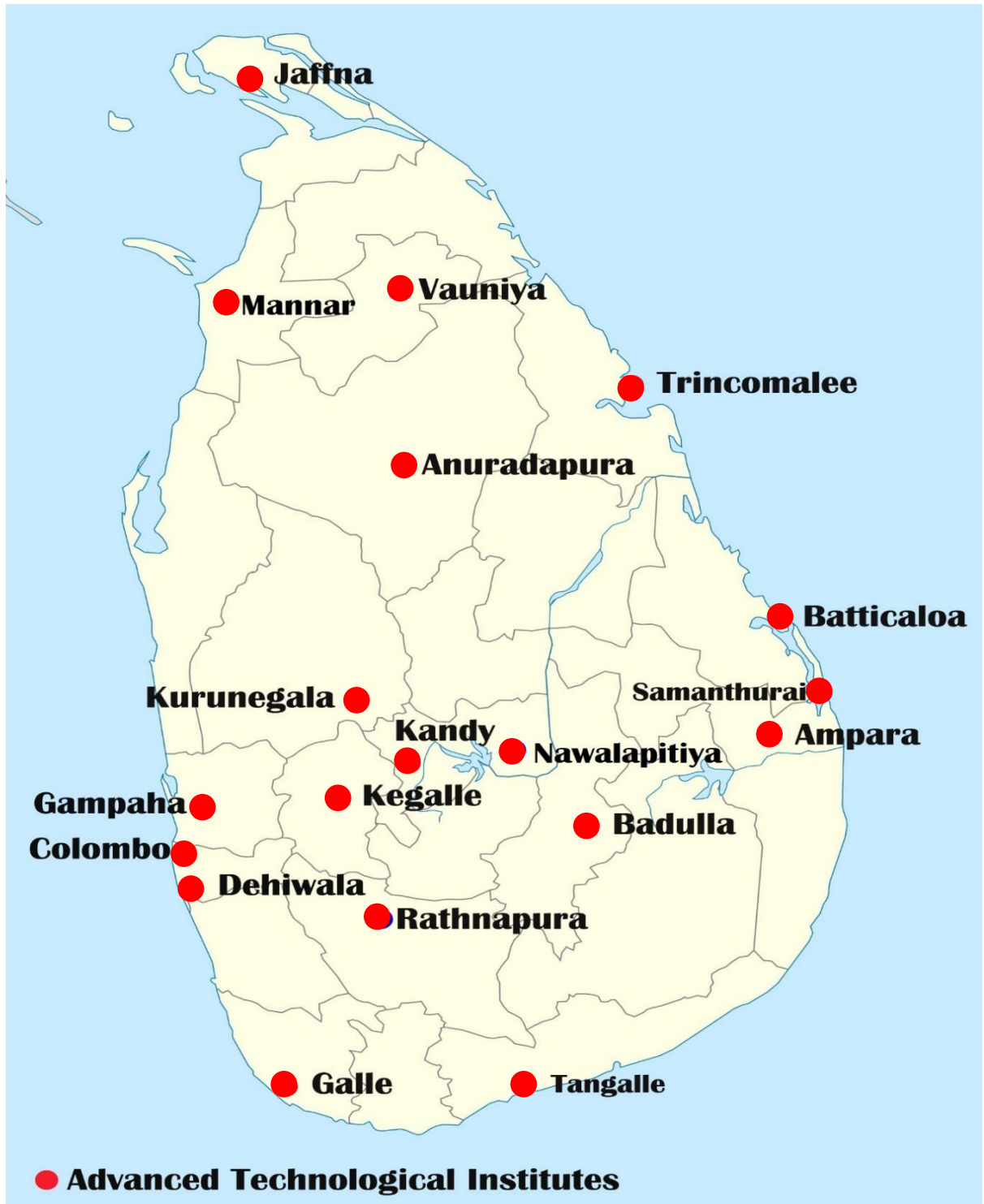
ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE OF SLIATE

PLANNING & RESEARCH DIVISION

The development, execution, and coordination of the action plan for SLIATE and ATI fall under the purview of the Planning and Research Division. In addition, this division is responsible for producing the Annual Report, tracking the implementation of the Action Plan, funding the Staff Development Programs, compiling the list of students who qualify for Mahapola scholarships, providing research support to the SLIATE staff, and producing academically relevant policy papers.

Research Allowance

As stated in Management Services Circular 02/2014, SLIATE assists its employees in conducting research. Five (5) major research disciplines, including Management and Accounting, English, Engineering, Information Technology, as well as Agriculture and Food Science, will be covered by the facilities.

Upon the recommendation of the Research Management Committee and with the consent of the Research Supervision Committee, the necessary actions will be undertaken to review the research proposals presented in the appropriate format. For this endeavor, a group of researchers with considerable experience conducting research in the Sri Lankan university system will serve as external reviewers, along with a panel of research specialists chosen by SLIATE as internal reviewers.

According to the currently in effect circular, the payment of research funding will start once the research proposals submitted for review have been approved, and the policies of SLIATE will also apply to the research activities.

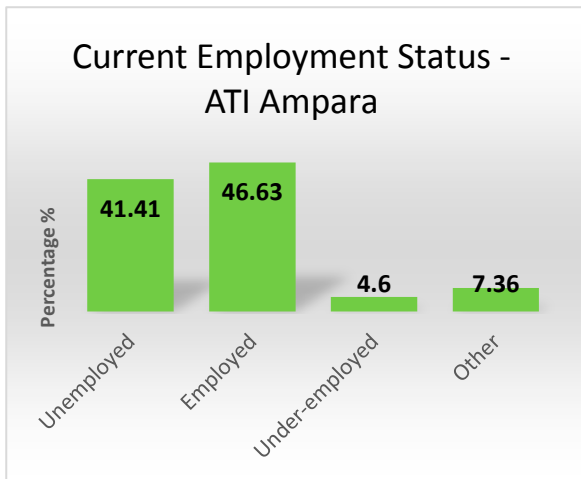


Figure 1: Current Employment Status - ATI Ampara

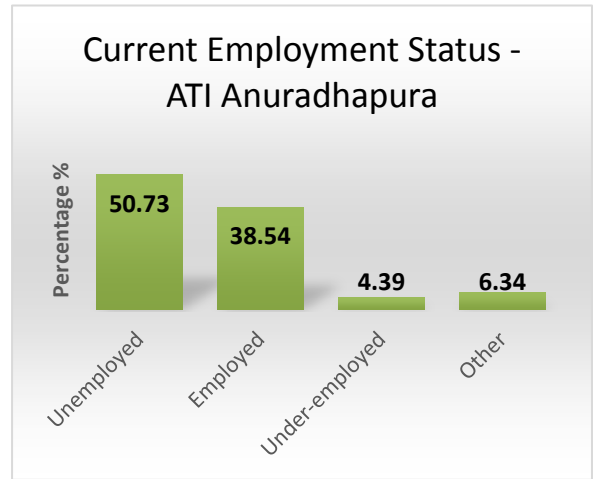


Figure 2: Current Employment Status - ATI Anuradhapura

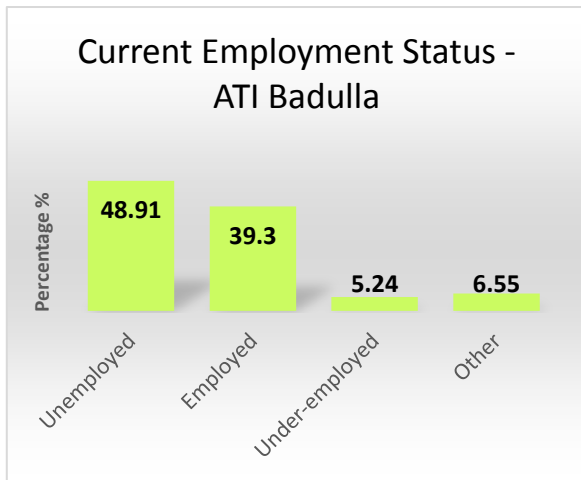


Figure 3: Current Employment Status - ATI Badulla

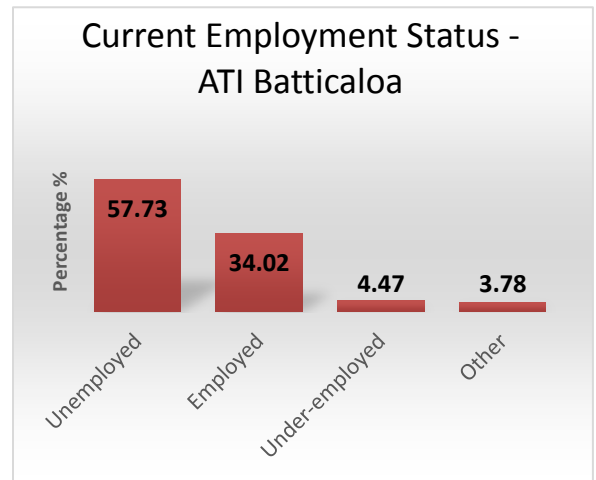


Figure 4: Current Employment Status - ATI Batticaloa

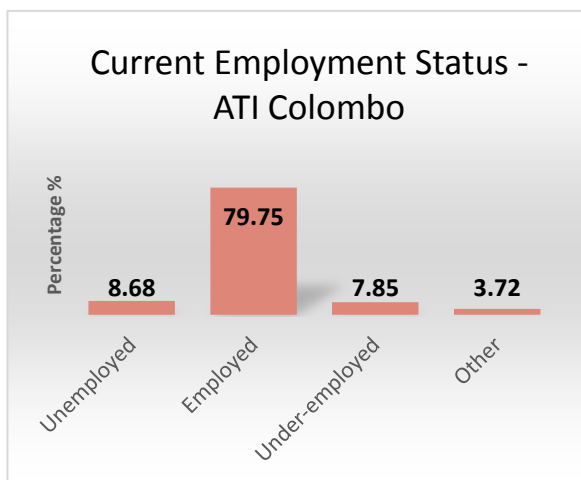


Figure 5: Current Employment Status - ATI Colombo

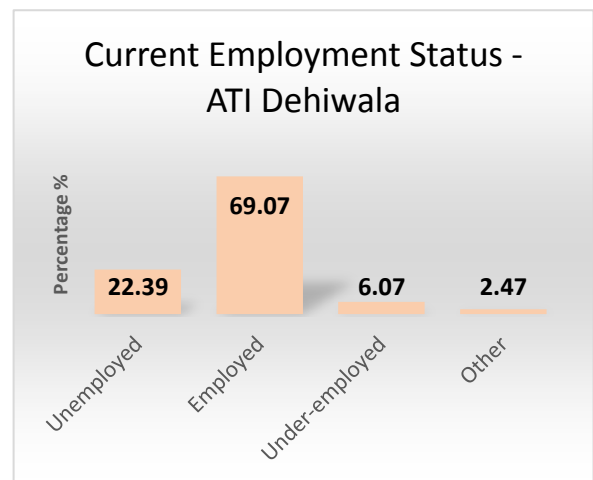


Figure 6: Current Employment Status - ATI Dehiwala

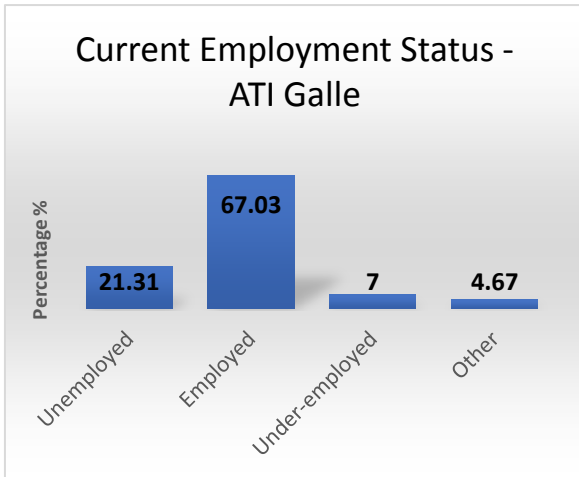


Figure 7: Current Employment Status - ATI Galle

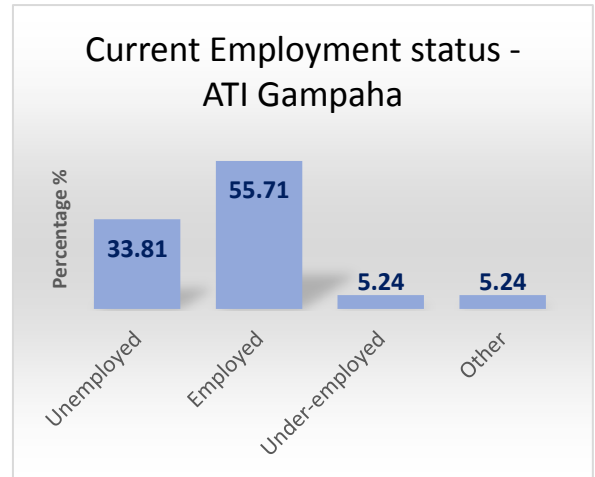


Figure 8: Current Employment Status - ATI Gampaha

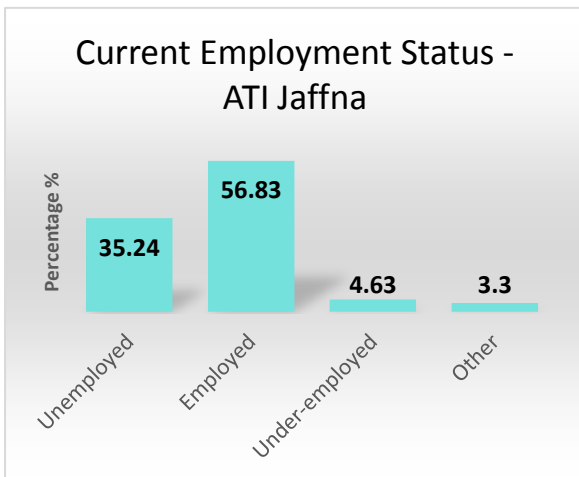


Figure 9: Current Employment Status - ATI Jaffna

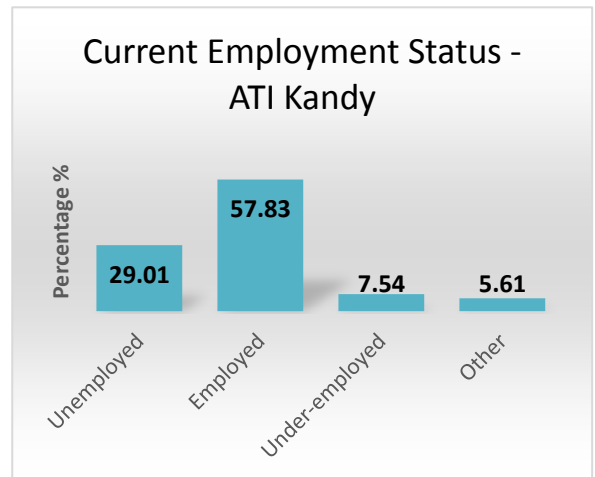


Figure 10: Current Employment Status - ATI Kandy

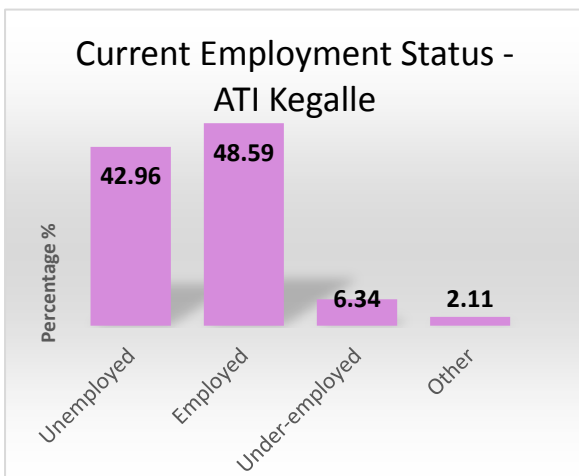


Figure 11: Current Employment Status - ATI Kegalle

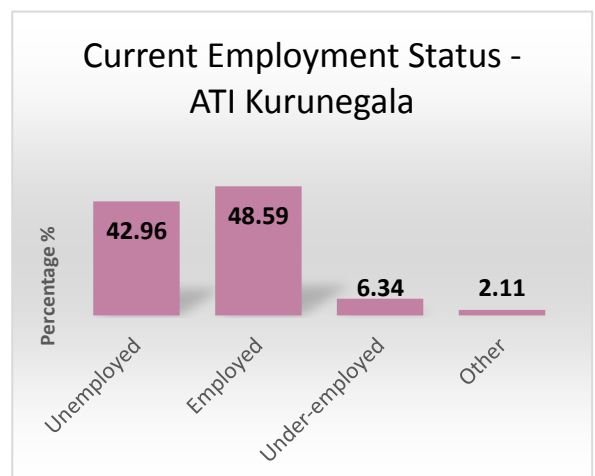


Figure 12: Current Employment Status - ATI Kurunegala

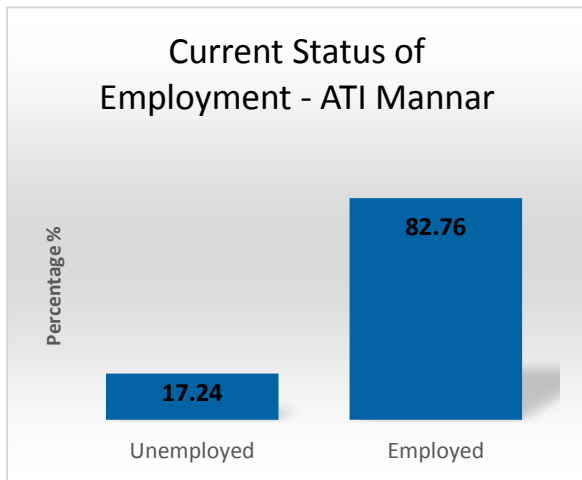


Figure 13: Current Employment Status - ATI Mannar

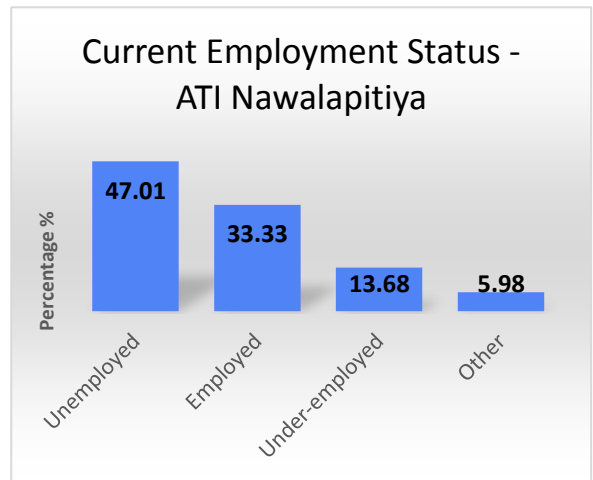


Figure 14: Current Employment Status - ATI Nawalapitiya

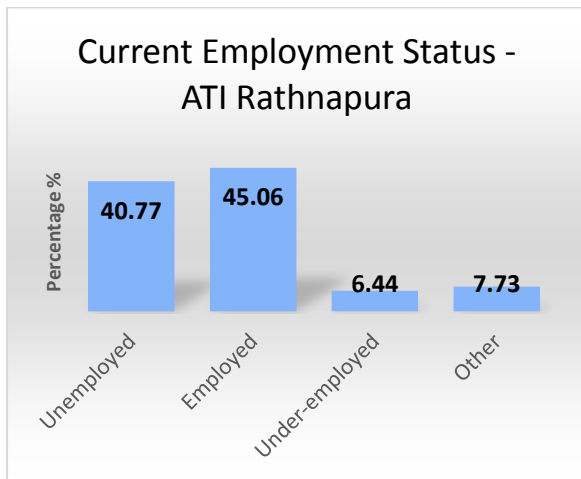


Figure 15: Current Employment Status - ATI Rathnapura

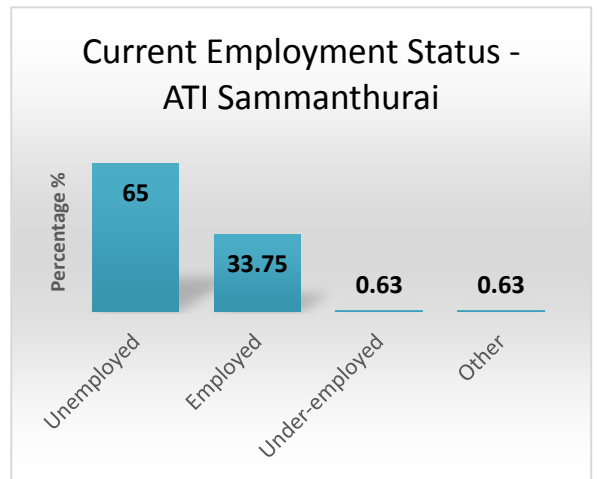


Figure 16: Current Employment Status - ATI Sammanthurai

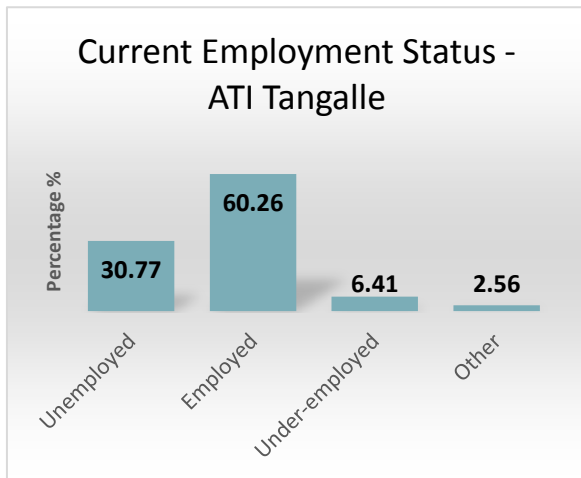


Figure 17: Current Employment Status - ATI Tangalle

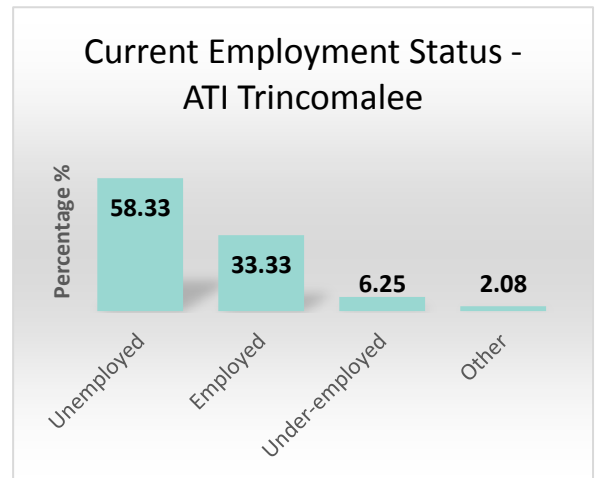


Figure 18: Current Employment Status - ATI Trincomalee

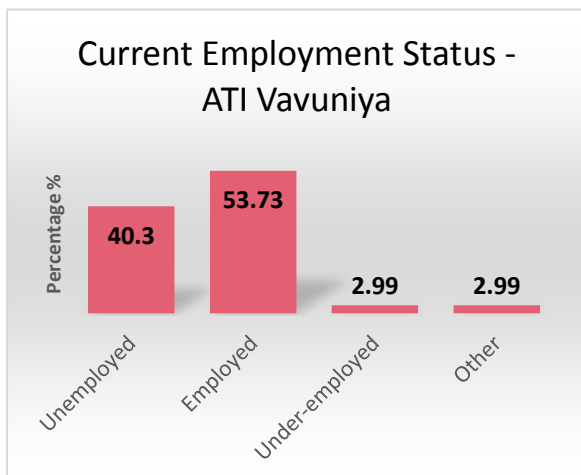


Figure 19: Current Employment Status - ATI Vavuniya

Assistant Lecturers of the academic staff working in the Advanced Technological Institutions affiliated with Sri Lanka Institute of Advanced Technological Education should participate in a staff development program that covers 100 hours as it is one of the most key requirements that must be completed in order to become permanent in the post according to the recruitment procedure (SOR).

A written request for participation in the staff development program should be forwarded to the Head Office by the Directors/Academic Coordinators of ATIs. The Staff Development Program Centre of the respective University will get an official letter, signed by the Director General of SLIATE, approving the financial arrangements and duty leave necessary for this program. Additionally, Assistant Lecturers will have the chance to complete the 100-hour staff development program and get reimbursement.

After completing the staff development program, a certified copy of the certificate and the letter from the university attesting to the completion of the requirement will be delivered to the head office. Mission of the MIS Division

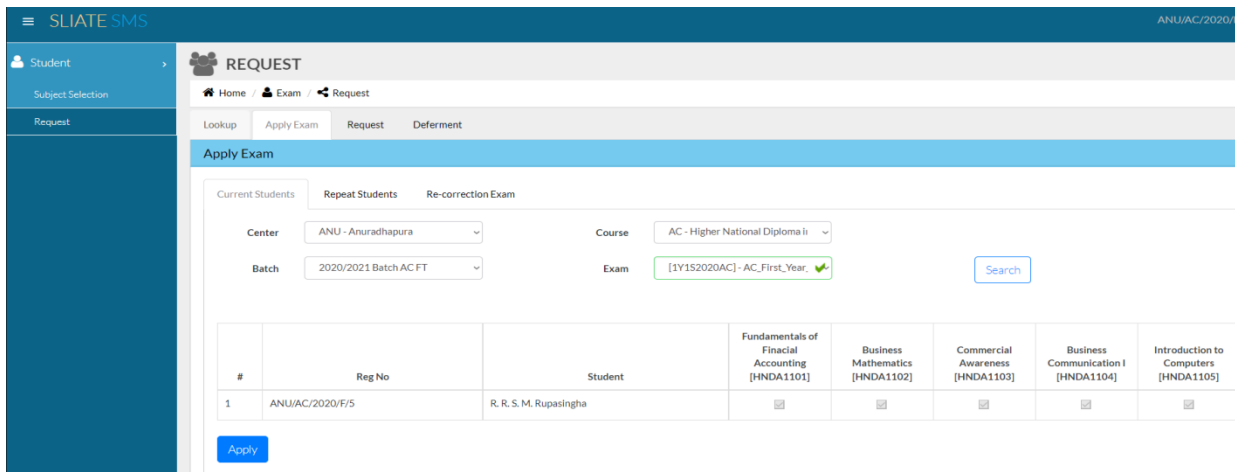
The MIS unit is committed to provide the highest quality technology services and support, thereby enhancing the operation, management, research, and educational capabilities within SLIATE.



INTERNAL AUDIT DIVISION

The Internal Audit Division of the Sri Lanka Institute of Advanced Technological Education has been established in the Head Office, and it performs all the tasks related to the audit of the Head Office and the Advanced Technological Institutes. There, the internal control system is strengthened by reviewing the existing internal control system, identifying weaknesses, making improvements, and recommending and introducing new control systems. Apart from this, evaluation of the institution process as per the circulars, assessing compliance with laws, regulations, and policies. It is the role of Internal Audit to identify weaknesses of controls through regulation and suggest necessary remedies to strengthen them.

Tasks performed by the Internal Audit Division in the year 2022.

- Collecting, organizing and forwarding information related to Audit Queries and audit reports referred by the Government Audit Division.
- Conducting three sessions of Audit Committee Meetings, forwarding the decision notes to the board of directors as well as making arrangements to forward them to the relevant responsible parties.
- Even with limited human resources, conducting audit inspections and directing audit queries and issuing reports after conducting audit investigations.
- Conducting and reporting special audit investigations in relation to Advanced Technological Institutes in Kandy, Galle, Gampaha as instructed by the Governing Council and the Audit Committee.
- Gathering and organizing information about the progress of matters related to the Sri Lanka Institute of Advanced Technological Education discussed at the Audit and Management Committee meeting of the Ministry of Education.
- Preparing and sending progress review reports of the Sri Lanka Institute of Advanced Technology Education as requested by the Chief Internal Audit Division of the Ministry of Education from time to time.
- Collecting and organizing information related to other Queries and Audit Reports.
- Preparation of the risk-based Internal Audit plan for the year 2023.
- Performing duties assigned by the Director General from time to time.

In the financial year 2022, under limited human resources and in the crisis situation prevailing in the country, audit functions had to be carried out only limited number of Advance Technological Institutes. According to the instructions received from the Director General and the Audit Committee, a risk-based Audit Plan was prepared to expand and streamline the audit activities in 2023.

A number of important issues were discussed; In the Audit Committee Meetings organized in the year 2022, where important decisions were made and the information was forwarded to the Management of the organization for its implementation, which is a victory for the Audit Division.

Report of the Auditor General on the Financial Statements and other Legal and Regulatory Requirements of the Sri Lanka Institute of Advanced Technological Education for the year ended 31st December 2022 in terms of the Section 12 of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018.

1. Financial Statements

1.1 Qualified Opinion

The audit of financial statements of the Sri Lanka Institute of Advanced Technological Education for the year ended 31 December 2022 comprising of the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2022, statement of changes in equity and cash flow statement for the year ended and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies was carried out under my direction in pursuance of provisions in Article 154 (1) of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka read in conjunction with the provisions of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018. My report will be tabled in due course in Parliament in terms of Article 154 (6) of the Constitution.

I am of the view that except for the effects of the matters described in the basis for Qualified Opinion section of my report, the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Institute as at December 31, 2022 and its financial performance and its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standards.



1.2 Basis for the Qualified Opinion

- (a) Though 379 items in relation to 15 types of goods costing of Rs. 8,510,955 in the stores without issuing after purchasing in the year under review, require to be identified as property, plant and equipment as per the Section 14 of the Sri Lanka Public Accounting

I have performed the audit according to the Sri Lanka Auditing Standards (SLAuSs). My responsibility under these auditing standards have been further described under the part of Responsibility of the Auditor on the Audit of the Financial Statements of this report. I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained, have been adequate and appropriate for my opinion.

1.3 Other information contained in the Annual Report 2023 of the Institute

The 'other information' means the financial statements included in the 2022 Annual report of the University that is expected to be given to me after the date of this audit and the information that is not included in my audit report. The management is responsible for these other information.

My opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and I, in any manner, do not guarantee or make any statement on them.

My responsibility on the audit of the financial statements is to read the above mentioned other information when it becomes available and to consider if such other information is significantly inconsistent with the financial statements or audit or my knowledge obtained otherwise.

When I read the Annual Report of the year 2022, if I conclude that there are significant misrepresentations based on the other information I received before the date of this Audit report and the tasks I had performed, such matters should be communicated to the governing parties for correction. If further material uncorrected misstatements exist, those will be included in my report to Parliament in pursuant of Article 154 (6) of the Constitution will be tabled in due course.

1.4 Responsibility of the Management and Those Charged with Governance of the Financial Statements

The management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standards and for such internal control as the management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatements, whether due to fraud or error.

When preparing financial statements, it is the management's responsibility to determine the ability to maintain the University and it is also the responsibility of the management to keep accounts on the basis of continuity and disclose the matters relating to the continuity of the University unless the management intends to liquidate the University or cease operations in the absence of any other option.

The controlling parties are responsible for the financial reporting process of the Sri Lanka Institute of Advanced Technological Education.

Subject to sub-section 16 (1) of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018, the University should maintain proper books and records of its income, expenses, assets and liabilities in order to prepare annual and periodic financial statements.

1.5 Responsibility of the Auditor in the Audit of the Financial Statements

My objective is to provide a reasonable assurance that financial statements are free from frauds and errors that occurred due to inaccurate false statements and to release the auditor's report along with my opinions. While fair assurance is a high-level guarantee, it does not always mean that auditing in accordance with Sri Lanka Audit Standards that will always detect quantitative disclosures. Frauds and mistakes are likely to result in quantitative disclosures, either individually or collectively, and may be expected to affect users' economic decisions based on these financial statements.

I audited in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards with professional judgment and professional compliance,

- By planning appropriate audit procedures when identifying and assessing the risk of inaccurate misrepresentations in financial statements due to fraud or error, I obtained adequate and appropriate audit evidence to avoid the risks of fraud or error. The impact of

fraud is stronger than the impact of inaccurate misrepresentation, and can lead to fraud, misconduct, forgery, intentional avoidance or avoidance of internal controls.

- In designing audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Corporation, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Corporation's internal control.
- The appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management is appreciated.
- The relevance of using the University continuity basis for accounting was determined based on the audit evidence obtained on whether there was sufficient uncertainty about the corporation's existence as a result of the events or circumstances. If I determine that there is sufficient uncertainty, my audit report should focus on the disclosures in the financial statements, and if that disclosure is inadequate, my opinion must be modified. However, continuity may come to an end based on future events or circumstances.
- The presentation, structure and content of the financial statements included in the disclosures were evaluated and the underlying transactions and events were evaluated in a reasonable and fair manner.

Governing parties will be informed on the key audit findings, key internal control deficiencies and other issues identified during my audit.

2. Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

2.1 The National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018 contains special provisions relating to the following requirements.

2.1.1 In accordance with the requirements set out in Section 12 (a) of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018, I have obtained all the information and explanations required for the audit, excluding the impact of what is described in the section on the basis of the Qualified Opinion of my report. My investigation shows that the proper financial records were maintained by the University.

2.1.2 The financial statements presented by the University in accordance with the requirements of Section 6 (1) (d) (iii) of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018, are consistent with the previous year.

2.1.3 The recommendations I made last year have been included in the financial statements submitted as per the requirement of Section 6 (i) (d) (IV) of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018.

2.2 In terms of the measures adopted and the amount of evidence and quantitative considerations, nothing came to my attention as to the following statements:

2.2.1 In accordance with the requirements of section 12 (d) of the National Audit Act, No. 19 of 2018, that any member of the Governing Body may be involved in any contract involving the University, directly or otherwise, out of the ordinary course of business.

2.2.2 In compliance with the requirements set out in Section 12 (f) of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018, except for the following observations, that anyone has acted in non-compliance with a written law or any other general or special directive issued by the Governing Body of the Institute.

Reference to Laws/ Directions	Observation
Financial Regulation 502 (2) of the Financial Regulations of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka	had not been taken to maintain a fixed assets registry for the property, plant and equipment worth Rs. 10,098,028,652/- as at 31 st December 2022.

2.2.3 That the Institute has acted in non-compliance with the powers, duties and functions of the Corporation except the following observations as required under Section 12 (g) of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018.

2.2.4 That the Institute has not procured and utilized its resources in an economical, efficient and effective manner as required under Section 12 (h) of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018.

2.3 Other Matters

(a) Though the construction of the Dambawela Institute of Advanced Technological Education had been completed and it had been handed over to the Institute on 18th September 2020, due to the delay in commencing its teaching and administrative activities until the month of June

in 2022, the expenses amounted to Rs. 4,983,214 for the water, electricity, sanitary and security services from January 2021 to May 2022 had been a futile expenditure.

- (b) The solar power system installed at the Kandy Institute of Advanced Technological Education from the year 2016 with the expenditure of Rs. 5,915,000 had not been functioning from the month of October 2021 and the Institute had not taken any action to restore the system though the company that had installed the said system had given a warrant period of 10 years for its manufacture faults and 25 years for its power efficiency exceeding 80%. As such, it has not been able to obtain the expected benefits to the Institute and during its operation period, an electricity generation income of Rs. 1,056,918/- had been incurred.
- (c) Action had been taken to construct a five-story building at the Dehiwala Institute of Advanced Technological Education in two phrases under the Project for the Higher Education for the 21st Century with the objective of maintaining the head office. The construction work was commenced on 26th August 2015 and the construction of 03 stories had been completed with the expenditure of Rs. 20,486,321 and it had been handed over to the Institute on 21st February 2017. The building had been remained inactive from the said date as the construction of the remaining two stories had not been completed. As the construction of the building had not been completed as expected, the Institute had been made to make a rental expense of Rs. 55,101,948 for the period from March 2017 to December 2022 to maintain the head office.
- (d) With the objective of reducing the electricity consumption of the Institute, a solar power system worth Rs. 19,784,000 had been installed at the Dehiwala Institute of Advanced Technological Education and such activity had been completed on 07th June 2019. As the Institution had not taken action to obtain the stock electricity connection in order to implement the said solar system even as at 09th June 2023, the Institution had been made to pay an amount of Rs. 4,445,646 for the electricity supply of the Institute from the month of June 2019 to the 31st December 2022.
- (e) Though the Director General of the Institute had been removed and 08 officers had been transferred due to the alleged complaints against them on violating the procurement regulations and the financial regulation on the procurement of the sanitary services of the Institute in the year 2018, disciplinary actions against them had not been completed even as at 09th June 2023.

- (f) Though a payment of Rs. 1,000,000 had been made on 30th December 2016 to the Urban Development Authority for a land situated in Rathnapura, valued Rs. 18,305,976, belonging to the Urban Development Authority for the construction of a quarters and a playground, no construction activity has been done as the Treasury had not released the balance amount and the payment of Rs. 1,000,000 had been a futile expenditure.
- (g) Though Rs. 1,371,400 had been made in the years 2014 and 2015 to 04 officers to follow post-graduate courses under the Project for the Higher Education for the 21st Century (HETC), those officers had not followed the said courses and action had not been taken to recover the said expenses even as at 31st December 2022.

- a. Although the new building that was constructed in the premises of Damabawela institute was handed over to the Sri Lanka Institute of Advanced Technological Education on 18.09.2019, due to the spread of the COVID- 19pandemic in the year 2020, students from all the island were not admitted to the advanced technology institutes and were only admitted from 26.09.2022 and studies were carried out in the institute since then.
- b. Although the J. Lanka Company, which installed the solar energy system at the Kandy Institute of Advanced Technological Institute, was informed to perform the relevant services and upgrades properly, their interest in performing the said tasks, is not at a satisfactory level. The solar energy system is expected to be implemented in consultation with this contractor. Also, the necessary activities in order to enter into the related service agreements is ongoing. It is expected to increase the efficiency and effectiveness of the system by carrying out maintenance activities.
- c. The Governing Council has approved that the work in progress of this building built in the Dehiwala Institute of Advanced Technological Education should be completed promptly and used for the establishment of the head office of the Sri Lanka Institute of Advanced Technological Education, and that this construction should be done with the contribution of labor from Sri Lanka Army, and the relevant work is currently underway. It is expected to complete this soon and establish the head office here. It will resolve the issue of maintaining head office on rental basis.
- d. According to the instructions given by the Governing Council regarding the solar power system of the Dehiwala Institute of Advanced Technological Education, the pre-procurement process has been canceled and approval has been given to select a consultant and contractor for this project through a new procurement process. Quotations were invited to select a consultant to provide consultancy services for the electricity project. Consultancy Services Procurement Committee has to meet to select a suitable candidate from among those quotations. The committee has requested the ministry to appoint the new chairman.

- e. The Ministry of Education dealt with the former director general of the institution in relation to the violation of rules and financial regulations regarding procurement of cleaning services, and the formal disciplinary inquiry against the other 08officials has now been completed, and instructions have been given to the investigating officers to submit the report soon as possible.

- f. 1 million rupees has been paid to the Urban Development Authority to acquire land for the Ratnapura Institute of Advanced Technology and it is kindly informed that sufficient funds have not been released from the treasury to pay the remaining 17 million rupees and we hope to complete these activities as soon as the funds are received.

- g. Out of the four officers who were referred to study postgraduate courses, the amount has been recovered from one officer at the time of retirement. Another officer has 4000/- rupees abatement for each month from May 2022 onwards. Another officer has been given a grace period of 06 months from 01.05.2022 to complete the course. The remaining officer have also been given a grace period of 6 months from 01.05.2022 to appear for the examination. The officials who have been granted the grace period have been instructed from the letter dated 03.06.2023 to provide information regarding the progress of the course.
