

INTRODUCTION

Bhiksu education is the most prominent part of the Buddhist education tradition in Sri Lanka. The inception of Buddhasravaka Dharmapeetaya is a positive step taken to ensure the Buddhist education that was found in Mahamewuna Maha Viharaya of Anuradhapura with the arrival of Mahinda Maha Thero. The institution concerned was established over by the Act No. 16 of 1968, it was re-established as Buddhasravaka Bhiksu University in terms of the Act No. 26 of 1996. It was promoted as Bhiksu University of Sri Lanka in accordance with the Act No. 15 of 2012 which the only university in Sri Lanka dedicated Bhikku Students. Establishment of faculties which indispensable for a university was taken placed by the Act No. 15 of 2012. Presently Bhiksu University can be identified as a significant institution in Sri Lanka for the field of Bhikku education.

This report will discuss the growth and new ventures achieved in the year 2015

Message of the Most Venerable Mahopadhyaya Thero

The Bhikku University of Sri Lanka has achieved a mammoth progress in the development of physical resource by the year 2015. Presently, Administrative building, buildings for Faculty of Buddhist studies and Faculty of language and cultural studies faculty with all facilities have already been completed. Such buildings are used to carry out administration and academic affairs of the university. Construction of library building is being processed to end. Construction of electrical lift of the Buddhist study faculty has already been completed. At present accommodation facilities for 125 bhiksu students are provided within Nandana mawatha premises and necessary steps have been taken to construct buildings for alms hall in the new premise. Further preliminary arrangements were organized to construct a center for students. Construction of security parapet walls in front of Manamunawatta premise and behind the premise had been completed within the year 2015. Since the existing land is not sufficient for future development in the university, a new land in extent of 6.6808 hectares has been acquired upon the payment of, of rupees 18.9 million in the year 2015.

Carders of the academic staff was created in the 2014 and those recruitments have been made within the year 2015 accordingly the academic staff of the university has been quantitatively increased.

Many programmes are being designed and implemented with the expectation of creating a conducive environment to fulfill the objects of establishing the university. Improving infrastructure required to increase the number of Bhikku students and directing lecturers and bikku students for researches through Buddhist Philosophy and incidental fields by creating scholars who are veterans in Theravada Buddhism, organizing various types of local and foreign conferences, directing bikku students to different social services, organizing foreign tours for student bikkus to countries such as Thailand and Burma where Theravada Buddhism is spread in order to study the traditions concerned. Four days Art Festival was conducted in order to sharp various skills of bhikku student of the university within the year under review.

Hundred and twenty five bhikku students were enrolled with the approval of the Senate and the Council for the academic year 2014/2015 and it is further carried out academic activities under semester and course unit method. Number of publications were published by the academic staff of the university. A classical seminar at international level was held “Buddhism for future human civilization”.

One day workshop on General Administration, Disciplinary procedure and introduction auditing was conducted for clerical and allied grades of Non-academic staff and one day workshop on improving attitudes and motivation was held for minor employee within the year 2015.

A residence English speaking training camp of six weeks was successfully conducted and special lecture for promotion of attitudes of the bhikku students was also held. In one of the significant decision made by the Senate of the university is to give opportunities for following the subject of Buddhist Philosophy as special degree course in the medium of English.

A sum of rupees 116 million for salary and wages, another sum of rupees 44.75 for recurrent expenditure has been incurred out of the rupees 163 million of treasury allocation received under recurrent expenditure for the year 2015. The amounting of rupees 252.5 million received from treasury has been spent out of 282.5 million allocated under capital expenditure in the year 2015.

I wish to mention that the aforesaid programs, workshops and activities were conducted in the year 2015 with a view to achieving the objects of the Bhiksu University of Sri Lanka Acts.

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1. Main Objects and aims of Bhiksu University of Sri Lanka

1.1 Main Objects of the Bhiksu University of Sri Lanka

The objects of this University in terms of Section (03) of the Buddhasravaka Bhiksu University Act No. 26 of 1996 are as follows.

1. To train Bhikku students in accordance with the teachings of the Lord Buddha.
2. To promote training and research in Buddhist meditation among Bhikku students of the University.
3. To train Bhikku students for the propagation of Theravada Buddhism in Sri Lanka and abroad.
4. To encourage the study of, and research in Buddhism.
5. To promote Buddhist culture and values.
6. To do any other thing connected with or incidental to any the objects aforesaid.

1.2 Main aims of the Bhiksu University of Sri Lanka

1. To promote facilities to student monks for their higher studies.
2. To guide them to gain a prudent knowledge of Theravada Buddhism through canonical studies.
3. To guide them gain a fair knowledge of the fundamental teachings of main non Theravada Buddhist traditions.
4. To afford necessary facilities and instructions from teachers in order to gain research oriented knowledge and practical training relating to Buddhist meditation.
5. To provide resource persons for lectures and workshops in order to gain prudence in Buddhism and Buddhist culture.
6. To increase facilities required for obtaining proficiency pertaining to more effective languages.
7. To organize discussions, seminars and workshops required to comprehend the value of a Buddhist monk and to comprehend the duties and responsibilities of a Buddhist monk.
8. To create a background to gain traditional as well as critical knowledge on transferring the Dhamma, fulfilling the duties relating to the Buddhist Order and to conduct religious performances etc. and to foster an attitude endowed with piety or confidence on Buddhism.
9. To assist to promote virtues required for missionary and academic services, religious co-existence and social services.
10. To facilitate to gain a comparative knowledge of fundamental teachings of other religions.
11. To assist to gain the classical teaching required for research activities.
12. To create a Buddhist cultural center and a milieu suitable for meditation.
13. To increase the existing facilities for promotion of technical knowledge including knowledge relating to computers required for Buddhist education.
14. To enhance the missionary and classical services of the university through external courses.
15. To initiate action for local and foreign scholarships pertaining to courses.


Chart 22.1: Details on Academic staff




Chart 22.4: Cost per Student 2011-2015





Chart 22.5: Cost per Student 2011-2015





Chart 22.6: Details on completion of the degree – 2011 to 2015



Chart 22.7: Number of enrolled Bhikku students – 2011 to 2015



Chart 22.8: Details of recurrent financial provisions – 2011 to 2015




Chart 22.9: Details of capital financial provisions – 2011 to 2015




2. Accounts have been prepared and presented in terms of Sri Lanka Public Accounting Standard (SLPAS) and have followed generally accepted accounting principles and policies except where it is specifically stated.
3. Following notes are shown in the account reports of the Buddhasravaka Bhikku University of Sri Lanka in the year 2015. A sum of Rs. 435,519,000.00 has been received from the government as recurrent and capital grant.

Report of the Auditor General on the financial statements of the Bhiksu University of Sri Lanka for the year ended 31 December 2015 in terms of Section 14(2)(c) of the Finance Act No.38 of 1971.

The audit of financial statements of the Bhiksu University of Sri Lanka for the year ended 31 December 2015 comprising the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2015, and the statement of financial performance, statement of changes in equity and cash flow statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, was carried out under my direction in pursuance of provisions in Article 154(1) of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka read in conjunction with Section 13(1) of the Finance Act, No.38 of 1971 and Buddashrawaka Bhiksu University Act, No. 26 of 1996 and Section 46 of the Bhiksu University of Sri Lanka (Amendment) Act, No. 15 of 2012. My comments and observations which I consider should be published with the Annual Report of the University in terms of Section 14(2)(c) of the Finance Act appear in this report. A detailed report in terms of Section 13(7)(a) of the Finance Act, was furnished to the Venerable Mahopadyaya on 02 September 2016.

1.2 Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards and for such internal control as the management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatements, whether due to fraud or error.

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1.3 Auditor's Responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards consistent with International Auditing Standards of Supreme Audit Institutions (ISSAI 1000-1810). Those Standards require that I comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the University's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures, that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the University's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements. Sub-Sections (3) and (4) of Section 13 of the Finance Act, No.38 of 1971 give discretionary powers to the Auditor General to determine the scope and extent of the audit.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my audit opinion.

1.4 Basis for Qualified Opinion

My opinion is qualified based on the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of this report.

2. Financial Statements

2.1 Qualified Opinion

In my opinion, except for the effects of the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of this report, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Bhiksu University of Sri Lanka as at 31 December 2015 and its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards.

2.2 Comments on financial Statements

2.2.1 Accounting Deficiencies

The following observations are made.

- (a) A sum of Rs.10,097,647 spent for the construction of the wall around the University premises could not be applied for the calculation of depreciations, as it had been capitalized under the lands.
- (b) A sum of Rs.95,500 spent for the purchase of 7 Water Dispensers which are not in capital nature had been capitalized instead of accounting as revenue expenditure.
- (c) The over provision amounting to Rs.230,962 shown as operating income in the financial performance report, had not been adjusted to the deficit from the ordinary activities in the cash flow statement.

2.3 Non-compliance with Laws, Rules Regulations and Management Decisions

Even though, the general deposits exceeding 2 years from date of deposit should be credited to Revenue in terms of Financial Regulations 570 and 571 of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka, action had not been taken to credit 12 contract retentions amounting to Rs.1,196,643 remained over 3 years period, to the University Fund.

3. Financial Review

3.1 Financial Results

According to the financial statements presented, the operations of the University for the year ended 31 December 2015 had resulted in a deficit of Rs.36,199,372 as compared with the corresponding deficit of Rs.4,615,312 for the preceding year, thus indicating a deterioration of Rs.31,584,060 in the financial result as compared with the preceding year. Increase in expenditure for the personal emoluments by Rs.26,048,580 and increase in provision for annual depreciation by Rs.12,038,919 had mainly attributed to this deterioration.

In the analysis of financial results of the year under review and 04 preceding years, a deficit increased continuously since the year 2011 and the deficit in the year 2015 had increased by 684 per cent as compared with the year 2014. The contribution of the University which was Rs.53,603,442 in the year 2011 after adjusting the personal emoluments and depreciation on non-current assets had increased continuously and it was Rs.131,059,384 and Rs.137,562,822 in the years 2014 and 2015 respectively.

4. Operating Review

4.1 Performance

4.1.1 Research Performance

The following observations are made.

- (a) The bi-annual progress reports or the final reports to be furnished relevant to researches in respect of 63 researches carried out in the years 2014 and 2015 by the academic staff of the University had not been furnished to the Research and Management Committee .
- (b) The final reports relevant to 18 researches carried out in the years 2011,2012 and 2013 had not been furnished to the Research and Management Committee even by November 2015.

promenade with a Buddha Shrine instead of the auditorium according to the revisions made after the commencement of the construction. Accordingly, the approval of the Estimate Examination Committee had not been obtained according to the Public Finance Circular No.02/2012 dated 07 August 2012 for the change of scope of the contract.

- (ii) It could not be ensured in audit on the accuracy of the constructions due to non-availability of detailed reports on the work done in terms of the plans recommended by the Technical Evaluation Committee.

- (iii) Payments made for Works not done
-

The following observations are made.

- (a) A sum of Rs.2,440,000 had been paid considering as the construction of the auditorium for 06 items of work not done which was relevant to the auditorium but not related to the items of the Buddha Shrine.
- (b) Even though a sum of Rs.5,500,000 had been paid for the installation of 8 air conditioners with 24,000 BTU capacity in the library building, only 06 machines of this capacity had been installed. Fifty two iron grills estimated as Rs.451,975 had been fixed instead of the 2 air conditioners which were not fixed at a cost of Rs.1,375,000. An over payment of Rs.923,025 had been made accordingly.
- (c) Even though ,83 Fluorescent Lamp Sets with a length of 2 feet under the trade name of BRAVO of the Electronic Ballast brand with one year guarantee according to the approved samples should be fixed , only 59 electric lamps supplied under the trade name of hipper belonging to the Choke Ballast brand which had not been given guarantee certificates had been fixed. However, the full amount of Rs.15,653,105 had been paid there for.

(iv) Constructions Carried out deviating from the Approved Standards

The following observations are made.

- (a) Even though according to the construction specifications, glass in 10 mm thickness should be used for the area of 12.42 square metres of the front door of the library and the two sides, glass in 6 mm thickness should be used for the internal partitions and other doors and windows and fixed on alluminium frames, all fixtures done by using glasses with 5 mm thickness. However, the total payment of Rs.13,204,389 stated under the alluminium works item No.3.10 of the prize proposal had been made without making deductions by analyzing prices.
- (b) Timber skirting should be done by using loop pile carpets on the floor as per the recommendations made by the Technical Evaluation committee in 06 places in 3 floors of the library building, the constructions had not been carried out accordingly.
- (c) Even though the mineral fibre super flex ceiling sheets should be used for the ceiling of the library building in terms of the decision of the Technical Evaluation Committee, the ceiling had been made by using a low quality ceiling board used in the market as low expenses ceiling sheets. Therefore, the ceiling sheets had become crooked and damaged at the time of audit examinations carried out on 15 March 2016, after 2 months of the completion of the constructions.
- (d) A sum of Rs.2,955,000 had been paid for the fixing and installation of the internal telecommunication system and the network system, 28 telephones had been supplied by laying relevant wires and cables but those telephones had not been installed. Confirmation of the functions of the network system could not be ensured as it had not been taken over after examining the functions of the network system.
- (b) An engineering estimate amounting to Rs.2,510,000 had been prepared for the landscaping activities of the University. Nevertheless, only one bid had been received due to bids called for only from the contractors who had fulfilled the basic qualifications of ICTAD SP-3, having not called for bids from the contractors qualified under ICTAD SP-4 in terms of the grading and financial limit of the ICTAD. Accordingly, the financial benefit could not be obtained to the University through the competition.

4.5 Personnel Administration

Permanent officers had not been appointed from the year 2012 for the Registrar and the Bursar which are the 2 key posts of the non-academic staff of the University and there was a tendency that temporary officers who come with sabbatical leave from other Universities and officers of other Universities had been appointed on acting basis without recruiting permanent officers. Therefore, it was observed in audit that it had been adversely affected on carrying on the efficient administration in the University.

5. Accountability and Good Governance

5.1 Internal Audit

The internal audit activities had not been functioned in a satisfactory level as the Assistant Internal Auditor post had been vacant since 2013.

6. Systems and Controls

Deficiencies in systems and controls observed during the course of audit were brought to the notice of the Venerable Mahopadyaya of the University from time to time. Special attention is needed in respect of the following areas of control.

Report of Auditor General in terms of the Section 14(2)(C) of Financial Act No.38 of 1971 regarding Financial Statement for the year ended 31st of December 2015 of Bhiksu University of Sri Lanka.

2.2 Comments on Financial Statements

2.2.1 Accounting Deficiencies

- a) Action has been taken to capitalize the amount of Rs.10,097,647.00 which was spent for parapet wall, under buildings in the year 2016. Accordingly, the depreciation was also calculated correctly and entered into accounts by journal note no: JE/2016/A/127.
- b) The amount of Rs:95,000 spent for 07 water dispenser which have purchased by the university within the year 2015 is not surcharged expenditure and this is capital nature expense. Water dispenser can be utilized more than one year and the water dispensers concerned have been used without faults for a period of two years. Further, it is informed that these equipments can be used another few years. Therefore, it is kindly informed that the procedure of accounting (Debiting to Miscellaneous equipment account) followed by us is correct.
- c) It is informed that action will be taken to prepare accounts avoiding such deficiencies in preparation of accounts in the year 2016.

2.3 Not compliance with laws, rules, regulations and management decisions.

This amount of money was received from the constructors for constructs and retained by the university. The amount concerned shown as uncertainty balance that should be paid in a separate account under chapter 571(3) of Financial Regulation and action will be taken to inquire with the relevant institution and base on their responses to transfer the money retained into the accounts as the income of university according to Financial Regulation 570, it needs arises. It is stated that such money is further retained in the deposit account (retention) in terms of Financial Regulation 571(3).

3.1 Financial Result

In comparison to the year 2014, main reason for the decline of financial result in the year under received (2015) is to increase emoluments and allocation of depreciation and reason for the increase emoluments of employees was to payment of 20% monthly Compeiatory Allowance for all academic staff by 20% and the recruitment of 13 newly employees to the staff of university.

Revaluation of old buildings of the university within the year 2015 have caused to increase the value of such assets and the amount of depreciation has accordingly, been increased compared to the previous years.

However, I wish to state that depict for the year will be reduced to 1.7 Million as following, when depreciation of Capital expenditure (Net Depreciation) and allocation for depreciation fixed assets are reconcile.

- b) Number of researches conducted in the year 2011, 2012 and 2013 contained in the Audit report should be corrected as seventeen. Final reports relevant to 11 researches out of such researches have been produced to Research and Management Committee as at 30th November 2016.

4.2 Management Activities

Even though it is stated in the audit report that the number of lecture hours relevant to courses of the university in the first semester as 940 lecturing hours, 270 lecturing hours should be reduced from said amount, since there are no visiting lectures for the subjects of Pali and Buddhist Civilization. Accordingly, it is further stated that out of 670 lecturer hours, 350 hours of visiting lectures have been conducted and on the amount of 320 lecturer hours it has been stated uncovered, has actually been covered on grounds as mentioned chart below.

4.3 Idle and underutilized assets

- a) As the Digital Duplicator Machine, ink and Duplo master role indicated in the Audit Report were in unserviceable position and further it was confirmed by annual board of survey and recommended to dispose and accordingly respective machine and other materials were given as donation on 19.10.2016 to Ikirigollawa Muslim Maha Vidyalaya in Anuradhapura under the proper procedure of disposal,
- b) Four rolls of nets suddenly purchased for covering plants have already been utilized for another necessary activity in the library building.

4.4 Procurement and Contract Procedure

- a) Construction of four stored library building
 - (I) According to the Cabinet Memorandum submitted on 12th May 2014 by the Minister of Higher Education regarding construction of this project, Approval has been granted to award the contract of constructing library building as Turn Key Project to Sathuta Builders (pvt) Limited by the Cabinet Paper No:14/0637/521/016 and dated 20.06.2014. Accordingly, Director (Procurement) of the Ministry of Higher Education has given further instruction to the university for necessary action by his letter no:HE/PR/BBI/01 and dated 27.06.2014.
 - (II) Accordingly, Ministers of Cabinet has approved to select the contractor, Sathuta Builders (pvt) Limited according to the recommendations made by the Ministry of Higher Education on the Cabinet Paper above mentioned instead of selecting a contractor through procurement procedure under national competitive bid.
 - (I) Construction of building has been carried out according to the revision to the plan as decided by the “Committee of discussing regarding the plan of proposed to construct the library building” held on 26.07.2014 to construct shrine room and walking path in the 3rd floor of the building instead of construction auditorium in consideration of requirement of the university

within allocation made available for the construction of auditorium. However, such revision to the plan has not been informed to Procurement Committee of the Ministry and has not been directed to the Procurement Committee of the University for the purpose. Reason for the matter is that relevant construction was made within the allocation of 3.5 Million allocated for auditorium and it was not expected to spent additional cost to the government within the revision to the plan.

Necessary action will be taken to produce the revision of scope of work of the contract to the Technical Evaluation Committee and such committee recommendation to procurement committee appointed and such recommendation to the Secretary of the Ministry of Higher Education for approval

- (II) Even though the detailed report should not be produced as mentioned in the audit query, conformity of the construction can be observed through in comparison the work items completed according to project plan.
- (III) Payment for unconstructed work
 - A. Total amount of Rs.3.5 million allocated further purpose, have been paid for the auditorium. However the payment will only be made for these constructions due to revision of scope of works. According to the recommendation of procurement committee appointed above. Since, final bills are to be paid, there is over payment if any, action will be taken to reduce such amount from the final bills and it is ensured that no lost is caused to the Government.
 - B. Eight air conditioned machines with capacity of B.T.U 24000 have been installed in the library building and technical evaluation committee approved such number of machines. All air conditioned machines concerned have been entered into inventory. Accordingly, estimates amount of 5.5millions have been paid for the purpose.
 - C. The amounting to Rs.15,653,105 million were paid to establish the electricity system belong to whole project. Installing electrical equipment have been revised more than the number of original plan according to the activities carried out. Accordingly, payments were made within the cost mentioned in the estimate. However, if there is any revision to the electricity bulb line action will be taken for approved according to the recommendation of the Procurement Committee.

IV. Construction made out of approved standards

- a) Accepted. Action will be taken to fix glass doors with approved thickness. Action will be taken to deduct the amount overpaid from the final bills retained.
- b) Accepted. At present, tiles have been laid. Rs.183.20 per sqft has been overspent for laying tiles other than for 1sqft laying Loop Pile Carpet. The revision was made in considering the facts such as value, existence and minimizes the maintenance cost of the building.
- c) Accepted. Action will be taken to fix newly ceiling by the contractor.
- d) Necessary action will be taken to check the functions of network system and hand over before paying final bills. Accordingly it will be taken action to rectify if there are any deficiencies in the network system.
- A. Accepted. Action will be taken to correct in the future.

4.6 Staff Administration

Since, tenure of office of the post of registrar had been restricted for a period of five years according the act of university. The tendency is that less number of persons apply for the post. By this time action is being taken to recruit qualified persons for the relevant post by publishing advertisement in the newspaper.

5.1 Internal Auditing

Qualified person was recruited for the post of Assistant Internal Auditor by publishing newspaper advertisement and he has rejected to report to the service due to any personal matter. Therefore the applications were invited by publishing advertisement in the newspaper, and recruitment will be made within next month (December 2016).

6.0 System and Control

Several special measures have been taken in this regard in the year 2016 and it had been possible to fill the vacancies of the staff, to execute procurement procedure to be optimum and to carry out budget direction and the views more pragmatically and systematically.
