01.	<p>The attention of the committee was drawn to the fact that, out of the four (04) Assistant Sports Directors approved for the Department of Sports Development, only two (02) are presently serving in the Department.</p>	<p>Out of the four (04) Assistant Director (Sports) posts in this Department, three (03) remained vacant and as per the request made in the letter No. DSD/ADM/01/085/02 dated 19.01.2024, the Department of Management Services granted approval on 05.04.2024 to recruit for these three (03) posts.</p> <p>Accordingly, the gazette notification was prepared and forwarded to the Public Service Commission for approval and the recruitment marking scheme was approved and sent on 05.07.2024 by the Secretary of the Public Service Commission. Meanwhile, due to the retirement of Mr. R.T. Alponso, Assistant Director (Sports), the remaining post also became vacant and the letters were sent to the Department of Management Services requesting the approval for the recruitments and since it was informed to forward the request for the committee chaired by the Secretary to the Prime Minister, that request was again forwarded to the Public Service Recruitment Review Committee chaired by the Secretary to the Prime Minister, approval has not yet been received.</p> <p>Accordingly, as per the approval granted by the Public Service Commission for the Gazette notification, applications were called through Gazette No. 2426 dated 28.02.2025, the interview was conducted on 27.05.2025 and forwarded to the Public Service Commission and officers were recruited to the three (03) approved vacancies on 31.07.2025. Furthermore, one of the officers retired on 03.08.2025.</p>

However, Sri Lankan sportsmen and sportswomen failed to achieve any medals at the Games, while two sportspersons from the Paralympic Games won medals. There were 33 sports included in this Games. • Six (06) sportsmen and sportswomen participated for 2024 Paris Olympic Games representing Sri Lanka. These sportsmen and sportswomen did not win any medals and only one medal was won by sportsmen and sportswomen who represented Sri Lanka at the Paralympic Games. There were 32 sports included in this Games.

❖ **2028 Los Angeles Games**

Sri Lankan sportsmen and sportswomen are expected to participate in the Olympic Games to be held in the United States of America from 14th July to 28th July, 2028. It is proposed to include 28 sports in this Games.

❖ **Asian Games**

- The 2026 Asian Games are scheduled to be held in Nagoya, Japan from 19th September to 4th October. The participation of Sri Lankan sportsmen and sportswomen will be decided as per the recommendations of the National Sports Selection Committee based on the performance of Sri Lankan sportsmen and sportswomen. Forty one (41) sports will be included in this Games
- Sri Lankan sportsmen and sportswomen who represented 2022 Asian Games held in China won following medals.

The eligibility for weight lifting should be qualified for this games and it is expected to participate sportsmen and sportswomen for other sports based on the recommendations given by the National Sports Selection Committee.

The Games, which are scheduled to be held in Pakistan, have been announced to be held from 23rd to 31st January 2026, but no final decisions have been made yet. • In 2019, Sri Lankan sportsmen and sportswomen managed to secure third place in the medal tally at this Games, winning 40 gold medals, 83 silver medals and 128 bronze medals.

The committee inquired on the expected and allocated annual recurrent and capital allocations made for the Ministry. he Committee's attention was directed towards the allocation of funds for school-level sports development, with particular emphasis on the relatively high proportion spent on recurrent expenses. Mr. Panditha Gunapala Senadeera (Member) 3. Mr. Pandula Andagama (Member) <p>Accordingly, a report was submitted by the above committee to the Hon. Minister of Sports in 1991 to designate volleyball as the national sport. The committee cited the following reasons in the report for designating volleyball as the national sport.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It is a traditional sport and a sport that evolved as a traditional sport. • Ability to participate in teams. • Ability to manufacture the necessary items locally. • Being a popular sport among the people. • Victory is determined by skill. • Helps the sport of volleyball for the development of physical fitness. <p>Its legal status -</p> <p>Volleyball has not yet been officially designated as the national sport by the Ministry of Sports through a gazette notification and In this context, the Ministry of Public Administration and Home Affairs, Provincial and Local Government was queried via letter ක්‍රීඩාංශ/ආ/09/16/1 dated 03.10.2023 and the Ministry responded that the matter would be reviewed and information provided at a later date.</p> <p>Future steps for determining the national sport of sri lanka -</p> <p>Since the Ministry of Public Administration and Home Affairs, Provincial Councils and Local Government has not yet confirmed that the legal national sport has been designated, the Ministry of Sports will take steps to inform the Ministry of Public Administration and Home Affairs, Provincial Councils and Local Government of the necessary recommendation that volleyball be designated as the national sport according to the Vini Vitharana report.</p>

The coordination between the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Sports	In order to encourage school students to engage in appropriate sports, activities are currently underway to distribute sports items and develop sports related infrastructure for the advancement of sports skills of students in identified schools under the programme to foster a sports culture. In addition, an allowance of Rs. 10,000/- per month is paid to nearly 800 students participating in sports covering all districts across the island under the Kreedha Shakthi programme. This will provide some motivation for their nutrition and to purchase sports items.

The Committee drew attention to the fact that out of the 26 projects mentioned in paragraphs 3.1 and 3.2 of the audit brief, 17 were completed and handed over with a delay, while 19 projects were completed and handed over with a delay and 10 projects were discontinued before completion. 	revealed before the committee that these projects were initiated without proper prioritization and feasibility studies and that the Ministry of Sports and the Department of Sports Development had spent more than 4 billion rupees in capital expenditure on these projects in 2020, 2021 and 2022.	
02.	The Committee's attention was also directed to the construction of the Bingiriya Sports Complex in the North Western Province. It was revealed before the committee that although it was proposed to construct the stadium with artificial turf, steps were later taken to construct it as a grass stadium due to lack of provisions.	Plans were formulated for the construction of a 200m track, a 400m track, an indoor stadium, a swimming pool, and a pavilion at the Bingiriya Stadium. Out of these projects, the pavilion and swimming pool have been completed and handed over to the department and the contract for the 200m track is scheduled for completion and handover by 31.12.2025. Bids were invited through a newspaper advertisement for the construction of the 400m running track, and following the recommendation of the Technical Evaluation Committee, the Departmental Procurement Committee decided to award the contract and submitted the decision to the Secretary for approval; however, before approval and award, a bidder filed legal action, which has delayed the contract to date. Due to a flaw in the basic plans for the indoor stadium, it has become impossible to install the planned roof. Consequently, the project has been halted midway.
