Our Mission

To produce a group of Buddhist monks with Theravada traditions having comparative understanding of Buddhist philosophy gained through Eastern and Western Languages endowed with the aspect of Dhamma and practical wisdom.

Introduction

With the arrival of Ven. Mahinda, the Buddhist education in Sri Lanka expanded and centered around the Kingdom of Anuradhapura with Maha Viharaya as basis. The Buddhasravaka Dharmapitiya was established in 1968 considering the need for a residential higher educational institution with the objective of bringing renaissance to Buddhist education which had been long preserved with state patronage and for studies connected with Theravada Buddhism and for propagating and conducting researches.

By expanding the objectives of the Buddhasravaka Dharmapitiya established by Act, No. 16 of 1968, the Buddhasravaka Bhikkhu University established by Act, No. 26 of 1996 functioned as a national University with 4 departments, namely, the Department of Buddhist studies, the Department of Languages, the Department of Social Services and Comparative studies and the Department of Practical Buddhist Studies. This University further comprises the structure of national Universities revised by the Act No. 15 of 2012 dated 11 July 2012. Accordingly, the name of this University has been altered. After the new revisions to the Act, this had become the Sri Lanka Bhiksu University. Along with the new revisions made to the Act, 2 faculties had been established, namely the faculty of Buddhist Studies and the faculty of Languages and Cultural Studies for which the approval of the Ministry of Higher Education had been obtained.

Message of Mahopadyaya Thera

Required funds are being provided annually to improve the infrastructure by Ministry of Higher Education in order to achieve the under mentioned aims and objectives of Sri Lanka *Bikku* University. As 100 *bikku* students still accommodated at the premises of *Nandana Mawatha* and 200 *bikku* students are accommodated at the hostels of new premises. Administrative activities have become tuff between these 02 premises. Further all the hostels of lectures including *Mahopadyaya Thera* also been located at the old premises. In this situation, a land in extent of 17 ½ acres has been granted by Ministry of Urban Development on our request to built hostels for both lectures and *bikku* students and however respective activities are delayed due to certain matters aroused in transferring the land concerned. Except all other basic needs required to ensure the smooth functioning of both academic and non academic activities are presently available at Sri Lanka *Bikku* University and required plans to construct new library building also been completed and handed over to the Ministry of Higher Education during this year. Moreover Buddhist Studies Faculty Building constructed at a cost of 177 million rupees was declared opened by H.E the president *Mahinda Rajapaksha* on 22.06.2013. Presently, the building concerned is totally deployed for respective work and on the same day the hostel building constructed at a cost of 76 million rupees also declared open. Further Language and Cultural Studies building with an estimated cost of 199 million rupees shows a progress of 71% by year 2013. Accordingly, required and expected infrastructure for the university could be completed at a satisfactory level. It is a pleasure that two new lecturers and three temporary lecturers could be recruited during this year and it is a positive step taken towards the development of human resources.

This university is in the run of becoming the apex institute among *Theravadi* higher education institutes in Asia and in the process of achieving the same it is committed to generate the scholars endowed with *Theravadi* traditional norms and practical knowledge and classical Dharma principals acquired through following western and eastern languages bounded with Buddhist philosophy.

During past few years the academic activities of this university was based on promoting facilities to get higher education for many *bikku* students, showing course of action to get an eminent knowledge on *Theravadi* Buddhism through studying sources, showing guidelines to get an understanding on basic teachings of non *Theravadi* Buddhist traditions, giving instructions to obtain training on research knowledge and practical knowledge, providing resource persons and conduct workshops to get more knowledge on Buddhism and Buddhist culture, offering required facilities to get language competencies , organizing discussions ,conferences and workshops to get an opinion on monks role and responsibility, promoting qualities required in creating religious amity and social service, providing balanced knowledge on other religions, broadening the classical status through external courses and *bikkus* on *Dhamma* propaganda campaigns in overseas.

Hence, this university also adhered to the procedures of other universities and accordingly 02 faculties namely Buddhist Studies Faculty and Language and Cultural Studying faculty was established as per the amendment Act No: 15 of 2012 and functioning under respective departments instead of studying divisions that were in operation so far.

As the functions of the university initiated in faculty mode, non academic staff for faculties as well as for other sections had to be recruited and accordingly two assistant registrars, four computer in put assistants and two persons were recruited for the post of cook that were vacant at that time.

In observation of the educational development of the university, it is very much significant that studies could be commenced as six months and course unit method for newly enrolled student *bikkus* in 2012 in terms of the plans of 2011. It was further established in 2013 as well. The same strategy is being reorganized through rectifying the mistakes. Publishing the 03rd volume of Buddhist academic book including certain publications of academic staff, conducting 02 workshops for academic staff and presenting 02 research papers by lectures of university for international level academic federations and publications of certain books printed by lectures of the university was taken place during this year.

Further, in 2013 a symposium was held with the theme of “Modern Buddhist Trends and Strengthening the *Theravadi* Buddhism in Sri Lanka” and research papers were presented by 03 researchers for the conference concerned.

In order to achieve the goals of the university, specially propagation of *Theravadi* Buddhism was highlighted and in the process a Chinese language certificate course was introduced as a new course together with the other available courses concerning while a measure of *Dhamma* propaganda campaigns and commencing the lectures of the same was taken place in year 2013.

Another significant activity carried out in this year is conducting a Tamil language training workshop as a 10 day residential training so as to enhance Tamil language skills of student *bikkus*.

In view of intensifying meditation among student *bikkus* a 04 day residential meditation programme was conducted for student *bikkus* of 01st year and 02nd year during this year.

Convocation No: 03 of this university was held at Pallekele International Buddhist Center on 03rd September 2013 and 115 students were awarded their degrees.

In respect of 105 *bikku* students enrolled for year 2012/2013 were directed to a 20 day leadership training programme during year 2013.

- To provide resource persons for lectures and workshops in order to gain prudence in Buddhism and Buddhist culture.
- To increase facilities required for obtaining proficiency pertaining to more effective languages.
- To organize discussions, seminars and workshops required to comprehend the value of a Buddhist monk and to comprehend the duties and responsibilities of a Buddhist monk.
- To create a background to gain traditional as well as critical knowledge on transferring the Dhamma, fulfilling the duties relating to the Buddhist Order and to conduct religious performances etc. and to foster an attitude endowed with piety or confidence on Buddhism.
- To assist to promote virtues required for missionary and academic services, religious co-existence and social services.
- To facilitate to gain a comparative knowledge of fundamental teachings of other religions.
- To assist to gain the classical teaching required for research activities.
- To create a Buddhist cultural centre and a milieu suitable for meditation.
- To increase the existing facilities for promotion of technical knowledge including knowledge relating to computers required for Buddhist education.
- To enhance the missionary and classical services of the university through external courses.
- To initiate action for local and foreign scholarships pertaining to courses.

4. Progress

Buddhasrawaka Bhiksu University Act No. 26 of 1966 was amended by (amendment) Act No. 15 of 2012 and said amendment introduced the administrative structure prevailing in other universities also to the University of Buddhasrawaka Bhiksu University. Two new faculties had been established consequent to the revision of the Act. Those two were identified as Buddhist Studies and Languages and Cultural Studies Faculties. The approval for the Ministry of Higher Education had been obtained in this connection.

The University had obtained significant development and progress under the human resources management during the year 2012. A venerable probationary bhiksu of the lecturing staff of the University had been confirmed in the post of lecturer. Meanwhile, applications were called for, and 2 venerable bhiksus had been recruited to the post of Probationary Lecturers and 3 venerable bhiksus had been recruited on temporary basis. Two venerable bhiksu of the lecturing staff were on study leave. One venerable bhiksu was following the Master of Philosophy degree in New Delhi, India and the other venerable bhiksu was following the Doctor of Philosophy degree at the University of Peradeniya. The venerable lecturers who had arrived to follow postgraduate degrees under the quality improvement of lecturing staff were engaged in academic activities.

Four computer operating assistants, two assistant registrars four drivers and two posts of cooks existing vacancies had been recruited to the permanent non-academic staff.

During the year 2013, two special training workshops had been conducted for the professional development of Academic, Administration and Non-Academic staff of the University. Meanwhile, the lecturing staff had been referred to various institutions for training courses.

The Buddhist Study faculty building constructed at a cost of Rs. Mn 268 was declared opened by H.E. The President. The state of art new hostel has been established in the new premise where 96 student bhiksus can be accommodated and the said hostel was declared opened by Hon. Minister of higher education in parallel with declared opening of faculty building of Buddhist Studies. Accordingly academic activities conducted at the premise of Nandana Mawatha was shifted to the faculty of Buddhist Study at new premise. Construction of 71% Faculty building of Languages has already been completed at an estimated cost of Rs.Mn, 368.

This University conducts two degree course, namely, B.A. (General) and B.A. (Special). During the year 2013, 26 student bhiksus had obtained B.A. (General) degrees and 14 student bhiksus had obtained B.A. (Special) degrees.

Three hundred and ninety seven students had registered themselves for external courses conducted by the University during the year 2013. Primarily, an external certificate course named Information and Media Technology commenced during this year with a view to improve the information technology knowledge of students residing in the North Central Province.

With the objectives of improving the computer knowledge of student bhiksus of academic year 2013, an information based course was introduced as a compulsory paper for student bhiksus of the first year. Meanwhile, two information technology courses to improve the computer knowledge of academic and non academic staff was commenced at the University on the month of January 2013.

4 (a) Aims that could not be achieved

Although applications were called through news paper advertisements in order to fill 03 posts of professor that have been vacant in the university, however no applications have received for the same hitherto. Further permanent officers could not be appointed to 03 main positions of this university namely registrar, bursar and librarian up to now and specially posts of registrar and bursar have been filled by two officers who have recruited under seven year leave basis.

Part of the student *bikkus* are accommodated at the premises of *Nalanda Mawatha* while the other part is at new premises of *Manamunawatta* and lecturer *theros* are given accommodation at *Nalanda Mawatha* premises. Location of hostels at two different palaces is really creating problems in administration. As a resolving measure a land in extent of 17 ½ acres being the plot Nos: 236 and 241 and FCP 1400 situated in *Isurumuniya* village in *Wessagiriya* division of *Nuwaragampalatha* Central divisional secretary division has been given to the university and how ever as unauthorized residents are reluctant to leave the place have caused problems in commencing the constructions. A request has been made to *Nuwaragampalatha* Central divisional secretary to get the matter solved even producing the same before magistrate court.

4. (b) Future Plans

Vision to be adhered in future development of the institute designed in terms of the vision mission and objectives of the university for the period from 2012-2016 has been presented through compact plan.

In this compact plan, strategies are clearly shown in respect of improving education, student and staff welfare etc. Further more attention is drawn on development of the quality of studies and researches.

In addition to this it is expected to generate at least certificate holders related to Tamil, Japanese, Chinese languages, Information Technology, communication and mass communication.

It has been planned to publish selected academic researches of lecturers through internet, publish certain selected tutorials of students through internet, and conduct subjective researches under archeology and practical Buddhist studies in year 2014. Initiatives have taken to allocate required funds for the same.

Publish research papers to enhance the theoretical and research skills of lecturers, publish academic volumes and arrange educational tours are also expected to carry out. Further it is scheduled to send 20 student *bikkus* to Thailand to do a study on *Theravadi* Buddhist traditions in that country and at the same time to send 20 student *bikkus* to Myanmar to study meditation techniques in that country as well.

Moreover, initiatives have been taken to train student *bikkus* who are capable of conducting sermons in Tamil language through the assistance of Tamil instructors under the patronage of the Ministry of National Integration.

Under the project of broadening the studies of the university, Educationist (Special) degree programme will be commenced in year 2014 and practical programmes are scheduled to be commenced in order to promote meditation among student *bikkus* of the university and “*Pindapatha*” programmes will be organized twice a year.

Through expediting the construction of language faculty building that is in progress at the moment and the faculty concerned which is being housed in Buddhist studies faculty will be shifted to the new building in upcoming year. In addition to this construction of library building will be commenced during year 2014.




Details of financial grants from the treasury to the University from 2001 to 2013 (Capital)



Details of expenditure from recurrent provision of the University from 1999 to 2013




Details of expenditure from Capital provision of the University from 1999 to 2013



01. The report on accounts for the year 2013 is presented in terms of Section 46 of the Sri Lanka Bhiksu University Amended Act, No. 15 of 2012 and the Finance Act, No. 38 of 1971.
02. Accounts have been prepared and prepared and presented by maintaining accounting concepts ,consistency,going concern ,accrual basis and .following the generally accepted accounting assumptions ,principles standards and practices which are usually adhered to in presenting accounts.
03. The following notes are extracted from the accounts of 2013 of the Sri Lanka Bhiksu University. Recurrent and Capital aid of Rs.288,750,000 had been obtained by the University from the Treasury.

 - iii. Loans amounting to Rs.7,729,970.48, had been granted under the Loans Fund for employees of the University. Their, Employees' Provident Fund is kept as sureties.
 - iv. The years' investments in deposits at state banks amounted to Rs.10,654,922.71. It represents money received as researches and donations. The investment are Research Fund of Rs.3,057,511.01 in National Savings Bank, Donation Fund of Rs.1,075,552.02 in National Savings Bank, Mahopadhyaya Fund of Rs.1,662,694.64, in National Savings Bank, donations of Rs.1,289,884.72,Donation Fund Of Rs.439,937.30 in People's Bank, external courses collections of Rs.3,092,393.79 in National Savings Bank and other money amounting to Rs.36,946.23 in National Savings Bank.
 - v. A sum of Rs. 3,493,839.51 had been earned from internal activities of the Sri Lanka Bhiksu University during the year.
 - vi. The fixed assets including work in progress showed a net value of Rs.740,805,152.33.
 - vii. Balance of stock of stores amounted to Rs.1,273,785.45 This had been confirmed by physical verifications carried out at end of the year. Issues of stocks are carried out on First in First out method.
 - viii. The bank balance at end of the year was Rs.2,071,124.36. It had been fully utilized to meet the accrued expenses in the first quarter of the ensuing year. The bank balance agreed with the accounts and the balances had been certified correct.

04. According to Section 10 of the Amended Sri Lanka Bhiksu University Act, No. 15 of 2012, the Employees' Provident Fund is maintained by the University. A separate report on accounts is prepared on this behalf.
05. The variances with regard to actual expenditure pertaining to recurrent expenditure heads had been adjusted with provisions approved by the Council.
06. Fixed assets shown without balances of values had been revalued and entered in to books and Balance assets belongs to the university, had been Submitted to the Department of Valuation for revaluation.
07. The service charge of 1% amounting to Rs. 6,933,712 paid to the Urban Development Authority for approving the plan of the new construction work of the University had been shown as work-in-progress in the accounts.

03. Provision had been made for payment of gratuity. The provision made as at 31.12.2013 was Rs.14,111,352 (Provision had been made from the initial year of the employees in order to compute the actual expenditure).

04. New Administrative Building

Construction of the Senate building in the new University premises has already been completed by the State Engineering Corporation and it had been handed over to the University. Payments had not been made as the consultants had not certified the final bills. However, the value relating to the final bill had been included in the Buildings Account with the objective of showing the value of assets belonging to the University. Arrears payable had been shown under creditors.

05. University Provident Fund

A separate Provident Fund is maintained for employees of the University as per provisions in the Act.

06. Amount recoverable from Lecturers for breach of Agreement

The amount recoverable from the Provident Fund had been fully recovered and accounted for ,with reference to the amount due from Rev Polpitiye Gnanaransi Thero for breach of agreement. A sum of Rs.312,375.97 is still due from the Venerable Thero. Legal action are been made for recovering and verdict for the same has not been received yet

07. Goods valued at Rs.9,138.40 recommended to be destroyed had not been destroyed yet and it had been shown as balance stock.

08.Revaluation of fixed Assets

Fixed assets shown without balances of values had beenrevalued and entered in to books and Balance assets belongs to the university, had been Submitted to the Department of Valuation for revaluation

09. Previous year's expenditure are incurred from the General Reserve with the approval of the Council.

10. Liabilities

One trishaw (YC1136) owned by the University met with an accident in the year 2012 and third party has claimed a compensation amounting Rs.500,000.00 .The same case is being handled by Sri Lanka Insurance cooperation And the procedure is still going on. As per Lay's impression ,liabilities over the same cannot be determined.

11. Accounting of Government Aid

Government Aid-Recurrent Aid have been stated as receipt revenue and expenditure report

Rehabilitation and capital Aid have been identified as receipt and work in progress and capital assets represented by these .In Accounting the government Aid, the University has adhered the revenue access (according to accounting standard No.10)
