4.1 INTRODUCTION

The Sabaragamuwa University of Sri Lanka is situated on the left of the way to Samanalawewa reservoir and is over 160 kilometers away from Colombo – Badullahighway. The University comprises of five (05) Academic Faculties, namely,

- Faculty of Geomatics
- Faculty of Management Studies
- Faculty of Social Sciences and Languages

In the year 2014, five faculties offered thirty three BA/BSc Degree Programmes, based on the Semester or the Course Units System of study, to a student population of about 1060. The annual intake of the University is in the region of about 1027students. Apart from some of the Degree Programmes offered by the Faculties of Applied Sciences and Social Sciences, which are of three-year duration, the rest extend over to a four-year period. The medium of instruction of all Science – based programmes is English. Wherever possible, the Lecturers strive to assist undergraduates by presenting the relevant course materials in Sinhala or Tamil medium as the case may be. The students reading for degrees at the SabaragamuwaUniversity could also select optional courses even from another Department within their own Faculty (inter – departmental courses), while following the major and minor subjects.

Apart from all these Faculties, StudyCenters and Units, the University has an AffiliatedAcademy named Sri Lanka Military Academy (SLMA). This academy situated at Diyatalawa prepares army cadets for the Degree of Bachelor of Military Studies awarded by the University.

**BRIEF:
HISTORY** The Faculty of Agricultural Sciences, Sabaragamuwa University of Sri Lanka was initially established at Rahangala in 1995 and was shifted to the main premises at Belihuloya in 2001 academic programmes were conducted with limited facilities at Belihuloya. In 2005 the faculty was able to win a competitive World Bank grant of RS. 82.5 million to develop infrastructure and other academic facilities. A comprehensive curriculum revision was undertaken and the degree programme was renamed as Agricultural Sciences and Management.

Degree Programme of the Faculty:

The Faculty of Agricultural Sciences offers a four year specialization degree, B.Sc. Agricultural Sciences and Management and students can specialize in four fields such as Agribusiness Management, Commercial Horticulture, Plantation Agriculture and Livestock Production.

The Faculty is composed of three Departments of study such as Agribusiness Management, Export Agriculture and Livestock Productions. The Department of Export Agriculture offers two academic modules in Plantation Agriculture and Horticulture. The Agribusiness Management is a unique department as the undergraduate program in Agribusiness Management is the first of its kind in a Sri Lankan university.

During the first four semesters (first 2 years), students need to follow core-courses for their general study on Agriculture followed by specialization either in plantation Agriculture or Horticulture or Livestock Production or Agribusiness Management for two more semesters (in the 3rd year). Students must select their field of specialization at the end of the second year, according to the results in previous years and their preferences. Farm Practice, Computer Sciences and English courses are offered in the first three years and students must reach a satisfactory grade for each course in each semester to complete the degree. In addition, elective courses offered during the final year and students must select four elective courses according to their preferences during the first semester of their final year (in the fourth year). The final semester of the final year is allocated for industrial training, which is a vital and specific component of the degree program and must undertake an applied research in the specialized field. The medium of instruction of the degree program is English.

The Faculty organizes programs as the practical components of the degree programme in collaboration with farmers in the area to ensure that knowledge and skills are exchanged between students and farmers. As a result the Faculty of Agricultural Sciences has developed close links with the surrounding communities. Furthermore, students are given an opportunity to visit various industries to get exposure to operational aspects of the industry and research organizations.

Department of Agribusiness Management

The department is geared to develop students analytical, business and entrepreneurial skills to produce agro-entrepreneurs and agribusiness managers for the present and future.

Department of Export Agriculture

Department of Export Agriculture is to produce graduates who possess knowledge and skills in advanced agricultural technologies and are capable of managing horticultural and plantation operations of any scale.

DEGREE PROGRAMME

The Faculty comprises five departments, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Physical Sciences and Technology, Department of Food Science and Technology, Department of Computing and Information Systems and the Department of Sport Sciences and Physical Education.

The Faculty offers B.Sc. (special) degree programmes in Food Science and Technology, Environmental Sciences & Natural Resource Management, Chemical Technology, Computer Science & Technology, Applied Physics, Computing and Information Systems, Sports Science and Management and Physical Education for the students who gain direct entry to the faculty on the basis of their performance at the GCE (A/L) Examination. The degree programs are designed to be four year degree programs with an exit point at three years for the students who graduate with a general degree in B.Sc. in Physical Sciences and Technology and Environmental Sciences and Management. The rest of the degree programs are strictly four year degree programs.

The selection of the students for the B.Sc. degree programmes in Computing and Information Systems, Sports Sciences and Management and Physical Education was performed on the basis of the G.C.E. (A/L) results as well as the performance at a selection aptitude test. The students who wish to get enrolled for the degree programmes in Sports Sciences and Management and Physical Education were also required to face an examination for physical fitness in addition to the selection test. However the selection procedure has been changed by the UGC through a circular and there will not be any further aptitude tests for the recruitment of undergraduates for the Faculty.

All degree programs offered through the faculty are designed to cater to the current job trends and demands both nationally and internationally. They are conducted exclusively in English. These degree programme are designed as interdisciplinary by incorporating subjects as Computer Science, Economics, Management, etc. that has facilitated our students to perform well once graduating serving a wider field than being specific and narrowed to than specialized field.

Apart from the academic activities the Faculty also contributes to the development of the community and the nation through extension and knowledge Dissemination programmes. The staff and the students participate in such activities annually.

DEPARTMENT OF COMPUTING AND INFORMATION SYSTEMS

The Department of Computing and Information Systems which offers a B.Sc. Special Degree in Computing and Information Systems was established in 01st March 2011, though the Degree programme was initiated back in 2008. The curriculum is specifically designed to produce skilled graduates both in Computing and Information Technology. At present the department has three well established laboratories with modern computer facilities.

The demand for the above degree programme has greatly increased thorough out the years and annual intake has reached the maximum capacity of 100 students per batch. The department has close collaborations with private computer industries to obtain technical support in conducting lectures and practicals as well as to provide opportunities for the undergraduates to carry out their mini projects and final year projects. This also has increased the opportunity for the undergraduates to secure job opportunities immediately after graduation .

DEPARTMENT OF FOOD SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

TheDepartment of Food Science and Technology was established in 2003though the B.Sc. special degree in Food Science and Technology was offered under the Department of Natural Resources since the inception of the Faculty in 1996. The range of the study area includes Food Science core, General Sciences, Environmental Science, Statistics, Computer Sciences, Marketing, Economics and courses in career development. The degree program is designed for the students who wish to pursue professional carriers in the field of food science and technology. The degree program has been designed so that the graduates could cater to the growing demand of the service of Food Scientists both in government and private sector. The degree also paves an excellent path for postgraduate studies in related disciplines of Food Science and Technology. At present the Department comprises of one professor of four senior lecturer three probationary lecturers There are several eminent senior academics and industrialists who contribute their services by conducting lectures and practicals in there specialized fields. The Department

has four well equipped laboratories namely; Food Analysis Laboratory, Food Microbiology Laboratory Food Processing Laboratory and meat processing Laboratory.

DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

The Department of Natural Resources of the Sabaragamuwa University of Sri Lanka was established in 1996 offering a B.Sc. General degree in Natural Resources. The degree program offered by this Department is designed to cater to the current job market in the fields of Environmental Protection, Natural Resource Management and Conservation, Biodiversity Conservation and Management, Environmental Advocacy and Ecology both in Sri Lanka and throughout the world.

In 2006 the Degree Programme which was initially offered as B.Sc. in Natural Resources a three year general degree program was upgraded and restructured to offer a Degree programme as Environmental Science and Natural Resource Management which has improved the job opportunities for the graduates. Currently the degree program is oriented in three major streams viz. Environmental Science, Conservation Biology and Earth Sciences with awarding two degree programs as B.Sc. (Special) in Environmental Science and Natural Resource Management – 4 years and B.Sc. (General) in Environmental Science and Natural Resources Management – 3 years. The degree also paves an excellent path for postgraduate studies. The staff of the department consists of one senior professor, six senior lecturers and two probationary lecturers. Many resource persons in specialized fields are invited in conducting lecture and practical courses for undergraduates.

DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICAL SCIENCES & TECHNOLOGY

The Department of Physical Sciences & Technology conducts degree courses in three major disciplines; namely, Chemical Technology, Applied Physics and Computer Science & Technology. Mathematics, Statistics, and Management Studies, Accounts are conducted as supporting tools for the programme. The staff of the department consists of one senior professor in Physics, one Professor in Chemistry, two senior lecturers, nine probationary lecturers and two temporary lecturers. The Department offers four degree programmes namely: B.Sc. (Applied Sciences) Special Degree in Chemical Technology (Duration: 4 years), B.Sc. (Applied Sciences) Special Degree in Computer Science & Technology (Duration: 4 years), B.Sc. (Applied Sciences) Special Degree in Applied Physics (Duration: 4 years) and B.Sc. (Applied Sciences) Degree in Physical Sciences (Duration: 4 years). All theoretical course units conducted by the department are heavily supported by a practical component which provides the preliminary experience to perform confidently. And also the Mini projects conducted throughout the third and the fourth academic years stimulate the students' creative and innovative thinking. The Final year project (research or industrial training) for one entire semester exposes the undergraduates to the working environment and provides hand on experience in industry before the graduation. The environment in the campus and the teaching programmes were all designed in a manner to establish this goal and also to produce specialists in their respective fields. Additionally, it is also creditable that the Department offers the only Degree in Applied Physics in the entire University System in the country

DEPARTMENT OF SPORT SCIENCES AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Two degree programmes namely B.Sc. Special Degree in Sport Sciences & Management and B.Sc. Special Degree in Physical Education have been awarded since 2008 through the Faculty of Applied Sciences. The Department of Sport Sciences and Physical Education was established in 01st March 2011. The courses of Sport Sciences & Management degree programme is specially designed to produce graduates with basic scientific sport skills and management skills required for today's teaching sports at primary, secondary and tertiary education levels and at other industries and organizations. The degree programme in Physical Education is specially designed to produce graduates who are competent the scientific basis of physical education activities and practices. The duration of the degree programmes are four years and at present there is a great demand for the degree programme which is significantly shown by the increasing number of student intake each year and at present the intake has reached the maximum capacity. The both degree programmes are well supported by practical activities and projects that has enabled to produce skilled and competent graduates within four years. The department also has many collaborations with sports organizations facilitating the students to participate in many national and international and one lecturer, ten probationary lecturers gaming competitions and coaching programmes. The staff comprises of one senior lecturer, one lecturer three temporary lecturers and ten probationary lecturers. The services of eminent sport specialist are also obtained to conduct both practical and theory courses for the students.

DEGREE PROGRAMME OF THE FACULTY

The Faculty of Management Studies comprises four departments; Department of Accountancy & Finance, Department of Business Management, Department of Marketing Management and Department of Tourism Management. The Faculty offers BSc (Special) Degree Programmes in Financial Management, Banking & Insurance, Business Management, Marketing Management, EcoBusiness Management, Tourism Management and Hospitality Management under each department respectively for the students who gain direct entry to the Faculty on the basis of their performance at the GCE (Advanced Level) Examination.

Presently the student allocation for each degree programme is done through the Faculty according to the students' preference and z-score at the beginning of the degree programme.






Expenditure for Books Purchased - 2014

6.2 CENTRE FOR COMPUTER STUDIES

Introduction

Centre for Computer Studies is an independent academic body directly functioning under the Vice Chancellor for providing IT services to the Sabaragamuwa University of Sri Lanka. It provides main services; such as Internet facility, e-mail facility, computer networking services, e-learning facilities, hardware & software maintenance services and resource personals for some of the faculties.

History

The history of Sabaragamuwa University Computer Centre goes back to the time of inauguration of Affiliated University College (AUC) of Sabaragamuwa Province in 1991. It started at one of the residential building then own to Samanalawewa Hydro Electrical Power Project and now D1-4 quarters of Sabaragamuwa University of Sri Lanka. Initially, it equipped with 10 numbers of **Tatung** 286 computers featured 1Mb RAM, 40MB Hard disks and an **OKI** 9-pin dot-matrix printer and at the time of inauguration of AUC, late Hon. President Ranasinghe Premadasa unveiled the plaque of the centre.

At that time AUC enrolled students for Diploma programmes and conducted three diploma courses called *Diploma in Accounting & Finance*, *Diploma in Tourism Management* and *Diploma in English*. The **Core Course of Computing** offered by the computer centre was compulsory component to obtain the diploma for all programmes.

After some times, with the donation of Rs. 15,000/= from the then Balangoda District Judge who launched a program to donate funds for social works from the fines collected from the drugs victims, initiated to start the construction of existing computer centre building with the help of then staff, students and villagers by “Shramadana Campaign” and finally completed using the government funds. It was the first building constructed simultaneous with the old auditorium for the AUC in addition to the buildings acquiring from the Samanalawewa Project.

Initially it was recruited one staff member to computer centre as an *Instructor-in-Computer-Technology* for conducting the lectures and practical for the core course. Meanwhile, two other instructors were recruited to the computer centre cadre to extend the work it carried out and it was the only computer centre which had an approved cadre in the AUC system.

After upgrading the AUC into full-fledged national university as Sabaragamuwa University of Sri Lanka in 1996, computer centre started to rendering its services to the different degree programs of different, especially for non-IT, faculties by means of designing and preparing course materials for IT related courses and conducting lectures and practical classes for it, helping to prepare and evaluate tender documents for purchasing of computers and other related equipments for the university, training of clerical staff of the university for effectively use of computers for their day to day works as well as helping to academic staff for preparing their postgraduate thesis and in preparing teaching materials etc.

When expansion of the university and its functions, computer centre was renamed as **Centre for Computer Studies** and re-organized under a Director and started offering assistance for conducting IT related courses for the degree programmes especially for Faculty of Management Studies and Faculty of Social Sciences & Languages and constructed another building adjacent to the existing centre for broadening its services. At the same time university Local Area Network was planned and commissioned and got connected to the Internet via LEARN and started providing and maintaining the Internet and network services to the entire university community. Launching Sabaragamuwa University Web Site and providing E-Learning environment are such land marking services offered.

Meanwhile, to strengthen the services provided by the Centre for Computer Studies the cadre provisions has been increased and at present, below mentioned cadres are allocated to it according to the 2012 approved cadre list of UGC.

Among four of the permanent Instructors' in Computer Technology, three of them are assigned to the three faculties; Faculty of Agricultural Sciences, Faculty of Social Sciences & Languages and Faculty of Management Studies to conduct/instruct the IT related lectures/practical on request.

Mr. Chathuranga Wanigasekara is acting as a coordinator of the computer center of faculty of Management Studies and is maintaining the faculty and university web sites in addition to working as an instructor. Mr. Herath is on two-year no-pay leave.

Mr. Pemawardana who is the Senior Instructor acted as an IT coordinator for the Faculty of Agricultural Sciences. Coordinators, who have participated in respective Faculty Boards, are coordinated with the Director of the Centre for Computer Studies to allocate human resources and other IT related services needed for the faculties. Three permanent cadre provisions have to be filled in future according to the requirements generated.

Assistant Network Manager is responsible for maintaining and improving the performance of the university LAN as well as implementing new network services when required under the supervision of the Director.

Computer Applications Assistant and the Technical Officer are assigned for the solving software and hardware problems of computers and accessories in faculty computer centers in addition to the other places such as centers, sections and offices of the entire university. Mr. Sanjeewa and Mr. Janaka are currently involving to do such work as well as to report about the faultier of equipments to the respective authorities to get decisions to repair them.

Present Status

Presently, on request of the different faculties, the academic services provided by the centre are mainly limed to conducting the IT Degree programme and computer minor programme of the Faculty of Social Sciences & Languages, some IT related subjects and practical components of the different departments of Faculty of Management Studies and to the degree program in Computing and Information System of the Faculty of Applied Sciences. Other IT services such as Internet and web service are provided for entire university. Further, in the 2014 IP phone systems was established by the university and all maintenance and enhancements are done by the center staff.

At present most of the faculties have built their own complexes and they have their own computer centers within them for conducting their IT related academic programs. Therefore, no need of using the existing buildings of the Centre for Computer Studies for conducting their programs further, instead they can be utilized for widen the services offered by the Centre such as conducting training programmes for non-academic and administrative staff as well as assisting the academic staff to fulfilling their IT-related needs etc.

The Centre for Computer Studies supervises all computer related academic activities of these five computer centers and maintains the campus-wide network including all the servers required to provide network services such as web and email services.

In year of 2013, infrastructure facilities and academic programs related with IT have further improved due to allocations from the consolidated fund by the Sabaragamuwa University of Sri Lanka. With this fund, the university managed to increase the Internet bandwidth from 20Mbps to 100Mbps and increase the number of computer facilities to all academic and administrative staff members at their work places.

Further, according to the annual plan University purchased more than 100 new computers and center helps to purchase and implement such computers in the university network.

Campus-Wide Network

Our campus-wide Local Area Network is run and maintained by the Centre for Computer Studies. It is administrated by our Assistant Network Managers within the server room. The server room consists of CISCO routers, proxy server, DNS server, CISCO for subnet switch, web server, e-mail server, e-learning sever, virus guard server (centralized server) etc. Performance of the network functions and the E-learning system are increased by upgrading the three servers namely Proxy, DNS and E-learning during the year 2014. Separating and partitioning of the server room from the existing computer lab, physical security and the easiness of maintenance of the servers are assured. Also by commissioning the alternative power generating system using a 20KVA standby generator and 20KVA UPS system, availability of network functions are guaranteed during the 24 hours a day and 7 days a week.

The wide area network now extended up to newly located Faculty of Geomatics building. All the five faculties are now inter-connected with fiber optic backbone. At present our commodity Internet band with is 100Mbps and physical link is capable of handling signals of 80Mbps bandwidth.

- Conducting Technical Evaluation Committees
- Give consultancy facilities for other government institutions.
- Conducting training workshops for academic and non-academic staff
- Implement/expand network of faculties, centers and offices
- Recruit a Programmer for building and handling new university web site

Goals Achieved during the year

- The legacy university e-mail system has been transferred to new enhanced system with the affiliation of Google. Now all the university community including academic, administrative, non academic and students can obtain such official e-mail from sab.ac.lk domain.
- Took necessary actions to extend the "software for the 21st century" programme for another three years with the consultation of Microsoft Sri Lanka. Further, include the "Office 365" facilities for the students who are studying the basics of IT.

- Take necessary actions to upgrade the Server room to obtain 150Mbps bandwidth and the physical link capacity from 80Mbps to 140Mbps to enhance the internet services offered.
- University website has been upgraded and implemented domains for each faculty and center. Further, several new domains has been included with the main web site. Student's Registration System, Online Result display system etc. have been implemented by the center staff during this period.
- A new e-Learning Server was granted by the HETC project and It was successfully implemented including a new Learning Management System with enhanced capabilities. New LMS administrator Dr. Salinda Premadasa has been appointed to administer the system and the involvement of both lecturers and students with e-learning significantly increased.
- The university proposed and purchased new IP phone system and the center staff fully involved to implement such system all over the university. The maintenance activities and further improvements of the IP phone system is doing by the Center Staff.
- Implement Kaspersky Virus guard system with 1000 users and avoid the virus problem in the university computer network. The company provided several training workshops for the center staff and it also helps to improve the knowledge on handling such a central control virus guard.
- Include the online problem reporting system under the Center for Computer Studies website. With this system any person of the university community can apply service from the center on hardware, software or any other technical problem which he/she faced in the university computer network, IP phone system or using any other electronic equipment.
- The director of the center has prepared a new IT policy document according to the new situations and provided it to the administration to approve and implement in the university.
- The staff of the center was requested to make a proposal for providing the Internet and Wi-Fi facilities for the student's hostels. The center staff successfully prepared a proposal and handed over it to the administration.
- The director and network administrators of the center conducted nearly 50 Technical Evaluation Committees for purchasing especially electronic item for the university during the period.
- The director of the center make technical consultancy on purchasing electronic items such as computers, printers, photocopy machines, etc. in other government institutions such as "Imbulpe Pradeseeeya Sabawa" and Provincial Council, Rathnapura.
- The center conducted two e-learning workshops for academic staff. Dr. Salinda Premadasa conducted these workshops and other academic support staff gave their support. Two Microsoft Office workshops were conducted for the Sub Wardens of the university by the academic support staff of the center.
- The center individually implemented several new networks at Administration branch, Establishment Branch, Sport Center, and agriculture faculty. If these implantations may do by the external party university should spend more cost and center helped to reduce the cost.
- Call applications and conduct an interview for recruit a computer programmer for the center. However, couldn't select a suitable person as a programmer and decided to recall the procedure.

7.1 CAREER GUIDANCE UNIT

Profile

Students Registration

Students registration is done annually whenever a new academic year has started. Academic & Students Welfare Division is maintaining a separate file for all the registered undergraduates of the university which contain up to date personal and academic life of them.

Accommodation Facilities

As the university is in a low density area, considering the difficulties in finding the residential facilities for undergraduates by themselves, all the students whose permanent residencies are more than 20 km away from the university are provided hostel facilities by the university. So, about 90% of the undergraduates are received the university provided hostel facilities.

The University has provided accommodation in its own hostels only for about 703 male students and 1168 female students out of 3468 residing students. All the other students have been provided with accommodation in rented houses in the vicinity with bare minimum facilities.

The University spends more than 11million per annum for rented houses to accommodate the students.

New Girls' Hostel

Newly constructed girls' hostel with two complexes where 780 students can be resided was opened in October, 2014. These complexes have 200 rooms, two reading rooms, common areas and other relevant facilities for resided students. But the canteen facility is not available in these complexes as yet.

New Constructions

Under the programme of Ministry of Higher Education, developing hostel facilities for undergraduate in the university system, the foundation stone was laid for constructing three hostel complexes for 1200 students in October, 2014. The construction has to be begun.

Medical Facility

Compare to other universities maintaining of the Medical Center of the University is very costly due to climate situation of the area. The closest base hospital is Balangoda which is 20 Km away from the university, and the nearest rural hospital is Pabahinna. But the University Medical Center has to cater not only for the students but also the resident staff and their family members. The service of Medical Centre is free of charge.

**THE STATUTORY REPORT ON ANNUAL STATEMENTS OF ACCOUNTS
OF THE SABARAGAMUWA UNIVERSITY OF SRI LANKA
FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31ST DECEMBER 2014**

Forwarded herewith are the Financial Statements of Accounts and the Annual Statements of Accounts for the year ending 31st December 2014. These Accounting Statements have been prepared and submitted in terms of Section 106 (1) and 107 (b) of the Universities Act. No. 16 of 1978 as amended by the subsequent legislation including the University (amendment) Act No. 7 of 1985 and in terms of the Finance Act No. 38 of 1971.

The presentation format of the financial statement has been changed from 2012 in compliance to the UGC Finance circular letter No 03/2011. The Financial statements are prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, fundamental accounting assumptions and the Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards laid down by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Sri Lanka and in accordance with the historical cost convention where appropriate accounting policies are disclosed in succeeding notes.

Income and Expenditure in respect of Extension Programmes conducted at Belihuloya and other self-financing projects were consolidated in the Statement of Accounts. Following are the silent features that are needed to be highlighted in the Annual Accounts.

01. As shown below the total Government Grants for Recurrent and Capital Expenditure for the year 2014 was Rs. 1,062,552,600 as against Rs. 925,534,700 received for the year 2013.

02. Income from the Self Finance Programme and other sources of the University as at the date of balance sheet was Rs. 48,663,817 as against Rs.42,360,543 for the year 2013.

03. Excess of expenditure over income in the year 2014 was Rs. 59,919,196 when compared with Rs. 47,093,974 for the year 2013.

05. The assignment of making the Fixed Assets Register and value up to 31.12.2005 given to the Consultant Management Frontiers has successfully been completed. The Management consultants introduced and calculated the depreciation for the year 2006 on the generally accepted method. Full year depreciation is charged in the year of the purchase, no depreciation is charged in the year of the disposal. And also this depreciation method is adopted in using the rates in the UGC circular 649 from the financial year 2006.

This method of calculation of depreciation was approved by our council at its 117th meeting held on 20.01.2007. Accordingly the University follows that method to depreciate our assets for the year 2014 and hope to continue in future.

06. The University adopted the income approach accounting principle for Capital grants and the donations effect from 01/01/2014 as per the Sri Lanka Accounting Standards 20 and hope to continue in future. Due to the adopting Sri Lanka Accounting Standards 20 income approach following adjustments have been made in accounts.

- a. Rs 861,619,853.00 credited to the General Reserve Account as prior year adjustment for amortization of Capital Grant base on deprecation of assets.
- b. Rs 116,054,184 credited to the General Reserve Account as prior year adjustment for amortization of Donation base on deprecation of assets.
- c. Statement of Financial performance 2013 was restated for comparative purpose adjusting Rs 167,466,356.00 as deferred income.

07. Lands & Buildings valued Rs. 119,284,110.00 at Buttala (Faculty of Applied Sciences) which was belonged to university earlier and currently operating without controlling of university have been removed from books of accounts during the year 2014. Accordingly, disposal loss of Land Rs 40,600,000 was charged to the Revaluation account and disposal loss of Building Rs. 43,446,161.75 has been charged to the current year performance statement.

08. Revenue Recognition – Revenue is recognized on accrual basis.

09. Expenditure Recognition – All expenditure incurred in maintaining the university has been recognized on accrual basis and charged to revenue in ascertaining the income over expenditure.

10. Cash Flow Statement – The Cash Flow Statement has been prepared using the indirect method. For the purpose of the cash flow statement, cash and cash equivalents consist of current accounts balances held at banks.

11. Current year re-valuation loss of Live stock at the Agricultural farm was Rs 626,290 charged to Profit & Loss Account.

12. The University was able to collect the funds of Rs 19,473,666 from the employees who violate the bonds. According to the UGC Circular, the collected amount was invested.

13. Gratuity provision has been provided for the employees who have completed 5 years service in the University System in the terms of Gratuity Act No 12 of 1983 and Gratuity provision for the year ended 31st December 2014 was Rs. 15,051,098.
14. University has spent Rs.1,027,708 for International Symposium from capital grants and fully amortized during the current year.



Report of the Auditor General on the Financial Statements of the Sabaragamuwa University of Sri Lanka for the year ended 31 December 2014 in terms of Sub section 108(1) of the Universities Act, No. 16 of 1978.

The audit of the financial statements of the Sabaragamuwa University of Sri Lanka for the year ended 31 December 2014 comprising the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2014 and the statement of financial performance, statement of changes in equity and the cash flow statement for the year then ended and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, was carried out under my direction in pursuance of provisions in Article 154(1) of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka read in conjunction with Sub section 107(5) of the Universities Act, No.16 of 1978. My comments and observations which I consider should be published with the Annual Report of the University in terms of Sub section 108(1) appear in this report. A detailed report in terms of sub section 108(2) of the Universities Act was furnished to the Vice Chancellor of the University on 08 July 2015.

1.2 Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards and for such internal control as the management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatements, whether due to fraud or error.



1.3 Auditor's Responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards consistent with International Standards of Supreme Audit Institutions (ISSAI 1000 - 1810). Those standards require that, I comply with the ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of risks of material misstatements of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers the internal control relevant to the University's preparation and fair presentation of financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the University's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of the accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements. Sub sections (3) and (4) of Section 13 of the Finance Act No.38 of 1971, give discretionary powers to the Auditor General to determine the scope and extent of the audit.

I believe that the audit evidences I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my audit opinion.

1.4 Basis for Qualified Opinion

My opinion is qualified based on the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of this report.



2. Financial Statements

2.1 Qualified Opinion

In my opinion, except for the effects of the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of this report, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Sabaragamuwa University of Sri Lanka as at 31 December 2014 and its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards.

2.2 Comments on Financial Statements

2.2.1 Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards

Actual cash out flow of Rs.262,614,397 for acquiring fixed assets during the year under review had been recorded as Rs.252,627,757 in the cash flow statement in contravention of Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standard No.02.

2.2.2 Accounting Policies

Although the University's policy for accounting for income and expenses is accrual basis, the receipt of Rs.59,252,600 and payment of Rs. 47,786,600 for Mahapola and bursaries had been accounted on cash basis, in the year under review.

2.2.3 Accounting Deficiencies

The following observations are made.

- (a) In the year under review, other equipment purchased at a cost of Rs.24,695,682 were not taken into account for the calculation of depreciation for the year and hence the depreciation for the year had been understated by Rs.4,939,136.
- (b) Even though the depreciation on government grants in the year under review was Rs. 206,932,538, the amount amortized as deferred income was Rs.206,569,272. Due to continuous accounting deficiencies of this nature, even though the value of the total government grants at the end of the year was Rs.2,263,300,000, the value of net assets represented by that was Rs.2,069,087,715.



(c) Amount of Rs.41, 109,618 receivable from respective parties who agreed to repay, for breach of contracts by 07 officers, had not been included in the Statement of Financial Position as a receivable amount.

(d) No action has been taken to recover the amount of Rs.235, 719 paid in excess of the amount due to Bandaranayaka Memorial International Conference Hall, for the convocation held on 09 December 2014, or to account for the same as a receivable amount.

2.2.4 Lack of Evidence for Audit

Details of periods and reasons for debit entries of Rs. 48,214,484 and credit entries of Rs.11,272,298 passed for provision of accumulated depreciation of the year under review, were not made available for the audit.

2.2.5 Un-reconciled Control Accounts

It was observed that yearly totals of the assets were casted erroneously as there was a difference of Rs. 862,091,260 in 04 non current asset items when checking additions to non current assets in the schedules used for calculating depreciation submitted with financial statements in the year under review and additions to assets in the financial statements from the year 2005.

2.3 Receivable and Payable Accounts

The following observations are made.

- (a) Recovery of 22 employee loan balances receivable amounting to Rs.596,856 had been suspended at the end of the year under review.
- (b) Action had not been taken to clear tender deposits, retentions and 64 balances of bidding guarantees amounting to Rs.29,450,645 aging 03 to 08 years.
- (c) Action had not been taken in the year under review to recover the debtor balance of Rs.105,525 coming from proper to year 2003.



- (d) Unclaimed wages as at 31 December 2014 of the year under review was Rs.174, 860 including an amount totaling Rs.103, 377, coming from year 2011.
- (e) An expenditure of Rs.353,640 has been incurred for the advertisement published by the Ministry of Higher Education for the opening of two buildings in two faculties of the University on 31 March 2012. Even though the Media Secretary to the Ministry of Higher Education has informed to recover this amount from Construction Engineering and Consultancy Bureau, it had not been recovered even by 31 December in the year under review.
- (f) A sum of Rs.4,699,075 was accounted as receivable as at 31 December 2009, in taking over the Applied Science Faculty premises at Buttala, by the University Grants Commission, and there was a further receivable amount of Rs.1,616,894 as at 31 December in the year under review. Steps were not taken to clear the amounts due even though more than 05 years had elapsed.



2.4 Non – compliance with Laws, Rules, Regulations and Management Decisions

The following instances of non – compliance with the laws, rules, regulations and management decisions were observed.

Reference to Laws, Rules, Regulations and Management Decisions

Non - compliance

(a) Financial Regulations of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka

(i) Financial Regulations 168 and 200

Actions were not taken to credit received from the contracted institution amounting to Rs.30,000 to the University Fund according to the Clause 08 of the agreement signed in relation to the photography of the convocation of the University held in the year under review.

(ii) Financial Regulations 571(2)

Even though steps have taken to set off 77 tender deposits amounting to Rs. 342,500 coming from the year 2008 and retentions amounting to Rs. 2,811,636 coming from the year 2005, against the General Reserve Account, confirmations of non-claimant were not obtained from deposit holders.

(b) Public Finance Circular No.449 dated 24 February 2011

exceeding 45 days is Rs. 30,000, the an appointment was given, in contravention of that for the post of full time Hostel Sub Warden Grade II on the assignment basis, for a monthly allowance of Rs.38,040 for a period of six months, without prior approval of the

Department of Public Finance.



(c) Procurement Guideline – 2006

(i) Section 3.6.1

Though the quantity required was known at the time of calling bids for the requirement of 1050 chairs for the lecture hall of the faculty of Social Science and Languages and the Auditorium 700 and 350 chairs had been purchased in two instances in the year 2012, spending Rs.5,286,120, against the clause referred to.

(ii) Section 9.3.1 (b)

Even though the approval of Secretary to the line ministry is required for the vehicle repairs above the value of Rs.200,000 a total amount of Rs.1,323,125 was paid for repair of three vehicles in the year under review without obtaining the approval.

(iii) Section 2.14.1

Even though the direct payments can be made only in emergency situations, contrary to that procedure, the contract was awarded for 03 months, for the maintenance of the University's playground, at a price of Rs.825,000 without calling tenders.

(d) Treasury Circular No.IAI/2002/02 dated 28 November 2002

A Register of Computer Assets had not been maintained for Rs.208,466,511 worth of computers.

(e) Treasury circular no.842 dated 19 December 1978

A Register of Fixed Assets had not been maintained.



3. Financial Review

3.1 Financial Results

According to the financial statements presented, the operating activities of the University the year ended 31 December 2014 had resulted in deficit of Rs.59,919,196 as compared with the corresponding deficit of Rs.47, 093,974 for the preceding year. Accordingly, a decrease of Rs.12, 825,522 in the financial results was observed in the year under review as compared with the preceding year.

3.2 Analytical Financial Review

Even though the government's contribution and other income have increased by Rs. 140,377,891 and Rs.6, 303,274 respectively in the year under review as compared with the preceding year increase in personal emoluments , contracted services, other recurrent expenditure, supply and consumption and maintenance expenses by Rs.117,119,956, compared to the preceding year and the disposal loss of Rs.43,446,162 arising from removing land and buildings at Buttala from the books, were the major reasons for the decrease.

4. Operating Review

4.1 Performance

The cost incurred for the education of 3,424 students during the year under review amounted to Rs.1,045,290,171 and the cost per student was Rs.305, 283. In the preceding year the cost incurred for the education of 3,359 was Rs. 724,914,540 and the cost per student was Rs.215, 813. Accordingly, the number of students had increased by 65 and the cost per student was increased by Rs.89,470 during the year under review as compared with the preceding year.



4.2 Transactions of Contentious Nature

The following observations are made.

- (a) Even though a capital expenditure of Rs. 1,420,450 was incurred in the year under review for revision of syllabus, the syllabuses were not revised even by May 2015 and failed to report the progress.
- (b) The transparency of the decisions taken by the members of the department's procurement committee could not be satisfied in audit as the period of the contract of Rs.8,514,000 for cleaning services of the university has been extended for another 06 months without acceptable reasons, by indicating that there are technical errors in the bid documents when offering contracts to outside parties.

4.3 Underutilization of Funds

It was observed that twelve funds maintained by the University, amounting to Rs.4,606,911 were inactive over the periods from 2 to 5 years.

4.4 Idle and Underutilized Assets

Two tractor trailers, 25 fiber chairs, 02 plastic tanks of 5,000 liters and 03 tanks of 2,000 liters kept unsecured at vehicle parking premises without being used.

4.5 Deficiencies in Contract Administration

Cabinet approval was granted to build an Information Technology building and an Administrative building in year 2005 and 2007 respectively. Even though the construction works were not commenced up to May 2015, a sum of Rs. 3,337,508 had been spent as consultancy fees and for the plaque.



4.6 Uneconomic Transactions

The following observations are made.

- (a) Even though a drinking water well for the Faculty of Management was built in a disorderly manner, in a rain water drainage by spending Rs. 760,767 without carrying out a proper feasibility study in the year under review, it was observed that water is not good for drinking.
- (b) Even though it was mentioned that the pumping rate of the tube well which was being constructed near to new female hostel at a cost of Rs.1,050,196 was 135 liters per minute, the actual pumping rate is 20 liters per minute. However the well was not yet used.
- (c) Due to purchase of air conditioned machines for a value of Rs.4,263,600 which are not compatible with the single phase electrical system of the University, an additional expenditure of Rs.871,820 had to be incurred to renovate the existing single phase electrical system.

4.7 Personnel Administration

The following observations are made.

- (a) Six positions were vacant out of 212 approved academic cadre for the university, as at 31 December 2014 and 03 vacancies out of that were for the post of Professor and the other 03 vacancies were for the post of Senior Lecturer.
- (b) The University has failed to recruit the Bursar of the University according to Section 33 in the Part vi of the Universities Act, No.16 of 1978.



- (c) There were 31 staff grade posts and 495 non-staff grade posts in the approved cadre for non academic staff of the University as at 31 December 2014 and out of them, 07 posts and 58 posts were vacant respectively. The authorities of the University had failed to fill those vacancies.

5. Accountability and Good Governance

5.1 Corporate Plan

A review of operating results of the prior three years, was not included in the Corporate Plan prepared for the period term year 2011 to 2015 according to the paragraph 5.1.2 of the Public Enterprise Circular No.PED/12 of 02 June 2003. The Corporate Plan had not been prepared in such a way to evaluate the annual progress as monetary values of the targets to be achieved were not included.

5.2 Internal Audit

According to the section 134(3) of Financial Regulations of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka, copies of the internal audit reports of a department should be submitted to the Auditor General. Nevertheless, such copies had not been submitted.

5.3 Budgetary Control

A sum of Rs.64,125,390 had been spent exceeding the estimated limits for revenue expenditure, and as a percentage it was 9 percent. Out of the provisions made in the budget as capital expenditure, 30 percent which is amounting to Rs.119, 797,619 was remaining. Thus it was observed that the budget had not been made use of as an effective instrument of management control.

5.4 Unresolved Audit Paragraphs

The position of implementing the directive given by the Committee on Public Enterprises held on 05 June 2014 is as follows.



- (a) Even though the cabinet approval was granted for the construction of administrative building in year 2007, construction works of that building had not been commenced up to May 2015. However, officers responsible for spending Rs. 1,494,543 as initial expenses were not reported to the committee.
- (b) A sum of Rs.60,000 had been paid from the University's money for the damages caused to the private vehicle of the Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture inside the university premises, and action had not been taken to recover that money or to report about the responsible officers to the Committee.

Deficiencies in systems and controls observed during the course of audit were brought to the notice of the Vice Chancellor of the University. Special attention is needed in respect of the following areas of systems and controls.

- (a) Asset Management
- (b) Personnel Management
- (c) Corporate and Action Plans
- (d) Stock Management
- (e) Expenditure Management
