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Ven. Vice-Chancellor's Message

Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka which was established on the 22nd of April 1982 in terms of the Buddhist and Pali University's Act No. 74 of 1981, which was amended by Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka Act No. 37 of 1995, is functional with its students study premises being situated at Pitipana North, Gabadawatta, Homagama, the administrative Building at 37, Moragahahena Road, Pitipana, Homagama. The External Examinations Branch at 214, Baudhaloka Mawatha, Colombo 07.

The Academic process which was started on the 9th of June, 1997, with barely the minimum facilities such as hostel facilities adequate enough for about 100 students, small lecture rooms seven in number, a small library, and a small administrative building has been upgraded to a developed level, even with certain shortcomings. A plot of land of five acres in extent was acquired from the western provincial council, and on this land, five two-storeyed lecture theatres, three, three-storeyed hostels, and the cafeterias were constructed and they were opened on the 20th of February 2005. In the newly received land, a three – storeyed library building, an auditorium and a building for common facilities were constructed and utilized.

The main administrative building was constructed on a plot of land near Pitipana junction close to the High level road and with the above building complex they were ceremoniously declared open on the 12th of August 2010, by his excellency, the president of the Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka, his excellency Mahinda Rajapaksha, with the participation of the Ven. Chancellor, the erudite scholar of Sanskrit, the expert in six – Oriental languages, the most venerable Nayaka Thero of the Amarapura Sangha Sabha, the expert writer, Royal Pandit, most venerable Davuldena Gnanissara Thero, and also with the participation of the Minister of Higher Education Hon. S.B Dissanayake, Minister of Education, Hon. Bandula Gunawardhana, and also with the participation of a distinguished gathering consisting of both clergy and laymen.

Thus, the action taken to develop a large number of infrastructure facilities was of immense help in its future development. Therefore, it is with great pleasure that the fact of recruiting 110 students both lay and clergy is mentioned here.

In order to inculcate mental discipline among all the students, a Buddhist counselling Programme has been started for both lay students and ordained; though it a practical meditation programme has been introduced. It has become a popular programme among students. Taking into consideration its value and use, the faculty Boards, the senate's and the council's unanimous decision to make it a compulsory study programme is a laudable measure and also it is highly appreciated. In the same manner, a two – years Diploma programme in Buddhist Counselling has also been introduced from 2011.

In achieving the aims of establishing the university, a two – year foreign missionary programme on dhamma in the medium of English has been started and it is being conducted on a special request made by her excellency, the former president. In order to improve the knowledge of English in students, a certificate course in English as well as a Diploma Course in English have been started. A Department of English has been established to provide an opportunity for those students who want to study English as a subject.

Arrangements have been made to design the infrastructure facilities needed to spread the teaching – learning process locally as well as internationally by using information technology, with the help of Arthur C. Clark centre and at the same time necessary plans have been designed to computerize each and every department and are nearing completion.

Action has already been taken to train academic and non- academic staff of the university and facilities for welfare activities have been provided to students and employees through the vice-chancellor's fund.

In view of the professional development of the academic staff, an opportunity has been provided for them to present one research paper on monthly basis and furthermore, steps have been taken to publish these research papers in the annual educational magazine "Pali and Buddhist studies ". It is a pleasure to mention here that 61 such staff development sessions have been completed at the end of the year 2011.

A certificate course in Computer Applications has been introduced for the benefit of the internal students since 2005. In addition to that language certificate courses in German, Japanese, Chinese, Hindi, Korean, and Tamil have been introduced as modern languages. All the study Programme have been made 2 year Programmes from the year 2011, for the optimum and maximum benefit of the students. The Bhikku students those who have come from far remote corners of the island will go back to their "Dayakas" once their studies are over. One aspect of their needs is to take into account an auspicious time. In order to help them and to give them the necessary knowledge a two year Diploma in Astrology and a two year diploma in Architecture have been started. A five year action plan has been designed from 2011 to 2016 and it has been put into practice while it is being updated.

On account of " Buddajayanthi" a programme on Dhamma communication to train, Buddhist missionary monks has been started with the help of the Ministry of Religious Affairs. Steps have been taken to start new courses of studies with the assistant of the Ministry of Religious Affairs and Moral Development.

It is a pleasure to mention of the fact that this university has become an international university since 182 foreign students have been registered and are studying at present and also there are affiliated institutions in Singapore ,Malaysia , America , United kingdom , Germany , Austria , Scotland and South Korea. The Academic staff has presented explorative research papers on dilapidated ancient Buddhist temples by visiting them with the guidance of the senior professor M.W.Wimal Wijerathne, who has joined this university on sabbatical leave. The ancient Pali chronicle "Thelakatahagatha" was edited and printed on account of the 25th Anniversary of this university which was fallen in the year 2011. Eleven external programs are being conducted by the External Examinations Branch of this university. They are , Diploma in Buddhism , Diploma in Pali , Diploma programme in Buddhist communication , Diploma in English , post Graduate Diploma in foreign Buddhist Missionary Service , post Graduate Diploma in Buddhist studies ,Bachelor of arts Degree programme, Master of arts Degree programme and the Master of philosophy programme. Locally, 4617 students and though foreign affiliated institutions 158 students got registered themselves for the above programmes and studied these programmes.

In order to expand the internal study activities, arrangements have been made to build hostel facilities for foreign students at the Homagama premises, examination halls, meditation chambers, and quarters for lecturers in the coming years. Furthermore, discussions are being held to establish foreign affiliated institutes in India, Australia, France, Japan and America. It is hoped to establish student exchange programmes with countries like India and Thailand by signing memorandums of understanding. Plans are being made to sign a memorandum of understanding with the Warsaw University in Poland.

Thus our university should be developed in physical and human resources, in order to render assistance to the people of the world through Buddhism by producing scholars in Buddhism locally as well as internationally through different strategies. Therefore, we should be duty bound in achieving it.

01. General

(a) Introduction

The Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka which was established in terms of the act of parliament No.74 of 1981 of the Democratic socialist Republic of Sri Lanka was ceremoniously opened on the 22nd of April 1982 at 214 Bauddhaloka Mawatha Colombo 07. The main objectives, to attain which the university was established are the propagation of Buddhism, the promotion of Buddhist and Pali studies in Sri Lanka and foreign countries and the provision of facilities for the conduct of research in the relevant field.

The above mentioned Act has been amended by the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka's(amendment) No 37 of 1995. Concurrent with the implementation of these amendments ,the local affiliated institutions which existed so far ceased to exist, and the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka was organized in conformity with the structure of other universities of Sri Lanka, consequently the university's External Examinations Branch and post – Graduate Institute was located at the Colombo Premises, the academic campus with hostels at Pitipana, Homagama, and the administrative buiding was established on 12th of August 2010 at 37, Moragahahena Rd, Pitipana. The "Mumtaz Mahal" the official residence of former speaker on Galle Rd in Colombo 03, that belongs to the parliament of Sri Lanka has been transferred to Buddhist and Pali university of Sri Lanka on 28th of May 2009. The arrangements have been made to convert Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka into a fully pledged international university. It holds the membership of the Association of the Universities of the Commonwealth Countries and is an associate member of the committee of Vice-Chancellors and Directors.(CVCD) of the university system of this country.

(b) Objectives

The objectives of the restructured university according to the provisions of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka Act(Amendment) No. 37 of 1995 are indicated below.

- (1). The training of scholars in Buddha Dhamma and Discipline for the purpose of the propagation of Buddhism in Sri Lanka and foreign countries as well as the sustenance of missionary work.
- (2). The promotion of the study of Pali Language, Buddhist Culture and Buddhist Philosophy in Sri Lanka and abroad and the advancement of these studies to suit the modern trends of the world.
- (2).
 - a) Training of bikkhu students and lay students to teach Buddhism and Pali Language in pirivenas, schools and the institutions of such equal standing.
 - b) Provision of faculties to maintain and develop ethically religious minded pattern of living and mental discipline.
 - c) Any other matter related or supplementary to the above factors.

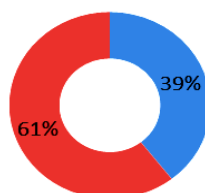

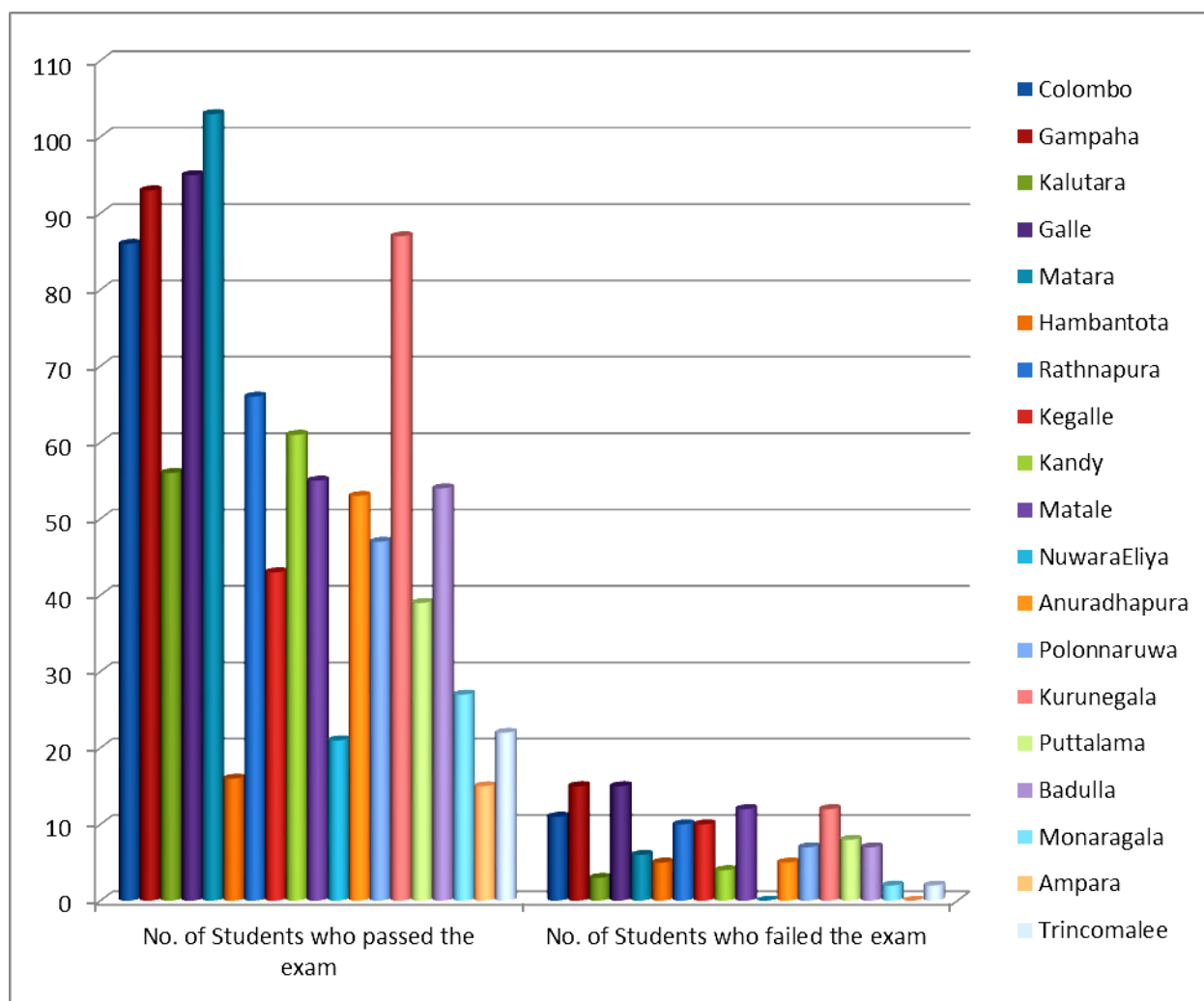

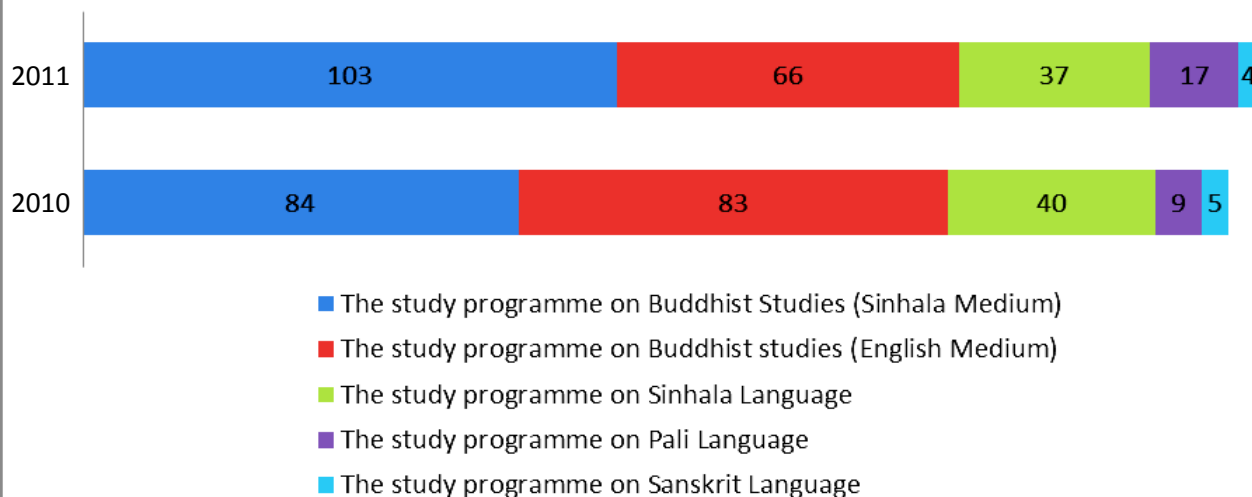

While the total income for the year was Rs. 105,698,820.00 from that a sum of Rs. 92,318,939.00 had been given as the government contribution for the recurrent expenditure. In the year 2011 a sum of Rs. 6,928,175.00 had spent from the external research projects. Report of the Auditor General on the Financial Statements of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka for the year ended 31 December 2011 in terms of Section 14(2)(c) of the Finance Act, No. 38 of 1971

The audit of financial statements of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka for the year ended 31 December 2011 comprising the balance sheet as at 31 December 2011 and the income statement, statement of changes in equity and cash flow statement for the year then ended and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes was carried out under my direction in pursuance of provisions in Article 154(1) of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka and Section 13(1) of the Finance Act, No. 38 of 1971 and Section 38 of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka Act, No. 74 of 1981. My comments and observations which I consider should be published with the Annual Report of the University in terms of Section 14(2)(c) of the Finance Act, appear in this report. A detailed Report in terms of Section 13(7)(a) of the Finance Act was furnished on 19 April 2012.

1.2 Management's Responsibility for Financial Statements

The management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles and for such internal control as the management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatements whether due to fraud or error.

1.3 Auditor's Responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards. Those Standards require that I comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment including the assessment of the risks of material misstatements of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the University's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the University's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. Sub sections (3) and (4) of Section 13 of the Finance Act, No. 38 of 1971 give discretionary powers to the Auditor General to determine the scope and the extent of the audit.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my qualified audit opinion.

1.4 Basis for Qualified Opinion

My opinion is qualified based on the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of this report.

2. Financial statements

2.1 Qualified Opinion

In my opinion, except for the effects of the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of this report, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka as at 31 December 2011 and its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles.

2.2 Comments on Financial Statements

2.2.1 Accounting Policies

The following deficiencies were observed.

- (a) Furniture costing Rs.3,854,820, cloaks costing Rs.837,096 and office equipment costing Rs.17,894,148 shown in the accounts as fully depreciated but still in use had not been revalued and brought to account.
- (b) Due to the failure of the University to account for the income of the External Courses Projects according to the periods, the surpluses of the completed Course Projects income amounting to Rs.15,702,486 had been shown in the balance sheet as current liabilities instead of being brought to account as income.

2.2.2 Accounting Deficiencies

The following deficiencies were observed.

- (a) The stock of publications valued at Rs.510,376 remaining in the Faculty Office had been omitted in the Board of Survey as at 31 December 2011 and the stock of the other publications had been computed at Rs.271,450. Nevertheless, the book value of the stock of publications amounting to Rs.420,486 had been shown in the financial statements. Action had not

been taken to adjust the balance amounting to Rs.361,340 in the financial statements.

- (b) Recurrent expenditure amounting to Rs.3,527,542 incurred by the University for the repair and maintenance had been spent under the accounting head “Rehabilitation and Improvement of Capital Assets” and brought to account that expenditure as non-current assets.

2.2.3 Accounts Payable

The value of retention money on contracts and suppliers as at the end of the year under review amounted to Rs.12,926,599 and out of that the value of unsettled balances older than 02 years amounted to Rs.11,501,967.

2.2.4 Non-compliance with Laws, Rules, Regulations and Management Decisions

Non-compliances with the following laws, rules, regulations and management decisions were observed during the course of audit.

2.2.5 Transactions not supported by Adequate Authority

According to the letter No. PE/1/116/6 dated 24 November 1984, instructions had been issued to invest the money of the Medical Assistance Fund in fixed deposits and the balance remaining after the adjustment of the interest income received thereon only should be reimbursed in order to reduce the contributions made to the Medical Assistance Fund from the University Fund. Nevertheless, the total contribution of Rs.1,512,940 had been credited to the Medical Assistance Fund without adjusting the interest income of Rs.169,152 so received in the year under review as in the preceding years. As such a sum of Rs.169,152 had been over-credited to the Medical Assistance Fund in the year under review.

2.2.6 Irregular Transactions

A sum of Rs.534,600 had been paid as allowances during the years 2010/2011 to the officers of the External Examination Division without obtaining the approval in terms of provisions in the Public Enterprises Circular No. 95 of 14 June 1994.

3. Financial Review

3.1 Financial Results

According to the financial statements presented, the working of the University for the year ended 31 December 2011, before taking into account the Government grant for recurrent expenditure, had resulted in a deficit of Rs.154,471,836 as compared with the corresponding deficit of Rs.125,338,149 for the preceding year, thus indicating an increase of Rs.29,133,687. After taking into account the Government grant of Rs.92,318,939 received for recurrent expenditure, the deficit for the year under review amounted to Rs.62,152,897 as compared with the corresponding deficit of Rs.43,168,149 for the preceding year. Thus the increase in the deficit amounted to Rs.18,984,748 and it had been mainly due to the provision made for employees gratuity commencing from the year under review.

4. Operating Review

4.1 Performance

The primary objective of the establishment of the University had been the training of academics on the Buddhist Doctrine and Discipline for the dissemination of Buddhism in Sri Lanka and abroad and act as a feeder source for the Buddhist Missionary Activities.

The number of local and foreign students who had applied as internal students and the number admitted for the general degrees during the year under review and the four preceding years are given below.

4.2 Academic Performance

The following matters were observed.

- (a) Even though the course period of the Doctorate Degree is 02 years, out of 22 students registered during the years 1994 to 2007, there were eight instances were observed where the degree had been passed after a period exceeding 05 years and 14 instances of failure to pass the degree.
- (b) The charges levied for the Masters and Doctorate of Philosophy had not been registered and as such the accuracy of the charges recovered and the charges recoverable could not be ascertained.
- (c) Even though library fees are charged for reading for the Doctorate degrees, satisfactory arrangements had not been set in place for the use of the library.

4.3 Cost of Students

The total recurrent expenditure incurred during the year under review for the academic activities of 519 students amounted to Rs.174,779,892 and the total recurrent expenditure incurred in the preceding year for 544 students amounted to Rs.142,049,552. The cost per student in the year under review amounted to Rs.336,763 and as compared with the cost per student in the preceding year amounting to Rs.261,120 indicated an increase of 28.9 per cent. The comparative cost per student in the year under review in the Universities of Kelaniya and Moratuwa amounting to Rs.184,226 and Rs.218,123 respectively.

4.4 Management Inefficiencies

The following observations are made.

- (a) In terms of provisions in the Inland Revenue Act, No. 10 of 2006 and the proposed amendments thereto made in the Budget for the year 2011, the employees of Government institutions whose monthly regular

employment benefits exceeding Rs.50,000 per month or Rs.600,000 per year should with effect from 01 April 2011, be registered under the Pay As Earn Tax system, recover the tax and remitted to the Department of Inland Revenue. Nevertheless, the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka had not taken action accordingly up to date.

- (b) A sum of Rs.2,986,806 had been paid in the year 2011 as research allowance to 25 lecturers of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka contrary to the provisions in the Management Services Circular No. 45 of 07 April 2011.
- (c) According to paragraph 12(ii) of the Circular No. 723 dated 12 December 1997 of the University Grants Commission, in appointing the members of the Evaluation Committees for promotion as Assistant Professors/Professors, persons of expert out side the institution and those who are not the teachers of the officer concerned should be appointed. Nevertheless, the 05 appointments of Assistant Professors/Professors made in the year 2009 though Evaluation Committees consisting of the members such as the External Lecturers, Temporary Lecturers and members representing the Board of Governors of the University are observed as made contrary to the provisions of the circulars and without transparency.

4.5 Under utilization of Funds

Balances ranging from Rs. 18 million to Rs. 40 million had been retained throughout the year in the Bank Current Account maintained for capital expenditure. Attention had not been paid to earn an income by investing such surplus cash in short term deposits.

4.6 Idle and Under utilized Assets

The following matters were observed.

- (a) The number of students registered in the library with a floor area of 3,881 square metres constructed at a cost of Rs.97 million had been 519 and the total number of library books had been 39,040. Nevertheless, the number of students who had used the library daily ranged in the very low level of 14 to 99.

- (b) Even though a fully equipped auditorium had been constructed at a cost of Rs. 28 million, the plans for its utilization had not been furnished to audit. It was observed that it had not been utilized for any useful purpose even during the year under review.
- (c) Even though the infrastructure facilities such as modernized and fully equipped buildings costing Rs.512 million had been improved since the year 2004, attention had not been paid to admit a larger number of students commensurate with the facilities.

4.7 Improvement of Knowledge through Research

Even though a major mission of the University is to release the student community to the society after the improvement of their knowledge through research, the Jiun Buddhist Research Publication Fund had not been utilized for any research or publication during the year under review and its balance as at the end of the year under review amounted to Rs.1,732,347.

4.8 Delayed Projects

Even though a mobilization advance of Rs.241,810 had been paid on 08 July 2010 to a Government institution without entering into a written agreement for the construction of a volleyball court, the work had not been commenced. The period of delay is 17 months.

4.9 Staff Administration

The number of vacant posts of the University as at the end of the year under review had been 32 and comprised 25 non academic posts and 07 academic posts.

5. Accountability and Good Governance

The Corporate Plan of the University had not been updated and an Action Plan according to such plan had not been prepared for the year under review. The annual budget had not been prepared in a manner to enable the achievement of objectives and targets of the Corporate Plan.

6. Systems and Controls

Deficiencies in systems and controls observed during the course of audit were brought to the notice of the Venerable Mahopadyaya of the University from time to time. Special attention is needed in respect of the following areas of control.

- (a) Fixed Assets
- (b) Library Management
- (c) Constructions
- (d) Internal Control on Documents of Financial Value
- (e) Human Resources Management
- (f) Accounting relating to External Projects
- (g) Settlement of Advances

The Auditor General's Report on the financial documents in accordance with the 14 (2) (c) of the Financial Act. No. 38 of 1971 of Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka for the year ending on the 31st of December 2011.

The above Audit report was presented to the 330th council of this University which was held on the 14th of November 2012. According to the recommendations of the Audit and Management Committee, these replies are presented herewith after the due consideration of the 334th council which was held on the 25th of March 2013.

2.2.1 Accounting principles.

- (a)** While a review of assets is being conducted by the survey committees at the moment, it is expected to appoint a committee after identifying the goals, to be calculated once those reports are received to the administrative authority. It is informed that arrangement will be made to reevaluate those assets through the committee.
- (b)** While a recommendation has been obtained after forwarding a criterion as to how the money received from the external projects should be spent, it is informed that it has been noted to get the approval of the treasury once the criteria are received to the council and gets its approval.

2.2.2 Lapses in Accounting

- (a) It is informed that it has been noted to present the value of the closing stock correctly, and the goods in transit to be transferred to goods in transit account.
- (b) Steps have been taken to account the recurrent expenditure account under the account of recurrent expenditure, the non-capital assets and the expenditure incurred on maintenance and repairs from the year 2012.

2.2.3 Accounts to be Received and Paid.

By August 2012, A sum of Rs. 238,782.00 has been released from the retention on contract basis in 2010 and 2011, while retentions amounting to 10.4 million is to be paid to CECB in a sum of Rs. 11,501,967.00 which is more than two years old, Action will be taken to pay the said amount to the institution in the future, once the short comings of the buildings are completed action will be taken to settle the other retentions in the future.

2.2.4 Incompatibility of laws, Rules and Regulations and Management Decisions.

- a) The Monetary Regulations of the Democratic, Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka.

- (i) 371(2) statement .

It is informed that all the advances that have not been settled during that time, have been settled.

- (ii) Statement 756

Reports have been submitted after finalizing the survey of goods and office equipment in 2011. On the revealed excesses and deficiency according to the reports, the misuse of goods and re-examination of goods are being done.

- b) **Article 19 for the procurement booklet dated 6th September 2010.**

To get the approval for the repairing of vehicles exceeding the limit had been submitted to the secretary of the Ministry of High Education.

- c) **The circular No. 25 dated 14th June 1994 on state Business Department.**

While action has been taken to stop the cutting of allowances, after the application of the University grants commission circular No.955 to our University, It is furthermore informed that action will be taken to get these funds paid with regard to the EPF contributions from the respective officials, after informing the council and its decision based on this.

2.2.5 Translations that have not been established by an adequate authoritative power .

The relevant investment incomes have been credited to the university's account by the bill No.128948.

2.2.6 Informal Transactions.

All the duties pertaining to the external degrees and the Post – Graduate Institute are done by the External Examinations Branch. The number of courses conducted by the External Examinations Branch is 14. The entire number of students registered was 7432. Accordingly, entire process of calling applications and registrations of students, conducting courses, conducting seminars, conducting exams and issuing of results, is done by one section. Arrangement will be taken in the future, to review the payments paid to the officials of the External Examinations Branch, and to pay them according to standard criteria.

4.1 Task completion

Since all the students, those who apply are not qualified, recruitments are done by giving the priority to the Z score of the students those who are qualified. There, the Ministry of Higher Education has given its approval to recruit only 110 students.

Thus, the permission is given only to recruit 110 students because , all the students those who are recruited should be provided boarding facilities throughout their study period according to the Buddhist and Pali University's amended act number 37 of 1997.

4.2 Academic Task Completion.

- a) It is expected to take necessary measures, as has been shown , to complete the degree during the due time duration , qualitatively and productively under quality control measures.
- b) At the moment action had been taken to do these tasks with a degree of formality.
- c) Steps had been taken to increase the number of students those who use the library of External Examinations Branch.

4.3 Cost to the students:-

Due to the increased expenditure on maintenance expenses in order to develop the infrastructure facilities the student per cost has increased at recent times.

4.4 Management Inefficiencies

- a) Arrangements will be made to send the shortages of tax money after the calculation in future.
- b) Attention has been directed to the matters shown. While the lecturers have been informed to submit the final research reports of the research proposals that had been submitted, it is expected to take necessary steps after forwarding them to the research committees to get relevant observations.
- c) Steps have been taken so as not to happen this situation in the near future.

4.5 Inactive underutilized assets.

It is noted to do away with the weaknesses shown .

4.6

- a) At certain occasions, the number of users of the library has been minimal according to the following reasons.
 - According the letter dated 18th of November 2011, the number of students whose studentship has been temporarily suspended is 29 due to the breach of disciplinary codes.
 - The Non availability of students in certain months due to these months being periods of vacation. eg –
 - The vacations received after the end of semester exams – from the 9th of July 2011 to 24th July 2011.

The following actions have been taken to minimize these situations by now.

- All the Heads of departments have been informed of the lack of the use of the library during the library Committee.
 - In order to supply a user friendly service to the readers, the library staff has been informed during the internal library staff meetings.
- b) This building has been utilized (used) for the activities of academic staffs and also for functions organized by the students (Literary festival) of this university. Arrangements have been made to conduct convocations external and internal future according to the

number of students. In addition to that, the convocations of Buddhist and Pali Diplomas have been held.

- c) While the basic Infrastructure facilities needed to continue the education process of the university have not been twne. It is an imperative condition theat the facilities that are relevant it should be developed. As an example, it can be cited that the lecturers did not have basis necessary facilities. Accordingly, the buildings and the other infrastructure facilities have been developed in keeping a balanced in all the facilities. The plans are being prepared to recruit more students in the future.

4.7 Developing knowledge thorough Research.

The university has planned to give a wide publicity regarding this scholarship scheme compelling the students to research process making the contribute the new knowledge to the society by as has been shown.

4.8 Late projects.

According to the decision 2010/03 of the Minor Tender Board Committee the establishment of a volleyball coat has been vested to the CECB under the basis of which takes the other projects of the university. Accordingly, a sum of Rs. 241,810.24 has been paid CECB as an advancement to start the work on 28.07.2010. The establishment of the volleyball coat has been stopped by now, even though it was started by that (institution) since a decision, had been taken to build up a housing scheme on the land adjacent to the volleyball coat.

4.9 Administration of staffs.

A) Non – Academic Staff

By now 17 posts have been recruited from the 25 non-academic posts that were vacant. Action is being taken to recruit for three vacated posts. It has been temporarily stopped recruiting for the rest of the 5 posts.

Academic Staff

Due to the lack of Lecturers, arrangements had been made to conduct an excessive number of lectures, to cover the existing syllabi, by appointing temporary lecturers, from the grant available for two posts of professorship. The other lecturer vacancies have been filled in for a post of computer instructor a written test was held after calling applications and an interview was held on the 18th November 2012 and have been recruited.

05. Accountability and Good Governance.

- a.** Action had been taken to offer the land where ' Mumtaz Mahal' building is situated in kollupitiya to this university by this parliament. Accordingly, steps had been taken to build the buildings with facilities to conduct the external courses. All those plans had to be changed since a decision had been taken to offer it to another party.

While certain projects that are included here have been cancelled at the moment, some other projects have been included in the composite plan and in the action plan in order to put them into action in the future.

Some of the projects could not be made practical since Lands had not been received by the university. But according to the action plan of the composite plan action will be taken to get the necessary activities./action

Report of the Auditor General on the Financial Statements of the Provident Fund of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka for the year ended 31 December 2011 in terms of Section 38 of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka Act, No 74 of 1981.

The audit of Financial Statements of the Provident Fund of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka for the year ended 31 December 2011 comprising the balance sheet as at 31 December and the Income Statement, for the year then ended, was carried out under my direction in pursuance of provisions in Article 154(3) of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka read in conjunction with Section 38 of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka Act, No.74 of 1981. My comments and observations which I consider should be published with the annual report regarding the above Financial Statements appear in this report.

1.2 Responsibility of the Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles and for such internal control as the management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatements, whether due to fraud or error.

1.3 Responsibility of the Auditor

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards. Those standards require that I comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risk of material misstatements of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risks assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Institution's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Institution's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my audit opinion.

2. Financial Statements

2.1 Opinion

In my opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Provident Fund of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka as at 31 December 2011 and its financial performance for the year then ended in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles.

2.2 Comments on Financial Statements

2.2.1 Accounts Receivable

Out of the amount of Rs.191,095 over remitted by a financial institution several years ago to the Department of Inland Revenue as Withholding Tax deducted from relevant interest income by investment of the Provident Fund of the Buddhist and Pali University a sum of Rs. 61,789 had remained unsettled as at the end of year under review.

3. Financial and Operating Review

3.1 Financial Review

According to the financial statements presented as at 31 December 2011, the working of the Provident Fund of the University had resulted in a pre-tax surplus of Rs.5,038,341 as compared with the corresponding surplus of Rs 5,489,591 for the preceding year thus indicating an decrease of Rs.451,250 in the surplus. Decreasing in interest rate the percentage on Treasury bills had been the main reason for the deterioration of the financial results.

3.2 Performance

Provident Fund of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka comprise 10 per cent contribution recovered from the monthly salaries of the permanent employees of the University and 15 per cent contribution paid by the University thereon. Investing the money in Treasury Bills and granting of staff loans is being done.

The following observations are made.

- (a) The fund had lost a sum of Rs.260,108 as interest due to delay on reinvestment of investments totalling Rs.52,200,000 which was matured at the end of the year under review.

- (b) A sum Rs.4,526,821 had been credited to the contribution Accounts during the year under review as Interest as compared with Rs.4,932,227 in the preceding year thus indicating a decrease of 8.21 per cent.
- (c) Provident fund amounted to Rs.1,711,522 could not be released to the 08 beneficiaries due to various reasons as at the end of the year under review.

While a sum of Rs.129, 306.00 had been re-paid by the Inland Revenue Department from the exceeded amount of retention tax money paid amounting to 191, 095.09 to get the rest amounting to Rs. 61,789.09, a discussion had been held with the bank of Ceylon Branch Manager at Torrington Branch, by the Bursar, and on his agreement, a letter informing the details about it has been sent. Accordingly, action will be taken to get the due amount of money according to the reaction.

Since a reply to it has not been received up to now, a reminder has been sent on 20.09.2012 reminding the above matter.

(a) After giving the loans for those have forwarded loan applications, arrangements have been made to re-invest the rest of the money, without any delay, after releasing the bonuses of the officials who resigned, retired, and vacated their posts.

(b) Since the interest rates of the treasury Bills went down during the current reviewing year as a whole, due to the excessive release of loans because of the excessive number of staff loan applications, and due to the excessive release of provident fund and due to the decrease of

the amount of money to be invested, a slight drop can be seen in the amount of interest during the previous year.

(c)

- * A sum of Rs.40, 554.00, 25 % of the provident fund money of Mrs. D.N.Nanayakkara, had been withheld since she has not submitted the documents and other goods and equipment. Furthermore, there is a case in the High Court on her behalf.
- * A sum of Rs.622, 779.00 of Mr.R.M.Chandrasiri and a sum of Rs, 396,155.00 of Mr.U.S.Prabath, have not been accepted by them since the cases that have been filed against them are being heard.
- * Steps had been taken to add to the income a sum of Rs 84,175.00 of Mr. U.A. Jayasiri the interest that had been earned after 01st of 03.2008, under the Journal Note 09 of 2012. In addition to that a sum of Rs. 365,286.16 had been paid Mr. U.A. Jayasiri, that had been debited to the provident fund.
- * Steps had been taken to get a sum of Rs.21, 399.00 to the income of the university that had been debited to Mr. Chaaminda Upul as exceeded interest under Journal notes No. 10 of 2012.
- * The Balance money of the provident fund of Mr.U.Susantha Jayarathna who resigned from the service on 30.11.2011 a sum of Rs.328,490.00 had been released on 24.01.2012
- * A finance committee paper is to be presented to get a sum of Rs. 7,706.00 of Ven. Nanda Thero to the income of the provident fund.
- * While it was referred to get the Attorney General's advice to release a sum of Rs 210,265.00 of Mr.N.A.K.K.Premennandra, since the instructions have been received regarding the payments, payments can be made in the near future.
