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Ven. Vice - Chancellor's Message

Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka, which was established on the 22nd of April 1982, in terms of the Buddhist and Pali University's Act No 74 of 1981, which was amended by Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka Act No. 37 of 1997, is functional, with its students' study premises being situated at Pitipana North, Gabadawatta, Homagama, the administrative Building at 37, Moragahahena Rd, Pitipana, Homagama, the External Examinations Branch at 214, Bauddhaloka Mawatha, Colombo 7 and at "Mumtaz Mahal" at 544, Galle Rd, Colombo 3.

The Academic process which was started on the 9th of June, 1997, with barely the minimum facilities such as hostel facilities adequate enough for about 100 students, small lecture rooms seven in number, A small library, and a small administrative building has been upgraded to a developed level, even with certain shortcomings.

A plot of land of five acres in extent was acquired from the Western Provincial Council, and on this land, five two – storeyed lecture theatres, three, three - storeyed Hostels, and the cafeterias were constructed and they were opened on the 20th of February 2005. In the newly received land, a two - storeyed Library Building, an Auditorium and a building for common facilities were constructed and utilized.

The main administrative building was constructed on a plot of land near Pitipana Junction close to the High Level Road and with the above building complex they were ceremoniously declared open on the 12th of August 2010, by his Excellency, the President of the Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka, his Excellency Mahinda Rajapaksha, with the participation of the Ven.Chancellor, the erudite scholar of Sanskrit, the expert in Six - Oriental languages, the most venerable Nayaka Thero of the Amarapura Sanga Sabha, the expert writer, Royal Pandit, Most Venerable Davuldena Gnanissara Thero, and also with the participation of the Minister of Higher Education Hon. S.B. Dissanayake, Minister of Education, Hon. Bandula Gunawardhana, and also with the participation of a distinguished gathering consisting of both clergy and laymen.

Thus, the action taken to develop a large number of infrastructure facilities was of immense help in its future development. Therefore, it is with great pleasure that the fact of recruiting 110 students both lay and clergy is mentioned here.

In order to inculcate mental discipline among all the students, a Buddhist Counseling Programme has been started for both lay students and ordained; through it a practical meditation programme has been introduced. It has become a popular programme among students. Taking in to consideration its value and use, the faculty Boards, the senate's and council's unanimous decision to make it a compulsory study programme is a laudable measure and also it is highly appreciated. In the same manner, a two - year Diploma Programme in Buddhist Counseling has also been introduced from 2011.

In achieving the aims of establishing the university, a two - year foreign missionary programme on dhamma in the medium of English has been started and it is being conducted, on a special request made by her Excellency, the former president. In order to improve the knowledge of English in students, a certificate course in English and a Diploma Course in English has also been started.

A Department of English has been established to provide an opportunity for the students those who want to study English as a subject.

Arrangements have been made to design the infrastructure facilities needed to spread the teaching - learning process locally as well as internationally by using information technology, with the help of Arther C, Clark Centre and at the same time, necessary plans have been designed to computerize each and every department and are nearing completion.

Action has already been taken to train academic and non - academic staff of the university and facilities for welfare activities have been provided to students and employees through the Vice-Chancellor's fund.

In view of the, professional development of the academic staff, an opportunity has been provided for them to present one research paper, on monthly basis and furthermore, steps have been taken to publish these research papers in the annual educational magazine "Pali and Buddhist Studies". It is a pleasure to mention here that 54 such staff development sessions have been completed.

A Certificate Course in Computer Applications has been introduced for the benefit of the internal students since 2005. In addition to that language certificate courses in German, Japanese, Chinese, Hindi, Korean, and Tamil have been introduced as modern languages. All the study programmes have been made 2 year programmes from the year 2011, for the optimum and maximum benefit of the students.

The bhikku students those who have come from far remote corners of the Island will go back to their "Dayakas" once their studies are over. One aspect of their needs is to take into account and auspicious time. In order to help them and to give them the necessary knowledge a two year Diploma in Astrology and a two year diploma in Architecture have been started. A five year action plan has been designed from 2011 to 2016 and it has been put into practice while it is being Updated.

On account of "Budda Jayanthi" a programme on Dhamma communication to train, Buddhist missionary monks has been started with the help of the Ministry of Religious Affairs. Steps have been taken to start new courses of studies with the assistant of the Ministry of Religious Affairs and Moral Development.

It is a pleasure to mention of the fact that this university has become an international university since 182 foreign students have been registered and are studying at present and also there are affiliated institutions in Singapore, Malaysia, America, United Kingdom, Germany, Australia, Scotland and South Korea. The academic staff has presented explorative research papers on dilapidated ancient Buddhist temples by visiting them with the guidance of the senior professor M.W. Wimal Wijeratne, who has joined this university on sabbatical leave. The ancient pali chronicle "Thelakatahagatha" was edited and printed on account of the 25th Anniversary of this university which was fallen in the year 2011.

Eleven external programs are being conducted by the External Examinations Branch of this university. They are, Diploma in Buddhism, Diploma in Pali, Diploma programme in Buddhist communication, Diploma in English, Post Graduate Diploma in foreign Buddhist Missionary Service,

Post Graduate Diploma in Buddhist Studies, Bachelor of Arts Degree Programme, Master of Arts Degree Programme and the Master of Philosophy Programme. Locally, 4617 students and through foreign affiliated institutions 158 students got registered themselves for the above programmes and studies these programmes.

In Order to expand the internal study activities, arrangements have been made to build hostel facilities for foreign students at the Homagama premises, examination halls, meditation chambers, and quarters for lecturers. In Order to expand the religious and educational service done by the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka further on account of 2600th " SambuddathvaJayanthi" Arrangements have been made to renovate the "Mumtaz Mahal" building in Colombo which was given to Buddhist and Pali University by his excellency the president. Furthermore, discussion are being held to establish foreign affiliated institute in India, Australia, Japan and America. It is hoped to establish student exchange programmes with countries like India and Thailand by signing memorandums of understanding.

Thus, our university should be developed in physical and human resources, in order to render the assistant to the people of the world through Buddhism by producing scholars in Buddhism locally as well as internationally through different strategies. Therefore, it is expected to be duty bound in achieving it.

01. General

➤ Introduction

The Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka which was established in terms of the Act of Parliament No.74 of 1981 of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka was ceremoniously opened on the 22nd of April 1982 at 214, Bauddaloka Mawatha, Colombo 07. The main objectives, to attain which the University was established are the propagation of Buddhism, the promotion of Buddhist And Pali Studies in Sri Lanka and foreign countries and the provision of facilities for the conduct of research in the relevant fields.

The above mentioned Act has been amended by the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka's Act (Amendment) No.37 of 1995. Concurrent with the implementation of these amendments, the local affiliated institutions which existed so far ceased to exist, and the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka was organized in conformity with the structure of other universities of Sri Lanka, consequently the University's External Examinations Branch and Post - Graduate Institute was located at the Colombo Premises, the academic campus with hostels at Pitipana, Homagama, and the Administrative building was established on 12th of August 2010 at 37, Moragahahena Rd, Pitipana. The "Mumtaz Mahal" the official residence of former speaker on Galle Rd in Colombo 03, that belongs to the Parliament of Sri Lanka has been transferred to Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka on 28th of May 2009. The arrangements have been made to convert Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka into a fully pledged international University. It holds the membership of the Association of the Universities of the Commonwealth Countries and is an associate member of the committee of Vice - Chancellors and Director's (CVCD) of the university system of this country.

➤ Objectives

The objectives of the restructured university according to the provisions of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka Act (Amendment) No. 37 of 1995 are indicated below.

- (i). The training of scholars in Buddha Dhamma and Discipline for the purpose of the propagation of Buddhism in Sri Lanka and foreign countries as well as the sustenance of missionary work.
- (ii). The promotion of the study of Pali Language, Buddhist Culture and Buddhist Philosophy in Sri Lanka and abroad and the advancement of these studies to suit the modern trends of the world.
- (iii).
 - (a). Training of bhikku students and lay students to teach Buddhism and Pali Language in pirivenas, schools and the institutions of such equal standing.
 - (b). Provision of faculties to maintain and develop ethically religious minded behavioral pattern of living and mental discipline.
 - (c). any other matter related or supplementary to the above factors.

Report of the Auditor General on the financial statements of the Sri Lanka Buddhist And Pali University for the year ended 31 December 2010 in terms of section 14(2)(c) of the Finance Act, No 38 of 1971

The audit of financial statements of the Sri Lanka Buddhist And Pali University for the year ended 31 December 2010 was carried out under my direction in pursuance of provisions in Article 154 (1) of the constitution of the Democratic socialist Republic of Sri Lanka read in conjunction with section 13(1) of the Finance Act, No. 38 of 1971 and Section 38 of the Sri Lanka Buddhist And Pali University Act, No. 74 of 1981. My comments and observations which I consider should be published with the Annual Report of the University in terms of Section 14(2) (c) of the Finance Act appear in this report. A detailed report in terms of Section 13(7) (a) of the Finance Act was issued on 30 April 2011.

1.2 Responsibility of the management for the financial statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. This responsibility includes: designing, implementing and maintaining internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatements, whether due to fraud or error, selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

1.3 Scope of Audit and Basis of Opinion

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit. Audit opinion, comments and findings in this report are based on review of the Financial Statements presented to audit and substantive tests of samples of transactions. The scope and extent of such review and tests were such as to enable as wide an audit coverage as possible within the limitation of staff, other resources and time available to me. The audit was carried out in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards to obtain reasonable assurance as to whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. The audit includes the examination on a test basis of evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in financial statements and assessment of accounting policies used and significant estimate made by the management in the preparation of financial statements as well as evaluating their overall presentation. I have obtained sufficient information and explanations which to the best of my knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of my audit. I therefore believe that my audit provides a reasonable basis for my opinion. Sub-sections (3) and (4) of Section 13 of the Finance Act, No. 38 of 1971 give discretionary powers to the Auditor General to determine the scope and extent of the audit.

2. Financial Statements

2.1 Opinion

So far as appears from my examination and to the best of information and according to the explanations given to me, I am of opinion that the Sri Lanka Buddhist and Pali University had maintained proper accounting records for the year ended 31 December 2010 and except for the effects on the financial statements of the matters referred to in paragraph 2:2 of this report, the financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Sri Lanka Buddhist and Pali University as at 31 December 2010 and the financial results of its operations and cash flows for the year then ended.

2.2 Comments on Financial Statements

2.2.1 Accounting Deficiencies

The following matters were observed

- a) Fixed assets costing Rs. 33,608,706 shown in the accounts as fully depreciated but in continuous use had not been revalued and brought to account.
- b) Equipment valued at Rs. 875,935 purchased from the income of the External Projects had been omitted in the Cash Flow Statement
- c) The balance stock of stores and the stock of publications amounting to Rs. 215,928 and Rs. 425,225 respectively had been understated and the retention money on contracts amounting to Rs. 75,389 had been overstated in the financial statements.

2.2.2 Unreconciled Control Accounts

A difference of Rs. 26,173 was observed between the accounts and the schedules relating to 03 items. Action had not been taken to make inquiries and rectify the difference.

2.2.3 Accounts Receivable and Payable

The following matters were observed.

- a) Action had not been taken even during the year under review to settle the unpaid salaries amounting to Rs. 41,568 brought forward over a number of years.
- b) Action had not been taken to recover and settle the loan balances amounting to Rs. 58,750 receivable from officers no longer in service either from the sureties or through legal action.
- c) The value of retention money on contracts and supplies as at the end of the year under review amounted to Rs. 12,329,892 and out of that the balances older than 05 years amounted to Rs. 7,911,317.

2.2.4 Non-compliance with Laws, Rules, Regulations and Management Decisions

Non-compliance with the following Laws, Rules, Regulations and Management decisions were observed during the course of audit.

2.2.5. Transactions not supported by Adequate Authority

According to the Treasury letter No. PE/1/116/6 dated 24 November 1984, instructions had been issued to utilize the interest generated for the Medical Assistance Fund and other investment income for the payment of contributions to the Medical Assistance Fund to reduce the contribution paid from the University Fund to the Medical Assistance Fund. Nevertheless, the entire contribution of Rs. 1,717,684 for the year had been credited to the Medical Assistance Fund without deducting the investment income of Rs. 384,942 received for the year under review.

2.2.6 Irregular Transactions

Expenditure exceeding the provision by a sum of Rs. 156,059 had been incurred on 02 External Project Courses.

3. Financial and Operating Review

3.1 Financial Review

3.1.1 Financial Results

According to the financial statements presented, the working of the University for the year ended 31 December 2010 had resulted in a deficit of Rs. 125,338,149 before taking into account the Government grant for recurrent expenditure as compared with the corresponding deficit of Rs. 111,391,478 for the preceding year, thus indicating an increase of Rs. 13,946,671 in the deficit. The deficit for the year under review, after taking into account of Government grant of Rs. 82,170,000 received for recurrent expenditure, amounted to Rs. 43,168,149 as compared with the deficit of Rs. 40,998,478 for the preceding year. Thus an increase of Rs. 2,169,671 in the deficit was indicated.

3.2 Operating Review

3.2.1 Performance

The following observations are made.

(a). Achievement of Objectives

The following observations are made.

- (i). Even though the release of student community to the society after the improvement of knowledge through research is one of the major missions of a University, the Jiun Buddhist Research Publication Fund had not been utilized for any research and publication activity in the year under review. The balance therein as at the end of the year under review amounted to Rs. 1,646,614
- (ii). Information on the statutory provision for the establishment of the Mahopadyaya Fund maintained by the University had not been furnished to audit and the balance therein as at the end of the year under review amounted to Rs. 1,944,896. Expenditure incurred from the Fund in the year under review comprised Rs. 191,646 on subsidy for gas and Rs. 1,000,000 as part of the expenditure amounting to Rs. 1,236,847 spent on the opening ceremony of the building complex.
- (iii). The primary objective of the establishment of the University had been the training of scholars on the Buddha Dhamma and Discipline for the dissemination of Buddhism and enhancing the Buddhist Missionary Work in Sri Lanka and abroad. The number of students who passed the Doctoral, Masters and Bachelor Degree and Diploma Examinations from the year 1984 to 2010 had been 4996.

(b). Enrolment of Students

The following observations are made.

- (i). A note on the number of applications received for internal studentship for general degree and the local and foreign students enrolled in the year under review and the 04 preceding years is given below.

Even though infrastructure including modern buildings with all facilities had been improved since the year 2004 at a cost of Rs. 512 million, attention had not been paid for enrolling a larger number of students commensurate with such facilities.

- (ii). The total recurrent expenditure incurred in the year under review on the academic activities of 544 students amounted to Rs. 142,049,552 and the total recurrent expenditure incurred on 546 students in the preceding year amounted to Rs. 131,868,318. The cost per student amounting to Rs. 261,120 for the year under review as compared with cost per student amounting to Rs. 241,517 for the preceding year indicated an increase of 8.11 per cent.

(c). Academic Performance

The following observations are made.

- (i). According to the Timetables for the Academic Year 2010 of the Faculty of Languages and the Faculty of Buddhist Studies of the Sri Lanka Buddhist and Pali University, an average of 30 lectures should be conducted for each subject. Nevertheless, out of the 1680 lectures for 56 subjects, 789 lectures only had been conducted.
- (ii). The attendance of students for lectures had been at a very weak level as due consideration had not been given to specify a compulsory percentage of attendance for lectures to qualify for sitting the examinations. In view of the non-attendance of students for lectures, 144 lectures relating to 41 subjects had not been conducted. There were 230 instances of less than 50 per cent student participates in respect of 290 lectures conducted.
- (iii). Even though the lectures of External Lectures had not been conducted due to the absence of students, a sum of Rs.60,000 had been paid in the Academic Year for 60 lectures not conducted.
- (iv). An examination of the lectures conducted per week by the Lecturers of each Academic Division revealed that the Temporary and Probationary Lecturers had conducted more lecture hours than the Permanent Lecturers. The reasons for that had not been explained.

3.2.2 Management inefficiencies

The following observations are made.

- (a). Criteria for the utilization of the Development Fund established in the year 1992 had not been prepared and the balance therein as at 31 December 2010 amounted to Rs. 510,293. The Fund had been utilized only for the supply of gas valued at Rs. 99,505 to the canteen from the year 2002.

- (b) Out of the conditions specified in the transfer of the land 05 acres, 0.27 perches in extent belonging to the Ministry of Agriculture, Lands, Animal Production and Health, Irrigation and Transport of the Western Provincial Council to the University on 05 December 2002, of which the University is enjoying the tenure at present, the condition relating to the procurement of the land on a lease had not been satisfied.

3.2.3 Resources obtained from other State Institutions

Even though the University is using two motor vehicles belong to the Ministry of Buddha Sasana and the Ministry of Higher Education, action had not been taken to effect the legal transfer of the motor vehicle.

3.2.4 Idle and Underutilized Assets

Even though a fully equipped auditorium had been constructed at a cost of Rs.28 million (exclusive of the Value Added Tax) the advance plans for its utilization had not been made available to audit. It had not been used for any useful purpose during the year under review.

3.2.5 Cost of staff

Vacancies in 19 posts comprising 15 non-academic posts and 04 academic posts of the staff of the University existed as at the end of the year under review.

4. System and Controls

Deficiencies in systems and controls observed during the course of audit were brought to the notice of the Mahopadyaya of the University from time to time. Special attention is needed in respect of the following areas of control.

- d. Internal Control

- f. Accounting for External Projects
- g. Maintenance of Personal Files

The Auditor General's report on the financial documents of Sri Lanka Buddhist and Pali University for the year ending on the 31st of December 2010 in accordance with the 14(2) C statement of the financial Act of No. 38 1971.

1.2 The Management's responsibility in relation to the financial documents.

1.3 Basis for the subject scope and principal for auditing.

2. Financial documents.

2.1 Principle.

2.2 Presenting ideas about the financial documents.

2.2.1 Limitations/drawbacks in accounting/maintaining accounts.

- a) It is hereby informed and noted down that steps will be taken in future to examine these fixed assets and conduct a physical evaluation followed by revaluation and entering into accounts.
- b) It is acknowledged that in preparing the financial transactions documents, the sum for the purchasing of external equipment which amounts to Rs. 875,935 has been overlooked and it will be rectified.
- c) As the value of stock is taken to the final accounts as Rs. 781,114, the final stock is valued with a deficit of Rs. 215,928. The necessary journals have been prepared to rectify this in the year 2011.

This said stock of published books are printed using the sum given by the Ministry on the occasion of the 25th anniversary of Sri Lanka Buddhist and Pali University and as they are not entered to the publishing stock at present, steps will be taken in future to look into the matter and enter into the stock balance.

Though this value of Rs. 75,389 is paid to the contractors, it has not been possible to deduct the amount from the account of the maintenance on the basis of contracts. This has been rectified by the journal notes number 81, 82, 86, and 87.

2.2.2 Non -compared Administrative Accounts

While journal notes have been prepared with regard to the difference of Rs. 190 pertaining to bicycle loans, it has been noted down to examine and take necessary steps in future in relation to the differences arising from advanced payment and special advances.

2.2.3 Receivable and Payable Accounts

- (a) While a financial committee decision had been taken with regard to the unpaid wages amounting to Rs.41, 568, it was also decided to send letters to the relevant personnel and to deposit the amount of money to the University's capital account if they were unable to respond within 14 days to the letters sent to them.
- (b) Steps have been taken to collect the sum of money that is noted as the loan balance due from the previous employees in releasing the benefits of the provident fund.
- (c) While the bursar requested the financial committee to decide upon the release of the relevant sum required for the maintenance of contracts and supply, the decision of the committee was to inform the relevant suppliers about the matter.

2.2.4 Non - conformity with the rules, regulations and management decision.

- (a) In preparing the relevant accounts for the year 2010, the income and expenditure pertaining to the self-financial course are accounted to the University account of income and expenditure.
- (b) No allocation is made for provisions. A certain percentage will be deposited for the employees resigning in future.
- (c) I.

- (a) In relation to F.R.37 (2) (b), the petty cash given in an instance should not exceed Rs. 20,000, however, there are instances in Buddhist and Pali University when advances have to be made exceeding Rs. 20,000. It is impossible to perform these duties within the limit of Rs.20, 000 as advances when sometimes the amount increases with circulars.

Ex: A sum of Rs.27, 500 had to be given as advances for the month of November, 2010 in relation to administrative board member fees, travelling expenses, and refreshments. (2011 - June - Rs.59, 000/=)

- (b) Though in relation to extra petty cash the advances should be repaid once the task is completed, a sum of RS.78, 527 has not yet been repaid as the bills sent by the relevant companies have been misplaced. Steps will be taken to retrieve them and accordingly the relevant advances will be repaid.
- (c) Even though petty cash should only be provided for the staff officers, occasional advances are given to the relevant clerks for meetings and maintenance work in the university. Otherwise, it is difficult to maintain the day to day work in the university.

Though it is necessary to comply with the Financial Regulation 371 (2) in providing petty cash, as it is not possible to do so on special occasions in the university, in order to solve the problems that are faced by the financial section, an institutional circular has been issued, for which the approval from the financial committee has been received.

- II. Arrangements have been made to inform the suppliers on the details regarding this sum of rupees 20,000.
- III. Stock taking has been done in relation to the following sections for the year 2010.

1. External examinations branch

Though the officials relevant to the conducting of the surveys have been informed, it has been noted down to conduct the surveys for the sections in which the confirmation of balance has not been done.

(d)

- I. It has to be mentioned that there is a procedure of marking leave for the lecturers when taking leave. It has to be reported that necessary steps will be taken to rectify any problem with regard to the manner shown.
 - II. While the drawbacks of 13 personal files have been identified, those drawbacks are being corrected in relation to the establishment code, and it is hereby mentioned that an institutional circular has also been issued regarding the matter (the institutional circular and a copy of the report prepared in relation to the drawbacks identified are attached)
 - III. While an attendance register should be maintained by each and every department, some departments (with employees) and already maintaining an attendance register.
There is already a procedure to confirm the attendance of the lecturers and accordingly the payments are made to the visiting lecturers.
As mentioned above, this has already been done and in order to make it more formal, the venerable vice-chancellor has already taken steps to inform in writing the deans and all the heads of departments.
- (e) It has been noted down to conduct the echo-test in this year for all the vehicles according to the circulars.

(f)

- (a) While up to 2010 a sum of rupees 3,855,206 has been overpaid to the EPF & ETF funds, in order to prevent this situation in future, the council has decided to disregard the academic allowance in paying the funds with effect from March 2011. Accordingly, the financial section will operate according to the above mentioned decision in paying salaries from the month of March.

(b) A professor has not retired in 2010 and any such gratuity has not been paid.

- 2.2.5. Transactions that have not been confirmed by a sufficient authoritative power.
Steps will be taken to deposit a sum of rupees 3,84,942 which was the investment income for the year 2010 to the university's common fund.

2.2.6 Informal transactions

A sum of rupees 161,900 in the year 2007 and a sum of rupees 175,000 in the year 2008 have been allocated as funds for the diploma in “Dhamma” communication program.

Likewise a sum of rupees 1,75,000 has been allocated as funds for foreign Buddhist “Dhamma” missionary service.

While funds have not been allocated for the years 2008 and 2009, these funds have been spent on lecture fees, travelling, allowances for the registrar, allowances for the assistant registrar, laborer fees, and payment for the clerks. As a result the sum of rupees 156,059 which have been excessively spent on two external course projects cannot be charged from the department of Buddhist affairs and the amount spent has been borne by the income gained from other external programs. It is informed further that the additional sum spent has not been borne by the government.

3. Financial and operational review.

3.2.1 Task completion.

(a) Reaching aims

- I. Funds can be applied from the Giun Buddhist research and Publication Fund only for the research based on Pali language and Buddhist studies. Such research work should be forwarded to a person who has obtained a university degree for the relevant subject or to a graduate holding a “pracheena” degree. Such request has not been received so far.
- II. According to the criteria of the establishment of the vice-chancellor’s fund, there is no obstacle to spend for welfare activities on such occasions.
- III. From the year 1984 to 2010 a number of 4,996 graduates and diploma holders have been produced. It needs to be mentioned that according to the act, the production of 4,996 graduates and diploma holders is a significant achievement given that the conducting of exams and the qualifications required depend on special situations.

(b) Recruitment of students

- I. The number of students to be recruited will be decided after the approval from the Ministry of Higher Education. Based on the approval, students have been recruited. According to the university annual report this is the university with the highest number of foreign students. A total number of 284 foreign students had registered as internal students from 2006 to 2010.

Taking into consideration the future needs of the university, the library building, faculty administrative buildings, lecture halls, the auditorium, the common facilities building and

the administrative building etc. were constructed. In those days, each of the administrative sections had been maintained in lecture halls. The university, which initially recruited 50 students, gradually increased the number of local students recruited to 110. Meanwhile foreign students are recruited without a limit. If constructions had been made to provide hostel facilities for the students, there would have emerged many problems with regard to infrastructure facilities. As a result, it has been designed in the composite plan to provide the required infrastructure facilities for providing residential facilities in order to recruit more students within the next five years by providing the above mentioned facilities under the 512 rupee million project.

II. (C) Academic task completion

- i. As a whole, lectures have been conducted for the university students in an adequate manner.

It should be shown here that reasons such as the absenteeism of students for lectures have resulted in some lectures not being held.

The knowledge expected of a university student and the related subject knowledge have been given.

- ii. Lectures have been conducted for the university students in an adequate manner. As a result of not presenting information regarding some lectures, the number of lectures conducted has been reported as a lower percentage.

There should be non-academic staff consisting of clerks and laborers and when the students attend lectures, the giving of attendance registers, collecting them, and keeping records are done by them. But as a result of not having such facilities, certain lectures that have been conducted, have not undergone the audit inquiry. Therefore it is mentioned that a sufficient number of lectures needed to maintain the quality of the programs have been conducted.

- iii. While a sufficient number of permanent lecturers are not there in the university to conduct the programs / courses conducted by the university, senior lecturers, heads of departments and deans are engaged in academic and administrative affairs of the university occupying different administrative positions. The service of the experts in relevant fields should be taken in order to get varieties of knowledge needed for different subjects. It is necessary to be done. In order to seek permission to recruit new lecturers to the university, management services department has been informed.

- iv. There are only 21 permanent lecturers. From that 10 of the academic staff, namely, the venerable vice-chancellor, the two deans, and the other heads of departments, are engaged in administrative work, and while performing the administrative work, they are also doing this work. As a result of being engaged in administrative work in this manner, compared to the permanent lectures, the temporary and the probationary lecturers have conducted more lecture hours.

3.2.2 Managerial inefficiencies

- (a) Gas has been provided for the canteen according to the council decision.
- (b) This university has been established under a special parliament act. According to the Buddhist and Pali university Act no.74 of 1981 which was modified by the Buddhist and Pali university Act no.37 of 1995, no taxes can be paid to any institution.

3.2.3 Resource taken from other state institutions.

Has been informed to be taken over by the ministry. These are outdated vehicles more than 15 years old.

3.2.4 Disposable and under-used assets.

This building has been used for the main festivals of the university students (such as the literary festival) and the programs of the academic and non-academic staff.

01. It is necessary to complete the particular leave form and the related bonds and other documents through the relevant clerks in the administrative section and it has to be presented to the venerable vice chancellor through the Head of Department and the Dean as well as to the registrar through the administrative officers and non - academic staff.
02. As it is necessary to get the approval from the leave committee in accordance with the time table for meetings planned for each month, attention should be given to present the relevant form, bonds and other related documents prior to the committee meeting is held.
03. After the approval from the administrative committee, only the duly completed forms and the relevant documents will be presented for the approval of the Ministry of Higher Education and "incomplete" will be mentioned and the ministry will be notified in relation to the forms which are incomplete and presented without the relevant documents.
04. As the recommended forms should be presented to the Ministry of Higher Education at least 14 days prior to leaving for abroad, the forms should be presented with sufficient time.

05. The university will not be responsible for buying flight tickets without leave approval and going abroad on one's own, regarding it as an urgent matter.
06. The venerable vice - chancellor reserves the right to deal appropriately with any situation related to going abroad.

Legal updating of the bonds of the staff who have received leave and engaged in studies or any other work.

This is in reference to the letter I received on 02.09.2010 regarding the above matter. In relation to that the relevant report is hereby presented.

01. Senior professor venerable Uthurawela Dhammarathana thero Dean (Language Studies)

According to the request letter made on 07.08.2003, the 223rd council held on 26.08.2003 has granted study leave with pay for two years to follow research at Sichuan University based on a scholarship granted by the People's Republic of China. The 258th council has approved for the next 9 months study leave with pay and study leave with no pay if leave is taken for the next three months.

Reported to university service at the end of the study leave, on 20.06.2007. The personal file does not confirm that a bond has been signed for this study leave.

02.Ven.Moragollagama Uparathana thero

Study leave has been approved by the 269th university council which was held on 31st of July 2007 for a post-graduate scholarship offered by the Socialist Republic of China at the Wohan University in Wohan province. An approval letter with regard to leaving abroad is not to be found in the personal file.

Returning to the university on 15th March 2010 has been started. A new bond should again be signed according to the university grants commission circular no.920. The venerable thero in his letter dated 02.09.2010 has started of his leaving abroad again from 10th September 2010.

Ven. Moragollagama Uparathana thero has come to an agreement with the university on 20th of August 2007. In that Bond,

- i. (8) of no.5 has not been completed
- ii. (9) of no.9 has not been completed
- iii. No. 12 has not been completed
- iv. No. 11 has not been completed
- v. The 2nd witness of the university has not signed

The personal file does not indicate, either of a council decision or a letter of approving leave based on that approval.

3. Ven.Dunukewatte Gunarathana thero (Senior lecturer)

Study leave starting from 04.01.2007 has been applied from a letter dated 18.10.2006. Accordingly, study leave has been taken for two years starting from 07.05.2007 to 07.05.2009. There are no letters granting approval. The study leave committee held on 19.08.2009 has approved the study leave for one more year. Accordingly study leave for three years has been taken. Has reported to work on 04th May 2010.

The personal file does not indicate of a council approving that leave. At the same time a letter approving the leave is not included in the personal file. There is no evidence indicating that a bond has been signed for this 3 year study leave.

4. Mr.Samantha ,llangakoon (Probationary lecturer)

The 263rd council (held on the 30th January 2007) has approved study leave with effect from 8th October 2006 to 7th October 2007. This has been informed by the letter dated 9th April 2007. Has reported to work on 1st March 2007 having covered 5 months of the study leave. A request has been made by a letter dated 08.01.2009 to take leave for the remaining 7 months with effect from 02.2009. Accordingly the rest of the study leave for postgraduate studies has been approved with effect from 1st March 2009. Has reported to work on the 22nd November 2009, according to the letter dated 22nd November 2009. No bond has been signed for the year leave taken.

5. Ven.Dr.Nelluwe Sumanawansha thero (Senior lecturer)

190th council has granted 2 year leave with pay with effect from 21st August 2001 to 20th August 2003 to study for the PhD at the University of Delhi. The 220th council held on the 27th May 2003 has extended the study leave for one more year starting from 21st August 2003 to 20th August 2004. Has reported to work again on the 5th July 2004. However the personal file does not confirm, the signing of a bond, going around.

6. Ven.Mawathagama Pemananda thero (Probationary lecture)

The 253th council held on 28th March 2006, has granted 1 year study leave with effect from the 20th April 2006, under the condition of conducting, half the number of allocate lectures. A request has been made by the letter dated 21st March 2007 for another six months study leave with effect from 20th April 2007. Accordingly the leave has been taken. Has reported to work again on the 19th October 2007.

There is no information indicating that a letter approving leave for the six months has been issued and a bond has been signed for the one year six months period.

7. Mr.K.G.Swarnananda: Lecturer (Probationary)

Study leave has been granted from 1st of January 2010 to the 30th October 2010 according to the decision made by 298th council. Study leave has been cancelled and recalled for duty with effect from 14th June 2010 by the letter dated 11th June 2010. A bond has not been signed for the relevant period.

8. Mrs. M.A. Chandrani Munaginghe (Senior lecturer)

Study leave has been granted from 1st of January 2004 – 31st of December 2004 and 1st of February 2006 to 1st October 2006 accordingly to the decision made by the 225th council. The personal file does not indicate the signing of a bond.

9. Ven. Pitigala Vijithathero (Senior lecturer)

It is observed from a letter presented by PitigalaVijitha thero on 19th December 2007 that study leave has been taken for one year with effect from 2nd May 2007 and reported for duty on 1st of January 2005. But accordingly to the personal file there is no letter regarding the approval, informing of the leave approval, council decision or a signed bond.

10. Mr.P.R Wasantha Priuadarshana (Lecturer-Resigned)

Has taken one year study leave from 1st of January 2008. Has reported to work again from 1st of April 2008. According to the personal file, there are no documents regarding council decisions or the manner in which approval was given for the leave.

It is concluded that leave had been given according to the decision of the 269th council held 31st July 2007.

11. Mr. M.H.P.K Gunasena (Lecturer probationary)

Study leave has been given with effect from 8th November 2005 according to the decision made by the 250th council held on 04th October 2005. A bond has been signed on 27th April 2006, to this effect.

12. Mrs. K.A.S.N Amarasekara (Senior lecturer)

Study leave has been approved with pay till 26th May 2006 by 249th council. Study leave without pay has been given by the 254th council from 26th May 2006 to 20th June 2006.

Leave without pay has been taken till 15th June 2006. A university bond for foreign study leave has been signed between the venerable chancellor and Mrs. Amarasekara. Only the parts under no. 9,10 and 12 mentioned in the agreement are not completed.

Study leave for one year with effect from 1st of January 2004 has been approved by the 223rd council. Report of the auditor General on the financial statements of the provident Fund of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka for the year ended 31 December 2010 in terms of section 38 of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka Act, No 74 of 1981.

The audit of Financial statements of the provident Fund of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka for the year ended 31 December 2010 was carried out under my direction in pursuance of provisions in Article 154(3) of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka read in conjunction with section 38 of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka Act, No. 74 of 1981. My comments and observations on the above financial statements appear in this report.

2.2 Responsibility of the Management for the Financial Statements.

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. This responsibility includes: designing , implementing and maintaining internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of Financial Statements that are free from material misstatements, whether due to fraud or error; selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

2.3 Scope of Audit and Basis of Opinion

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit. Audit opinion, comments and finding in this report are based on review of the Financial Statements presented to audit and substantive, tests of samples of transactions. The scope and extent of such review and tests were such as to enable as wide an audit coverage as possible within the limitations of staff, other resources and time available to me. The audit was carried out in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards to obtain reasonable assurance as to whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. The audit includes the examination on a test basis of evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in financial statements and assessment of accounting policies used and significant estimate made by the management in the preparation of financial statements as well as evaluating their overall presentation. I have obtained sufficient information and explanations which to the best of my knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of my audit. I therefore believe that my audit provides a reasonable basis for my opinion.

3. Financial Statements

2.1 Opinion.

So far as appear from my examination and to the best of information and according to the explanations given to me, I am of opinion that the Provident Fund of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka had maintained proper accounting records for the year ended 31 December 2010 and the financial Statements have been prepared in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles and give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Provident Fund of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka as at 31 December 2010 and the financial results of its operation and cash flows for the year then ended.

2.2 Comments on Financial Statements

2.2.1 Accounts Receivable

The amount of Rs. 191,095 over remitted by financial institutions several years ago to the Department of Inland Revenue as Withholding Tax deducted from interest earned on fixed deposit owned by the Buddhist and Pali University had remained unsettled even as at the end of year under review.

3. Financial and Operating Review

3.1 Financial Review

According to the financial statements presented as at 31 December 2010, the working of the Provident Fund of the University had resulted in a pre-tax surplus of Rs. 5,489,591 as compared with the corresponding surplus of Rs. 8,101,632 for the preceding year thus indicating a decrease of Rs. 2,612,041 in the surplus. Decreasing in interest rate of invested Treasury bills had been affected for this.

3.2 Performance

The main source of income of the Fund comprise 10 per cent contribution recovered from the monthly salaries of the permanent employees of the University and 15 per cent interest paid by the University thereon. Investing the money of the Fund in Treasury Bills and grant of staff loans is being done.

The following observations are made.

- (a) The fund had lost a sum of Rs. 29,982 due to delay on reinvestment of investment Rs. 11,500 which was matured at the end of the year under review.
- (b) A sum Rs. 8,169,110 had been granted to the members during the year under review as loans as compared with Rs. 2,019,340 in the preceding year thus indicating a increase of 304.54 per cent.
- (c) Provident fund amounted to 3,042,430 could not be released to the 11 beneficiaries due to various reasons as at the end of the year under review.

4. Systems and Controls

Deficiencies in systems and controls observed during the course of audit were brought to the notice of the institution from time to time. Special attention is needed in respect of the settlement of Loan Balances.

Accordingly, it has been agreed upon to provide this sum to the university and the Bursar and the Assessor have signed an agreement to that effect. That department has informed that steps will be taken to provide the sum soon. Accordingly, it is further informed that a sum of Rs. 129,306 have been taken from the Internal Revenue Department at present.

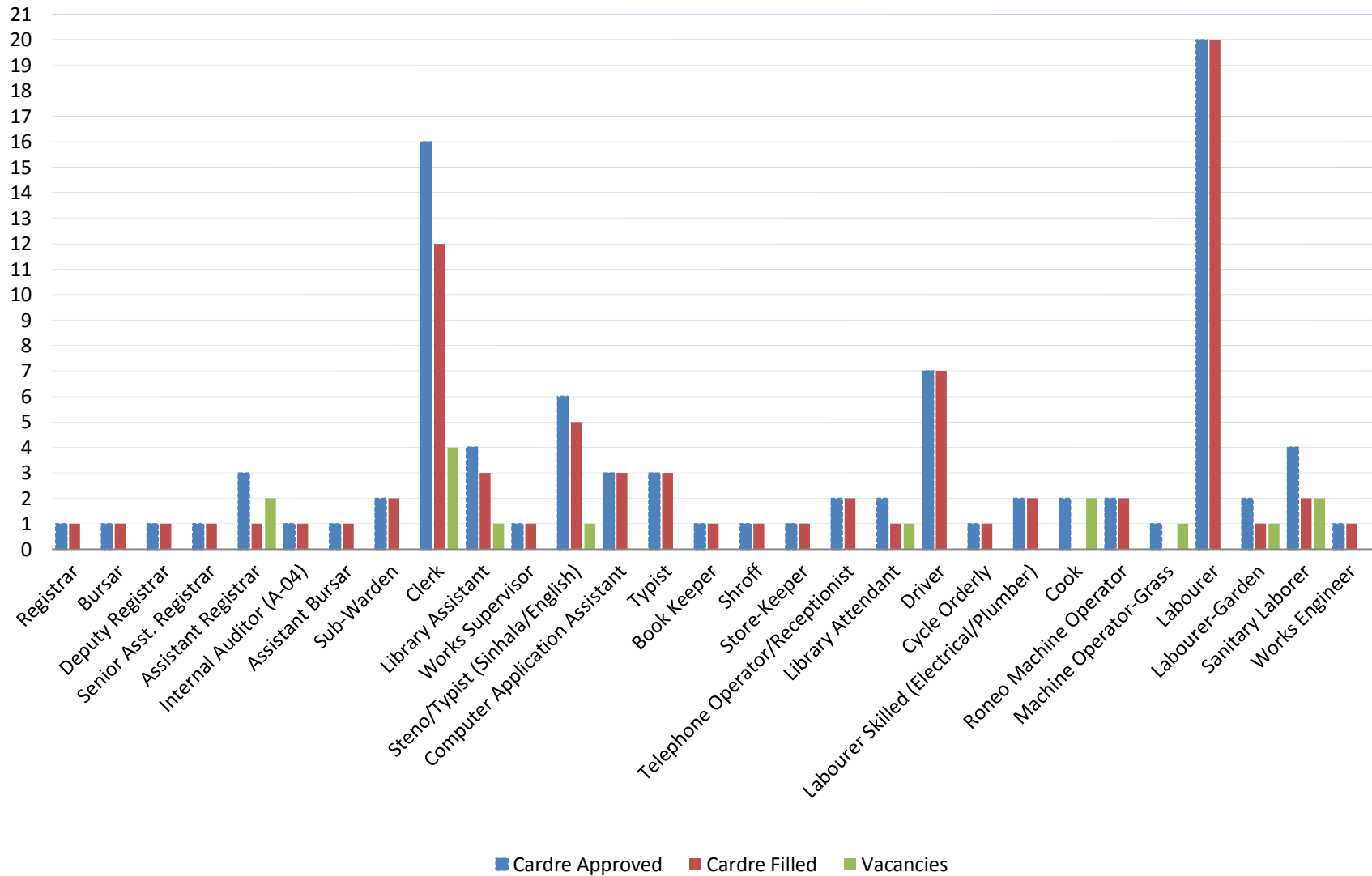

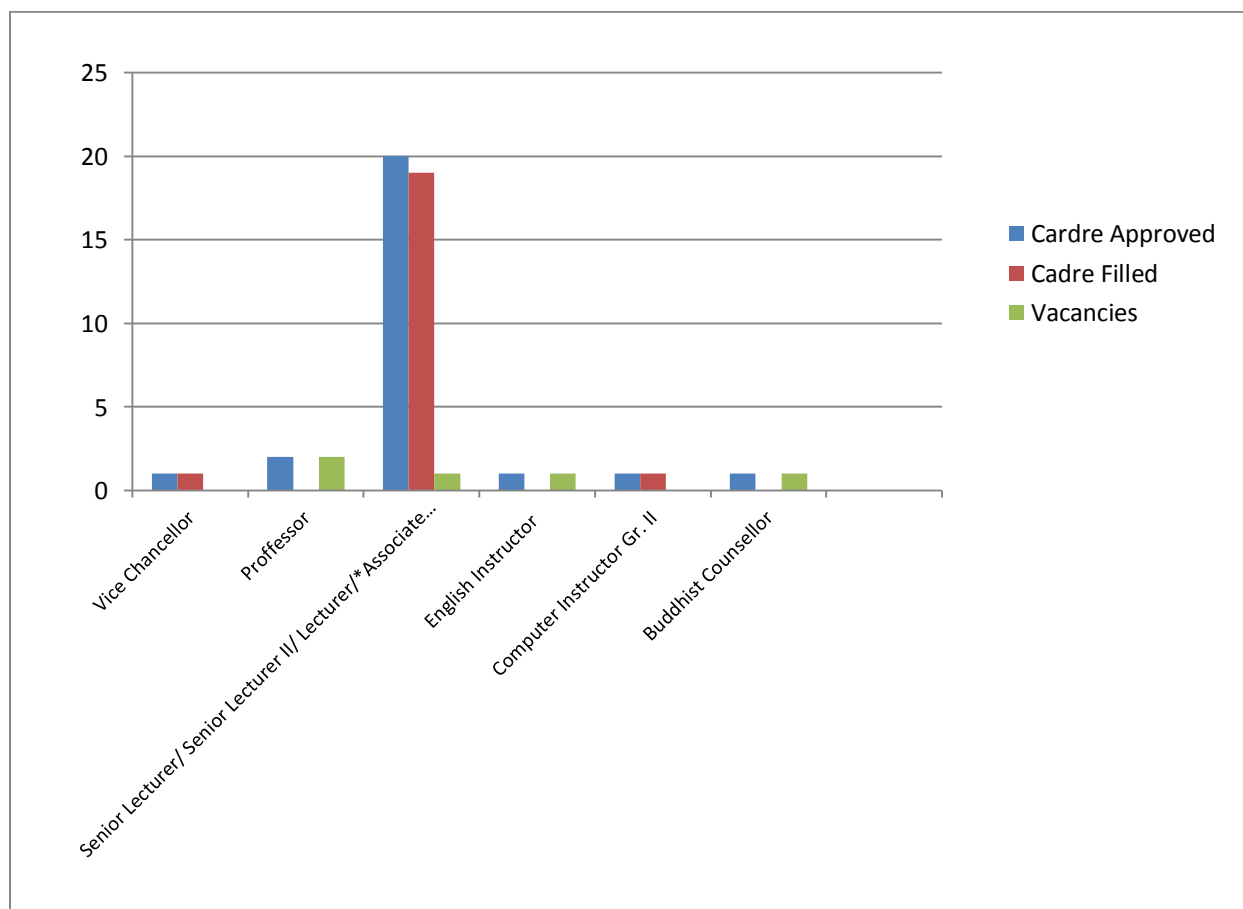

Cadre Position for Academic Staff 31.12.2010 (Teaching)

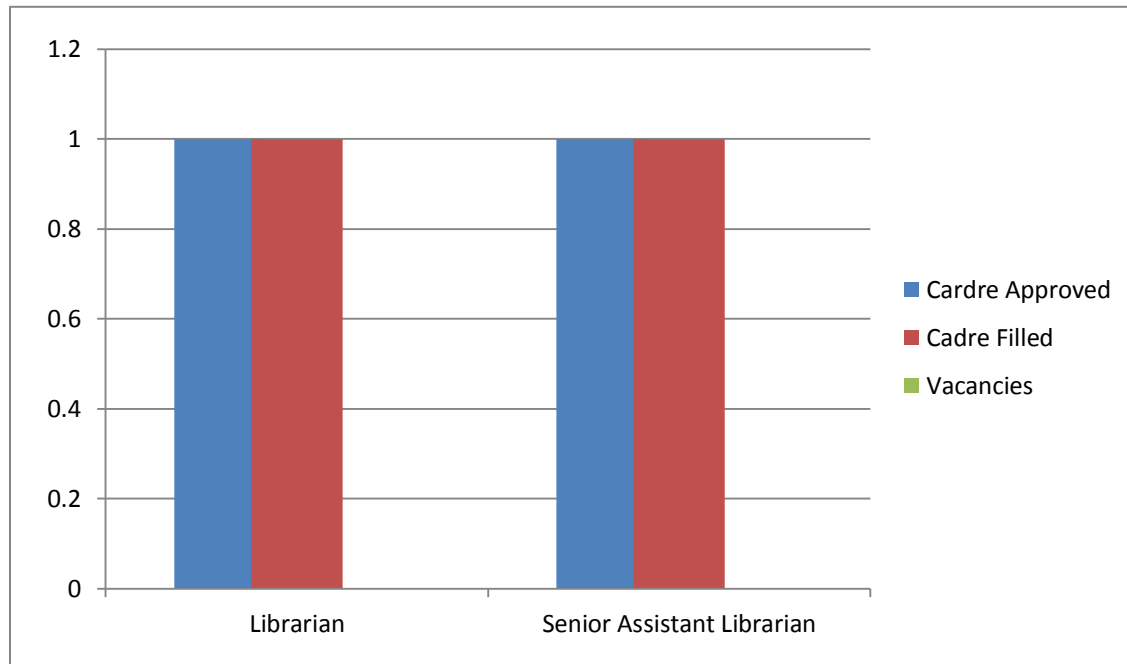
