During the year 2014, University of Ruhuna made a significant contribution in the fields of knowledge creation, knowledge dissemination and community services, which have been the defining rules of great universities. The university was able to reach its goals through improving the quality and relevance of its educational and research programmes. As a leading higher educational institute in the country, University of Ruhuna continues to seek new ways to support scholars and students at all levels in their pursuit and testing of the new ideas as world desperately need sustainable solutions to threatening issues like climate change, renewable energy, human health, foods and shelter. Therefore, in the year 2014, University of Ruhuna continued to encourage and support cross-disciplinary research collaboration among academics by providing significant number of research grants under the “Strengthening of research capacity of the University of Ruhuna” programme.

The building programme showed significant improvement this year. The new building complex of the Phase II of the Faculty of Fisheries and Marine Sciences & Technology was commenced this year and scheduled to use by end of 2016.



Faculty of Engineering

Dean's statement/Review

The Faculty of Engineering functioned smoothly during the year 2014 under the leadership of Dr. P.D.C. Perera who has been serving as the Dean since 1st January 2013.

The 1st Annual Research Symposium of the Faculty was held successfully at the Faculty under the theme of "Engineering Trends for Sustainable Developments" on 18th January, 2014.

The 15th batch with 223 students was admitted to the Faculty of Engineering on 12th February, 2014. The Development Programme was started on 17th February, 2014 and their first semester Academic programme was started on 28th April, 2014.

The Faculty has received a special capital fund worth of Rs. 146 M for the year 2014. These funds were mainly used for purchasing the laboratory equipments for the laboratories and for improving the facilities in the laboratories. Faculty has also received Rs. 40 M for constructing two blocks of academic quarters consisting of 8 apartments. Also, UGC has allocated another Rs. 20M for renovating the existing quarters of the Faculty.

With the funds received from previous year, the Faculty managed to complete the construction of the new student canteen. Faculty has also managed to complete the planned sections of the new examination hall. The construction of the proposed auditorium complex has been completed. The construction of the proposed 100 room hostel building (Phase I) and the new library building was progressing well. In addition, under the expeditious hostel project programme of the Ministry of Higher Education the Faculty has allocated another 100-room hostel building (Phase II) and the construction was started in August 2014.

The Engineering Education Center of the Faculty arranged three months industrial training for 2nd and 3rd year Engineering undergraduates at various industries in Sri Lanka with the support of National Apprentice and Industrial Training Authority.

Students Union of the Faculty under the guidance of the Faculty staff organized several activities such as new-year festival, cricket and volleyball tournaments, cultural event for social harmony, annual farewell and Christmas Carol programme, during the year 2014. In addition, the Engineering Faculty Student Union has organized a cultural show "Thambarawila - 2014" on 18th October 2014.

Civil and Environmental Engineering Society has organized a “Spaghetti Bridge Competition – 2014” on 27th September, 2014 at the Faculty premises. University undergraduates in Civil Engineering field and students of the Higher Educational Institutes were participated for this competition. This society has also organized several guest lectures and a job fair in the Faculty.

The XBOTIX 2014, a Robotics Competition, was organized by the Electrical and Information Engineering Society (EIES) collaboration with IEEE student chapter and IET Ruhuna Chapter. University undergraduates and students from the schools took part in this competition which was held at the Faculty on 19th November, 2014.

Ruhuna Alumni Association of Mechanical and Manufacturing Engineering and the Ruhuna Alumni Association of Electrical and Information Engineering were established in year 2014.

Faculty participated the “Techno 2014”, National Engineering and Technology Exhibition held at BMICH in October 2014. In this exhibition Faculty’s stall won the best University Stall (Gold) award. In parallel to the exhibition, there were several competitions were held for the Engineering undergraduates. The students of the Faculty have actively participated for those competitions and won

the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places in the CAD Eager Competition (For Mechanical Engineering students), 3rd place in the Hakathan Competition (For Electrical Engineering students), 3rd place in the Spaghetti Bridge Competition (For Civil Engineering students) and the 3rd place in the Concrete Mix Design Competition (For Civil Engineering students). Overall, our Faculty won the highest number of awards for TECHNO 2014 exhibition.

Faculty has also actively participated in the Inter-Faculty Literacy and Dancing Competition – 2014 and won the 1st place in Short Stories Competition, 1st and 2nd places in Short Films Competition and 3rd place in Solo Dancing Competition.

Faculty of Fisheries and Marine Science and Technology

Dean's statement/Review

As the 9th batch of intake, 38 of students were recruited to follow the Degree of B.Sc in Fisheries and Marine Science reaching the total number of student population of the faculty to 189. There are 07 of graduate students conducting research for M.Phil degrees at the faculty.

Totally there are 18 carder positions at the faculty and physically remains only 10 and other are on study leave and one senior lecturer joined Marine Environment Protection Authority (MEPA) on secondment base. Therefore faculty had to get the service of visiting lecturers.

The new building which was built under the phase -1 of the Faculty building project was completed providing spaces for Dean's office, three laboratories, two lecture halls, one auditorium, Museum, Board room, Computer laboratory, academic common room, student reading room and three more rooms for various activities. Except one laboratory, other laboratories and lecture halls can be used immediately after having furniture. Moreover, the first stone also was laid down for the phase II of Building project which includes buildings for departments of Fisheries and Aquaculture, Limnology, and Oceanography and Marine Geology of the Faculty.

Curriculum of certain course modules of the Department of Limnology revised. The module LIM 4121 was revised and renamed as LIM 4122 adding one more credit point to the course module. Department of Oceanography and Marine Geology introduced two new course modules OCG4162 and OCG4171 to the current undergraduate curriculum of B.Sc in Fisheries and Marine Science Degree programme considering the current requirement of subject specific knowledge and experience to undergraduates.

Faculty made proposal for new degree two programmes namely B.Sc in Marine and freshwater science degree for offering special degree in Oceanography and Marine Geology and special degree in Water Science and Technology. The proposals have been submitted to University grant commission. The curriculum of the currently offering B.Sc in Fisheries and Marine Science degree was revised and it will be offered for the students who will be specialized in Fisheries and Aquaculture, according to the new proposal. The proposal for the degree programme of B.Sc in Marine Engineering Technology also was approved by the senate and governing council of University of Ruhuna and it is at the process of revising by external reviewers for submission to UGC.

Faculty obtained the sailing license from Ministry of Fisheries for the offshore operation of research boat

and the research vessel was able to be used for undergraduate practical classes and final year student research projects. One person of Sri Lanka Navy looks after the research vessel which is anchored at Galle Navy Harbor. The Hydrological apparatus which was manufactured at the Department of Mechanical and Manufacturing under the TURIS fund was completed and installed at the Faculty of FMST. Service Laboratory –Faculty which is run by the Department of Limnology has been able to get the license from Environmental Authority of Sri Lanka for water testing and water samples are received from various industries to get water quality reports. There are seven research projects funded by outside institutions (Saitama-Japan, World Maritime University of Sweden, Biosphere foundation of USA, NRC, NSF and NARP)

Faculty members have published 04 international indexed journal papers, 05 non indexed international papers, 04 local peerreviewed full papers, 21 abstracts, one book and one book chapter and have done 04 editorial work.

Prof. TPD Gamage, as the Dean of the faculty contributing for the infrastructure and academic programme development of faculty completed his successive six years and two months period in December 2014 and terminated the office period as the Dean.

Faculty of Science

Dean's statement/Review by Prof. W.G.D. Dharmaratna

Bachelor of Computer Science (Special) Degree, 3+1-year degree program, was started in this year selecting students after the third year examination. The major revision of the BSc Degree programme has been completed by several departments, to introduce a four-year degree programme with one semester of industrial training. A proposal has been submitted to UGC to offer three new degree programmes under Technology Stream, but awaiting for the approval of the building project. Industrial Training and Research Coordinating Centre (ITRCC) which was established in 2013 has been progressed well in this year. Many students, 24 BSc General Degree, 32 Special Degree and 33 BCS Degree students, completed either industrial training or research projects in this year and some students had secured employment in the private sector.

Funds received under UDG grant have been used effectively in 2014 for many student activities. Two self-learning software packages, for English and Soft skills, have been installed in all computers accessible to students. Funds received under QIG window-2 competitive grant have been used to upgrade lecture theatres, workshop and the animal house, to setup a Molecular Laboratory and a Statistics Laboratory, and to purchase many essential equipment. About 70% of Rs. 25 million has been already used. About 60% of the funds (Rs.10M) received under QIG Window 4 competitive grants have been already used to upgrade electronics laboratory and to purchase equipment essential for the development of student's projects. Some funds have been allocated to market an invention, the hopper making machine, through NERD.

Several research projects started under first round of TURIS grant have been completed successfully and some students have submitted their theses. New foreign student has been registered for his PhD degree under the supervision of Prof. Mangala de Silva with the financial assistance through a new TURIS grant. Ms. Nadeesha Wickramage completed her PhD based on research at CREN, CMS experiment, which is the first time a graduate student from a Sri Lankan university had completed such a degree. Vice Chancellors award for the most outstanding young researcher-2014 was received by Dr. K. Masakorala.

The construction of the second stage of the Dept. of Computer Science Building is continuing. The proposal submitted to build a canteen with a communication centre for the Faculty has been approved. The new module developed under Management Information System (FOSMIS) has been

successfully used to register new students online this year.

The faculty organized the inventions and innovations exhibition/competition-2014 successfully. The participation of undergraduates and school children in Matara Zone during the two day exhibition was good. A quiz competition among A/L students in Matara Zone was also conducted during the second day of the exhibition. First Ruhuna International Science & Technology Conference, RISTCON-2014, was organized very successfully. Prof. L.P. Jayatissa and Prof. Mangala De Silva received Presidential awards and Dr. Jinasena Hewage received a merit award of NRC. Department of Mathematics organized a four-day study group meeting with the participation of experts from India and other Sri Lankan Universities, students and industry representatives to solve problems specific to industries participated. First electronic version of Ruhuna Journal of Science was published in this year. Two Senior Lecturers were promoted to the posts of Professors and one Professor was promoted to the Senior Professor. Several vacancies, Academic and Non-Academic, have been filled during this year.

A scholarship fund has been established to provide financial assistance to needy students. Prof. L.P. Jayatissa contributed Rs. 280000.00 for the fund. Scholarship Program of Educational Support Foundation of Ruhuna Mathematics awarded 45 scholarships to university and school students in 2014.

Science Faculty Day – 2014 was organized successfully. Number of student activities, such as, the Debate Competition, Pirith Ceremony, New Year Festival, Musical Programme, Painting Exhibition, Photography Exhibition and Carrier Fair have been organized in this year. Two students of the faculty published novels and a group of students staged a drama called "Dalabu Nade", as a result of a project supervised by Prof. L.P. Jayatissa. Two student societies, Ruhuna Science Research Circle and Gravel Club, established. Several community projects were conducted by students with the supervision of Prof. E.P.S. Chandana, some of these projects were funded by private sector organizations. A group of students did a project on Testing of Traditional Soil Nourishing Formula in a Paddy Field successfully and the results were published at a national event. Department of Computer Science developed an e-filing system for Civil Appellate High Court, Matara.

The details of curriculum development, research output, national services, community services, University services and international contributions of individual departments are given in Table 6.

Faculty of Graduate Studies

Dean's Statement

The Faculty of Graduate Studies just completed it's 3rd year of age. During the last year 28 students were newly registered for postgraduate research degrees (i.e. M.A by research, M.Phil. & Ph.D.) increasing the enrolment of research degree students up to 267 (Table 1). Number of new registration for postgraduate taught courses in the year 2014 was 300 and hence the total enrolment in taught courses in the year was 491 (Table 02). Accordingly the overall student enrolment in the Faculty of Graduate Studies (together in research degree programs and in taught courses) in 2014 was 758. Furthermore 151 students have completed their postgraduate degrees during the year, and graduated at the last convocation. (Table 03)

The Faculty of Graduate Studies has shown significant progress in the year 2014. One Master degree program (i.e. MA in Sociology) was newly started in the year 2014. Faculty proposed three

more new Master Degree Programs, Master of Arts in Peace & Development, Master of Arts in Development Planning and Master of Business Management during the year. Already the UGC has approved the Master of Arts in Peace and Development and it is going to be started in the year 2015. The other two programs are in the process to get UGC approval. Meanwhile the Faculty of Graduate Studies have taken a series of steps to streamline all the postgraduate programs maintaining and increasing the standard and quality of postgraduate degrees offered by the University of Ruhuna.

Meanwhile initial works are underway to introduce two compulsory course modules (i.e Basic Statistics & Data Analysis, and Research Methodology) for research students in all the disciplines.

The total earnings and expenditure during the year 2014 are given in Table 4 & 5.

4. Centre for International Affairs

Centre for International Affairs (CINTA) was inaugurated in 2005, according to a Senate decision taken at the 199th Senate meeting of the University of Ruhuna held on 17.08.2005.

The services rendered by the CINTA have now playing an important role in the University of Ruhuna promoting academic programmes with foreign universities, scholars and students. The Centre is functioning as the coordinating body in developing links and signing Memoranda's of Understanding etc. in order to strengthen the international academic links between the University of Ruhuna and international organizations.

RESILEINCE Project

Center for international Affairs has conducted a project partner meeting of the above project from 17th to 19th January 2014.

Tangled in their own (safety) nets- Resilience, adaptability and transformability in fish communities at the face of world fisheries crisis (Resilience Project) Professor Oscar Amarasinghe visited to Penang as the programme coordinator with Ms. Anuradhi Jayasinghe as junior researcher from 23rd November 2014 to 28th November 2014 and presented project progress.

NORHED-Climate Change Project

A NORHED project on "Incorporating Climate Change into Ecosystem Approaches to Fisheries and Aquaculture Management in Vietnam and Sri Lanka" commenced in September 2014. Professor Oscar Amarasinghe, the coordinator of the project, attended the first planning workshop in Nha Trang University in Vietnam during 25-28 October 2014.

NOMA- CPDS Project

This project was commenced in the year 2007/8 and continued till the end of year 2014. We were able to successfully complete the project as planned during the year 2014. Six M.A students were guided to complete their Master theses and required financial and narrative reporting were also completed.

NORHED- CPDS project

Based on the proposal submitted in the last year, a new project on Strengthening Research, Education and Advocacy in Conflict, Peace and Development Studies was approved by the NORHED. The project is being implemented by four academic institutions namely the University of Life Sciences in Norway, COMSATS Institute of Information and Technology in Pakistan, Tribhuvan University in Nepal and University of Ruhuna. During the year 2014, the project commenced its operation and MOUs signed for collaboration between the implementing institutions. Nine Nepal students visited the University of Ruhuna to follow their third and fourth semester course work on CPDS-M.A. Five Sri Lankan students visited to study same course in Nepal. Two academics of the University of Ruhuna received scholarship grants to follow their PhDs, 08 small researches in CPDS is also in operation

Other

The Director of CINTA, Professor B. G. Nanayakkara was on sabbatical leave from 25th November 2014 to 31st December 2014 and Professor Rohan Rajapaksha was appointed as the Acting Director during that period.

Four students from University of Agder, Norway were registered at the CINTA to follow B.A Development Studies Programme for 3 months.

5. Distance and Continuing Education Unit

Distance and Continuing Education Unit (DCEU) of the University of Ruhuna, previously named External Examination Unit (EEU) established in 1997 with the broad objective of providing higher educational opportunities to prospective students in the region and country who are unable to enter national universities in Sri Lanka. Distance and Continuing Education Unit has been growing steadily and currently cater to the needs of over 30,000 external under graduates.

As per guideline and regulations of the UGC circular 932 new batch registered in February 2014 based on the results of the aptitude test. Distance and Continuing Education Unit has revised the existing B.A. syllabus and converting it to semester based course unit system in year 2014. The new syllabus contains core courses, foundation courses and supplementary course. The objectives of introducing these courses is to produce quality graduate with fulfill requirements of the graduate profile and Sri Lanka Qualification Frame Work.

The DCEU has conducted B.A. Part II examination in December 2014 and First examination in Arts March 2014. 1035 number of students got through the B.A. General Degree in year 2014 and their convocation will be held in May 2015

DCEU obtained 25 million grants under UDG-EDP-HETC Project for the proposal submitted on Improving Relevance and Quality of External Degree Programme. Under UDG-EDP grant, DCEU has planned to conduct following activities.

- I. Improve Governance and Management
- II. Improve Quality and Relevance
- III. Enhance Learning Resources and Learner Support Services
- IV. Promote Collaboration with State and Non-state Training Institutions

In view of expanding its activities, DCEU established one regional center in Hambanthota and construction work has commenced in Galle center.

To improve and enhance the knowledge of external students, Distance and Continuing Education Unit has been successfully conducted 16 feedback seminars for Part I, 16 feedback seminars for Part II for the year 2014. From this year as per 932 circular DCEU conducted 32 hours seminar series for each subject for the students registered in year 2014 with the contribution of Professors and Senior Lecturers of the University of Ruhuna. In this time seminars also conducted in Kurunegala District.

The university expand its activities to cater the emerging future education and training need of the area, establish a Centre for Multidisciplinary Studies and Research at Hambanthota. This centre functions under DCEU and it offer diploma and certificate level courses in all disciplines. 2nd Batch of Certificate Course on Tamil Language Proficiency, started in December 2014. In addition to that placement test conducted for commence English Language Certificate and Diploma course.

In year 2014 DCEU was able to launch its new web site www.dceu.ruh.ac.lk and central data base system and Automation of DCEU activities. University Administration and Financial Authorities related to Distance and Continuing Education Unit.

Report of the Auditor General on the Financial Statements of the University of Ruhuna for the year ended 31 December 2014 in terms of the Section 108 of the Universities Act, No. 16 of 1978

The audit of Financial Statements of University of Ruhuna for the year ended 31 December 2014 comprising the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2014 and the statement of comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and cash flow statement for the year then ended and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, was carried out under my direction in pursuance of provisions in Article 154(1) of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka read in conjunction with the Sub-section 107(5) of the Universities Act, No. 16 of 1978. My comments and observations which I consider should be published with the Annual Report of the University in terms of Sub-section 108(1) of the Universities Act appear in this report. A detailed report in terms of Sub-section 108(2) and Section 111 of the Universities Act was furnished to the Vice Chancellor of the University on 30 April 2015.

1.2 Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these Financial Statements in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards and for such internal control as the management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatements whether due to fraud or error.

1.3 Auditor's Responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards consistent with International Standards of Supreme Audit Institutions (ISSAI 1000 – 1810). Those Standards require that I comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the University's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the University's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements.

Sub-sections (3) and (4) of Section 13 of the Finance Act, No. 38 of 1971 give discretionary powers to the Auditor General to determine the scope and extent of the audit.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my audit opinion.

1.4 Basis for Qualified Opinion

My opinion is qualified based on the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of this report.

2. Financial Statements

2.1 Qualified Opinion

In my opinion, except for the effects of the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of this report the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the University of Ruhuna as at 31 December 2014 and its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards.

2.2 Comments on Financial Statements

2.2.1 Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards

The following observations are made.

- (a) According to the Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standard 7 when items of property, plant and equipment are revalued, the entire class of property, plant and equipment, of such assets should be revalued. Nevertheless, only a portion of the lands belongs to the University had been revalued and shown in the financial statements.
- (b) Even though Bank overdraft should be shown under other current liabilities in terms of the Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standard 1, the Bank overdraft of Rs.48,021,864 arising after setting off the overdraft of the Recurrent and Capital Bank Current Accounts totalling Rs.108,713,032 against the cash and Bank balances had been shown under current assets.

2.2.2 Accounting Deficiencies

The following observations are made.

- (a) Even though purchases of capital nature amounting to Rs.12,110,019 had been made from the Fund established according to the Memorandum of Understanding entered into between the General Sir John Kotelawala Defence University and the University of Ruhuna, that amount had not been capitalized by transferring to the asset accounts.
- (b) The machinery and equipment and office equipment valued at Rs.1,290,669 purchased on credit basis during the year under review had not been brought to account.

2.2.3 Unreconciled Control Accounts

A difference of Rs.1,499,057 was observed in the reconciliation of balances of 20 items of account in the Faculty of Agriculture and the Faculty of Medicine shown in the financial statements and the relevant balances shown in the subsidiary registers.

2.2.4 Lack of Evidence for Audit

Even though the value of the Livestock of the Farm as at 31 December 2014 had been assessed at Rs.1,796,510, the value of the Livestock could not be correctly verified as the Register of Animals of the Farm (cows, buffalos, poultry, pigs and goats) had not been maintained properly.

2.3 Accounts Receivable and Payable

A sum of Rs.10,324,920 remained receivable over the periods ranging from 01 year to 13 years as at 31 December 2014 from 12 members of the academic staff for the breach of agreements entered into with the University. Action had not been taken for the speedy recovery of that amount.

2.4 Non-compliance with Laws, Rules, Regulations and Management Decisions

The following non-compliances were observed.

- one key to a staff officer. A sum of Rs.519,840 and 40 packets of salaries totalling Rs.1,220,000 remained in Custody of the Cashier on 29 September 2014, the date of audit.
- (ii) Financial Regulation 371 Even though advances obtained should be settled immediately after the completion of the purpose, action had not been taken even by 10 June 2015, either for the settlement or for the recovery from the officers concerned, the advances amounting to Rs.674,298 paid to 18 officers and 03 institutions as at 31 December 2014.
- (iii) Financial Regulation 394 Even though the value of cancelled cheques should be considered as an amount received and credited to the specific income account, it had not been so done in connection with 19 cancelled cheques valued at Rs.210,670.
- (iv) Financial Regulation 1646 Eventhough the Daily Running Charts of each month should be furnished to the Auditor General before the fifteenth day of the following month, the Daily Running Charts and the Monthly Performance Summaries of 06 motor vehicles of the Faculty of Agriculture from January to September 2014 had not been furnished to audit even up to the end of the year under review.
- (c) Establishments Code for the University Grants Commission and Higher Education Institutions
- Chapter XX
- Sections 3.1 and 3.2
- Every Higher Education Institution should maintain an Attendance Register and every person employed in such institution should mark therein the times of arrival and departure. The officers of the academic staff



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of the University had not furnished their Attendance Register and the Leave Register and as such the salaries and allowances amounting to Rs.886,860,747 paid during the year under review could not be satisfactorily vouched in audit.

- (d) Treasury Circular No.842 of 19 December 1978 and the Treasury Circular No.1A1/2002/02 of 28 November 2002 Register of Fixed Assets had not been maintained for the fixed assets of the University. A Separate Register of Fixed Assets had not been maintained for the Computer Software and Hardware valued at Rs.47,071,914:

- (e) University Grants Commission Circular No.737 of 18.August 1998 All money recovered from the persons who had breached the agreement entered into with the University should be invested in interest bearing fixed deposits or Treasury Bills. Even though the University had recovered a sum of Rs.41,729,919 up to 31 December 2014 from persons who had breached the agreements, that money had not been invested.

2.5 Transactions not Supported by Adequate Authority

A sum of Rs.4,045,505 received for the Human Resource Development of the Faculty of Management and Finance under the Norad's Programme for Master Studies and start up Fund and Norwegian Program for Development, Research and Evaluation had been transferred to the Vice Chancellor's Fund without the approval of the Donor Party and without being utilized for the purpose of the project.



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3. Financial Review

3.1 Financial Results

According to the financial statements presented, the operations of the University for the year ended 31 December 2014 had resulted in a surplus of Rs.42,348,000 as against the deficit of Rs.164,624,000 for the preceding year. The financial result for the year under review as compared with the preceding year, had improved by a sum of Rs.206,972,000.

3.2 Legal Cases Initiated against the University / by the University

The University had filed two cases as at 31 December of the year under review in the Supreme Court and the District Court, while there were 19 cases filed against the University in the Courts and the Labour Tribunal. The amount recoverable in connection with the case filed by the University in the District court amounted to Rs.5,282,110 and the compensation claimed under 03 cases out of the 19 cases filed against the University amounted to Rs.31,505,977.

4. Operating Review

4.1 Management Inefficiencies

The following observations are made.

- (a) Two students of the Faculty of Medicine of the University of Ruhuna had not obtained 31 installments of bursaries amounting to Rs.74,000 in respect of the years 2012, 2013 and 2014 while 23 students of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences who had registered in the year 2012 had not obtained 253 installments of bursaries totalling Rs.562,800 and such amount continued to be credited to the Unpaid Bursaries Account and the University had not carried out any investigation in that respect.



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- (b) Assets valued approximately at Rs.26,463,266 had been purchased during the year 2006 to 2010 under the Specific Agreement on Research Co-operation between the Swedish International Development Co-operation Agency Project implemented by the Faculty of Fisheries, Marine Sciences and Technology. Even though nearly 04 years had lapsed after completion of the project, action had not been taken to handover the said assets to the University.
- (c) The Department of Fisheries Biology had been converted to the Faculty of Fisheries, Marine Sciences and Technology with effect from 08 November 2006. As such the inventory items of the former Marine Biology Department should have been distributed among the offices and Other Departments of the newly established Faculty and new inventory Register should have been prepared. But it had not been so done. Even the inventory Register maintained up to the date of audit had not been prepared properly on Form General 44.
- (d) Fourteen Categories of goods in the form of stationery and papers valued at Rs.103,588 received to the stores of the Faculty of Agriculture during 1997 to 2011 remained in the stores over a long period without being issued. No action had been taken on those items.
- (e) Even though in purchasing the 250 writing tables for the Examination Hall of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences these had been supplied delaying 107 days after the specified date, the total amount of Rs.1,137,500 had been paid without recovering the liquidated damages amounting to Rs.60,856 in terms of the agreement.
- (f) The test check carried out regarding the issuance of sport items to the students by the Physical Education Division, it had revealed that 38 instances in which the sport items issued over a period ranging from 01 year to 11 years had not been returned. But action had not been taken for the recovery of such sport items or the value thereon.
- (g) According to the decision of the Governing body taken at the meeting held on 10 June 2013, not to recover rent from the occupants of the quarters of the University, rent amounting to Rs.1,422,025 had been under recovered from 87 members of the staff.



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4.2 Operational Inefficiencies

The following observations are made.

- (a) An advance amounting to Rs.1,396,917 paid during the years 2006 to 2013 for purchasing library books and periodicals had not been settled even by 31 December of the year under review.
- (b) According to the information obtained from the Division of Students' Affairs of the University, instead of 1,145 students that could have been admitted for 11 Academic Courses only 920 students had been admitted for the Academic Year 2013/2014. As such 225 students who were qualified for admission of the University had been deprived of the opportunity to acquire higher education.

4.3 Transactions of Contentious Nature

The following observations are made.

- (a) The University of Nordland of Norway and the University of Ruhuna had jointly implemented the Project for a Research Book on the Development of Small and Medium scale entrepreneurs of Sri Lanka under two foreign aid projects namely Norad's Programme for Master Studies and Startup Fund and the Norwegian Programme for Development, Research and Evaluation Project and 12 member of the Academic Staff of the University of Ruhuna had been paid a sum of Rs.780,000 for the contribution of this country. Nevertheless, no evidence to prove that even a single copy of the relevant book had not been received to the University of Ruhuna even up to 10 June 2015.
- (b) A Hostel for 115 students of the Faculty of Medicine had been obtained on 02 January 2012 for a monthly rental of Rs.115,000 without obtaining a valuation report. Nevertheless, the monthly rental as per the valuation report obtained on 09 September 2014 amounted to Rs.80,000. As such, a sum of Rs.702,000 exceeding the valuation of the Government had been paid with effect from 02 January 2012 to 02 October 2014.



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- (c) A sum of the 8,928,192 had been paid to a private institution for the supply and fixing 84 writing tables and benches for the Lecture Hall of the Faculty of Management and Finance. The University had incurred a loss of Rs.432,000 due to the supply and fixing writing tables and benches which did not conform with the specifications provided.
- (d) The balance of the Account of Unpaid Bursaries, as at 31 December 2013 amounted to Rs.4,511,350 and it had been increased by 91 per cent up to Rs.8,602,050 as at 31 December of the year under review. The reasons for such increase had not been disclosed at the audit.
- (e) The land, 2 Roods and 1.9 perches in extent and the building therein donated to the University by the Sambodhi Trust Board had been temporarily handed over to the Urban Development Authority on 23 August 2013 for the use of the activities of ceremony related to the Conference of the Heads of commonwealth countries. Even though requests to get returned this land and building had been made on 27 January 2014 to the District Office of the Urban Development Authority, Galle and on 10 April 2014 to the Ministry of State Defence and Urban Development, the property had not been returned to the University up to date.

4.4 Under-utilization of Funds

Swedish aid amounting to Rs.45,300,469 had been received for the implementation of the project "Specific Agreement on Research Co-operation between the Swedish International Development, Co-operation Agency" from the year 2006 through the Faculty of Fisheries and Marine Sciences and Technology of the University. The said project had been implemented up to December 2010 and only a sum of Rs.30,704,916 out of the provision had been spent according to the information made available to audit. The balance sum of Rs.14,595,553 had been returned without being utilized.



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4.5 Idle and Under-utilized Assets

The following observations are made.

- (a) One thousand three hundred and twenty two units of thirty one lighting accessories, which can be used for the Auditorium, since the year 1983 and 40 chemicals received to the Main stores on 14 August 1998 had been retained in the stores without being utilized.
- (b) Even though a gas oven valued at Rs.8,718 had been received to the stores of the Faculty of Engineering on 14 June 2014, it had been retained in the stores even up to 27 November 2014, the date of audit, without issuing to the party who had made the request for the same. Additionally, 83 items of 06 categories of various stationery had been brought forward as a balance in the Inventory Register over a number of years.
- (c) The Electricity generator of 85 K.V.S capacity installed near a students' hostel had not been utilized for any purpose with effect from January 2012 to 31 December of the year under review.
- (d) It was observed during the course of audit that the balances of two Bank Accounts totalling Rs.60,234 remained idle as at 31 December of the year under review. No suitable course of action had been taken thereon.
- (e) A sum of Rs. 1,824,346 granted under the Research Grants for the implementation of 04 projects of the Faculty of Medicine had been remained idle in the account as the said projects had not been implemented during the year under review.
- (f) According to the financial statements for the year under review the balance of Rs.811,535 of Bank of Ceylon was observed as an unchanged balance in the financial statements since the year 2007. Necessary action had not been taken regarding the same even up to the end of the year under review.

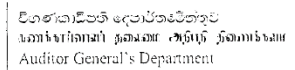


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4.6 Uneconomic Transactions

The following observations are made.

- (a) Even though a sum of Rs.1,700,260 had been paid to the Bursar of the University of Peradeniya and the Deputy Bursar of the University of Sri Jayawardanepura for the preparation of the Register of Fixed Assets of the University, it had not been completed even by 31 December 2014.
- (b) Even though the Government had granted financial assistance and leave with salary for the officers of the Academic Staff of the University of Ruhuna for the completion of their higher educational qualifications, 20 instances of which evidence in support of non-completion of the relevant Postgraduate Degrees were observed in audit test checks. Out of the 20 instances the payments made by the Government to 12 Professors and Lecturers alone amounted to Rs. 9,890,511. The information on payments made to the other 8 Professors and Doctors could not be gathered from their personal files.
- (c) Opportunities to provide benefits to many people from the expenses have been deprived through providing books, purchased at the cost of Rs.7,512,491 under the project of enhancing the relevancy and quality of the education of undergraduates to various Departments instead of providing them to the Main Library.
- (d) Financial assistance amounting to Rs.1,740,622 had been granted to two Lecturers including a Temporary Lecturer to complete their educational qualifications under the Project of Specific Agreement on Research Co-operation between the Swedish International Development Co-operation Agency implemented by the Faculty of Fisheries, Marine Sciences and Technology with effect from the year 2006 to the year 2010, without any guarantee. It was revealed that both Lecturers are not serving in the University at present and as such it was observed that the University had not received any benefit for the said expenses.



- #### 4.7 Identified Losses

- (a) A sum of Rs.16,012 had to be paid as penalty due to failure of obtaining the revenue license for the year 2014 on due dates in respect of 04 Motor Vehicles of the Faculty of Agriculture, Mapalane and the University bus.
- (b) The paying officer should frequently find out whether the balance in bank is adequate to meet all payments made by cheques in terms of Government Financial Regulation 387 overdrafting had been prohibited from any Bank Account of the Government in contrary Bank Overdraft interest amounting to Rs.93,112 had been paid related to two current accounts of the University during the period from January to December 2014.

(c) At an audit test check of the drugs purchased for the Medical Centre of the Faculty of Agriculture it was revealed that 46 items of drugs had been out dated and the value of 27 of those items amounted to Rs.23,899. Neither the necessary action had been taken to hand over such drugs to other Medical Centres before their expiry dates nor to make suitable arrangement.

4.8 Staff Administration

Academic and Non- academic Staff

The approved cadre of the Lecturers of Academic Staff of the University (inclusive of Probationary Lecturers) as at 31 December of the year under review had been 601 while the actual staff as at 01 June 2015 had been 477. Thereby 124 posts were vacant. There were 152 vacancies in the Non- Academic Staff and No.of posts not approved in the actual staff was 64.

4.9 Motor Vehicle Utilization

The following observations are made.

- (a) Motor Car belonged to the University of Ruhuna was repaired at a cost of Rs.188,722 during 2013 and 2014. But it had not been run after April 2014. The Motor Car had remained idle even up to 21 January 2015 without taking action either for repairing or disposal.
- (b) The engine of the bus donated to the University in 2007 had been repaired in two instances with effect from 2012 at a cost of Rs.748,360. Before lapsing the guarantee period or completion of total number of kilometres to be run the bus had been handed over to the same garage for repairs on 16 June 2014 at an estimate of Rs.260,280 even without entering into an agreement. The bus remained idle, unprotected and exposing natural disasters unrepaired even up to 30 April 2015.

5 Accountability and Good Governance

5.1 Action Plan

An Action Plan for the year under review had not been prepared in terms of paragraph 4 of the Public Finance Circular No.01/2014 of 17 February 2014.

5.2 Budgetary Control

In reconciliation of the budgeted income with expenditure with the actual income and expenditure it was observed variances ranging from 20 to 327 per cent related to 11 items.

5.3 Tabling Annual Reports

The Annual Reports for the years 2012 and 2013 had not been tabled in Parliament even by 09 April 2015.

5.4 Unresolved Audit Paragraphs

Even though the matter related to the recovery of rent from the officers occupying the quarters of the University had been discussed at the committee meeting of Public Enterprises No.73 held on 04 October 2012 and a decision had been taken, it had not been implemented even up to 15 April 2015.

Deficiencies in System and Controls observed during the course of audit were brought to the notice of the Vice Chancellor from this to time. Special attention is needed in respect of the following areas of control.
