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## THE EMBLEM OF THE UNIVERSITY

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The emblem of the University takes the form of a circle with three concentric circles placed close together on the periphery, all on a background of yellow. In the center of this circle is a smaller concentric circle enclosing a full bloom lotus, *Nelumbo nucifera*, in abstract form, and consisting of two tiers of petals one underneath the other. In the center of the circle, stylized stamens enclosed in two concentric circles surround the receptacle. Between the outer set of concentric circles and the central lotus is a wide circular band carrying the motto of the University on the upper half of the band, while the name of the University appears in the lower half, both written in Sinhala characters. The motto, taken from an ancient Buddhist text, reads;

***Vijja Uppatitam Settha***

*(‘among all that rise knowledge is greatest’)*

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## REVIEW OF CHANCELLOR

### BRIEF INTRODUCTION

The University of Sri Jayewardenepura commenced on 16<sup>th</sup> February 1959 as the Vidyodaya University with the enactment of the Vidyodaya University and Vidyalkara University Act No. 45 of 1958. At the inception the University was located in Maligakanda and was shifted in 1961 to the present location.

With the enactment of the University of Ceylon Act No. 1 of 1972 all Universities were named as Campuses and the Vidyodaya University became Vidyodaya Campus headed by the Campus President appointed by the Minister of Education. In 1978 with the enactment of the Universities Act No. 16 of 1978 the Campuses were again named as Universities and the Vidyodaya University was named as the University of Sri Jayewardenepura.

At present there are five Faculties, namely, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Faculty of Applied Sciences, Faculty of Management Studies and Commerce, Faculty of Medical Sciences and the Faculty of Graduate Studies. In addition, the Postgraduate Institute of Management (PIM) located in Colombo 8, is also affiliated to the University of Sri Jayewardenepura.

Yagirala Forest Reserve which is managed by the Sri Lanka Forest Department a block of 40 ha has been given to the Department of Forestry and Environmental Studies of the Faculty of Applied Sciences of this University for promoting education and research. A Research Centre has been built by the University to facilitate the personnel with research and education interests about this forest. This bungalow type venue is also used as the Visitor Centre for the people who prefer experience of the life in the rainforest with the hospitality of the villagers in the area.

The Faculty of Medical Sciences offers Medical and Para-Medical Degrees and two State Hospitals, namely, Colombo South Teaching Hospital, Kalubowila and Sri Jayewardenepura General Hospital, Sri Jayewardenepura are functioning as Teaching Hospitals of the Faculty.

Being one of the six Universities selected for a project titled “Transformation of Six Universities to International Level” initiated and funded by the Ministry of Higher Education, the University submitted a proposal and the proposal was granted approval by the authorities. Accordingly, “World Class University” Project was started by calling for applications for PhD research studies especially on multidisciplinary research. *The project started in 2011 and was in progress during the year review. Eighteen (18) PhD Projects were selected for funding in 2011. Out of these 18 projects, nine projects started during the year under review.*

Since the establishment of the University Seven (07) Chancellors and Twenty Four (24) Vice-Chancellors have been appointed by the President of the Democratic Republic of Sri Lanka to the University of Sri Jayewardenepura as given in Table 1.

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## ACHIEVEMENTS

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### GENERAL

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The University was not closed even for a single day in the year under review. Calm and quiet environment for academic activities of the University students was enhanced. As such all students were able to move freely in the University premises and use the facilities such as library, sports and recreational, etc.

### CEREMONIAL REMEMBRANCE OF FOUNDERS

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As annual events, the Founder of this University Most Venerable Hikkaduwe Sri Sumangala Thero, and the first Vice-Chancellor of this University Most Venerable Welivitiye Soratha Thero were ceremonially commemorated on April 30<sup>th</sup> and July 17<sup>th</sup> and this year memorial lectures were delivered by Prof Ratna Wijetunge, Emeritus Professor and 50<sup>th</sup> commemoration of the Most Venerable Welivitiye Soratha Thero was celebrated in grand scale with the ceremonial unveiling of the

bronze statue of Sri Soratha Thero by His Excellency Mahinda Rajapaksha, the President of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka. The statue was donated by Senior Professor Sunil Ariyaratne.

#### SPECIAL PROJECTS CARRIED OUT

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- Continued the cultivation project in the University premises. Vegetable harvest was sold among the employees at a slightly less price than the market price and the money received were credited to the University Account.
- Continued to help for developing the activities related to Corporate Social Responsibility by way of assisting students, academics and non-academics, enabling them to serve outside the University.
- Continued scholarship programmes for university students through various persons and organizations both within the country and abroad.

Work carried out satisfactorily by the Centre for Dengue Research (CDR) established on a subject of national importance at the Department of Microbiology at a cost of Rs. 92,632,0401/- under the Cabinet approval previous year progressed remarkably during the year under review. The achievements include (1) Best paper prize for a paper on: Suppression of virus specific immune responses by IL-10 in acute dengue infection at the European Academy of Allergy, and Clinical Immunology Congress 2013, held in Milan and (2) Best paper prize for a paper on: Defining the role of dengue virus specific T cell and antibody responses and their contribution to severe clinical disease in a large cohort of individuals from Sri Lanka at the Asia Pacific Allergy, Asthma and immunology congress 2013 held in Taiwan.

- Continued the work started by the Department of History and Archaeology of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in collaboration with the Department of Archaeology to procuring or furnishing the archaeological investigations, Archaeological and Architectural conservation, infrastructure facilities, landscaping, layout, maintenance, construction and administration services at the Rajagala archeological reserve. This project is funded by the US Ambassador's Fund Large Grant which was achieved by the University following a competitive procedure.

- World Class University Project (WCUP)  
The World Class University Project (WCUP) which has been established under the direction of the Ministry of Higher Education has marked remarkable achievements. Prof. Ranil de Silva, Director, WCUP was successful in obtaining Associated Partner status to the Faculty of Medical Sciences, USJP within the European Graduate School of Neuroscience (EURON),, which lead towards the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between EURON and USJP on the 9<sup>th</sup> December 2013 headed by Prof. Dr. Harry Steinbusch; Director, School for Mental Health and Neuroscience at Maastricht University, Netherlands and Dr. N. L. A Karunaratne, The Vice Chancellor of the USJP. This enabled USJP to be eligible for the sum earmarked by the European Union for developments in the field of research, innovation and higher education which currently stands at EUR 54 Billion for a period of 7 years (2007-2013).
- The Staff Cricket Team secured Runners-up, Best Batsman, Best Bowler, and the Man of the Series Trophies at the Cricket Tournament organized by J.P. Cricket Academy in Bangalore, India and held at Bangalore during 23<sup>rd</sup>-30<sup>th</sup> November 2013.
- Government Service Athletic Championship 2013 held Torrington Ground during, 5-6 December 2013 was represented by the University Staff Athletic Team and secured 03 Gold Medals, 09 silver Medals and 02 Bronze Medals.



One such step is to introduce the Learning Management System, under this several workshops were conducted both for the faculty members and for the students.

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## OUTCOME BASIS LEARNING

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Decisions were taken to revise the syllabuses and improve new evaluation systems to course units by incorporating soft skill components. Identified areas as important to improve were: Imitativeness, Flexibility, Adaptability, Responsibility, Decision Making, Problem Solving, and Creativity. Identified soft skills to improve the above were: communication skills, Team Work, Lifelong Learning and Information Management skills, Entrepreneurship Skills, Ethics and Professional Moral, Leadership Skills.

To achieve above objectives the revised syllabuses incorporated group work, institutional training, organizing projects and conferences in addition to assignments and mid term tests.

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## SRI LANKAN UNIVERSITIES WORLD RANKING

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The 1998/99 World Development Report: Knowledge for Development (World Bank 1999) proposed an analytical framework of four key strategic implementations to guide countries in the transition to a knowledge-based economy: an appropriate economic and institutional regime, a strong human capital base, a dynamic information infrastructure, and an efficient national innovation system.

Tertiary education is a fundamental aspect that supports this framework to build a globally competitive economy by developing a skilled, productive, and flexible labour force and by creating, applying, and spreading new ideas and technologies. A recent global study of patent generation has shown, that universities and research institutes, rather than firms, drive scientific advances in a country (Cookson 2007). High-performing tertiary education systems are required to therefore encompass a wide range of institutional models that together produce the variety of skilled workers and employees sought by the labour market.

Among the tertiary institutions in Sri Lanka, University of Sri Jayewardenepura (USJP) stands at a position of number 3198 on the world ranking scale as reported by "Webometrics Ranking of World Universities 2013".

### **University Town Project in Sri Lanka**

Sri Lankan Higher Education Ministry has launched special project to establish university towns in Sri Lanka. The new project has named “university township project”

What is a University Town

In a University town there are special features, they are professional institutes, hostel facilities, students union, Child care centre, hospitals, Banks, Shopping complexes, Gym, sports complex, Laboratory, Library and Improved road network. Shopping malls will be set up to provide commercial and financial services to both university town population and local community. Both People and students can use these facilities. A college town or university town is a community which is dominated by its university population

Under this project Shopping Malls, hospitals, banks, post office, libraries, labs and research centers will be set up in the selected university. These facilities can be used for both town community and the students.

The economy of the city is closely related with the university activity and university can earn from this project he said.

The objective of township project is to expand the infrastructure facilities of the universities and integrate the town community and the university students. When developing each university town, the historical significance related with each university will be considered he further said.

The project has already started and University Grant Commission has sent a letters to all Vice Chancellors informing them to send proposals. Sri Jayewardenepura, Colombo, Kelaniya and Rajarata universities have sent proposals expressing their willing. In the previous Budget government has allocated Rs.1 billion to universities and these money uses for the project. “Our intention is to systematically turn Sri Lanka into a key educational hub in the Asian region. The university towns can be seen in Oxford, Cambridge and Manipal universities.





## **FACULTY OF MEDICAL SCIENCES**

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Faculty of Medical Sciences was established in 1993 as the fourth Faculty of the University of Sri Jayewardenepura. By the year 2006, the faculty developed into a full-fledged Faculty consisting of 17 Departments. For the first time in Sri Lanka, the Faculty commenced degree programmes to B.Sc. in Nursing, Bachelor of Pharmacy and B.Sc. Medical Laboratory Science.

This is only Faculty in the University, which on its own handle registering of students, conducting examinations and deal with financial matters. In 2013 a new Department of Allied Health Sciences was established.

## **FACULTY OF GRADUATE STUDIES**

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Faculty of Graduate Studies (FGS) in the University of Sri Jayewardenepura was established in 1996 under the provisions of the Faculty of Graduate Studies Ordinance No. 3 of 1987. Since then this faculty expanded with its activities by bringing all the post graduate courses of the university under its purview and coordination. Initially it was established in a temporary building of the university and then shifted to a new building on 18th October 2010 with all the modern facilities to meet the postgraduate work.

FGS functional model differs from the existing undergraduate faculty model. FGS consist of study Boards instead of departments. These study boards are the active decision making units of the faculty. Initially there were six study boards and a new study board which focuses on multidisciplinary studies was established in 2011 with the senate & council approvals. The seven study boards of the faculty are given below:

1. Humanities
2. Social Sciences
3. Management and Commerce
4. Life Sciences
5. Physical sciences
6. Medical Sciences
7. Multidisciplinary studies

FGS model is focused to initiate multidisciplinary research activities among the members of the study boards interactively as the study boards consist of mixture of academics from various disciplines from the four different faculties.

Each study board is chaired by a senior academic with a high level of professional caliber. The members of the study boards are the academic members of the university who actively involved in research work, postgraduate supervision and those who serve as the coordinators for postgraduate programs.

The decisions taken in the above six board of studies will be taken up for discussion and for further considerations and for recommendation to the approval of the senate by the Faculty Board meeting chaired by the Dean of the Faculty.

Faculty board of the Graduate Studies consist of the deans of all four faculties, three senate nominees, three council nominees and the Chairpersons of the seven study boards as invited members.

There are two major types of degree programs offered by the faculty namely; the research degrees (Ph D, M Phil, MA & M Sc) and degrees offered by course work where a research component also is involved.

The degrees with course work and a research component have been designed to provide necessary conceptual background to the candidate through lectures, required practical training, industrial training and field work in specific areas. These programs are offered at two levels namely; the postgraduate diploma level or the M Sc, MBA, MPM, or MA. In some programs progression is possible form the postgraduate diploma to the Master level degrees.

Recently the Multidisciplinary study Board initiated compulsory course units for the Ph D students. The students registered in this study board have to complete this course unit component during its first year and it is a requirement for the upgrading from M Phil status to Ph D level. Management study board also initiated a new Ph D program and the candidates registered for the Ph D program also have to follow one year course work component before commencing their research project.

FGS has awarded 84 Ph D degrees, 132 M Phil degrees, 189 MA degrees, 919 M Sc degrees 1252 Postgraduate Diplomas from 1996 to 2013 and there is a significant increase of student numbers registered for postgraduate degrees.

As a new initiative FGS is planning to offer new M Sc programs namely, M Sc in Science Administration and M Sc in Strategic Sciences & social harmony in 2014. In addition to that it is expected to offer a credit transfer international postgraduate training program for the foreign students.

The web page of the faculty provides all the information of the faculty activities. It will be helpful for the candidates to get all the required information through the internet and make their decisions efficiently. A staff member will be trained to update the faculty web site regularly. Database for the faculty have been already developed and through this database it is expected to provide an efficient service to the candidates register for different programs.

It is expected to take a strong initiative within the next five years to progress the FGS from its present status to a level of a Graduate School. It is envisaged that a Graduate School will have greater administrative and financial autonomy in order to conduct all the faculty activities. Steps will be taken for this progression from 2014 onwards to reach its effective level at the end of 2020.

## LIBRARY

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Under the direction of the librarian Dr. Nayana Wijayasundara, five Senior Assistant Librarians, one Assistant Librarian, one Assistant Registrar (Library Services- from 01.10.2013) and 49 non-academic staff were carried out duties in the library.

During the year, 2498 books were purchased at a cost of Rs.4,586,277.37 from the annual allocation and 81 periodicals were purchased at a cost of Rs.8,191,661.08. One electronic database (HINARI) was purchased at a cost of Rs.132,000.00.

During the year 3810 readers were registered including Academic staff (39), Non – academic staff (52), Undergraduate students (3145) and Diploma and Postgraduate students (574). With that the total number of registered users was increased to 15,467.

The rate of fulfillment of Inter-library loan requests was 81.69%.

Three workshops were conducted by the library for students in order to enhance the awareness of information resources and information literacy skills.

During the year 01 Doctoral study and 01 Masters degree were completed by the library staff. 02 PhD, 01 PG diploma, 02 degree and 07 diploma studies were carrying out by the library staff during the year 2013.





**Report of the Auditor General on the Financial Statements of the University of Sri Jayawardhanapura for the year ended 31 December 2013 in terms Sections 108(1) of the Universities Act, No. 16 of 1978**

The audit of financial statements of the University of Sri Jayawardanapura for the year ended 31 December 2013 comprising the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2013 and the statement of comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and cash flow statement for the year then ended and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, was carried out under my direction in pursuance of provisions in Article 154 (1) of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka read in conjunction with Section 107(5) of and Section 108 of the Universities Act, No. 16 of 1978. A detailed report in terms of Section 108(2) of the Universities Act was furnished to the Vice-Chancellor of the University on 21 August 2014.

**1.2 Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards and for such internal control as the management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatements whether due to fraud or error.

**1.3 Auditor's Responsibility**

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards consistent with International Standards of Supreme Audit Institutions (ISSAI 1000 – 1810). Those Standards require that I comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements.

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An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgments, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatements of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the University's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the University's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. Subsections (3) and (4) of Section 13 of the Finance Act, No. 38 of 1971 give discretionary powers to the Auditor General to determine the scope and extent of the audit.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my audit opinion.

#### 1.4 **Basis for Qualified Opinion**

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My opinion is qualified based on the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of this report.

## 2. **Financial Statements**

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### 2.1 **Qualified Opinion**

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In my of opinion, except for the effects of the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of the this report, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the University of Sri Jayawardanapura as at 31 December 2013 and its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards.

### 2.2 **Comments on Financial Statements**

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#### 2.2.1 **Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards**

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The following observations are made.

- (a) Action had not been taken to revalue and account for assets costing Rs.1,314,600,400 fully depreciated but being used at present.



- (b) Even though the land and building situated at Kohuwala purchased for Rs.61.5 million in the year 2001 had been transferred to the Institute of Aesthetic Studies of the University of Kelaniya on 17 October 2003 as it was not suitable for the purposes of the University, the adjustments relating to the transfer had not been brought to account.

### 2.2.2 Unreconciled Control Accounts

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A difference of Rs.77,753 was observed between the balance of Advances Account (Faculty of Medicine) and the Schedule furnished for the Accounts.

### 2.2.3 Lack of Evidence for Audit

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The following observations are made.

- (a) Even though a balance of Rs.90,249 was shown in the rehabilitation, laboratory and teaching equipment advances the particulars of the persons or the institution to whom the advances were granted had not been furnished to audit. It was revealed that the balance is an unidentified balance.
- (b) The files adequate for the confirmation of the capital advance of Rs.1,310,000 paid to the Maharagama Urban Council included in the statement of financial position had not been furnished to audit over a number of years.

### 2.3 Accounts Receivable and Payable

-----

The following observations are made.

- (a) Action had not been taken for the settlement of the balance older than 5 years amounting to Rs.3,818,485 included in the balance of Rs.94,690,359 shown as sundry advances in the statement of financial position.
- (b) Even though the money relating to unclaimed scholarships out the money received from the Mahapola Trust Fund for the grant of Mahapola Scholarships should be paid back immediately to the Mahapola Trust Fund, action had not been taken to settle the scholarship money amounting to Rs.11,753,550 relating to periods ranging from two years to five years.



- (c) A sum of Rs.4,060,069 older than 05 years and a sum of Rs.2,295,569 between two to five years remained in the Sundry Deposit Accounts and action had not been to identify those amounts for settlement or write back to income.
- (d) A sum of Rs.291,642 receivable from courses and projects over a number of years had not been received up to date and action had not been taken thereon.

#### 2.4 Non-compliance with Laws, Rules, Regulations and Management Decisions

- (b) University Grants Commission Circular No. 830 of 09 September 2003. Even though an employee should have been confirmed in the post for the employee to be eligible for grant of fees by the University for following courses, contrary to the circular 23 Teachers under probation had been paid course fees amounting to Rs.1,992,170 in connection with 26 courses.
- (c) Government Procurement Guidelines of 25 January 2006 Guideline 3.4(a) Even though the National Comparative Building Policy should be followed always, contrary to that bids for two canteens of the University for the year under review had been awarded by drawing lots among the employees of the University.
- (d) Treasury Circular No. 1A1/2002/02 of 28 November 2002. Even though a Register of Computers, Accessories and Software of the University should be maintained, it had not been maintained.

### 3. Financial Review

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#### 3.1 Financial Results

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According to the financial statements presented, the operations of the University for the year ended 31 December 2013 had resulted in a surplus of Rs.20,507,333 as against the deficit of Rs.73,197,266 for the preceding year, thus indicating an improvement of Rs.93,704,599 in the financial results.

### 4. Operating Review

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#### 4.1 Performance

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Recurrent expenditure amounting to Rs.1,813,208,326 had been incurred in the year under review for 10,455 students studying in the 04 Faculties of the University. As compared with that recurrent expenditure of Rs.1,436,252,349 had been spent for 9,619 students in the preceding year. Accordingly, the overall cost per student had increased from Rs.149,214 to Rs.173,429 by Rs.24,115 or 16 per cent. The cost per student of each Faculty is given separately below.

#### 4.2 Management inefficiencies

The following observations made.

- (a) Despite the payment of rent for the hostel procured from a private institution up to August 2014, an advance of Rs.1,000,000 had been granted on 13 March 2014 in respect of September and October 2014. The balance sum of Rs.640,920 had been paid to the institution on 13 June 2014. The need for making payments for future periods had not been explained to audit.
- (b) In addition to the salaries and allowances approved by the University Grants Commission, the non-academic staff had been paid allowances amounting to Rs.3,152,491 out of the income received from the External Project Courses conducted by the University extraneous to the Public Enterprises Circular No. 95 of 14 June 1994.
- (c) The value of the bonds of 41 Lecturers who had proceeded abroad on academic leave and breached the agreements amounted to Rs.85,304,889 and a further sum of Rs.71,633,636 out of that remained recoverable as at 31 December of the year under review. Action had not been taken to initiate legal action against the officer or the surety in connection with the long outstanding bonds referred to above.
- (d) In terms of paragraph 3 of the Circular No. 1/2001 dated 20 April 2011 of the Ministry of Higher Education, the research allowance for the ensuing year could be paid only if the Research Committee is satisfied with the contents of the research reports of the preceding year. Nevertheless, research allowances amounting to Rs.84,110,368 had been paid in the year 2013 without paying attention to the research reports of the year 2012.



- (e) The approval of the Cabinet of Ministers had been received on 06 August 2003 for the Project on the Disposal of Waste Water of the University costing Rs.70 million and a sum of Rs.2,336,090 had been paid to the National Water Supply and Drainage Board for the preparation of the preliminary plans for constructions. According to the comment made by the Committee on Public Enterprises, the Waste Water Collection Network planned for construction in place of that project had not been commenced up to date.
- (f) Action had not been taken for the recovery of electricity charges for the year under review amounting to Rs.597,888 recoverable from 04 employees canteens consuming electricity exceeding 250 units. Legal action in terms of the agreements had not been taken for the recovery of electricity charges amounting to Rs.3,116,772 recoverable in respect of the years 2009 to 2012.
- (g) Even though a sum of Rs.1,147,412 had been paid to a private company in the year 2005 for the preparation of a Register of Fixed Assets, the Register of Fixed Assets had not been prepared up to the date of the financial statements.
- (h) As a result of the payments made contrary to the decision of the Cabinet of Ministers dated 23 December 2004 on the renting of hostels from an institution, overpayments amounting to Rs.12,868,737 had been made to the institution concerned up to the end of the year under review. Action had not been taken to revise the Cabinet decision in connection with the increased rent.
- (i) Even though the reimbursement of a sum of Rs.1,690,141 out of the salaries paid over a number of years to two lecturers released for service in the Government or Government affiliated institutions on the basis of reimbursement of salaries, should be obtained, the institutions concerned had informed that the money cannot be reimbursed. Even though the salaries should be recovered from the respective Lecturers, no action thereon had been taken up to the end of the year under review.
- (j) The motor vehicles, distress and employees loan balances amounting to Rs.2,201,370 granted to the employees up to the end of the year under review remained without being recovered over a number of years.



#### 4.3 Operating Inefficiencies

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The following observations are made.

- (a) Out of the 147 Teachers who had presented proposals for the conduct of researches from the year 2005 to the year 2012 the submission of research reports by 45 Teachers who had obtained research grants amounting to Rs.14,305,845 had been delayed for periods from one year to eight years.
- (b) A sum of Rs.24 million had been paid up the year 1998 in 03 installments for a block of 05 acres from the Methsevana land allocated for the Faculty of Medicine. Nevertheless, land 1 acre 34.2 perches in extent only had been taken over up to date. The balance block of land had not been taken over up to date. The sum of Rs.24 million paid had been shown in the financial statements as unsettled advances over a number of years.

#### 4.4 Underutilization of Funds

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Out of Rs.25,371,411 in 69 Endowment Funds, a sum of Rs.18,537,995 had been withdrawn and invested. Action had not been taken for the investment of Rs.6,833,416 remaining in the Funds.

#### 4.5 Idle an Underutilized Assets

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The tenure of the land 41.31 perches in extent situated in Boralesgamuwa had been transferred to the University for the purpose of providing hostel facilities for 300 students, on 06 August 2003 by the Divisional Secretary, Kesbewa after the payment of a sum of Rs.1.6 million to the Western Provincial Council. The land had not been used for a useful purpose since that date up to the end of the year under review and any development work had not been done.



## 6. Systems and Controls

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Deficiencies in systems and controls observed during the course of audit were brought to the notice of the Vice Chancellor of the University from time to time. Special attention is needed in respect of the following areas of control.

- (a) Fixed Assets
- (b) Control Accounts
- (c) Petty Cash
- (d) Management of Self Financing Courses
- (e) Stores Control
- (f) Agreement and Bonds

Below are the actions and answers due to be taken for the above mentioned report under your Ref: EC / E / USJ / 06/13/04 and dated 03/01/2015.

**2.2. Statement regarding the financial documents.**

**2.2.1 Government Accounting Standards of Sri Lanka**

(A) All the currently used assets are being assessed by government assessors. By now, motor vehicles, lands, and buildings have already been assessed and they are included into the final accounts. It is expected to finalize the process by 15<sup>th</sup> June.

(B) The land at Kohuwala and Thakshala building which belong to the University are currently being used by the University of Visual and Performing Arts. The discussions are being held to regain the building to the university. Since the land is still owned by the university. It cannot be disregarded when assets are calculated for accounts. Further it has been informed in writing to the University of Visual and Performing Arts to submit the land before 31/03/2015.

### **2.2.2. Administrative Accounts (unbalanced)**

Research Advance Account (Faculty of Medical Sciences) has shown an outstanding balance which is prevailing for several years. Steps have been taken to settle this balance.

### **2.2.3. Zero Evidence for Auditing**

A) It has been difficult to trace the personnel who have been given these advance payments and as a result this balance prevails in accounts. However, steps are being taken to settle this account.

B) Balance has been carried forward as it has been difficult to trace the relevant documents pertaining to the task performed in the year 1999. This amount has been paid to the Urban Council, Maharagama, but the effort made in getting the documents from them was not successful.

### **2.3 Accounts receivable and payable**

A) The amount Rs.1, 310,000 is the payment made to the Urban Council, Maharagama and the balance remains in the advance payment account of the library. It has been settled in the final accounts of 2014.

B) Actions are taken to settle the long standing accounting error in Mahapola Scholarship Account.

C) Payable deposit account has been formulated by library deposits, laboratory deposits etc. Repayments are done on written requests made by the depositors and the deposits pertaining to courses are only released after the completion of the respective courses.

D) All the entries are properly done in the revised final accounts of the year 2013.

### **2.4 Disregarding the administrative rules and regulations**

A) i. Necessary actions have been taken to inform the lecturers who have now vacated the posts after signing the bonds. According to the establishment code if the bond value is not repaid during the stipulated time; the guarantors should be informed within three weeks. However it

is necessary to calculate all the due payment to the university other than the bonds by collecting relevant data from each department. Therefore, it should be informed that it is practically difficult to calculate the full due amount within three weeks.

(A) ii. Explanation is applicable.

iii. Academic staff members do not sign in- and out in the whole university system and therefore, University Grants Commission should take a policy decision with regard to this.

B) The Probationary Lecturers who are recruited to the academic staff are confirmed after post graduate qualifications. Their posts will be terminated if they fail to obtain a post graduate degree during 8 years. So that course fee is paid to the probationary lecturers during the Probationary period and it has been done accordingly.

C) The staff canteen and the canteen for non-academic staff are run by the University Lecturers' Association and the Welfare Association of the Non-academic staff respectively. However the supervision of these, is carried out by the university.

D) All the assets are audited and a computer software for fixed asset report is being prepared. Therefore, all the reports on assets can be taken according to the circular in due course.

## **4.2 Administrative Inefficiencies**

A) Hostel facilities are provided for 500 students at Uro – Lanka hostel, but after the completion of the bond period, the directress of the hostel informed that the hostel facilities cannot be provided further. Consequently as there was no any other alternative to provide hostel facilities for 500 students, the university had to set about to pay this amount and get the hostel time extended for two months.

B) This payment was done by using the external project generated funds with the approval of university finance committee and in accordance with the public administration circular No 380 as the activity was done outside day today university activities.

C) Some lecturers who are studying abroad and have violated the bonds have paid the full value of the bond at once while some others pay the

due value in installments. Steps are taken to recover the due payments. As it takes about three years when the bonds are violated some guarantors have changed their personal address and as a result it is difficult to relocate their new addresses thereby the notification to those guarantors usually get delayed.

D) In the event of paying research allowances for the year 2013, all the research proposals presented by lecturers were collected and they were approved by the research committee and the research allowances were paid accordingly.

E) Although payments were made to the National Water Board for performing the basic planning of ground survey for the whole water drainage system the Water Board is still in the process of planning a water drainage system for Maharagama and Boralesgamuwa. Once the project is implemented university's waste water can be diverted to it.

F) Canteen tender is given for a period of one year. The canteen owners for the above period are not running the canteen and it has therefore been difficult to collect the full amount from them. However, a sum of Rs.125, 000.00 has been released from the deposited funds.

As canteens are run as a welfare activity, a proposal has been made to the Administration Committee by the Audit Committee to include, only the pre-deposits, canteen rent and the fee for the damages made by the canteen owners in the bond.

G) In the year 2015, a fixed asset report was prepared and now at the moment the steps are being taken to produce a computer software based report for fixed assets by re-auditing all the assets up to 2014.

H) The document prepared in order to increase the hostel fee for the Uro-Lanka Residency Hostel has been sent to the Ministry of Higher Education to obtain the cabinet approval on 09/9/2011 and 08/11/2011 respectively. Further, a reminder has also been sent in this respect on 03/10/2012.

I) The sum of Rs. 252 258.06 due from Dr.A.S.D. Jayarathne is to be recovered from the arrears pay for the year 2014 which was to be paid in the month of February 2014.

The due some of money from Dr.(Mrs)P.T.R.Makulouwa will be deducted from the Employees Provident Fund at its disposal and the steps are taken to obtain the amount due to be obtained from the Army.

J) Out of the total loan balance taken as vehicle, distress and employee loans balance of Rs.2, 201 370.00, the employees who obtained a loan amount of 1 523 533.00 and are on no pay leave and it is expected to deduct the due amount from their salaries once they are back in service or from the provident fund balance in the case of vacation of post. Out of this amount, Rs.312 603.00 has been recovered in the years of 2013 and 2014. Present loan balance consists of Rs. 2 67 886.00 received from the provident fund and Rs.30 600.00 from the salaries.

### **4.3 Management Inefficiencies**

A) The actions will be taken to recover money from those lecturers who fail to submit research records after completion of the research in the stipulated time period.

B) By the year 2011 five acres and 2.5 perches have been acquired from Methsevana land.

### **4.4 Minus Utilization of funds**

Non -utilized amount Rs. 4,766 858.00 of Family Clinic Fund and Ernest and Young fund was not invested as it is expected to use in the coming years. The rest of the balance amount has been invested in 64 projects and the investment procedure carried out in the year 2014.

### **4.5 Inactive and underutilization of funds**

At present the buildings of the land at Borelesgamuwa are being used as the residence for 4 drivers and 13 labourers who serve in the maintenance, supply division, the faculty of Humanities and Social

Sciences and the faculty of Applied Sciences. It is expected to develop these buildings to do further constructions in the future.

## **5. Systems and Administration**

Special attention will be paid to the field mentioned under the systems and administration.
