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THE EMBLEM OF THE UNIVERSITY



The emblem of the University takes the form of a circle with three concentric circles placed close together on the periphery, all on a background of yellow. In the center of this circle is a smaller concentric circle enclosing a full bloom lotus, *Nelumbo nucifera*, in abstract form, and consisting of two tiers of petals one underneath the other. In the center of the circle, stylized stamens enclosed in two concentric circles surround the receptacle. Between the outer set of concentric circles and the central lotus is a wide circular band carrying the motto of the University on the upper half of the band, while the name of the University appears in the lower half, both written in Sinhala characters. The motto, taken from an ancient Buddhist text, reads;

(‘among all that rise knowledge is greatest’)

VICE CHANCELLOR'S REVIEW

BRIEF INTRODUCTION

The University of Sri Jayewardenepura commenced on 16th February 1959 as the Vidyodaya University with the enactment of the Vidyodaya University and Vidyalandara University Act No. 45 of 1958. At the inception the University was located in Maligakanda and was shifted in 1961 to the present location.

With the enactment of the University of Ceylon Act No. 1 of 1972 all Universities were named as Campuses and the Vidyodaya University became Vidyodaya Campus headed by the Campus President appointed by the Minister of Education. In 1978 with the enactment of the Universities Act No. 16 of 1978 the Campuses were again named as Universities and the Vidyodaya University was named as the University of Sri Jayewardenepura.

At present there are five Faculties, namely, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Faculty of Applied Sciences, Faculty of Management Studies and Commerce, Faculty of Medical Sciences and the Faculty of Graduate Studies. In addition, the Postgraduate Institute of Management (PIM) located in Colombo 8, is also affiliated to the University of Sri Jayewardenepura.

Yagirala Forest Reserve which is managed by the Sri Lanka Forest Department a block of 100 ha has been given to the Department of Forestry and Environmental Studies of the Faculty of Applied Sciences of this University for promoting education and research. A Research Centre has been built by the University to facilitate the personnel with research and education interests about this forest. This bungalow type venue is also used as the Visitor Centre for the people who prefer experience of the life in the rainforest with the hospitality of the villagers in the area.

The Faculty of Medical Sciences offers Medical and Para-Medical Degrees and two State Hospitals, namely, Colombo South Teaching Hospital, Kalubowila

and Sri Jayewardenepura General Hospital, Sri Jayewardenepura are functioning as Teaching Hospitals of the Faculty.

In addition, during the year under review the Department of History and Archaeology of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences commenced a Literature Survey of the Comprehensive Documentation of the Historic Buildings within the World Heritage site of Galle Dutch Fort funded by the 2011- Ambassador's Fund for Cultural Preservation (AFCP) Programme of the Embassy of the United States of America.

Being one of the six Universities selected for a project titled "Transformation of Six Universities to International Level" initiated and funded by the Ministry of Higher Education, the University submitted a proposal and the proposal was granted approval by the authorities. Accordingly, "World Class University" Project was started by calling for applications for PhD research studies especially on multidisciplinary research. The project is in progress. Eighteen (18) PhD Projects were selected for funding. In order to carry out highly scientific research laboratory equipment were purchased for this purpose.

Since the establishment of the University (07) Chancellors and fourteen (28) Vice-Chancellors have been appointed by the President of the Democratic Republic of Sri Lanka to the University of Sri Jayewardenepura as given in Table 1.

In terms of University Act No 1 of 1972 it was named Vidyodaya Campus of University of Sri Lanka. Under the provisions of Universities Act No.16 of 1978 it was renamed as the University of Sri Jayewardenepura.

Academic and administrative functions of the University as well as policy planning are taken by the Official Boards empowered under the University Act. The Administrative Council, Senate, Faculty Boards, and Post-graduate Academic Boards are the Official Boards of the University.

Decisions of these Boards are put into effect by the various officers of the University.

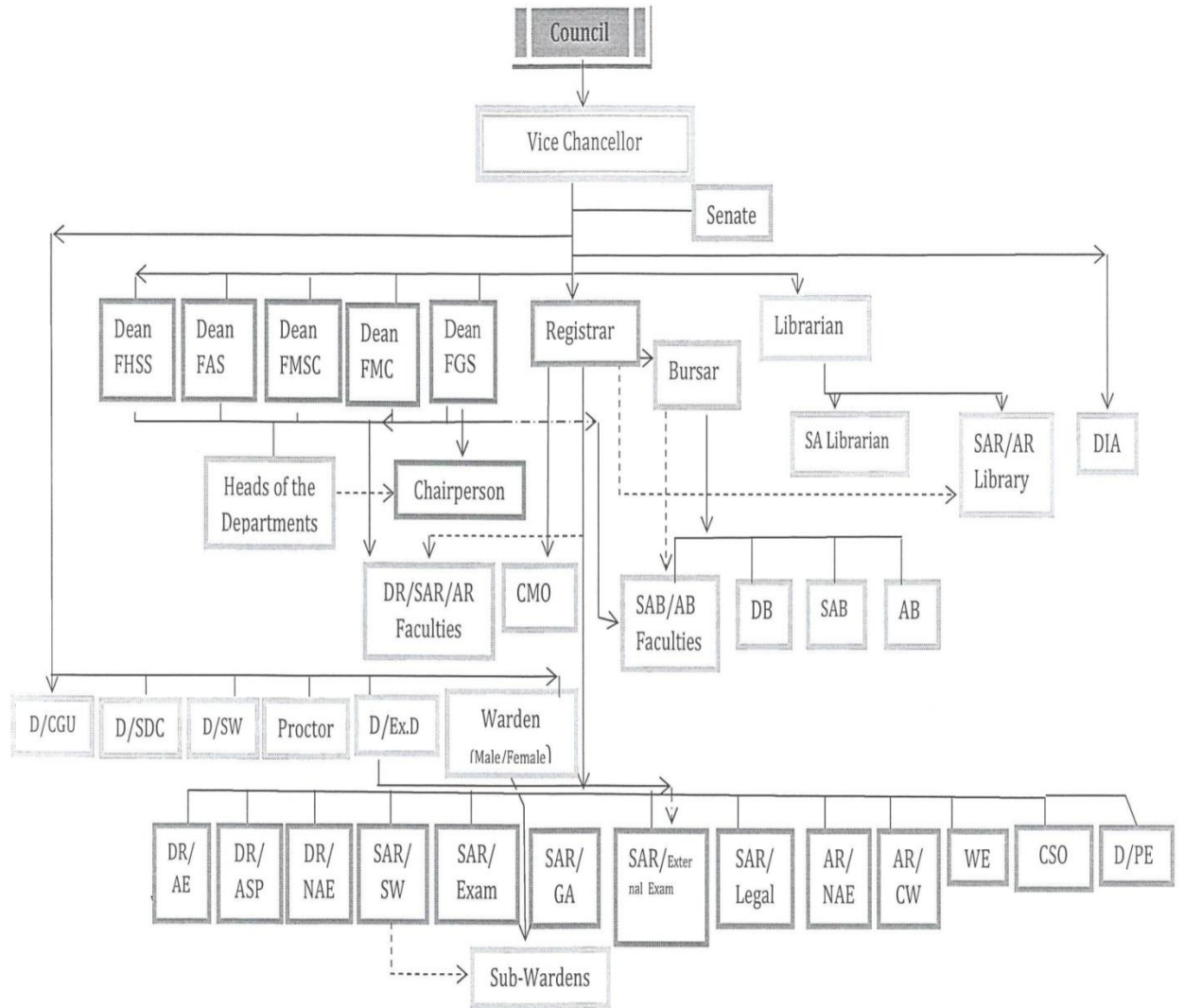

FACULTY OF GRADUATE STUDIES

Faculty of Graduate Studies (FGS) was established in 1996 under the provisions of the Faculty of Graduate Studies Ordinance No.3 of 1987. The postgraduate research activities of the university were earlier conducted through individual faculties and it was realized that the need of a separate unit to coordinate the postgraduate activities of all the faculties in order to maintain the standards and to achieve consistency in degree awarding regulations. As a result, now the University of Sri Jayewardenepura has an approved research strategy operated through the Faculty of Graduate studies which act as an umbrella for research activities conducted by all the faculties of the university.

FGS was established with the idea of promoting multidisciplinary research concept by formulating six study boards initially instead of existing isolated “faculty model” for subject based research. This model is focused to initiate multidisciplinary research activities among the members of the study boards interactively as the study boards consist of mixture of academics from various disciplines from the four different faculties.

The six boards of studies of the faculty are:

1. Humanities
2. Life Sciences,
3. Management and Commerce,
4. Medical Sciences,
5. Physical Sciences and
6. Social Sciences

Recently a new study Board was introduced which is named as “Multidisciplinary study Board to initiate multidisciplinary research activities.

Each study board is chaired by a senior academic ¹with a high level of professional calibre. The members of the study boards are the academic members of the university who actively involved in research work, postgraduate supervision and those who serve as the coordinators for postgraduate programs.

The decisions taken in the above six board of studies will be taken up for discussion and for further considerations and for recommendation to the approval of the senate by the Faculty Board meeting chaired by the Dean of the faculty.

Faculty board of the Graduate Studies consist of the Deans of the four faculties, Chairman of the study boards as invited members, two senate nominees and three council nominees.

THE DEGREE PROGRAMS

There are two major types of degree programs offered by the faculty namely;

1. The Research degrees (Ph D, M Phil, MA & M Sc) and
2. Degrees offered by course work where a research component also is involved

Research degrees consist of Ph.D., M.Phil and MA or M Sc. *Table 1* illustrates the degrees offered by course work through the FGS of the University of Sri Jayewardenepura.

LIBRARY

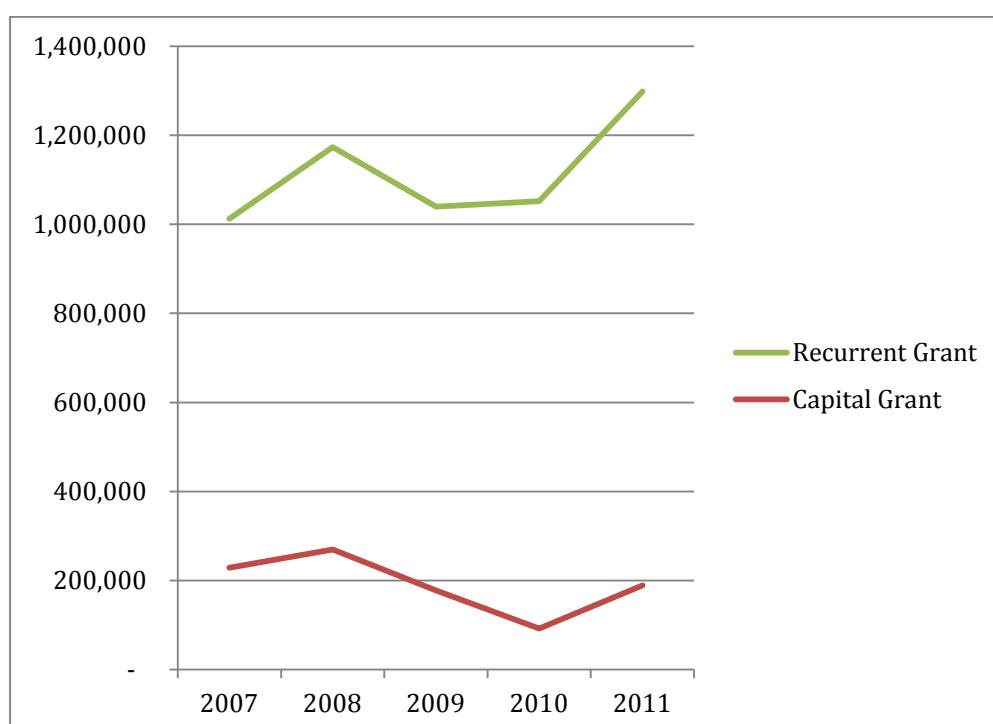

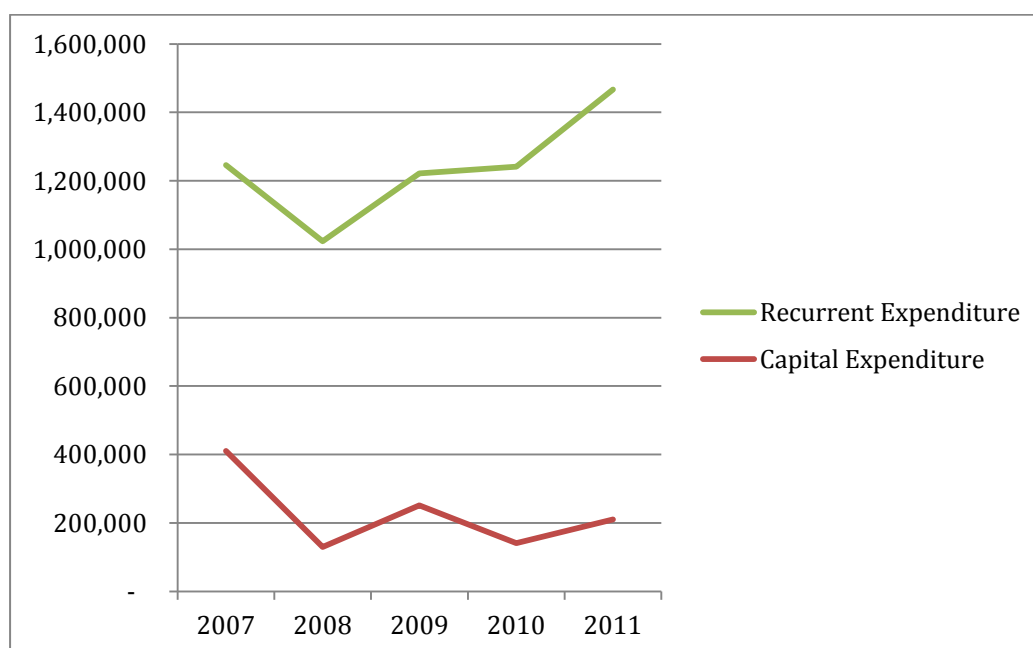

Report of the Auditor General on the Financial Statements of the University of Sri Jayewardenepura for the year ended 31 December 2011 in terms of Section 108 of the University Act No. 16 of 1978

The audit of financial statements of the University of Sri Jayewardenepura comprising the balance sheet as at 31 December 2011 and the income statement, statement of changes in equity and cash flow statement for the year then ended and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, was carried out under my direction in pursuance of provisions in Article 154(1) of the constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka read in conjunction with Sub-section 107(5) of the Universities Act No. 16 of 1978. My comments and observations which I consider should be published with the Annual Report of the university in terms of Sub-section 108(1) of the Universities Act appear in this report. A detailed report in terms of sub-section 108(2) and Section III of the Universities Act was issued to the Vice - Chancellor of the University on 14 June 2012.

1.2 Management responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standards and for such internal control as the management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatements, whether due to fraud or error.

1.3 **Auditor's Responsibility**

My responsibility is to express an opinion based on my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards. Those Standards require that I comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditors judgment , including the assessments of the risks of material misstatements of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the university's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the university's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements. Sub – section(3) and (4) of Section 13 of the Finance Act No. 38 of 1971 give discretionary powers to the Auditor General to determine the scope and extent of the Audit.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my qualified audit opinion.

1.4 **Basis for Qualified Opinion**

My opinion is qualified based on the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of this report.

2. Financial Statements

2.1 Qualified Opinion

In my opinion except for the effects of the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of this report the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the University of Sri Jayewardenepura as at 31 December 2011 and its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standards.

2.2 Comments on Financial Statements

2.2.1 Sri Lanka Accounting Standards

Assets costing 1,109,795,572 fully depreciated but still being utilized had not been revalued and brought to accounts in terms of Sri Lanka Accounting Standard No. 18.

2.2.2 Accounting Deficiencies

Accounting deficiencies totalling , Rs. 8,355,725 revealed at the test examination of Financial Statements had been referred to the Vice – Chancellor of the Sri Jayewardenepura University by the detailed report on 14 June 2012. Those deficiencies had been rectified and the revised financial statements were presented to audit on 03 August 2012.

2.2.3 Unexplained Differences

Balances of 14 accounts totalling Rs.110,429,899 on the financial statements presented had not been tallied with relevant schedule balances. The difference was Rs. 8,254,931.

2.2.4 Accounts Receivable and Payable

The following observations are made.

- (a) Action had not been taken to recover 12 advance account balances totalling Rs. 10,690,115. This balance had included a balance of Rs. 6,124,387 remained for 5 to 20 years old.

- (b) Loan balances of employees as at the end of the year under review remained unrecovered since number of years amounted to Rs. 2,535,988.
- (c) At a test examination revealed that salaries of Rs. 2,967,792 should have been reimbursed from the relevant institutions to which 2 lecturers had been released to the government or government affiliated institutions on reimbursement of salaries basis as at 30 April 2012.
- (d) The following observations are made in respect of lecturers who had breached the agreements or bonds.
 - (i) The amount receivable from 63 Lecturers who had breached agreements and bonds was Rs. 78,595,639 as at the end of the year under review.
 - (ii) The value of bonds amounting to Rs. 20,125,352 relating to 32 lecturers had been older than 10 years and proper attention had not been paid to recover such money.
 - (iii) In handing over the files to the Attorney General in order to take legal action to recover the bond value of Rs. 35,961,284 from 17 lecturers a long delays of 1 to 14 years were observed.

2.2.5 **Lack of Evidence for Audit**

The following observations are made.

- (a) Confirmations from receivable balance of Rs. 47,065,267 and payable balances of Rs. 29,319,794 had not been obtained and age analysis and detailed schedule for receivable and payable balances of Rs. 2,666,183 and Rs. 17,721,338 were not made available for audits.
- (b) In terms of Chapter 26 Section 2.1 of the Establishments Code of the University Grants Commission all the assets and goods of higher educational institutions should be verified annually by a Board of Survey. Nevertheless , Board of Survey reports in respect of fixed assets valued at Rs. 2,816,690,383 were not made available for audit.

- (c) Confirmation of balances for the balance of Rs. 2,666,183 receivable from projects, which had included in the balance of Rs. 3,504,244 receivable from self financial courses and 22 projects stated in the financial statements, had not been obtained.

2.2.6 **Non – compliance with Laws , Rules , Regulations and Management Decisions.**

The following instances of non – compliance with laws , rules , regulations and management decisions were observed.

(a)	Sub - section 99 (1) of the Universities Act No. 16 of 1978	Money received by Higher Educational Institutions from any source should be credited to the University Fund and should be utilized for financial requirements of the University. Nevertheless , the balances in current accounts relating to the self financial courses conducted by various faculties had not been utilized for such purpose and the balances of such 9 accounts as at 31 December 2011 amounted to Rs. 44 million.
(b)	Treasury Circular No. 810 of 26 July 1971	Recoveries of half pay or no pay leave should be recovered in full from the salaries of the month in which leave is obtained or the following month, However , there were long delays in the recovery of no pay leave.
(c)	Treasury Circular No. 842 of 19 December 1978	A register of fixed assets had not been maintained.
(d)	Public Finance Circular No. 380 of 19 January 2000	Out of the money collected from consultancy services provided to external parties, a percentage of 10% to 25% which is determined by the university should be credited to the University Fund. Nevertheless, a sum of Rs. 3,936,911 had been received for providing consultancy services but that money had been spent in contrary to that Circular.

2.2.7 Transactions of Contentious nature

In terms of the decision of the Cabinet of Ministers No. 400/04/1798/035/064 dated 13 January 2005, rent for the rented out Private Hostel since 2007 should be at Rs. 1,000 per student in the first year and an annual increment of 5% from the next year should be paid. Due to computation of rent in contrary to that, an over payment of Rs. 8,416,469 had been made to the tenant for the period from 2008 to August 2012.

3. Financial Review

3.1 Financial Results

According to the financial statements presented the operation of the University for the year ended 31 December 2011 had resulted a deficit of Rs. 1,346,893,157 before taking into accounts the government grants received for recurrent expenditure as compared with the deficit of Rs.1,203,175,403 for the preceding year. The deficit for the year under review had reduced to Rs. 109,828,507 after receipt of government grants for recurrent expenditure amounting to Rs. 1,237,064,650 as compared with the deficit of Rs. 37,461,694 after receipt of government grants for recurrent expenditure amounting to Rs. 1,165,713,709 for the preceding year.

The deficit for the year under review had increased by Rs.72,366,813 as compared with the preceding year and increase in personal emoluments and travelling expenses by Rs. 164 million had been the main reason for it .

4. Operating Review

4.1 Performance

The following matters were observed.

- (a) The recurrent expenditure incurred on 9,707 students during the year under review in 4 faculties amounted to Rs. 1,493,682,822 and as such the cost per student was Rs. 153,877 as compared with the recurrent expenditure incurred on 10,465 students in the preceding year amounted to Rs. 1,429,973,872 by incurring cost per student amounting to Rs. 136,643.

- (b) Even though the academic staff of the University Consists of 491 Lecturers, 128 Lecturers or 26% of them had gone on Sabatical Leave or other leave.

4.2 **Management Inefficiencies**

The following observations are made.

- (a) Although a sum of Rs. 3 million had been given by the University Grants Commission on 30 December 2010 to set up a security fence round the swimming pool of the university, the works of it had not been commenced even by 20 February 2012, the date of audit examination.
- (b) Twelve lecturers had borrowed library books ranging from 2 to 25 books in excess of number of books borrowed by a Lecturer. The academic and non – academic staff had kept 397 library books in their custody in excess of the period of keeping books ranging from 01 month to 24 years.
- (c) A land, 100 acres in extent in Yagirala Reservation belonging to the Department of Forest had been annually leased out by license No. H/7/48/96 but it had not been revalidated after paying the annual rental of Rs. 4,000 and other related taxes since the year 2000. It was revealed at a physical examination carried out in the year 2011 that there were illegal tea plantations in the reservation but it had nither been informed to the Forest Department nor any legal action taken.

4.3 **Operating Inefficiencies**

According to the letter No. බොකො/විනාදේ/01/36/01 dated 10 February 2010 of the Commissioner of Buddhist, it was approved to exchange 40 perches of land located near the university belonging to a pirivena with the land to the extent of 41.63 perches located at Abeyratna Mawatha, Boralsogamuwa belonging to the university to construct a building for external examination Department with facilities. Nevertheless, the senate had not taken any action thereon up to now.

4.4 Underutilization of Funds

The following observations are made.

- (a) The account balances of 42 scholarship funds amounted to Rs. 2,043,310 without investing the excess money after retaining the required money, the opportunity of earning money to strengthen the fund in long run had been deprived.
- (b) Even though a balance of more than Rs. 20 million had remained in the bank current account operated for the Management Faculty Development fund from February 2011 to the end of the year, action had not been taken to utilize this money in a fruitful investment.

4.5 Idle and Underutilized Assets

Although a computer information system installed under 8 modules by incurring a sum of Rs. 4,003,580 in the year 2010 and US \$ 28,101 had been installed under the university Higher Educational Management Information System (UHEMIS) of the Ministry of Higher Education the university had not made any attempt to utilize this system.

4.6 Delayed Projects

The approval of the Cabinet of Ministers had been given on 06 August 2003 for the disposal of Waste Water Project of the university at a cost of Rs. 70 million , the constructions works thereof had not been begun even by the end of the year under review.

5. Accountability and Good Governance

5.1 Corporate Plan

The following observations are made.

- (a) In terms of Section 5.1.3 of the Public Enterprises Circular No. PED/12 dated 02 June 2003 the approved and updated corporate plan and the annual budget by the Board of Management should be presented to the Department of Public Enterprises, the relevant Ministry and the Auditor General before 15 days before commencing the financial year. Nevertheless Corporate Plans for the years 2011 and 2012 had not been presented.

- (b) According to the decision of the Board of Control No. 370:06(12) dated 11 February 2010, a committee, consisting of 06 members had been appointed on 1 March 2010 for the preparation of a Corporate Plan for the years 2011-2015. However its functions could not be completed as performance indicators could not be included in the Corporate Plan as per Section 5.1.2 of the Public Enterprises Circular No. PED/12.

6. **System and Control**

Weaknesses in systems and control observed in audit were brought to the Vice - Chancellor from time to time. Special attention is needed in respect of the following areas of control.

- (a) Fixed assets
- (b) Control accounts
- (c) Vehicles control
- (d) Petty cash control
- (e) Income from self financial courses

Audit report of the University of Sri Jayewardenepura for the year ending 31st December 2011, under the provisions of section 108(2) of the Universities Act No 16 of 1978 and section 13(7) A of Finance Act No 38 of 1971.

Observations on the audit report No EC/E/USJ/FA/2011 dated 27th September 2011 on the above matter are as follows.

2.2 Observations on Financial Statements

2.2.1. Accounting Standards of Sri Lanka

- (a) In terms of Sri Lanka Accounting standards No 18, totally depreciated but the assets in use of Rs. 11,109,795,572 will be re-assessed, re-valuated and we have already made a request to the Department of Valuation. They have agreed to carry out this work beginning of 01.12.2011.

2.2.2 Deficiencies in Accounting

Necessary amendments have been effected in the statement submitted to Auditor General on 03.08.2012.

2.2.3 Differences not explained

- (1) Differences in Financial Statement and Schedules as shown by you are long standing and action has been taken to reconcile these differences.

2.2.4 Accounts Relating to payments

- (a) These receipts and payments are long standing and action has been taken to rectify these errors.
- (b) Recipients of these loans have been identified. Some of these employees have resigned or retired and action has been taken to recover this money from their Provident Fund. Those who have obtained transfers to other places, action has been taken to inform such places and recover the dues.

2.2.5 Lack of evidence for auditing

- (a) Action will be taken to produce age analysis of the schedules submitted for auditing.
- (b) Board of Survey report has been prepared on Fixed assets.
- (c) Letters have, been sent to get confirmation of the receivable of Rs. 2,666,183.00.

2.2.6 Not in Conformity of rules Regulations and Management Decisions.

- (a) Although your reports indicates that all moneys received from all sources should be credited to the University Account according to section 99 of the Universities Act No 16 of 1978 , Section 101 of the Act. Stipulates that moneys should be credited to separate accounts. Accordingly moneys received from different sources have been credited to University Account and for convenient financial control these monies have been credited to 9 different accounts according to the nature of receipts in favour of the University. For example two accounts for rehabilitation and capital expenditure. All these accounts are under direct supervision of the Bursar and payments are effected with relevant approval.
- (b) Action has been taken to recover the dues from employees who obtained no pay leave in 2010. In terms of Treasury circular No 810 of 26.07.1971 action has been taken to recover the dues from those who have obtained no pay leave.
- (c) Fixed asset register is under preparation.
- (d) In this report 14% of the University fund that is 1,102,500/- is set apart for consultation services in the estimates and this amount has not been released by the organization provident funds. This project has still not been completed and action will be taken to obtain the funds due to the University before the conclusion of the project.

2.2.7 Questionable Transactions

In terms of the cabinet decision dated 05.01.2005 Euro Lanka Residences agreed to construct a hostel to accommodate 2184 students and rent it out to the University. It was decided to provide hostel facility for 600 students and charge Rs.1,000/ per month from each student, However Euro Lanka failed to provide accommodation for 600 students and was able to construct the building to provide accommodation to only 312 students. Under these circumstances it was not possible to implement the decision of the cabinet and the University made arrangements to obtain advice from the Attorney General's Department.

The Attorney General's Department pointed out that since the work of the project has not been completed, it is not possible to amend the conditions of the memorandum of understanding and sign as agreement in terms of the Cabinet decision.

This position was discussed at the Council at its 355th meeting held on 16.09.2007 and considering the urgency in providing hostel facilities to students it was decided to provide accommodation to 312 students although the building was not complete, and rent out on the basis of an external hostel for one year and pay at the rate of Rs.1000/- per student per month. Action was taken to keep the Cabinet informed about the deviation from the Cabinet decision through the Ministry of Higher Education by way of a Cabinet paper. Accordingly, assistance of the Department of Valuation and the Department of Estate Management and Valuation of the University was sought in determining the rent of the Euro Lanka Hostel to hire it as an external hostel. Accordingly charges for the second year were determined systematically.

4.2 Management Deficiencies

- (a) Rs.1,879,703.03 has been recovered from Prof. S.D.Jayaratne who has been released to accept the post of Chairman of the State Pharmaceutical and State Pharmaceutical Production Corporation.

Director salaries of the Sri Lanka Army was requested to re-imbrues the salaries and allowances paid to Dr. Ms. P.T.R.Makuloluwa who was released as specialist in Anesthesia to the volunteer force of the Sri Lanka Army.

But it has been decided not to re-imbrues the academic allowance and the equalization allowance. Rs. 1,064,963/- paid as salaries have been re-imbursed

to the University and action has been initiated to recover the balance 2,463,259/-.

Dr.Ms. Maluloluwa should have reported to work on 01.11.2011 at the University but since she had not reported for duty it was reported to the Council and the Council decided to inform her to report for duty and that is she fails to do so she will be treated as having vacated the post she had not been paid her salary from 01.11.2011.

- (b) Material necessary to construct the safty fence around the swimming pool have been purchased and action has been taken to construct the fence.
- (c) For number of years academic and non academic staff members have not returned the book borrowed and after giving notice, 180 books have been returned. It has been decided not to issue books to the staff who have not returned the books. After giving sufficient notice is has been decided to recover the cost of such books.
- (d) Teachers who have violated bonds and agreement, action has been initiated to recover the value of bonds. Action also has been taken to institute Legal action through the Attorney General's Department. Some teachers who have violated bonds belong to the time barred category and referred such cases to Attorney General for Legal advice and a report will be submitted to the Council regarding the action to be taken.
- (e) Action has been taken to renew the license of 100 acres of "Yagirala " forest reserve belonging to Department of Conservation of Forest has been informed to check whether the neighbors along the border of the "Yagirala" field center and legal action will be taken after informing the Police.

4.3 Operational Deficiencies

It was planned to obtain a land in extent of 40 perches adjoin the University belonging to Sunethara Devi Maha Pirivena and give the land belonging to the University at Abeyratne Mawatha Boralesgamuwa. The Commissioner of Buddhist Affairs who considered this as an important matter decided to acquire this land to the government and transfer it to the University without payment of money and give the land belonging to the University by a gift deed. To effect this transaction several discussions were held with the Provincial Council of Maharagama and Kesbawa. The Provincial Commissioner of Lands (western Province) No1 and Provincial Commissioner 06/Col/534 by his letter have informed Provincial Council Secretaries of Maharagama and Kasbewa that it is necessary to effect this transfer of land and to submit necessary reports. Action will be taken to conclude this transfer of lands early.

4.4 Deficient Funds and Investment

Funds received for scholarships will be invested and the interest will be used for the award of scholarships. Excessive income will be reinvested.

4.5 Inactive and Deficient Assets

- (a) Monies received from the self supporting courses of the Management Faculty will be in excess temporarily and will be credited to the development fund of the Faculty. Action is being taken to invest these excessive funds.
- (b) Computer Information System established under HEMIS of the Higher Education Ministry to store all data and hand over to the University for the use of the University was not successful it was not possible to make use of it.

4.6 Delayed Projects

This project cleans all the waste water of the University and replace to the environment. Consultation of the project has been assigned to the National Water Supply and Drainage Board.

According to the original plans it was proposed to install a pipe system and to have a cleaning machine. All data relating to the proposed collecting of waste water with the minimum of expenditure, the most suitable location was identified as the Meth Sevana premises.

A geographical survey was done to find out the suitability of the location and it was revaluated that in order to construct waste water tank if was necessary to have pile foundations. All plans were finalized but the beginning of the project got delayed as acquisition of the Meth Sevana land to the University was not finalized. The acquisition of the land from the Western provincial Council was done in 2012.

In June 2012 there was a progress review meeting on this project. At this meeting it was related that a system to direct waste water of the Maharagama and Borelasgamuwa towns up to Soysa Pura Purification plant and purify the waste water had been started by the National Water Supply and Drainage Board and it is expected to complete the project by 2015. Accordingly the waste water of the University will be directed to this system. This will take about three years and it was decided to lay only the pipe lines to direct waste water. Accordingly National Water Supply and Drainage Board is in the progress of preparing the plans and the Board is preparing the tender document it is proposed to call for tenders during October this year.
