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
Introduction

The Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka which had been established by the Parliamentary Act No.74 of 1981 of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka was inaugurated at No.214, Baudhaloka Mawatha, Colombo 07 on the 22nd April 1982. The major objectives in the establishment of this University are to publizise the Buddhist Doctrine, to promote the Buddhist and Pali Studies in Sri Lanka as well as in foreign countries and to facilitate researches in the respective fields.

The above Act has been amended by the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka (Amendment) Act No. 37 of 1995. With the enforcement of the said Amendments, the local affiliated Institutions have been invalidated and the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka had undergone the process of re-structuring to comply with the structure found in the other National Universities of Sri Lanka and it has been established in Homagama in the Month of June while the External Examinations and Post Graduate Studies Centre of the University has been established at the premises located in Baudhaloka Mawatha, Colombo 7. The Academic Premises with hostels has been established at Pitipana, Homagama and the Administration Centre (Head Office) has been established at No. 37, Moragahahena Road, Pitipana on 12.08.2010. The required initiatives have already been taken for transforming the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka in to a fully equipped University with international recognition. The University has obtained the membership of the Association of Commonwealth Universities and it is an Associated Member of the Committee of Vice Chancellors and Directors (C.V.C.D.) of the University System of the Country.

The Message of the Venerable Mahopadyaya Thero

The Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka, which is currently operated under the purview of the Ministry of Higher Education is a University functions by the Act No. 74 of 1981 and the Act (Amendment) No. 37 of 1995. The University which inherits a history of 30 years and has achieved national and international recognition, holds the membership of the Association of Commonwealth Universities and the Committee of Vice Chancellors and Directors (C.V.C.D.) of the University System of the Country. Academic and Research activities of the internal students of the University are performed in the premises located at Gurulugomi Mawatha, Pitipana, Homagama while External Examination Activities are carried out at the Post Graduate and External Examination Studies Centre situated in Bauddhaloka Mawatha Colombo 07. The foremost Objective of this University in terms of the Act is to produce disciplined scholars who are appropriate to promote the Studies of Pali and Buddhist Philosophy in Sri Lanka as well as in foreign countries.



Academic as well as research activities of the Buddhist and Pali University are carried out by 8 Departments of Study under the two Faculties of Buddhist Studies and Language Studies. I am pleased to mention that the availability of Senior Professors, Professors, Senior Lecturers and Graduates with Doctorate Degrees among the Academic Staff which is approximately 50 members has contributed positively for uplifting the quality of the academic and research activities.

The Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka which is perfected with the aforementioned Human Resources as well as fully equipped library facilities, Lecture hall facilities with modern accessories and residential facilities provides a proper academic and research environment. Thereby, a large number of local and foreign lay and clergy students register with the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka annually with the objective following Courses.

The Courses of the University has been designed with the objective of producing scholars who befit the modern world with knowledge and discipline through broadening the wisdom in subjects and practical usage. Likewise, the attention has been focussed on introducing novel courses by identifying new requirements. Further, we have drawn our attention to produce scholars useful to the world through functioning with the identification of the national and international requirements by updating the prevailing Courses. Hence, the facilities required for teaching the oriental and western Languages such as Tamil, Hindi, Chinese, Japanese, Korean and French in addition to the English Language. In parallel to nourishing the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka with Human resources as well as Physical Resources, functioning for building a proper world through bestowing the World with scholars equipped with wisdom and Discipline through utilization of such resources is our utmost duty. I greatly appreciate the cooperation extended by the Government and the commitment of the Academic and Non-academic staffs and the compatibility of students.

11 Meetings of the Committee on Study Leave were held during the year 2014.

Progress/ (Achievements)

- Construction of a hostel for 200 foreign students.
- Making arrangements to expand the space requirement by constructing an extension to the Faculty Administration building.
- 10 Foreign Affiliated Institutions have already been established and 140 foreign students are currently following the Courses.
- 53 foreign students are following internal courses in the University while 247 foreign students are following external courses in the University.
- Internal Degree Courses are being executed under the Unit System and the Syllabuses of Internal Degree Courses have been updated and newly revised.
- Counselling, Meditation Programmes and Ascetic Programmes have been implemented.
- Commencement and implementation of Courses in Languages, Counselling, Astrology and Computer Technology which will be assisting in the improvement of skills of all the internal students. Accordingly, eight (08) Certificate, Higher Certificate and Diploma Courses are been carried out for internal Students.
- A Pali Dictionary is being compiled.
- Transferring a land to the extent of two acres out of the land owned by the Department of Agriculture located at Gabadawatte.

Post Graduate Degrees and External Programmes

- The total number of students following external courses is 6,692 and 247 students out of the total students are foreign students.
- Providing the opportunity for Graduates who have obtained their First Degree to fulfill their Post Graduate qualifications.
- Introduction of two year Courses for Master of Arts and for Post Graduate Degrees with a view to fulfilling Post Graduate Degree requirement.
- Conducting 11 Courses at the Post Graduate and External Examination Studies Centre.



Utilization of Capital Provisions

- Preparation of the Master Plan.
- Establishment of the PABX Telephone System which inter-connects the Faculty Administration Complex of the University Situated in Homagama, Hostel Complex and the major Administration Building complex.
- Implementation of a Project for purification of wastewater collected at the University premises and to discharge the purified water to the Environment.
- Installation of lightning conductor system.
- Commencement of the renovation activities of the Post Graduate and External Examinations Studies Centre.

Development of Human Resources

- Making arrangements to increase the Academic Staff quantitatively and qualitatively by the recruitment of 10 Members to the Academic Staff.
- Monthly submission of research papers of the lecturers for professional development workshops of the Academic Staff.
- 98 Researches, Publications and Papers have been published by the Academic Staff during the year 2014.
- Trainings have been provided to the Non-Academic Staff by offering them with training courses internally and externally for uplifting the efficiency of the Non-Academic Staff. Accordingly, three training programmes have been conducted inside the University premises and 23 Non-Academic Staff members have been directed to external institutions in 34 instances for training programmes.
- 11 officers have been newly recruited to the Non-Academic Staff.

- Increasing the number of foreign students following the Courses in the University up to 200.
- Development of class rooms with the intention of maintaining the Methodology of Student Based Learning along with the Modern Technological Facilities.
- Establishment of the Second Language Laboratory.
- Expansion of local and international Dhamma Communication Activities.
- Provision of residential facilities to the Academic and Non-academic Staffs.
- Construction of a Centre for Mental Exercises with a Dhamma Hall for the development of the skills of under-graduates.
- Further promotion of Foreign Affiliated Institutions.



- Improvement of the knowledge in Foreign Languages, Information Technology and Researches required for the Buddhist Studies.
- Reaching the Goals of the Institution through the expansion of opportunities required for the accomplishment of Objectives of the University by making amendments to the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka Act.
- Improvement of the opportunities of studies and researches that can be directed towards achieving the Religious and Social Reconciliation.
- Designing the Server Room with the accessories required for networking.



1) Specific Accounting Principles

1.1 General Principals

1.1.1 Institutional Entity

The Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka has been established by the Act No.74 of 1981 and the Act has been amended by the Act (Amendment) No. 37 of 1995. The Study Unit of the University is situated in Pitipana North, Gurulugomi Mawatha, Homagama while its Administration building is located at No. 37 of Moragahahena Road, Pitipana, Homagama. The External Examinations and Post Graduate Studies Centre of the University is situated at No.214 of Bauddhaloka Mawatha, Colombo 07.

1.1.2 Fundamental Activities and the Nature of the Operations

Vision

To be the foremost and most excellent Buddhist University in the World.

Statement of Mission

Bestowing the World with Versatile Buddhist Missionaries and Scholars capable of promoting and fostering in Sri Lanka as well as in Foreign Countries the Philosophy of Life, which is perspicuous by the Dhamma of the Lord-Buddha and well disciplined with the influence of the Buddhist Doctrine, Pali Language and the Wisdom achieved on the related Subjects and perfected with different Skills.

This University has been established under the Ministry of Higher Education and is mainly operated with the Provisions of the Government.

The University where local lay and clergy students as well as foreign clergy students are following Degree Courses is comprised of two Faculties, namely, Buddhist Studies Faculty and Language Studies faculty.

Students are consistently encouraged by the University to follow the Post Graduate Degrees and to conduct Researches.



1.1.3 Basis of Preparation.

(a) Statement of Conformity

The Final Financial Statements have been prepared as per the Sri Lanka Public Service Accounting Standards (SLPSAS) and the Principles adopted in the previous years, the Financial Act No. 38 of 1971 and the Establishments Code have been made applicable whenever necessary.

In addition, the following Circulars which have been made applicable to the University by the Administration Council of the University from time to time have been also used for the purpose of recording Accounts.

- * Circulars issued by the University Grants Commission (UGC).
- * Circulars on the Principles of Public Enterprises.

(b) Basis of Estimation

Estimations have not been made based on the change in the monetary value except in instances which have been specifically mentioned and the Financial Statements have been prepared on the Historical Cost Basis.

(c) The Currency used in the preparation of the Financial Statements

Values have been estimated in Rupees and Cents used in Sri Lanka and action has been taken to round off the Financial Statements to the last Rupee.

1.2 Assets and Evaluation of assets

1.2.1. Identification of Assets

- (a) Assets have been reported to the value obtained subsequent to deducting the accumulated depreciation from the cost of assets such as Property, Plant and Equipment.
- (b) These assets have been mentioned on the cost of purchasing or the cost of construction including the basic expenditure incurred.

1.2.2 Depreciation of Assets

- (a) I. Fixed Assets have been depreciated using the Straight-line Method as per the University Grants Commission Circular No. 649 and have been

- III. If assets are further utilized when the value of such assets have become zero (0) level after the assets are depreciated, such assets are revalued and the value is recorded as Non- current Assets and the revaluation surplus is transferred to the Revaluation Reserve Account.
- IV. The bus in the possession of the University has been revalued for Rs. 750,000 in the year 2014 and the said value is added to the accounts.
- V. The hostel for foreign students (Sarasavi Mandura), gifted by the Ministry of Higher education has been assigned over to the University by now.

- (b) (1) Actions are taken to write off within the five years starting from the year 2012, the balance of the capital Grants Account of the Government commenced from the year 2011 in relation to the vehicles provided by the General Treasury in the year 2011 on the Hire Purchase Basis.

- (c) **Buldings under the Turn key Project of the University**

1.2.3 Evaluation of Stocks.

- (1) The stock in the stores have been evaluated on the Purchased Price and the stocks are issued on First in First out Basis.
- (11) The relevant allocations have been made in the year 2012 for the slow moving items to the value of Rs.71, 594 and for Nonmoving items to the value of Rs.12, 635.

1.2.4 Investments

- i. One Fixed Deposit and one Savings Account have been commenced for Fixed and Savings Accounts that existed separately for each Scholarship and Prize Funds which already existed for Scholarships and Prizes obtained by the University on the approval of the Administration Council. Scholarships are offered annually, based on the interest accrued in relation to the opening Deposit.
- ii. A new fixed deposit to the value of Rs. 1,620,000 has been initiated for Jiyun Buddhist Research and Publications Fund.
- iii. A new fixed deposit to the value of Rs. 5,250,000 has been initiated for the Mahopadyaya Fund.
- iv. A Fixed Deposit to the value of Rs. 8,500,000 has been initiated from the income earned from External Examinations.
- v. A Fixed Deposit to the value of Rs. 550,000 has been initiated from the interests received from the investing of the Mahopadyaya Fund and the external project funds.
- vi. The amount of money allocated for the Funds for Medical Assistance will be deposited in Fixed Deposit Accounts and the interest earned from it



annually will be transferred to the University's Recurrent Account to settle Recurrent Expenditure.

1.3 Liabilities and Allocations

- (a) The Retirement Gratuity Fund No. 12 of 1983 has been made applicable to the University and provisions have been allocated for the year 2011 for the payment of Service Gratuities.

It has been decided to write off such Capital expenses within (from 2013) 3 years since the students admitted to the University leave the University within 3 years.

(b) Expenditure incurred for the development of skills of the Non – academic and Academic Staff are considered as Capital Expenditure and recorded in Accounts under Skills Development It has been decided to write off the Capital expenditure in four years when it is not in conformity with the contract.

1.7 Paying Taxes

The university has been exempted from paying income tax under the section 7(b) of the Inland Revenue Act No. 10 of 2006.

1.8 Identification of Sources of Income

The income has been calculated on the accumulated basis and monetary basis when recorded in accounts.

1.9 Expenditure

Expenditure incurred for bursaries and Mahapola have been recorded in Accounts. Other expenses have been identified timely and recorded in Accounts.

The Report of the Auditor General on the Financial Statements of the Sri Lanka Buddhist and Pali University prepared for the Year Ended 31st December 2014 in terms of Section 14 (2) (C) of the Finance Act No. 38 of 1971.

The audit of financial statements of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka for the year ended 31 December 2014 comprising the Statement on the Financial Position as at 31 December 2014 and the Statement on the Financial Performance, statement of changes in equity and cash flow statement for the year then ended and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory Information was carried out under my direction in pursuance of provisions in Article 154(1) of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka read in conjunction with Section 13(1) of the Finance Act, No. 38 of 1971 and Section 38 of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka Act No. 74 of 1981. My comments and observations which I consider should be published with the Annual Report of the University in terms of Section 14(2)(c) of the Finance Act, appear in this report. A detailed Report in terms of Section 13(7)(a) of the Finance Act will be furnished to the Venerable Mahopaddyaya Thero of the University in due course.

1.2 Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles and for such internal control as the management determines is necessary to enable the preparation



of financial statements that are free from material misstatements whether due to fraud or error.

1.3 Auditor's Responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards which are in conformity with the International Auditing Standards of the Supreme Audit Institutions. Those Standards require that I comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatements of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements of the University in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the internal control of the University. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. Sub - sections (3 and 4) of Section 13 of the Finance Act, No. 38 of 1971 give discretionary power to the Auditor General to determine the scope and the extent of the audit.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my qualified audit opinion.

1.4 Basis for Qualified Opinion

My opinion is qualified based on the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of this report.



2. Financial statements

2.1 Qualified Opinion

In my opinion, except for the effects of the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of this report, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka as at 31 December 2014 and its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with the Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards.

2.2 Comments on the Financial Statements

2.2.1 Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards

Even though all the assets, liabilities, income and expenditure have to be included in the Financial Statements at the fair value, arrangements have not been made to account the fair value by revaluating the assets to the cost of Rs.4,681,438, which have been fully depreciated though they are still being utilized.

2.2.2 Accounting Policies

Even though it has been revealed in the financial statements that making adjustments in compliance with the time considering the time period applicable to the purchase, construction and disposal of assets in adjusting the depreciation applicable to the identified assets is the Policy adopting in the computation of the depreciation, the University has adopted the policy of depreciation for several classes of Noncurrent Assets starting from the date of purchasing while adopting the Policy of Depreciation for the whole year without considering the date of purchasing of the other classes of assets.



2.2.3 Accounting Deficiencies

The following observations were made.

- (a) An amount of Rs.624,378 for the depreciation of buildings for the year under review has been over stated due to errors made in calculation.
- (b) Even though the Depreciation has to be calculated subsequent to estimating the time through which the vehicles revalued and owned by the University can be used effectively after the revaluation, the accuracy of annual depreciations had not been substantiated due to the depreciation of revalued vehicles using the depreciation ratios applicable to new vehicles.
- (c) In accounting the revaluation of assets, the University had not identified the cost and accumulated depreciation correctly. The revaluation surplus had been under stated by Rs.11,863,188 as per the computations made at the Audit.
- (d) The Revenue Expenditure of Rs.1,749,762 incurred in the revaluation had been debited to the Buildings Account as a Capital Expenditure.
- (e) Accrued Expenditure of Rs.1,232,684 which was the total related to the Year under review had been accounted as the expenditure for the year 2015.
- (f) Expenditure for Gratuity and allocation for Gratuity for the year under review had been under stated by Rs. 1,356,236 due to non-allocation of provisions for Gratuity for officers who had not completed a service of 5 years.
- (g) Even though an amount of Rs. 35,035 from the imprest of Rs. 50,000 provided to an officer of the Institution for incurring postal expenses had been saved at the end of the Year, it had not been mentioned in final accounts as a money balance.
- (h) In the preparation of Financial Statements, an amount of Rs. 4,930,839 for the Cost for Salaries and Rs. 1,571,407 for the cost for stationary related to the External Examinations Division had been accounted as a Cost in the Internal Division and depreciation for assets used by the External Examinations Division had not been identified. Even though a surplus of Rs. 5, 664,049 had been indicated for the External Examinations Division, it is not possible to satisfy with the accuracy of it.
- (i) The Uncompleted Works Account had been under stated by Rs. 3,867,814 due to the transfer of only the amount paid to the supplier without retainer and advances for



- the rectification of the error of debiting the value of interim bills paid for building projects not completed during the financial year to the Buildings Account.
- (j) Expenses to a sum of Rs. 12,487,566 incurred for the renovation and maintenance of buildings in the nature of revenue had been accounted as capital expenditure.
- (k) Even though goods to the cost of Rs. 674,653 which had been purchased for maintenance activities were remaining at the end of the year under review, the goods had not been accounted as balance in stock but had been written off against the profit.
- (l) Though the Expenditure generated during the year under review but unpaid could be accrued as an expenditure of the Financial year, expenditure to the value of Rs. 2,025,064, the accumulated value for the financial Year had been accrued based on a report compiled using the values indicated in the expenditure estimates of each Course of the External Examinations Division, which were not actually generated values.
- (m) A physical verification of stocks had not been carried out for stocks of publications as at 31 December 2014. The value of stock had been under stated by Rs. 568,020 due to indicating the value of Stock of publications which was Rs. 946,700 according to the report of the Assistant Registrar who was in charge of stocks of publications as Rs. 378,680 in Financial Statements.
- (n) The balance of Rs. 1,249,213 which had been deferred in the previous year through the External courses had been further maintained as a deferred income without identifying it as an income of the Year under review.

2.2.4 Unreconciled Control Accounts

Even though the balance of distressed loan as per the Statement of Financial Position as at 31st December of the Year under review was Rs. 2,751,099, a difference of Rs. 372,915 was reported in the balance of the distressed loan since the balance was Rs. 2,944,014 according to the List of individual balances.



2.2.5 Non availability of Evidences for the Audit

Evidences were not submitted to the Audit to substantiate the projects for which the balances of Rs. 8,756,861 payable to the Central Engineering Consultancy Bureau (CECB) and Rs. 1,239,426 payable to the State Engineering Corporation which had expired more than 5 years and included in the retained balances on contracts included in the Financial Statements, had been retained.

2.3 Transactions not Substantiated by Adequate Authority

Extraneous to the Government approved salaries and allowances, a sum of Rs. 988,600 had been paid to the non-academic staff as allowances while not having an adequate surplus from the income earned from three Courses related to the External Projects conducted by the University without complying with the Circular No. 95 dated 14th June 1994 of the Department of Public Enterprises.

2.4 Non – Compliance with Laws, Rules, Regulations and Management Decisions

The following instances of noncompliance with the following Laws, Rules, regulations and Management Decisions were observed.

3. Financial Review

3.1 Financial Results

3.2 Legal Actions Instituted against the University

08 cases have been filed in Courts of Law by employees against the University due to dismissal from service on various grounds and not providing Posts.

4. Operational Review

4.1 Performance

Even though the training of Scholars on the Buddhism and on the rules of discipline for the priesthood for publicizing the Religion of Buddhism in Sri Lanka as well as in foreign countries and for fostering the Buddhist missionary activities, the attraction of foreign students for obtaining internal degrees was drastically declined when compared with that of in the previous years.

4.2 The Cost per Student

The total recurrent expenditure incurred for 359 students for the academic activities during the year under review was Rs.235,642,269 and the total recurrent expenditure incurred for 333 students during the previous year was Rs.190,592,915. The cost per student was Rs.656,385 in the year under review and it was an increase of 14.68 percent when compared with Rs.572,351 which was the cost per student in the previous year.



4.3 Management Inefficiencies

The following observations were made.

- (a) In the promotion of a Lecturer in Grade II to Grade I on the basis of a self-evaluation Report as per the Circular No. 721 dated 21 November 1997, the promotion of the Lecturer in Grade II to Grade I has been made by antedating for four years as an approved methodology had not been designed by the Administrative Council for the determination of the date of promotion.
- (b) Two Sub wardens were recruited on the contract basis for covering duties of the Sub wardens of hostels who had been transferred to the Ministry for disciplinary inquiries. Even though the permanent Sub wardens had been re-employed subsequent to the end of the disciplinary inquiries, one of the Sub wardens recruited on contract basis had been employed further by extending the period of contract. The requirement of extending the contract appointment was not clarified in the Audit and an amount of Rs. 161,320 had been uneconomically paid to the above Sub warden as salaries until 02nd July 2015.
- (c) Having obtained a Degree obtained from a recognized University is the minimum qualification for the recruitment of an officer for a Post of Computer Instructor of Grade II. However, a person who had not fulfilled the said minimum qualification had been recruited to a Post of Computer Instructor Grade II by the University with effect from 08th October 2012. 17 applicants who had fulfilled the basic requirement had applied for this Post and applicants who had completed the Degree with the Subject of Information Technology were among those applicants and therefore, the reasons for recruiting the aforementioned applicant who had not even submitted a Degree Certificate, could not be revealed at the Audit.
- (d) An officer who had been appointed as an Assistant Registrar of the University with effect from 12th July 2004 had been removed from the service during his probationary



period on 27th January 2009 making various accusations against him and without conducting a Disciplinary Inquiry. The officer had filed cases in the Human Rights Commission on two instances against the extension and termination of the probationary period and the Human Rights Commission had ordered to reinstate the Officer in the Service and to provide him with the other concessions entrusted to him. It had been informed through the Circular No. 17/2005 dated 05th October 2005 that the decisions taken by the Human Rights Commission had to be executed and it has also been notified through the letter of the Secretary to the President bearing No. E&O/AC/1/8/6 dated 10th October 2014 that the Cabinet of Ministers had to be notified in case the decisions of the Human Rights Commission would not be executed. However action had not been taken accordingly.

- (e) A newspaper advertisement had been published with a view to recruiting a Lecturer (Probationary) for the subject of Sanskrit in the Department of Cultural and Languages Studies and a Board had been appointed to conduct a structured interview for the selection of a qualified person. The Post of Lecturer had been awarded to the person who was in the fifth position according to the merit order of marks without recruiting the person who had scored the highest marks according to the interview Mark sheet. The reason for filling the vacancy in an irregular and unlawful manner was not clarified at the Audit. An Applicant who was alleged to have been treated unfairly due to this reason had filed a case against the University.
- (f) Projects pertaining to a sum of Rs. 915,262 which had exceeded a period in between 2 to 5 years after paying advances had not been implemented and the institution had not taken action to recover the advance amount or performance bonds from the responsible officers or to take legal action against such officers.

4.4 Operational Inefficiencies



The following observations were made.

- (a) The balance of Scholarships and Prizes Fund Investment Savings Account as at 31 December 2014 was Rs. 2,154,522 and the amount had been maintained as a savings deposit without investing it.
- (b) Jiun Buddhist Research and Publications Fund established for assisting the researches only in the fields of Buddhist Studies and Pali language had not been used to accomplish the relevant objective subsequent to the year 2006 and the balance of the Fund at the end of the year under review was Rs. 2,134,222.
- (c) A Committee had been appointed for the verification of Library books during the year 2013 and a deficit of 4224 library books was observed as per the report of the Committee. Even though the value of deficit has to be adjusted using accounts subsequent to taking necessary action by investigating the reasons for the deficit and by identifying the parties responsible, procedures in that regard had not been taken.

4.5 Under-utilization of Funds

A balance exceeding Rs. 20 Million was available in the Monetary Account maintained for Capital Expenditure as at the last date of the Year 2014 due to obtaining treasury provisions without forecasting the requirements of funds properly.

4.6 Idle and Under Utilized Assets

The following observations were made.

- (a) Even though infrastructure facilities including modernized buildings equipped with all the facilities have been improved incurring a cost of Rs. 512 Million starting from the year 2004, plans had not been designed to use the facilities.
- (b) A Fax Machine, a Clerical Table and 02 water filter stands to the values of Rs.30,240, Rs.19,100 and 27,866 respectively had been stored for a period of 08 months to 31



months as capital goods had not been purchased on necessity. The reasons for purchasing these goods without a necessity was not clarified at the Audit.

5. Accountability and Good Governance

5.1 Procurement Plan

11 items of goods out of 35 items of goods that had been scheduled to be purchased according to the Procurement Plan for the Year under review had not been purchased and 27 items of goods to the cost of Rs. 8,978,551 had been purchased without being conformed to the procurement plan. Accordingly, it was observed that the procurement plan had not been used as an effective financial controlling agent.

6. Systems and Controls

The deficiencies in systems and controls observed at the Audit were brought to the attention of the Venerable Mahopaddyaya Thero of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka. The special attention has to be focused on the following fields of control.

- (a) Management of Assets
- (b) Constructions
- (c) Human Resources Management
- (d) Accounting related to the external Projects
- (e) Controlling of Vehicles

The Report of the Auditor General on the Financial Statements of the Sri Lanka Buddhist and Pali University prepared for the Year Ended 31st December 2014 in terms of Section 14 (2) (C) of the Finance Act No. 38 of 1971.

2.2 Comments on the Financial Statements
-----**2.2.1 Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards**

Agreed. Necessary instruction have been issued to include in the Accounts prepared for the year 2015 after revaluating.

2.2.2 Accounting Policies

(a) Agreed. Necessary instructions have been issued to implement the Depreciation Policy according to the standards with effect from the year 2015.

2.2.3 Accounting Deficiencies

(a) Not agreed. Since the expenditure of Rs. 12,487,566/= incurred on the renovation and maintenance of buildings under the rehabilitation and improvement of capital assets is a capital expenditure, a sum of Rs. 624,378/= has been accounted as the allocation for the relevant depreciation.

(b) Since the useful life has not been mentioned in the revaluation of vehicles, the depreciation has been effected on the policy which has already been adhered to and such depreciation has been accounted.

(c) Agreed. Necessary instructions have been issued to investigate into the revaluation surplus that was pointed out and to rectify the same in the future.



- (d) Agreed. Accordingly, instructions have been issued to make relevant rectifications.
- (e) The expenditure of Rs. 1,232,684/= pointed out in the financial year 2014 is a collection of 35 vouchers and a sum of Rs. 147,700/= out of the amount has been accounted as accrued expenses and since vouchers related to the rest of the expenses had been received by the Finance Division in the Month of February, such expenditure has been accounted for the year 2015.
- (f) Agreed. Necessary instructions have been issued to make arrangements in accordance with the relevant accounting standards with effect from the next year.
- (g) Agreed. Necessary instructions have been issued to make relevant rectifications in the Year 2015.
- (h) I would like to inform you that it is expected to open a separate account for the External Examinations and Post Graduate Studies Division with effect from 01.01.2016. Accordingly, I would like to inform you that this will lead to submit accounting activities of the External Examinations Division much clearly in the future.
- (i) The advance amount of Rs. 4,219,824/= paid to the supplier is included in the sum of Rs. 12,698,921/=:, which is the value of interim bills paid for the building projects which were not completed. The sum of Rs. 1,037,047/=:, the amount retained has only been mentioned in short. Measures necessary for the relevant rectification have been taken.
- (j) The sum has been accounted as a rehabilitation and improvement of assets under capital expenditure.
- (k) Not agreed. Not included in accounts.
- (l) Even though it had been scheduled to incur expenditure for external projects in the year 2014, an unspent amount of Rs.2,025,064/= until 31.12.2014 has been mentioned as accrued expenses.
- (m) Agreed. The amount of discount (40%) provided for the stock of publications has only been stated in the account.
- (n) Necessary Action has been taken to keep accounts for the sum of Rs. 1,249,213/= deferred in the previous year through the external courses, as an income in the



year 2015. Since it has been scheduled to conduct only one course of study for two years and the rest of the Courses would be completed within one year, the income earned from such Courses had been accounted as the income of the year and only the income earned from the course of Buddhist Counseling conducted for Police Officers had been deferred for the following year.

2.2.4 Unreconciled Control Accounts

Agreed. Necessary measures have been taken to rectify this in the future.

2.2.5 Non availability of Evidences for the Audit

It is expected to take action in this regard subsequent to obtaining a recommendation from the Administrative Council.

2.3 Transactions not Substantiated by Adequate Authority

Not agreed. According to the Accounting Reports, it is obvious that there is an adequate excess for the payment of allowances. Accordingly, this cannot be accepted as a management inefficiency. Likely, the Director General of the Department of National Budget had informed us through his letter dated 25.06.2014 on the heading of Maintenance of a Fund for Post Graduate and External Examination Courses and incurring its expenditure that they have no objection pertaining to the maintenance and administration of a Fund for Post Graduate Degrees and External Examination Courses in terms of Provisions stipulated in Sub section (2) (i) of Section 17 of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka Act. No. 74 of 1981 in responding the letter dated 01.04.2014 sent by the Venerable Mahopadyaya Thero on the above heading. Accordingly, the administrative functions of the Fund are performed as per the instructions issued by the Administrative Council.

2.4 Non – Compliance with Laws, Rules, Regulations and Management Decisions

(a)

- (1) A Register on Lecture Records including the information on Lectures conducted as per a fixed time table, viz name / signature / date / time / subject code of the



lecturer and signature of student is maintained by each Department of study to confirm the attendance of the Lecturer.

- (2) The Heads of the Departments of Study have recommended that Lecturers do report for lectures. Further, they have recommended that the attendance of Lecturers for duties, meetings and the other committees is substantiated by placing signatures. In addition, a register for placing signatures of lecturers in each Department of Study is also being maintained for substantiating the attendance of Lecturers.
- (3) The service rendered by the lecturers of the university cannot be limited to a 08 hours' service. Therefore, it is not possible to mark the time of their departure. They engage in services pertaining to the studies such as providing instructions in relation to independent assignments and researches, preparation of question papers, standardization and evaluation of answer scripts and engaging in researches without imposing a time restriction.

Even though the Auditors have constantly inquired this matter for the past years, it is kindly notified that our University has to adhere to the same methodology that is being followed by the entire system of Universities.

- (b) Not agreed. A register for fixed assets is being maintained at present. It is expected to update in the future as per the Circulars.

3. Financial Review

3.1 Financial Results

3.2 Legal Actions Instituted against the University

08 cases are still in the trial stage and it is kindly notified that action has to be taken in the future according to the verdicts given by the Courts of law for the Cases.



4. Operational Review

4.1 Performance

Number of foreign students attracted to follow Courses in the previous year had reduced due to the higher level of existing competition for the Degree Courses in the University. (Institutions conferring Buddhist Degrees and Diplomas have been commenced in the recent past and state patronage has also been provided for such institutions.) The reduction in a year cannot be considered as a reduction in the performance since this varies according to the internal as well as external factors.

4.2 The Cost per Student

Not Agreed. Since the expenditure incurred on the External Examinations Division is also included in the recurrent expenditure though the total recurrent expenditure during the year is considered in the computation of cost per student, it is more appropriate to compute this cost per student subsequent to taking into account the students following Post Graduate Degrees without considering the expenditure. The Ministry of Higher Education has decided that the number of internal students enrolled to this University is in the range of 100-110 students in every year. Likely, recurrent expenditure had reached a higher value due to the annual increments in salaries and the increase in the other expenses. The situation has created due to the decrease in the number of students enrolled when it is compared with the increase in the expenditure. The promotional activities required for the enrolment of larger number of foreign students are being carried out constantly as a remedial measure to overcome this situation and I hope to attract a higher number of foreign students by modernizing the Courses in the future.

4.3 Management Inefficiencies

- (a) This University has also adopted the methodology adopted by the University System of back dating the date of fulfilling qualifications without exceeding the effective date (01.12.1997) of the Circular (721) where it has been mentioned that a Senior lecturer in



Grade II is qualified to be promoted to Senior Lecturer Grade I subsequent to completing a service of 06 years in Grade II.

The approval of the Administrative Council for following the methodology introduced by the Establishments Circular Letter 11/2015 dated 04.09.2015 of the University Grants Commission.

- (b) Since it was not possible to obtain the services of the two permanent Sub wardens, two Sub wardens were recruited on contract basis. Even though the permanent Sub wardens subsequently reported for duty again, there was a necessity to obtain the service of a new Sub Warden as "Sarasavi Medura" Hostel had been opened by the time. Accordingly, the service of a sub Warden on the contract basis was obtained as per the decision of the Administrative Council until a Sub warden is recruited on the permanent basis by including the requirement in to the estimate of the personnel.
- (c) Mr. Gunasekera was informed to submit the original copy of his First Degree Certificate to the University and accordingly, he had submitted the said original copy to the University. It was referred to the relevant University through the E-mail with a view to substantiating the information mentioned in it. However, the e-mail was not sent to the recipient and as a result a letter was sent to the said University using a courier Service. No response has yet been received for the letter.
- (d) The service of the Officer had been terminated on a decision of the Administrative Council on 27.01.2009. The decisions taken by the Administrative Council from time to time has already been submitted to the Auditor. Likewise, this officer has filed a case in the labour tribunal under MH/33/763/9 against the Institution and it is not possible to take a final action until a final decision is given since the case is still in the trial stage. Further, it is obvious that it is not possible to take action according to the letter No. E&O/AC/1/8/6 which was pointed out by the Auditor since the letter was issued on 10.10.2014.



- (e) The interviews were conducted again as per the judgement of the Supreme Court Case SCFR110/2014. The recommendation of the Interview Committee has been forwarded to the Administrative Council for approval.
- (f) I noted down the matter to investigate it in the future and to take action necessary to rectify it.

4.4 Operational Inefficiencies

- (a) Agreed. This savings account is comprised of the interest income earned through the investment of the Scholarship and Prizes Fund. The money required for scholarships and prizes awarded annually is taken from this account and long term investments have not been made as there is no possibility of keeping the money required for scholarships and prizes which are awarded for the following year and to invest the remaining amount of money in long term investments at the end of the year. It has been decided to consider this in the future.
- (b) There was a problematic situation in the accomplishment of the objectives of this Fund adhering to the criteria already existed and the criteria of the Fund has been altered by now for the accomplishment of the relevant objectives more effectively in the way that the Auditor has pointed out in the previous years.

4.5 Under-utilization of Funds

Even though payments have to be made by 31.12.2014 for Capital Expenditure, balance of money was remained in the account as payments have not been made due to following reasons.

- Non submission of bills in due time by the relevant contractual institutions for work in progress.
- Delay in work due to weather.



4.6 Idle and Under Utilized Assets

- (a) Not Agreed. All the buildings have been constructed based on the requirement and they are used accordingly.
- (b) These goods have been purchased according to the demand of each Division. 02 Water Filter Stands have been purchased for Offices of the Faculties. These goods had been stored in the main stores without making a placement of these goods during the period of enlarging the Faculty Office Building. Necessary action has been taken to place the goods in the relevant faculties since the enlargement of the Faculty Administration building has already been finalized.

The Clerical Table pointed out in the Report had been purchased for the External Examinations and Post Graduate Centre, Colombo and this table had not been carried from the main Stores due to ongoing office modernization activities. The good has already been handed over to the relevant Division.

Fax machine has already been handed over to the relevant Division.

5. Accountability and Good Governance

5.1 Procurement Plan

Not Agreed. Practically such purchases have to be made on timely requirements. Purchasing of such goods have been made from Government Institutions under the Power of Superintendent entrusted to the Mahopapddyaya Thero for incurring costs. I would like to inform you that purchases in all the other instances have been made in compliance with the Circulars issued from time to time by the Government and adopting the Procurement Process of the Government.



Further, I would like to point out that the Procurement Plan is used as an effective financial controlling agent in every year by the University.

6. Systems and Controls

Attention will be focused for minimization of the deficiencies in the future if such deficiencies are detected subsequent to investigating such deficiencies indicated in these fields.
