## Message of the Vice-Chancellor

The University of Ruhuna's contributions to enhance the knowledge capital of the country through intellectual human resources development were significantly improved during the year 2012. The university was able to reach this target through improving the quality and relevance of its educational and research programmes. As a leading higher education institute in the country, University of Ruhuna continues to seek new ways to support scholars and students at all levels in their pursuit and testing of new ideas and to expand the impact that their ideas can have around the globe. Therefore in the year 2012, University of Ruhuna continued to encourage and support cross-disciplinary research collaboration among academics by providing large number of research grants under the "Transforming of University of Ruhuna into International Status (TURIS) Project".

We have re-imagined our approach to address the international intellectual community by conducting number of international symposia. Faculty of Agriculture and Engineering conducted four international symposia within this year. The Faculty of Agriculture introduced three new degree programmes this year with the objectives of expanding the higher education and improving the relevance.

The building programme showed significant improvement this year. The stage I of the new building complex for the Faculty of Fisheries and Marine Sciences & Technology was commenced this year scheduled to use by end of next year. The construction of near-abandoned building project for the Examination Hall for the Faculty of Humanities & Social Sciences was recommenced and scheduled to be finish next year.



## FACULTY OF ENGINEERING

### *Dean's statement/Review*

The Faculty of Engineering, University of Ruhuna functioned smoothly during the year 2012 under the leadership of Dr. A.M.N. Alagiyawanna who has been serving as the Dean. His second term in the Office of the Dean was over by 31<sup>st</sup> December 2012.

Due to the issues of Z-Score of 2012 A/L students and related court cases, the UGC could not assign new students for year 2012. Therefore, the Faculty could not admit any new student for year 2012. Also, academic works of available students were disturbed for couple of months due to trade union actions of academic staff as well as non academic staff. Therefore, no student could graduate in 2012. The academic semesters were extended and final years are to graduate in January 2013. The Engineering Education Center of the Faculty arranged three months industrial training for 297 Engineering undergraduates at various industries in Sri Lanka with the support of National Apprentice and Industrial Training Authority. Annual surveying work camp for final year Civil and Environmental Engineering students were held at Ebilipitiya with the support of Mahaweli Authority and the University.

Student Union of the Faculty under the guidance of Faculty organized several activities during year 2012. Especially, the students organized a shramadana campaign to colour wash the student center and canteen. The Faculty established the Ruhuna Engineering Faculty Scholarship Foundation and also arrangements were done to establish the Engineering Faculty Sports Club for the benefits of students. The Faculty also established the Playground Development Fund and funds will be generated by hiring the playground to external organizations when the students are not used. An Alumina association attached to the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering was also established.

Underground power cabling system replacing the temporary power supply arrangement was started and partly carried out under the rehabilitation funds of year 2012. Surge arrestor system to protect the power supply system from lightning was installed at all main buildings. International bandwidth was increased to 5 mbps from 2 mbps from 1<sup>st</sup> May, 2012. New telephone system was installed for the Faculty as the existing system was completely damaged due to lightening in April 2012. Some partitioning works were also done at departments. A shelter was erected for parking the bikes of staff in the Administration Building.

The approval of the Cabinet of Ministers was received for the new three story library building proposal submitted by the Faculty. The Total Cost Estimate was Rs. 128.6 M and the State Engineering Corporation was approved as the Consultant of the Project. Designing and preparation of drawing and BOQ were started. Arrangements were made to call tenders to complete the partly constructed hostel block, and Drawing Office & Auditorium complex.

The Faculty received 8 M as capital allocation from University and purchased essential laboratory equipments. The University Grants Commission provided additional funds of Rs. 8 M and purchased 40 Computers, IT accessories and 3 multimedia projectors etc. The Faculty also purchased laboratory equipments worth of Rs. 6 M using the funds received from the Internationalization of University of Ruhuna grant for the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering and Department of Mechanical and Manufacturing Engineering. A 15 Seated new passenger Van (Nissan Urvan) worth of Rs. 8.4 M was also received through the SATREPS project of Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering funded by JICA. In addition, SATREPS project facilitated one Research Assistant who is a M.Phil candidate of the University and provided funds and few equipments for various activities of the projects.

Also, Faculty submitted a proposal for enhancing the infrastructure requirements (student canteen, examination hall and some partitioning works) and laboratory requirements for catering additional intake to be admitted from 2011 A/L. In addition, Faculty had a serious concern on the severe shortage of the academic staff in the Faculty and has submitted a proposal to Ministry of Higher Education to consider for implementing to attract and to retain academic staff in the Faculty.

University of Adger, Norway offered two full scholarship for M.Sc. degree in Renewable Energy and two full scholarships for Information Technology and four graduates of the Department of Electrical and Information Engineering were nominated in year 2012.

The Faculty has made arrangement to sign MOU with Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering, University of Ruhuna and Provincial Department of irrigation (Southern Province) for initiating University-Industry collaborative research “Development of an information retrieval system for minor irrigation tanks in Southern Province”. Another MOU was proposed to sign between Toyama Prefectural University (TPU), Japan and University of Ruhuna for collaborative research.

IESL recommended full accreditation for 5 years in place of two year conditional accreditation for the Civil and Environmental Engineering programme as the department successfully met the imposed conditions within last two years. Faculty has taken actions to register 06 new candidates for M.Phil degrees. Few academics were successful in receiving research grants from National Science Foundation (02) and Internationalization of University of Ruhuna grant (04).

## FACULTY OF FISHERIES AND MARINE SCIENCES & TECHNOLOGY

### *Dean's statement/Review*

Academic Programme - The total student population of the Faculty owing to the year 2012 account to 187 students. Academic programme of the Faculty was behind the other faculties and therefore intake of 2010 and 2011 were combined to avoid delays. However this was not effective due to the lengthy non academic and academic trade union actions respectively. In order to facilitate the additional intake in 2012, a decision was taken to construct a temporary building at the new Faculty premises.

Human Resources - Two new academic staff positions were received to the Faculty from UGC and another two were borrowed from the Faculty of Management and Finance. All four positions for the three academic departments were advertised. Presently the Faculty has nearly 1:14 teacher: student ratio without considering the academic staff on study leave which is below the standards for a B.Sc. special degree programmes in science.

Building Programme – Phase I of the building programme of the Faculty commenced on 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2012 with the participation of the Vice Chancellor. At the end of the year 2012 nearly, 50% of the project has been completed. Also, for the Phase II, a proposal was submitted to the Ministry of Higher Education with an estimated cost of Rs. 694.6 millions for three Departments.

Research Vessel- The completed vessel was expected to hand over in August 2012. Delay of supplying air-conditioner and the generator to the Sri Lanka Navy by relevant agencies the handing over was delayed.

University Township Development Project – The Faculty submitted a comprehensive proposal for the University Township Development and that was accepted by the Ministry of Finance for funding. Request was made to the Secretary of the Ministry of Urban Development Authority for assistance in designing the project.

Service Laboratory – The Faculty was registered as an accepted water quality analysis laboratory under Central Environmental Authority and water samples from industries will be analyzed from different industries for environmental certification.

Progress in Research - Presently, there are six research projects funded by outside institutions while there are some other projects supported by the Faculty. At present there are three MPhil students and two PhD students working on these projects. The first research degree of the Faculty was produced. Also, the Faculty was able to publish three international papers and in addition to that 15 papers published in local conferences and journals.

International Collaboration - MoU Signing Ceremony between South China Sea Institute of Oceanology (SCSIO) and the University of Ruhuna was held successfully on 09th January 2012. As a result of this agreement, a fully automated weather station was established as an activity.

## FACULTY OF MANAGEMENT AND FINANCE

### *Dean's Statement/Review*

The Faculty of Management & Finance is a newly established Faculty which came in to the existence since 29th April 2003 at the main premises of the University of Ruhuna. The Faculty has three Departments of studies namely Department of Management & Entrepreneurship, Department of Accounting & Finance and Department of Marketing, in addition to the computer unit and the e-learning centre. At present Faculty offers courses in a range of disciplines leading to Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) degrees. Under the current educational reforms at the University, Course-Unit based Undergraduate Programmes were introduced with effect from September 2001. With these reforms, the Faculty is now offering BBA Degree Programmes in both Sinhala and English mediums. Other than the Undergraduate programmes, the faculty offers Master in Philosophy (M.Phil.) and Master of Commerce (M.Com.) degree programmes based on independent research. Postgraduate Diploma in Business Administration (PDBA) and Master of Business Administration (MBA) programmes are special degree programmes offered by the faculty, which are mainly based on coursework and research component

***Mission of the Faculty:*** This Faculty is designed to investigate into unexplored phenomena on Management and Finance by maintaining a trade-off between modern Management Systems and Sri Lankan regional cultural contents, to transfer such knowledge by means of study programmes, conferences and publications, and to become the Centre for Regional Management Studies in Sri Lanka.

***Objective of the Degree program at the Faculty:*** Produce graduates with a sound knowledge, skills and attitudes of Management and Finance to ensure and uplift the socio-economic standards of the country.

### ***Faculty Undergraduates and Study Programs:***

The total student population of the Faculty for the year 2012 is 1606 and there were total of 280 Management graduates in the year 2012 for the General Convocation of the University of Ruhuna. The Faculty could run the study programs through expediting the programs though there was academic and non-academic trade union actions in the University system.

The Faculty could complete most of the parts of the revision of the existing Bachelor of Business Administration degree program at the Faculty. Thus, the Diploma in Marketing Management program was commenced as one of the fee levying programs at the Faculty. In addition, the Faculty plans to offer Diploma in Management of Local Government program in the year 2013.

### ***Human Resources at the Faculty:***

There are seven (07) new academic staff recruitments in the year 2012 to the Faculty and they were allocated to the three Academic Departments of the Faculty as 02 for the Department of Accounting and Finance, 04 for the Department of Management and Entrepreneurships and 01 for the Department of Marketing. Thus, there were four (04) promotions to Senior Lecturer Grade II while there was only one promotion to Senior Lecturer Grade I. The total number of non academic staff was remains the same as there are no any new recruitments

### ***New Faculty Building Complex:***

The initial work of the new Faculty Building complex has been completed and it is expected to lay the foundation stone at the beginning of the year 2013. The estimated cost of the Faculty Building project is approximately Rs. 332 million.

### ***Research and Developments Activities at the Faculty:***

The Faculty has conducted jointly conducted an international Conference: 1st International Conference on Management and Economics: ICME 2012 at COMSATS, Pakistan. Thus, there are two new MPhil research projects and the staff has received some Research grants from the project of Transforming University of Ruhuna into International Status.

## FACULTY OF SCIENCE

### Dean's statement/Review

A major curriculum revision is in progress which is to be implemented with the new batch of students in 2013 (2012 A/L batch). More emphasis will be given on industrial applications and undergraduate research projects. Industrial Training and Research Coordinating Centre (ITRCC), a virtual centre, has been established. A coordinator for ITRCC has been appointed with the approval of the Council. A workshop was organized in Jan. 2012 for small industries in Matara and Hambanthota districts. Some students have been involved in industry related research projects.

The proposal submitted by the faculty for competitive Quality & Innovative Grant (QIG), window 1 &2, under HETC project has been selected to fund. The faculty is expecting to receive Rs. 25 million under this proposal, for a period of three years starting from 2013. The staff of the Faculty has received 12 research grants of total of more than Rs 20 million under Internationalization of Universities Grant received to the University for 2011 and 2012. Furthermore, some research equipment worth of Rs. 7.5 million have been approved for the faculty of science in 2012 under the same grant. The proposal submitted under HETC QIG Window 4 competitive grants, Research Dissemination and Commercialization Projects, of total of Rs. 10 million has also been approved.

A new MSc. Degree programme is in preparation by the committee appointed by the Faculty Board. The number of new students registered for postgraduate research degrees have been significantly increased this year and majority of them have received research assistantships under the internationalization of universities grants

Management Information System of Faculty of Science (FOSMIS) has been successfully expanded to incorporate many facilities. At present, the students could register for course units and examinations online through FOSMIS. The applications for Special Degree Programmes are called through FOSMIS and the students could submit their applications by completing an online application form interactively. Students could monitor their records, such as, courses completed and registered, attendance for classes, results, GPA etc. through FOSMIS. Notices and messages for students could be posted on FOSMIS. Students are quite happy with this system.

Carriers Fair was organized successfully in this year with the participation of several industries and final year students. Science Symposium has been organized in this year but scheduled to be held in Jan. 2013. International conference on "Meeting on Mangrove ecology, functioning and Management" (MMM3) and a Workshop on Appraisal of policies towards the Climate Compatible Development (CCD) in the coastal zone of Sri Lanka. More than 100 scientists from various parts of the world participated to the conference, in addition to about 20 local participants.

The details of curriculum development, research output, national services, community services, University services and international contributions of individual departments are given in Table 6.

As a newly started Faculty of University of Ruhuna. The Faculty of Graduate Studies just reached to its 2<sup>nd</sup> year of age. During the last year 20 students were newly registered for postgraduate research studies (M.A by research, M.Phil. & Ph.D.) increasing the enrolment of research students up to 175 (Table 1.1). Meanwhile 09 students (02 Ph.Ds & 07 M.Phils) have completed their research degrees (Table 1.2) & 10 students have submitted their thesis & waiting until other formalities (thesis evaluation, viva voce examination. etc) get completed.

### 3. Centre for Conflict Studies

The Centre for Conflict Studies was established in August 2004 and was fully equipped with the assistances of USAID (OTI) programme in December 2005.

The centre presently operates under the wings of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences. The following are its objectives:

- Enhancing social-cultural harmony within the Sri Lankan society.
- Facilitating the conflict study centre as a resource base for local, national and international parties/ partners who work or have an interest in the field of conflict resolution and peace building.
- Linking local communities with the academic communities in the universities for stimulating debate and dialogue on the issues relating to social harmony and peace building and also serving as a practical resource for local or international initiatives seeking to address conflict.
- Creating an environment within the university student community to stimulate academic debates over the current issues of conflict and peace building in the country.

### 4. Centre for Modern Languages & Civilizations

Centre for Modern Languages and Civilizations was established on 26 July 2002 as a “Resource Centre for Modern Languages”. Presently French, German, Japanese, Korean, Tamil and Hindi courses are conducted under this Centre for the undergraduates. All study programmes under Modern Languages are conducted by a team of local and foreign teachers and the duration of each course is 120 hrs.

#### Registration of Students

489 Students from four faculties were registered for 06 Language courses for the 2012/2013 academic year.

#### Tamil Language

36 students were registered for the 5<sup>th</sup> batch of external Tamil course started on 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2012 and 36 students of the 4<sup>th</sup> batch of external Tamil course have successfully completed the Certificate Course in Tamil Language Proficiency.

#### Japanese Language

The first Intake of Certificate Course in Japanese Language Proficiency started on 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2011 for external students. Due to the lack of funds to continue the Certificate Course in Japanese Language for internal students it was combined with the course started for external candidates. The Japanese Foundation granted US \$ 3035.93 to purchase teaching materials and staff expansion for the Japanese Language course.

#### Korean Language

Korean Embassy has appointed new KOIKA volunteer Ms. Kim Ji-He to teach Korean Language in the University of Ruhuna. To replace Ms. Kim Young Ji who left from Sri Lanka. Korean International Cooperation Agency (KOIKA) donated teaching materials (ie: text books, CD, VCD, DVD) and furniture to develop the Korean Language course. Three students have successfully completed the Certificate Course in Korean Language.

## 5. Centre for International Affairs

Centre for International Affairs (CINTA) was inaugurated in 2005, according to a Senate decision taken at the 199<sup>th</sup> Senate meeting of the University, of Ruhuna held on 17.08.2005.

The services rendered by the CINTA have now playing an important role in the University of Ruhuna promoting academic programmes with foreign universities, scholars and students. The centre is functioning as the coordinating body in developing links and signing Memoranda's of Understanding etc. in order to strengthen the international academic links between the University of Ruhuna and international organizations.

### • Academic Activities

#### 1. MA Degree Programme in Conflict, Peace and Development Studies (CPDS)

The MA programme in Conflict, Peace and Development Studies (CPDS) was continued during the year 2012 as well. The programme was successfully completed by the 4<sup>th</sup> cohort students and 18 more students including eleven Nepali students are being studying for the 2012/2013 academic year. The CINTA was able to coordinate the programme by maintaining close relationships with the Tribhuvan University in Nepal and the Life Science University in Norway. Apart from the academic and practical activities, the CINTA has hosted the 2012 annual meeting of the CPDS programme. The annual meeting was participated by the representatives from the Life Science, University of Norway, Tribhuvan University in Nepal, Eastern University of Sri Lanka and the University of Ruhuna. The programme is continually contributing to develop South-South and North-South relationships while raising the international profile of the University of Ruhuna.

#### 2. International Collaborative Workshops/ Research Projects

##### 2.1 Resilience International Workshop

Center for International Affairs has conducted an International Workshop on 13<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup> October 2012.

##### 2.2 Resilience Project: 'Tangled in their own (safety)-nets?' Resilience, adaptability, and transformability of small-scale fishing communities in the face of the World fisheries crisis.

Through the conceptualization and operationalization of both "resilience" and "wellbeing", the project will contribute to the growing research on adaptability to changes in the context of poverty, and address the resource scarcity scenarios and their consequence on the poor's wellbeing. The project will benefit the researchers in the University of Ruhuna by strengthening their research capacity which will be achieved through intense cooperation and networking amongst researchers (South-South and North-South), active involvement of the Southern partners in technical methodological workshops, analytical framework design, data analyses and publications.

##### 2.3 Cocoon Project: "Reincorporating the Excluded- Providing space for small scale fishers in the sustainable development of fisheries in South Africa and South Asia"

By dealing effectively with fisheries conflicts, the project will provide space some of the important fisheries stakeholders excluded from the process of fisheries development and, also fulfill certain knowledge gaps in the fields of socioeconomics and governance. The project will benefit the University of Ruhuna and Sri Lanka as a whole, in strengthening the capacities and skills of organizations, groups and individuals at different levels and also by creating opportunities for Sri Lankan students to pursue their Masters and Doctorate studies in the disciplines of fisheries law, governance and management.

#### 3. The following students were registered at the CINTA to follow Masters and research programmes at the University of Ruhuna.

- 18 students from Nepal, Tribuvan University – MA in NOMA/CPDS Programme
- 01 student from Belgium, University of Belgium- as a research student

## 7. Distance and Continuing Education Unit

Distance and Continuing Education Unit (DCEU) of the University of Ruhuna, previously named External Examination Unit (EEU) established in 1997 with the broad objective of providing higher educational opportunities to prospective students in the region and country who are unable to enter national universities in Sri Lanka. Distance and Continuing Education Unit has been growing steadily and currently cater to the needs of over 30,000 external under graduates. The total number of students applied to the General Degree in Arts (External) Programme in year 2012 is 3596 and these students to be registered after conducting the aptitude test as per UGC circular 932.

The Distance and Continuing Education Unit has conducted the first Examinations in Arts (External) examination in February 2012. 402 number of total candidates has successfully got through the General Degree in Arts (External) part II in year 2012 and so far, 4421 students have been graduated from the University.

With the guidelines of the UGC circular 932 Distance and Continuing Education Unit decided to introduce new courses of studies for the students admitted from year 2012, to cater current and emerging social demands.

Distance and Continuing Education Unit obtained 25 million grant under UDG-EDP-HETC Project for the proposal submitted on Improving Relevance and Quality of External Degree Programme. Under UDG-EDP grant, DCEU has planned to conduct following activities.

- I. Improve Governance and Management
- II. Improve Quality and Relevance
- III. Enhance Learning Resources and Learner Support Services
- IV. Promote Collaboration with State and Non-state Training Institutions

In view of expanding its activities, DCEU will be established three regional centers in Hambanthota, Galle and Matara.

To improve and enhance the knowledge of external students, Distance and Continuing Education Unit has been successfully conducted 35 feedback seminars in the year 2012 with the contribution of Professors and Senior Lecturers of the University of Ruhuna.

#### Duration of the Course

Annual Registration

The University of Ruhuna commenced enrollment for External degrees in 1997. The annual intake was around 2000 during the initial few years and it has exceeded 3000 now. As per guidelines of the UGC circular 932 annual intake of students for the Degree Programme will be limited to double the number of students intake for the internal programme. **Report of the Auditor General on the Financial Statements of the University of Ruhuna for the year ended 31 December 2012 in terms of Section 108(1) of the Universities Act, No.16 of 1978.**

The audit of financial statements of the University of Ruhuna for the year ended 31 December 2012 comprising the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2012 and the comprehensive statement of financial performance, cash flow statement for the year then ended and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information was carried out under my direction in pursuance of provisions in Article 154(1) of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka read in conjunction with Sub-section 107 (5) and Section 108(1) and (3) of the Universities Act, No. 16 of 1978. My comments and observations which I consider should be published with the annual report of the University in terms of Sub-section 108 (1) of the Universities Act appear in this report. A detailed report in terms of Sub-section 108 (2) of the Universities Act was issued to the Vice Chancellor of the University on 15 May 2013.

1.2 Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Public Sector Accounting Standards and for such internal control as the management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatements whether due to fraud or error.

1:3 Auditor's Responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards. Those Standards require that I comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements.

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An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatements of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the University's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the University's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. Sub-sections (3) and (4) of the Section 13 of the Finance Act, No. 38 of 1971 give discretionary powers to the Auditor General to determine the scope and extent of the audit.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my qualified audit opinion.

#### 1.4 Basis for Qualified Audit Opinion

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My opinion is qualified based on the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of this report.

#### 2. Financial Statements

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##### 2.1 Qualified Opinion

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In my opinion, except for the effects of the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of this report, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the University of Ruhuna as at 31 December 2012 and its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards.

## 2.2 Comments on Financial Statements

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### 2.2.1 Accounting Deficiencies

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The following observations are made.

- (a) Seventeen vehicles belonging to the University had not been revalued and brought to account whereas only the residual value of them had been shown. Out of these vehicles, the value of 16 vehicles had been included in the accounts as Rs.33,000. Further, the value of a bus, an ambulance, 04 three wheelers, 05 motor cycles and one tractor and trailer which are being used at present and existing in running condition had not been brought to the Account of Motor Vehicles as at 31 December 2012 as fixed assets.
- (b) Even though the balances of accounts of the financial assets and liabilities should have been converted at the exchange rate prevailed at the end of the accounting period and the profits or losses incurred thereon should have been adjusted to the Income and Expenditure Account when converting the foreign currency transactions of the Institute into the local currencies, the losses as at 31 December 2012 identified in that manner amounted to Rs.325,722 and it had not been brought to account. Similarly, the income for the year under review relating to that account amounted to Rs.44,185. However, it had been brought to account as Rs.52,915 and as such the income for the year had been brought to account overstating by Rs.8,730.
- (c) The custom duty and harbour charges amounting to Rs.3,210,395 to be paid at the time of importation of micro bus obtained through the JAICA Project had only been paid by the University. Accordingly, the total value of the vehicle (Including the Value Added Tax) amounted to Rs.8,400,000. However, it had been brought to account as Rs.11,610,395. Therefore, it was observed that the import duty amounting to Rs.3,210,395 had been brought to account twice.
- (d) A sum of Rs.4,655,664 spent during the year under review for making fence to the Gam Udawa land which was handed over to the Faculty of Agriculture, had been debited to the buildings account instead of being debited to the lands account.
- (e) The value of 03 plots of lands in extent of 378.3 perches acquired from the lands belonging to the University in the years 1982, 1985 and 2006 had not been assessed and included in the accounts.

- (f) The loan balances which could not be recovered from the monthly salaries of the employees had been entered in a separate account named HO 3030 with the expectation of recovering from the Provident Fund. Even though the balance of this account should have been Rs.3,466,532, it had been entered as Rs.3,242,581 and as such a difference of Rs.223,951 was observed. Further, it was decided to recover these loan balances from the Universities Provident Fund. However, it was observed that there were no balances in the provident fund accounts of 11 employees when making reconciliation with the list of balances of Provident Fund as at 31 December 2012 computed and forwarded by the University Grants Commission. Accordingly, alternative action had not been taken up to now to recover a sum of Rs.385,025 remained outstanding. In this connection computation of interest had also not been made.

#### 2.2.2 Unreconciled Control Accounts

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The following observations are made.

- (a) There was a difference of Rs.1,427,390 between the balances according to the subsidiary records relating to 10 projects maintained by the University and the balances according to the accounts.
- (b) The daily egg collecting register and egg yield register maintained at the Mapalana Farm had not been properly maintained and always there were differences between those registers. A difference of 1,764 eggs was observed between those registers in the month of September 2012 itself and the value of those was Rs.26,460.

#### 2.2.3 Unsettled Accounts

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Advances amounting to Rs.109,414 granted for 03 projects 03 years ago and advances amounting to Rs.151,392 granted to 06 officers and one institution in the year 2012 had not been settled even up to 31 December 2012.

#### 2.2.4 Unexplained Differences

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According to the schedules of the final accounts and schedules submitted by the Academic Institution Division, two differences of Rs.3,247,201 and Rs.3,073,555 respectively were observed between the amount recovered and amount to be recovered from the Lecturers who had violated the agreements.

#### 2.2.5 Lack of Evidence for Audit

The following observations are made

- (a) Even though the value of stocks of animals of the Mapalana Farm as at 31 December 2012 had been assessed as Rs.1,779,000, it was unable to correctly verify the value of stocks of those animals due to improper maintenance of register of animals of the farm. Further, the entire stock of animals of the farm should have been included in the financial statements. However, the value of products prevailed at the stall of the farm as at that date had not been shown in the financial statements under the closing stock. Similarly, information relating to

the value of animal foods amounting to Rs.2,454,406 purchased during the year under review and the value of closing stock of animal medicines amounting to Rs.44,828 had not been shown in the financial statements.

- (b) A Register of Fixed Assets prepared properly so as to include all the assets of the University had not been submitted for audit.

#### 2.2.6 Non-compliance with Laws, Rules, Regulations and Management Decisions

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The following instances of non-compliances were observed.

(b) Employees Provident Fund Act No.08 of 1971 and Employees Trust Fund Act No.46 of 1980	Even though sums of Rs.338,400 and Rs.55,260 should have been paid as contributions of the Employees Provident Fund and the Employees Trust Fund respectively for 08 farm labourers of the Faculty of Agriculture Science from December 2011 to July 2012 and for 08 officers of the Faculty of Medicine from July to November 2012, it had not been paid accordingly.

(c) Sections 5.2 and 5.6 of Chapter XIX of the Establishments Code of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka.

A percentage of 12.5 from the salary of a married officer and a percentage of 7.5 from the salary of an unmarried officer should have been recovered as rent for the occupation of the permanent quarters. Otherwise, the valuation report from the Chief Valuer and approval thereon from the Secretary of the Ministry should have been obtained if a fixed rent is recovered. However, the University Fund had incurred a loss of about Rs.3,103,188 in the year 2012 due to recovery of fixed rents from the officers of the University who had occupied the official quarters. Further, quarters should be allocated only to a limited period. It was not obvious that on which basis the quarters had been allocated due to occupation in the quarters for long period, and not maintaining a waiting list of applicants of the quarters.

(d) Financial Regulations of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka 570 and 571

Action had not been taken in terms of the Financial Regulations in respect of deposits amounting to Rs.9,352,916 remaining for a period over 02 years as at 31 December 2012.

### 3. Financial Review

#### 3.1 Financial Results

According to the financial statements presented, the activities of the University for the year ended 31 December 2012 had resulted in a deficit of Rs.1,431,816,000 while this deficit had become a surplus of Rs.112,332,000 as a result of grant of Rs.1,544,148,000 received from the Government for recurrent expenditure. The deficit for the preceding year was Rs.1,202,969,000 before taking into consideration the Government grant and the deficit had become a surplus of Rs.263,947,000 as a result of the Government grant of Rs.1,466,916,000 for recurrent expenditure for that year. The surplus for the year under review had decreased by Rs.151,615,000 as compared with the preceding year.

### 3.2 Analytical Financial Review

A summary of Income and Expenditure is given below.

The following observations are made in this connection.

- Income had decreased as compared with the year 2011 and the decrease of income from Mapalana Farm by Rs.2,731,000 and decrease of income from external courses by Rs.11,275,000 was the reason for this. However, miscellaneous income had increased by Rs.2,745,000.
- Expenditure had increased by Rs.217,305,000 as compared with the year 2011 and the increase of salary expenditure, expenditure on supplies and utilities and maintenance and contractual services by Rs.188,933,000, Rs.13,002,000 and Rs.19,387,000 respectively was the reason for this.
- Advances paid for capital activities had increased by 249 per cent in the year 2012 and payment of advances amounting to Rs.17,338,186 for purchasing research vessel to the Faculty of Fisheries, Marine Science and Technology was the reason for this.

- (c) Advances paid for capital activities had increased by 249 per cent in the year 2012 and payment of advances amounting to Rs.17,338,186 for purchasing research vessel to the Faculty of Fisheries, Marine Science and Technology was the reason for this.
- (d) Trade and other receivables had increased by 32 per cent due to increase of advances on transport expenditure and advances receivable on international researches. These balances had increased on the basis of non-reimbursement of expenditure for air ticket provided to the lecturers who had gone abroad on study leave (Based on reimbursement from the University Grants Commission) up to 09 May 2013.
- (e) The balance of gifts and donations had increased by 56 per cent due to receipt of cash during the year for new projects and Green Dyke Project.
- (f) The balance stock had increased by 38 per cent due to increase of stocks purchased to the Head Office by 58 per cent and increase of stocks purchased to the Faculty of Engineering by 183 per cent.

### 3.3 Legal Action Initiated against the Institute and by the Institute.

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- (a) Eighteen cases had been filed in the courts against the University requesting compensation amounting to Rs.32,972,272 in respect of matters such as not taking action in terms of agreements, decisions of the Board of Control and the Board of Appeal, not making payment of contribution to the Employees Provident Fund and decisions taken by the Board of Control.
- (b) A case had been filed at the Supreme Court by the University against the verdict given by the Appeal Court for dismissing a lecturer on probationary from the service in connection with a cash fraud.

### 3.4 Working Capital Management

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Current ratio and quick assets ratio had decreased from 3.13 to 1.45 and from 2.98 to 1.32 respectively due to decrease of current assets by 26 per cent and increase of current liabilities by 60 per cent in the year 2012 as compared with the year 2011.

#### 4. Operating Review

##### 4.1 Performance

##### 4.1.1 Academic Activities

Important data relating to academic activities of the University for the year under review are given below.

Students failed at the examination of the Faculty of Science, Faculty of Agriculture Science and the Faculty of Fisheries, Marine Science and Technology were 32 per cent, 31 per cent and 31 per cent respectively. Accordingly, it was observed that out of the total candidates, 1/3 of the candidates had failed the examination.

The following observations are made in this connection.

The cost per student of the Faculty of Agriculture Science which bearing the highest cost per student, was at a higher percentage of 423 per cent as compared with the cost per student of the Faculty of Management and Finance which bearing the lowest cost per student. This was a higher value of 84 per cent exceeding the cost per student of the Faculty of Engineering. On the whole, there was an increase in the cost per student of all the faculties.

#### 4.1.3 Obtaining Study Leave and Sabbatical Leave by the Academic Staff

Total academic staff of the University was 448. Out of these, 101 officers had obtained study leave during the academic year 2012 whereas 27 officers had obtained sabbatical leave during the academic year 2012. Accordingly, 29 per cent of the entire academic staff had obtained study leave and sabbatical leave.

The following observations are made in this connection.

- (a) Even though study leave and sabbatical leave should have been approved for lecturers so as to carry out the academic activities of the University continuously without any obstacle, in several instances study leave and sabbatical leave had been approved for more than 50 per cent of the academic staff of the Departments. Further, this situation had exceeded the level of 80 per cent in certain Departments.

Example:-

- There were 06 academic staff at the Department of Geological Science and out of them, 05 persons had obtained study leave.
- There were 05 academic staff in the Department of Pharmacology of the Faculty of Medicine and out of them 03 persons had obtained study leave and one person had obtained sabbatical leave.

- (b) Owing to granting study leave and sabbatical leave to the academic staff without any control, external lecturers had to be recruited for covering up the lecture hours of those lecturers. Accordingly, a sum of Rs.2,260,500 had to be spent (Except travelling expenditure) in the year 2012 for external lecture fees for 04 Departments only.
- (c) According to the test check, 47 lecturers of 07 Departments belonging to 05 Faculties had conducted lectures for 4,277 hours in the academic year 2011/2012. Among these, 14 lecturers had conducted 651 lecture hours and it had represented an average value of 1.9 hours per week.
- (d) The entire approved lectures hours of 16 hours had not been conducted relating to 04 subjects of the Department of Surgery of the Faculty of Medicine.

#### 4.2 Underutilisation of Funds

Among the research projects implemented at the University, 17 projects had not been implemented in the year 2012 and as such a sum of Rs.3,409,451 allocated for these projects had remained idle. Out of Rs.4,844,945 provided for 05 projects, only a sum of Rs.17,116 had been spent during the year under review.

#### 4.3 Idle and Underutilised Assets

Stocks valued at Rs.338,037 and Rs.245,796 had remained at the main stores and at the Faculty of Agriculture Science respectively for long period without issuing due to purchasing of stock without identifying the requirement.

#### 4.4 Uneconomic Transactions

Inquiry of an officer interdicted for irregularities taken place and referred to disciplinary action had taken nearly a period of 02 years for completion. A surcharge of Rs.100,710 had been paid at the time of releasing gratuity due to accepting his request for retirement during that period.

#### 4.6 Utilisation of Vehicles

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The following observations are made.

- (a) Even though 02 vehicles of the Faculty of Agriculture and the Faculty of Engineering had been underutilized, hired vehicles had been obtained and paid sums of Rs.58,390 and Rs.370,900 respectively. Further, leave had been approved for drivers without considering the service requirement. Opportunity had been given to the drivers of the Head Office, Wellamadama for remaining idle without deploying in the service.
- (b) A cab vehicle of the Faculty of Agriculture Science was condemned from 05 May 2010. Even though a period of nearly 2 ½ years had elapsed after taking action to repair, it had remained idle due to not taking a decision by the Control Authority to repair it.
- (c) Even though it was shown that test should have been carried out for consumption of fuel of all the vehicles in terms of Section 08 of Chapter XXVII of the Establishments Code of the University Grants Commission and the Institute for Higher Studies, these tests had not been carried out in respect of vehicles belonging to the University whereas fuel had been balanced under various values. Further, information that should be recorded in the reverse of the running chart in Form General 268 had not been shown. In addition to this, a Register of Vehicles and a Register of Vehicle Repairs had not been maintained.
- (d) Entering vehicle accidents in the Register of Losses and Damages and reporting to the Auditor General in respect of vehicle accidents had not been done in terms of Financial Regulation 110.
- (e) Even though daily running charts and monthly summary reports relating to vehicles should have been submitted to the Auditor General before 15 days of the ensuing month in terms of Financial Regulation 1646, running charts and monthly summary reports completed as per requirement had not been submitted relating to 45 vehicles out of 49 vehicles belonging to University.

## 5. Accountability and Good Governance

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### 5.1 Corporate Plan - 2011 - 2015

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The following observations are made.

- (a) Even though it was shown that a special degree course in business administration and a diploma course on local government had been started in addition to the courses existing at present keeping with the aim of increasing the opportunity of entrance to the education in the academic year 2012 at the Faculty of Management and Finance, it was unable to achieve that aim during the academic year 2012.
- (b) Even though it was shown that a special science degree on food technology and courses such as preservative agriculture and geological management had been started in addition to the courses existing at present keeping with the aim of increasing the opportunity of entrance to the education in the academic year 2012 at the Faculty of Agriculture Science, it had not been achieved.
- (c) Even though it was targeted to achieve the objectives such as commencing a new postgraduate course, providing laptops for all the lecturers, starting 03 degree programmes in collaboration with the Sri Lanka Navy, starting 03 courses in diving and swimming, establishment of Language Teaching Unit, starting multi-cultural courses and establishment of Faculty Development Fund and Department Development Fund in the year 2012 with the aim of increasing the opportunity of entrance to the education at the Faculty of Fisheries and Marine Science, these targets had not been achieved.
- (d) A period of time expected to achieve the targets of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Science, Faculty of Engineering and Faculty of Medicine had not been specifically shown.

### 5.2 Audit Committees

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The meetings of the Audit Committee had been conducted in 04 times during the year under review and it was observed that some of the decisions taken at the Audit Committee were not in a position to implement them.

### 5.3 Procurement Plan

A Procurement Plan had not been prepared during the year under review.

### 5.4 Budgetary Control

It was observed that attention had not been drawn in respect of Corporate Plan when preparing the Budget. Further, some of the financial data had not been included in the Corporate Plan and as such it could not be compared with the Budget.

### 5.5 Tabling of Annual Report

Annual Report for the year 2011 had not been tabled in Parliament.

### 5.6 Observations on Unsettled Audit Paragraphs

Even though the Committee on Public Enterprises had discussed and had given directives to carry out, the following directives had not been carried out up to 09 May 2013.

#### Matters taken for Review

Recovery of house rent in various denominations such as Rs.600, Rs.350, Rs.200, Rs.150 and Rs.100 without recovering economical rent in terms of Establishments Code from the officers who had occupied the official quarters.

Even though an officer had been recruited in the year 2005 for preparing register of fixed assets, an officer who had obtained sabbatical leave had been appointed to the post of Deputy Bursar for carrying out the above

Divisional Heads should accept the responsibility of covering up the syllabus by the staff from the same Department while granting study leave and sabbatical leave for those who need it.

Study leave and sabbatical leave had been granted for academic staff without any control even during the year under review and external lecturers had been recruited for covering those syllabuses.

## 6. Systems and Controls

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Weaknesses revealed in the areas of systems and controls were brought to the notice of the University through audit queries. Special attention is needed in respect of the following areas of control.

- (a) Control over vehicles
- (b) Recovery of house rent
- (c) Taking action in terms of agreement and recovery of cash in respect of lecturers who had gone abroad by getting study leave but not returned back to the country.
- (d) Granting study leave and sabbatical leave.
