**Vision :** A Victorious Army through Professional Competence, Reliability and Honour.

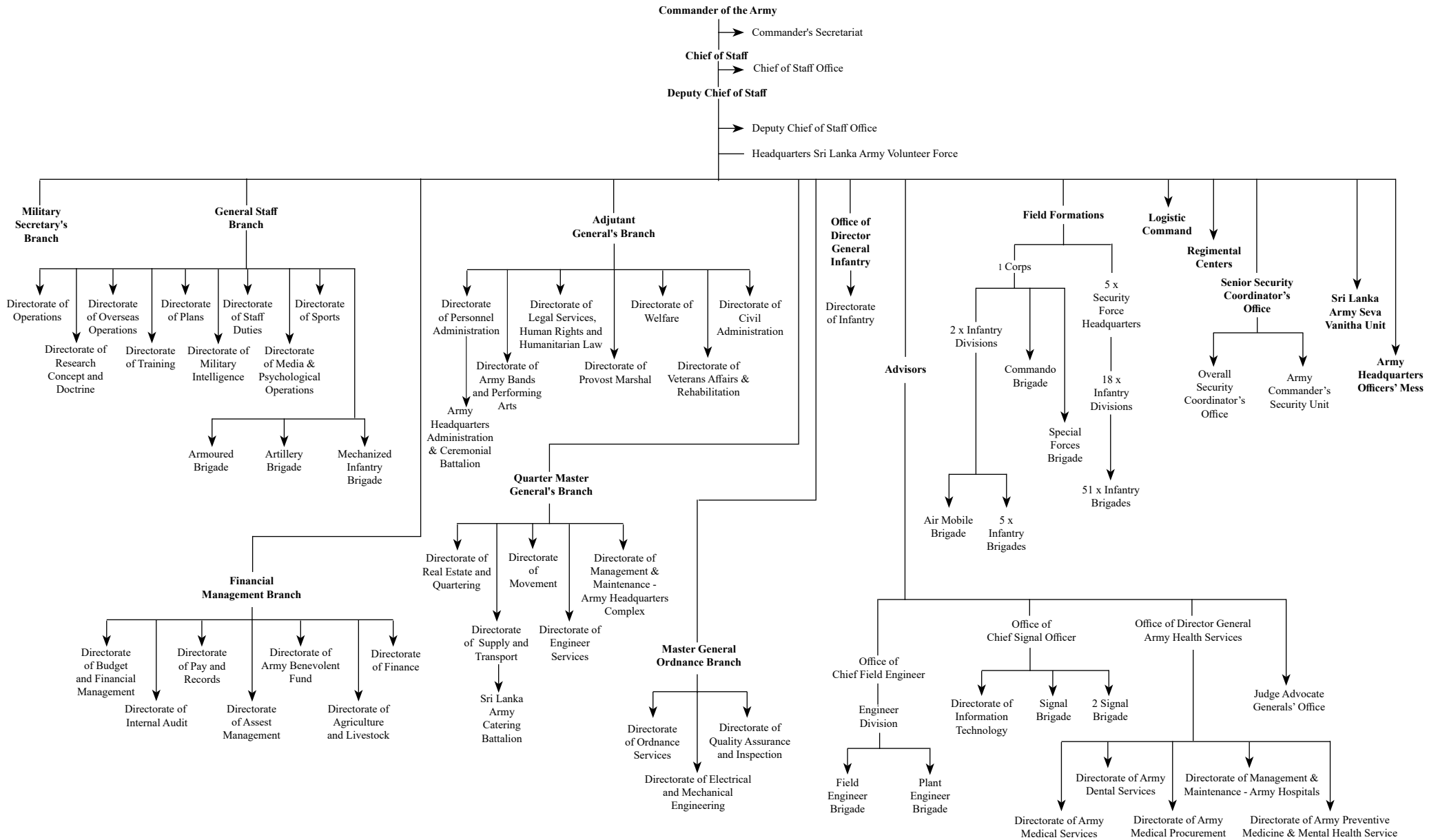

**OUTLINE ORGANIZATION - HEADQUARTERS SRI LANKA ARMY**



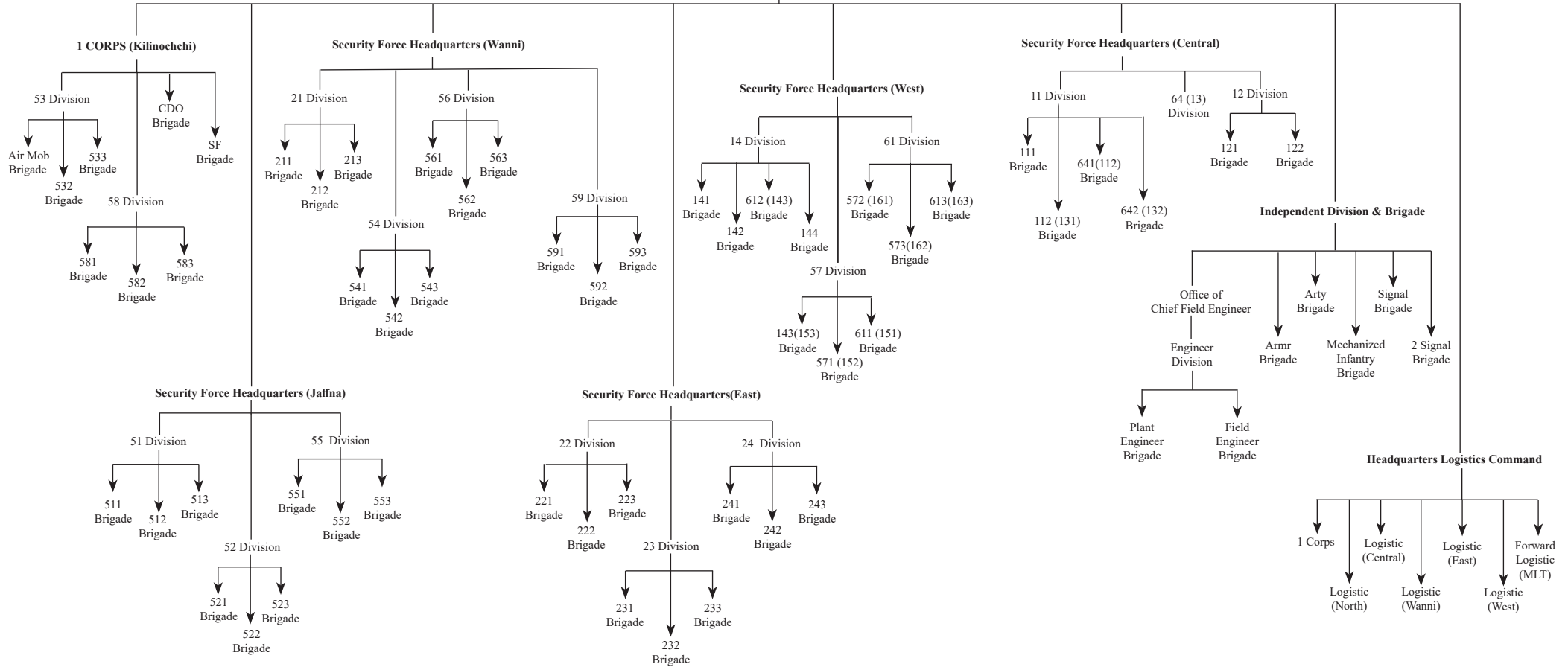

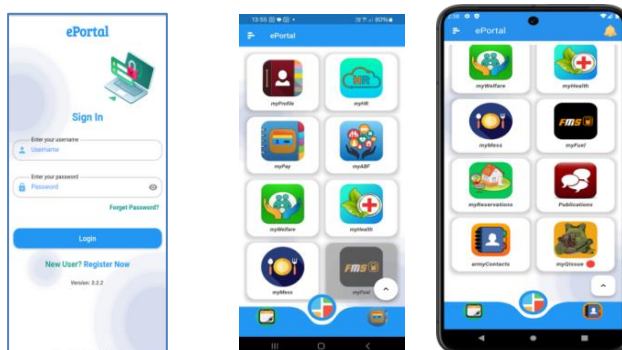
(1) **Army Digital Correspondence Platform (ADCP) System**

(2) **Army E-Portal Software System.**

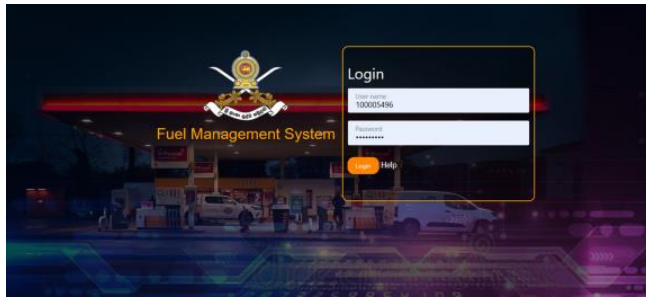
This system has been created for the salary and welfare matters of all officers/other ranks in the Army and is currently deployed in a live run for operational use.



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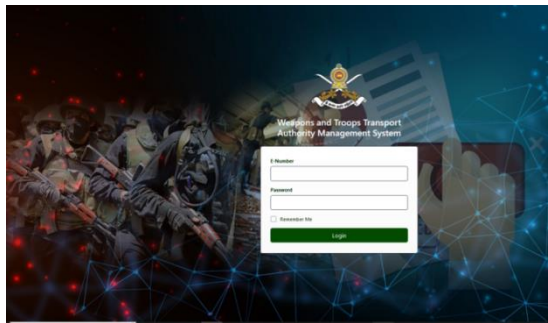
(3) Fuel Management System (FMS) Software System

This system has been implemented with the aim of efficiently issuing fuel for all vehicles in the Sri Lanka Army.



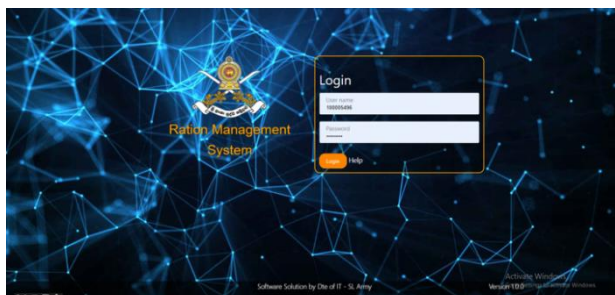
(4) Weapons and Troops Transport Authority Management System

This software system has been implemented with the aim of efficiently granting approvals for the transportation of troops and weapons/armaments within the Sri Lanka Army.



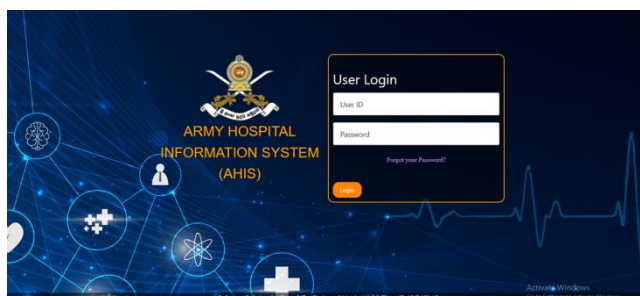
(5) Ration Management System



This reserve account is the corresponding account of Property Plant and Equipment.

Cash & cash equivalents include local currency notes and coins in hand as at 31st December 2023.

6.2 **Impact of Human Resource Shortage/Excess on Institutional Performance**

a. The Sri Lanka Army has actively contributed for over 75 years to safeguarding the nation from threats. Beyond its inherent duties, troops are also deployed during sudden disaster situations and for nation-building tasks.

b. Accordingly, due to the significant number of vacancies currently existing for officers and other ranks within the Army, various difficulties have arisen in performing both the inherent and non-inherent duties assigned to the Army. Furthermore, while the Army is engaged in a restructuring process to align its organizational structure with the required strength for achieving future operational concepts, leading to a reduction in personnel numbers, the tasks performed by the Army are not decreasing proportionally. This lack of proportional decrease in workload further intensifies the aforementioned difficulties in maintaining institutional performance.
