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THE EMBLEM OF THE UNIVERSITY



The emblem of the University takes the form of a circle with three concentric circles placed close together on the periphery, all on a background of yellow. In the center of this circle is a smaller concentric circle enclosing a full bloom lotus, *Nelumbo nucifera*, in abstract form, and consisting of two tiers of petals one underneath the other. In the center of the circle, stylized stamens enclosed in two concentric circles surround the receptacle. Between the outer set of concentric circles and the central lotus is a wide circular band carrying the motto of the University on the upper half of the band, while the name of the University appears in the lower half, both written in Sinhala characters. The motto, taken from an ancient Buddhist text, reads;

Vijja Uppatatam Settha

(‘among all that rise knowledge is greatest’)

VICE CHANCELLOR'S REVIEW

BRIEF INTRODUCTION

The University of Sri Jayewardenepura commenced on 16th February 1959 as the Vidyodaya University with the enactment of the Vidyodaya University and Vidyalandara University Act No. 45 of 1958. At the inception the University was located in Maligakanda and was shifted in 1961 to the present location.

With the enactment of the University of Ceylon Act No. 1 of 1972 all Universities were named as Campuses and the Vidyodaya University became Vidyodaya Campus headed by the Campus President appointed by the Minister of Education. In 1978 with the enactment of the Universities Act No. 16 of 1978 the Campuses were again named as Universities and the Vidyodaya University was named as the University of Sri Jayewardenepura.

At present there are five Faculties, namely, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Faculty of Applied Sciences, Faculty of Management Studies and Commerce, Faculty of Medical Sciences and the Faculty of Graduate Studies. In addition, the Postgraduate Institute of Management (PIM) located in Colombo 8, is also affiliated to the University of Sri Jayewardenepura.

Yagirala Forest Reserve which is managed by the Sri Lanka Forest Department a block of 40 ha has been given to the Department of Forestry and Environmental Studies of the Faculty of Applied Sciences of this University for promoting education and research. A Research Centre has been built by the University to facilitate the personnel with research and education interests about this forest. This bungalow type venue is also used as the Visitor Centre for the people who prefer experience of the life in the rainforest with the hospitality of the villagers in the area.

The Faculty of Medical Sciences offers Medical and Para-Medical Degrees and two State Hospitals, namely, Colombo South Teaching Hospital, Kalubowila and Sri Jayewardenepura General Hospital, Sri Jayewardenepura are functioning as Teaching Hospitals of the Faculty.

Being one of the six Universities selected for a project titled "Transformation of Six Universities to International Level" initiated and funded by the Ministry of Higher Education, the University submitted a proposal and the proposal was granted approval by the authorities. Accordingly, "World Class University" Project was started by calling for applications for PhD research studies especially on multidisciplinary research. The project started in 2011 and was in progress during the year review. Eighteen (18) PhD Projects were selected for funding in 2011. Out of these 18 projects, nine projects started during the year under review.

Since the establishment of the University Seven (07) Chancellors and Twenty Four (24) Vice-Chancellors have been appointed by the President of the Democratic Republic of Sri Lanka to the University of Sri Jayewardenepura as given in Table 1.

- Continued the cultivation project in the University premises. Vegetable harvest was sold among the employees at a slightly less price than the market price and the money received were credited to the University Account.
- Continued to help for developing the activities related to Corporate Social Responsibility by way of assisting students, academics and non-academics, enabling them to serve outside the University.
- Continued scholarship programmes for university students through various persons and organizations.
- A Centre for Dengue Research (CDR) established on a subject of national importance at the Department of Microbiology at a cost of Rs. 92,632,0401/- under the Cabinet approval.
- The Department of History and Archaeology of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences collaboration with the Department of Archaeology commenced to procuring or furnishing the archaeological investigations, Archaeological and Architectural conservation, infrastructure facilities, landscaping, layout, maintaince, construction and administration services at the Rajagala archeological reserve.



Vidyodaya University was established under the provisions of Vidyalandara and Vidyodaya Universities Act No 45 on 1st of January 1959. In terms of University Act No 1 of 1972 it was named Vidyodaya Campus of University of Sri Lanka. Under the provisions of Universities Act No.16 of 1978 it was renamed as the University of Sri Jayewardenepura.

Academic and administrative functions of the University as well as policy planning are taken by the Official Boards empowered under the University Act. The Administrative Council, Senate, Faculty Boards, and Post-graduate Academic Boards are the Official Boards of the University.

Decisions of these Boards are put into effect by the various officers of the University.



FACULTY OF GRADUATE STUDIES

Faculty of Graduate Studies (FGS) was established in 1996 under the provisions of the Faculty of Graduate Studies Ordinance No.3 of 1987. The postgraduate research activities of the university were earlier conducted through individual faculties and it was realized that the need of a separate unit to coordinate the postgraduate activities of all the faculties in order to maintain the standards and to achieve consistency in degree awarding regulations. As a result, now the University of Sri Jayewardenepura has an approved research strategy operated through the Faculty of Graduate studies which act as an umbrella for research activities conducted by all the faculties of the University.

FGS was established with the idea of promoting multidisciplinary research concept by formulating six study boards initially instead of existing isolated “faculty model” for subject based research. This model is focused to initiate multidisciplinary research activities among the members of the study boards interactively as the study boards consist of mixture of academics from various disciplines from the four different faculties. In addition to the six study boards a new study Board was introduced which is named as “Multidisciplinary study Board” to initiate multidisciplinary research activities.

The seven boards of studies of the faculty are:

1. Humanities
2. Life Sciences,
3. Management and Commerce,
4. Medical Sciences,
5. Physical Sciences and
6. Social Sciences
7. Multidisciplinary

Each study board is chaired by a senior academic ¹ with a high level of professional caliber. The members of the study boards are the academic members of the University who actively involved in research work, postgraduate supervision and those who serve as the coordinators for postgraduate programs.

The decisions taken in the above seven boards of studies will be taken up for discussion and for further considerations and for recommendation to the approval of the senate by the Faculty Board meeting chaired by the Dean of the faculty.

Faculty Board of the Graduate Studies consist of the Deans of the four faculties, Chairmen of the study boards as invited members, two senate nominees and three council nominees.



LIBRARY

Under the direction of the librarian Mrs. W.A.D.N.D. Wijayasundara, five Senior Assistant Librarians, two Assistant Librarian and 51 non-academic staff were carried out duties in the library.

During the year, 422 books were purchased at a cost of Rs.1,590,808.64 from the annual allocation and 1047 books were purchased at a cost of Rs. 6,631,049.08 from the HETC grant for libraries. In addition, 102 periodicals were purchased at a cost of Rs.10,629,023.78 and 02 electronic databases were purchased at a cost of Rs.2,689,870.33.

During the year 937 readers were registered including Academic staff (30), Non – academic staff (26), Undergraduate students (679) and Diploma and Postgraduate students (202). Total number of registered users was 13,951.

The rate of fulfillment of Inter-library loan requests was 53.2%.

Five workshops were conducted by the library for students in order to enhance the awareness of information resources and information literacy skills.

Four research projects were conducted by the library academic staff during the year and 02 conference papers were presented.





**Report of the Auditor General on the Financial Statements of the University of
Sri Jayewardenepura for the year ended 31 December 2012 in terms of Section 108(1) of the
University Act No. 16 of 1978**

The audit of financial statements of the University of Sri Jayewardenepura comprising the financial position as at 31 December 2012 and the comprehensive income statement , statement of changes in equity and cash flow statement for the year then ended and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, was carried out under my direction in pursuance of provisions in Article 154(1) of the constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka read in conjunction with Sub- section 107(5) Section 108 and 111 of the Universities Act No. 16 of 1978. My comments and observations which I consider should be published with the Annual Report of the university in terms of Sub – section 108(1) of the Universities Act appear in this report. A detailed report in terms of Sub – section 108(2) of the Universities Act was issued to the Vice - Chancellor of the University on 16 May 2013.

1.2 Management's responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards (SLPSAS) and for such internal control as the management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatements, whether due to fraud or error.

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1.3 **Auditor's Responsibility**

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards. Those Standards require that I comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditors judgment , including the assessments of the risks of material misstatements of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the University's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the University's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements. Sub – section(3) and (4) of Section 13 of the Finance Act No. 38 of 1971 give discretionary powers to the Auditor General to determine the scope and extent of the Audit.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my qualified audit opinion.

1.4 **Basis for Qualified Opinion**

My opinion is qualified based on the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of this report.

2. **Financial Statements**

2.1 **Qualified Opinion**

In my opinion, except for the effects of the matters described in paragraph 2.2 of this report, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the University of Sri Jaywardenepura as at 31 December 2012 and its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards.

2.2 **Comments on Financial Statements**

2.2.1 **Public Sector Accounting Standards of Sri Lanka**

Assets valued at Rs.695,548,229 which had been fully depreciated but being utilized at present had not been revalued and brought to accounts.

2.2.2 **Accounting Deficiencies**

Deficiencies totalling Rs. 2,577,984,409 revealed at test checks carried out in respect of financial statements had been referred to the Vice Chancellor of the University of Sri Jaywardenepura by my detailed report under Section 108(2) dated 16 May 2012 out of those deficiencies, deficiencies valued at Rs.1,859,622,498 relating to 25 paragraphs had been rectified and the revised financial statements had been submitted to audit on 10 June 2012.

2.2.3 **Unreconciled Control Accounts**

There were differences of Rs.1,278,216 between the financial statements and the three schedules and action had not been taken to find the reasons and to rectify it.

2.2.4 **Accounts Receivable**

The following matters were observed.

- (a) Sundry advances, retention on contracts, sundry deposits totalling Rs.6,041,318 had remained outstanding for a long period and action had not been taken to take them in to revenue or to settle those balances.

- (b) The amount recoverable from 60 Lecturers who had breached agreements and bonds as at the end of the year amounted to Rs.104,655,651. According to the personal files of those officers a sum of Rs.3,954,949 recoverable from 10 officers had been overstated in the financial statements whereas a sum of Rs.24,557,633 recoverable from 25 officers had been under stated in the financial statements. Accordingly a sum of Rs.20,602,684 had been under stated in the financial statements.
- (c) In terms of agreements entered into with the external parties who provide services to the University, Electricity Charges amounting to Rs.2,842,001 for the years 2009, 2010 and 2011 recoverable as per agreements had not been recovered up to now and a suitable course of action had also not been taken to recover same.
- (d) Loan balances of Computers, Vehicles, Distress and various staff loans totalling Rs.2,864,409 by the end of the year under review had remained unrecovered for number of years. Action had not been taken to recover the outstanding loan balances of Rs.1,077,466 from the resigned employees from their EPF and the loan balances of other employees from their sureties.

2.2.5 **Unidentified Income**

Receipts during the year under review in the "Miscellaneous Deposit Self Finance Operating Fund " account under external courses revenue collection account operated for all courses conducted under the Faculty of Management and Commerce amounted to Rs. 1,029,385. This Income had been credited to the Management Faculty Development Fund instead of being accounted by identifying the relevant revenue heads.

2.2.6 **Lack of Evidence for audit**

The following matters were observed.

- (a) Schedules, confirmation of balances or receipts in respect of balances of accounts receivable totalling Rs.14,011,642 were not made available for audit.

(b) Investment certificates or bank pass books in respect of two investment accounts totalling Rs.309,525 were not made available for audit and confirmation of balances from the bank had also not been obtained.

(c) Attendance records to ensure the salaries and allowances amounting to Rs.853,559,275 paid to the Academic Staff during the year under review were not made available for audit.

2.2.7 **Non – compliance with Laws , Rules , Regulations and Management Decisions.**

The following non - compliance were observed.

(a) Financial Regulations 396(c)	Action had not been taken in respect of 25 cheques valued at Rs.609,837 issued but not presented for payments as at 31 December 2012 and elapsed for more than 6 months relating to 5 current accounts in terms of Financial Regulations.
(b) Treasury Circular No. 810 dated of 26 July 1971	Although the recoveries in respect of half pay and no pay leave should be recovered in full from the month in which leave is obtained or from the next months' salary. Nevertheless, a sum of Rs.151,307 recoverable for no pay leave in the year 2012 had not been recovered even by 30 April 2013.

- (c) Public Finance Circular No. 380 of 19 January 2000
- Out of the money recovered on consultancy services provided by the Faculty of Post Graduate of the University to external institutions a percentage determined by the University ranging from 10 to 25 per cent should be retained. Nevertheless even the minimum retention of 10 per cent had not been recorded from the amount of Rs.14,113,103 received during the period from 2009 to 2012 for a consultancy services project provided to an external institution.

3. **Financial Review**

3.1 **Financial Results**

According to the financial statements presented the operation of the University as at 31 December 2012 had resulted in a deficit of Rs.1,568,557,463 before taking into accounts the government grants for recurrent expenditure as against the surplus of Rs.322,290,849 for the preceding year. After taking into account the government grant of Rs.1,463,551,750 for recurrent expenditure the deficit for the year had reduced to Rs.105,005,713 as against the surplus of Rs.1,559,361,508 after taking into account the government grant of Rs.1,237,070,659 received for recurrent expenditure for the preceding year. The deficit for the year under review had increased to Rs.1,664,367,221 as compared with the preceding year. Decrease in government provision and donations by Rs.1,505,000,000 had been the main reason for this decrease.

4. **Operating Review**

4.1 **Performance**

Recurrent expenditure of Rs.1,436,252,349 had been incurred for 9619 students in the year under review studied in 4 Faculties of the University as compared with the recurrent expenditure of Rs.1,196,537,673 incurred for 9776 students in the preceding year. Accordingly , the cost per student is as follows.

According the overall cost per student had increased by Rs.26,919 or 22 per cent as compared with that of the preceding year.

4.2 **Management Inefficiencies**

The following matters were observed.

- (a) In terms of Paragraph 3 of the Higher Education Circular No.1/2011 dated 20 April 2011, the payment of research allowance was based after 31 December 2011 only on the assurance of the Committee that the appearance of the final research report in a Scientific Publication accepted by the Committed at an International or National level and / or the presentation in the Philosophers satisfaction during that year. The final research reports in respect of research proposals submitted for the year 2011 by the Lecturers of the University had not been submitted. Similarly in making research allowance payments for the year 2012 the presentation of final research reports relating to the year 2011 had not been considered.

- (b) Of the salaries paid to the two Lecturers since several years who had been released to Government or Government Affiliated Institutions on reimbursement of salaries basis, salaries amounting to Rs.1,690,141 had to be further reimbursed. Of them, one specialist female Doctor should have been reported for duty on 01 November 2011 but she had not done so and as such the Board of Control had decided on 17 June 2013 to terminate her service from 01 September 2012.

4.3 **Operating Inefficiencies**

The following matters were observed.

- (a) Out of 108 Lecturers who had submitted proposals during the periods 2005 to 2011 to conduct researches under research grants, 41 lecturers who had obtained a sum of Rs.9,392,638 had delayed the submission of their research reports ranging from 3 to 52 months.
- (b) Irrespective of the competent photography Institution who had quoted the least prices for taking photographs and video filming at the 38th internal and 9th external convocations, it had been awarded to the Vidudaya Multi – Media Unit of the University. As a result Rs.300 had to be paid for the "obtaining the degree in the stage photograph" which should have been obtained at Rs.40 per photograph from one student. Accordingly the University had over recovered sum of Rs.1,509,300 from 5,805 students as photograph fees. Out of the collected amount a sum of Rs.762,600 for printing of photographs and a sum of Rs.90,000 as staff allowances of the Multi Media Unit, totalling Rs.852,600 had been spent.
- (c) A stock of paints of valued at Rs.1,760,137 in the main stores and other stocks valued at Rs.1,346,654 in the sub stores had been stored unnecessarily. As a result blocking the stores facilities increase in stock holding cost and tied up the working capital in stock were observed.

- (d) A stock of toner valued at Rs.1,640,386 and purchased during the period from 2003 to 2012 had become obsolete or slow moving due to such reasons as purchasing without calculating the requirement in each year, without considering the out dated period of goods, purchasing in excess of requirements etc.
- (e) As a recommendation had not been given by the verification team to dispose 58 types of goods out of 88 which had been identified as damaged or non usable by the store keeper they had not been removed from the closing stock.

4.4 **Under Utilization of Funds**

The following matters were observed.

- (a) The balance of 65 Endowment Funds amounted to Rs.6,113,398. As the balance after retaining the required money for their objectives had not been invested , the opportunity to Strengthen the fund by investing the excess funds in an effective manner had been deprived.
- (b) Eventhough a balance over Rs.20 million had remained in the bank current account maintained for the Management Faculty Development Fund with the approval of the Board of control from January to October 2012, those funds had not been utilized for a fruitful purpose at relevant intervals and as Such an additional benefit could not be obtained.

4.5 **Idle and Under Utilized Assets**

There were 21 lecture halls for 9 academic Divisions in the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences for the academic year 2011/2012 of the University. During normal one weeks period, number of non used lecture halls in the First and the Second academic half years from 40 per cent to 100 per cent amounted to 18 and 16 respectively. Accordingly the non –utilized lecture hall capacities in the first academic half year and the second academic half year had represented 78.3 per cent and 72.7 per cent of the overall hall capacity respectively. It was not ensured that a proper plan had not been prepared for the maximum utilization of lecture halls.

4.6 **Identified Losses**

Although the estimated amount of Rs.535,000 had been recommended by the 269th Finance Committee dated 12 July 2011 in respect of the Mahapola Scholarships main celebration for the year 2009/2010 subject to the ascertainment of provision from the Mahapola Trust Fund, only Rs.100,000 had been reimbursed. The reimbursement of the sum of Rs.433,099 further recoverable from the total expenditure of Rs.533,099 incurred for the Mahapola Celebration had been rejected by the Mahapola Scholarships Trust Fund due to the disruption of celebration by students.

4.7 **Personnel Administration**

The following matters were observed.

- (a) The swimming pool had been constructed by a Voluntary Organization to improve the sports skill of the students of the Universities in Sri Lanka and handed over to the Student Community of Sri Jayewardenepura University for their Utilization in the year 2010. However the University had not taken any effective course of action to maximize the service of the swimming pool and the number of students use the swimming pool daily is only about 25.
- (b) The post of the Dental Surgeon in the Dental Clinic had been vacant since 28 June 2010 whereas the post of the Doctor in the medical centre had been vacant since 19 August 2011. Action had not been taken to fill those vacancies even by the end of the year under review.

5. **Accountability and Good Governance**

5.1 **Corporate Plan – 2011/2015**

The audit test check carried out in respect of progress reaching targets set in the action plans prepared for the years 2011/2012 in terms of Corporate Plan for the period of the University revealed the following matters.

- (a) The responsible parties determined to fulfill the expected targets, stated in the action plan had not been made and responsibilities had not been assigned.

- (b) It was not established in audit the accuracy of the data utilized for ascertaining the present levels of performance indicators.
- (c) It was not possible to identify the problems in achieving the targets set for each year and the operation and the progress review purpose could not be achieved due to non-appointment of a Steering Review Committee for follow up action.

5.2 **Observations on Unresolved Audit Paragraphs**

The following matters were observed.

- (a) The land and Building at Kohuwala Purchased on 19 February 2001 for Rs.61.5 million had been handed over to the Easthetics Academic Institute of the University of Kelaniya on 17 October 2003 due to non suitable for the requirements. The Committee on Public Enterprises met on 10 October 2012 had informed that a report in respect of action to be taken on this land and building should be submitted to the COPE by discussing the Line Ministry University Grants Commission and two Universities. Nevertheless it had not been done yet.
- (b) As payments had been made in Contrary to the decision of the Cabinet of Ministers on 23 December 2004 relating to renting a hostel from an institute, an over payment of Rs.10,866,850 had been made as at the end of the year under review. Action had not been taken to get the approval of the Cabinet of Ministers yet to increase the rent as per the re commendation of the COPE.
- (c) Eventhough a sum of Rs.24 million had been paid to the Western Provincial Council in 3 instances up to 1998 for the acquisition of the Methsewana land for the Faculty of Medicine, the value of land had been assessed at Rs.80 million and Rs.139.21 million in two instances due to non-acquisition of the land at that time. According to the recommendation of the Committee on Public Enterprises met on 10 October 2012, it was informed that the relevant information and observations to be submitted to the District Secretary, Colombo to obtain the required advice at

the Colombo District Development Councils meeting. Nevertheless necessary action had not been taken.

- (d) The approval of the Cabinet of Ministers had been given on 06 August 2003 for the disposal of waste water of the University Project under a cost of Rs.70 million. A sum of Rs.3,010,188 had been paid to the National Water Supply and Drainage Board for the preparation of the principal plan . The waste water collection network project planned to be constructed instead of the above project as stated by the COPE had not been commenced even up to now.
- (e) According to the letter dated 10 February 2010 of the Commissioner of Buddhist, it was approved to obtain a piece of land 40 perchase in extent, belonging to a pirivena situated near the University on order to construct a building with all facilities to the external Examination Devision and to hand over the land situated at Abeyratne Mawatha Borelesgamuwa belonging to the University to the Pirivena in place of the above land it was also stated that piece of land, belonging to the Pirivena should be acquired by the government without making any payments and to vesting the land belonging to the University to the Pirivena by a deed of offer and this Land exchange should be treated as an essential transaction. According to the recommendations of the Committee on Public Enterprises dated 10 October 2012, it was stated that the title deeds should be obtained from the land registrar and submit details to the Committee. Nevertheless, it had not been done up to now.
- (f) In compliance with the Treasury Circular No.842 dated 19 December 1978, a sum of Rs.1,147,412 had been paid to a private company in the year 2005 by the University to prepare a Register of Fixed Assets. As it had not been prepared by a standard computer programme it could not be used for the requirements of the University. As stated by the COPE in the year 2012, the improvement of this program up to a level of a Computer Programme had not been done up to now.

- (g) Eventhough the Committee on Public Enterprises had instructed to formulate a methodology to ensure the daily attendance of the academic staff in terms of Section 3.1 of Chapter 20 of the University Establishment Code and to ensure their leave in terms of Section 1.6.1 of Chapter 10,it had not been prepaid up to now.

6. **Systems and Control**

Weaknesses in systems and control were brought to the attention of the Vice - Chancellor of the University from time to time. Special attention is needed in respect of the following areas of control.

- (a) Fixed assets control
- (b) Control accounts
- (c) Settlement of petty cash
- (d) Management of self financial courses
- (e) Drugs provision activities in the medical centre
- (f) Stores control
- (g) Agreements and bonds

REPLIES TO AUDIT QUERIES

ACTION TAKEN AND PROPOSED STEPS TO BE TAKEN IN RESPECT OF THE FINAL AUDIT REPORT OF 31.12.2012.

Accounting standards of state sector of Sri Lanka.

2.2.1 All asserts of the university are being re-valued by the officers of the Government Valuation Department and on receipt of their report and action will be taken to adjust values in the accounts.

2.2.3 Un-reconciled Administrative Accounts

Differences in Financial Statements and sub schedules have been identified and corrected to the possible extent and Rs.1,278,216/- which had been brought forward from a long time will be corrected in due course.

2.2.4 Accounts to be received

- (a) Retention on contracts, miscellaneous deposits and balances on unsettled advance accounts which had been brought forward from a long time had been identified and corrected and action will be taken to identify other balances and correct such balances.
- (b) The total value had been computed according to the salary and other allowances payable in terms of the agreement and bond signed, the value of the scholarship and other expenses incurred on scholarships. But there is a difference between the period of study leave taken by the academic staff and the salaries and allowance paid. As such the difference in value has to be recovered under the provisions of the clauses stated in bond and agreement in the personal file.
- (c) Space for canteens and other services for the welfare of the student community are awarded annually by following the tender procedure. As such people who tender differ annually. Those who are awarded the tenders are required to pay the charges for electricity but they avoid payment .But it is not possible to discontinue their services which may lead to student crisis in the university. A new system has been introduced in 2014 to levy charges for water and electricity .Action will be taken accordingly.

- (d) Rs.1,077,466/-shown as outstanding loans of employees resigned, Rs.250,000 is from an employee in service and presently deductions are in process. The balance Rs.818,966/- will be deducted at the time of releasing University Employees Provident Fund. Rs.8500/- loan balance had been deducted from an employee transferred to another university.

2.2.5 Income not identified

Rs.1,029,385 relating to the audit query is not in respect of the year under reference and relating to some previous years. In view of the difficulty in checking the details the amount had been credited to the "Faculty Development Fund "This has been corrected by transferring the sum to the university fund.

2.2.6 Evidence for auditing

- (a) Steps have been taken to prepare sub schedules for the balance payment of Rs. 14,011,642.
- (b) Fixed deposits certificates have been obtained in respect of the related investments and are in the relevant files.
- (c) Payment of salaries and allowances of academic staff are made on the recommendation of the Heads of Departments to the effect that their services were obtained. Signing of attendance registers by the academic staff is a policy matter to be implemented by the University Grants Commission.

2.2.7 Non conformity of rules regulations and Management decisions

- (a) Action has been taken under financial regulation 396(c) regarding cheques issued and not submitted for payment up to 31.12.2012
- (b) Rs.151,307/- relating to no pay leave of 2012 had been deducted.
- (c) Funds due from the counseling project to the university fund had been credited in 2013.

4.2 Management inefficiencies

Research payments will be made in terms of Higher Education Ministry circular no 1/2011 dated 20.04.2011 and circular instructions issued by the University Grants Commission.

- (b) Under the payment of salaries for employees released for service in public institutions, action will be taken to recover the payment due from State Pharmaceutical Corporation.

Sri Lanka Army has informed that allowances included in the payments due to the university cannot be paid under existing regulations. All details will be submitted to the Treasury and approval will be obtained to write off Rs.1,437,882,73 from the accounts.

4.3 Operational inefficiencies

- (a) Teachers who have obtained Research Grants have been given time till 30.09.2013 to submit research reports, if they fail to submit reports on time, grants given will be deducted

- (b) When quotations were called for taking photographs at the Convocation, Vidudaya Multi Media Unit confirmed that they could undertake the job and they were entrusted with the job. Cost of a photograph, depended on the size of the photograph. As such I wish to inform you that the students were not required to pay more. Audit and Management Committee has recommended that a procedure should

be introduced to take photographs at the Convocation at a concessional rate and action will be taken accordingly. Multi-media unit has also been requested to submit reasonable quotations in the future.

- (c) This paint was purchased to paint various places of the university and maintenance work of the university was delayed due to the strike action taken by the academic and non-academic staff in the previous year. The paint that was stored has been used and the balance is being used now.

- (d) The purchased stock of Toner has accumulated over a period of nine years as the photo copiers and computer printers that were purchased during the period were discarded due to defects. The stock of toner that cannot be used will be discarded.

- (e) Unusable items will be identified and action will be taken to sell such items by auction.

4.4 Un - utilized funds

- (a) Required funds had been retained in accordance with the aims of the prize funds and the balance had been invested fruitfully.
- (A) These excess funds were invested on three months fixed deposits in the People's Bank with the approval of the Finance and Capital Works Committee.

4.5 Idle and under - utilized assets

Lecture halls will be fully utilized.

4.6 Identified Losses

It was not possible to hold the Mahapola function due to an incident which took place out- side the

University administration.Rs.433,099/- spent had been accounted as an expenditure on student welfare.

4.7 Staff Administration

The number of students using the swimming pool has been increased and the use of the pool has been made available to outsiders on a payment of a fee.

- (a) It had not been possible to fill the vacancies of the university staff due to the delay in obtaining approval.

5. Accounting activities and good administration

(a) (b) (c) Action has been taken to update the university corporate plan and the preparation of the

2014-2018 corporate plan is in progress. A lecturer has been appointed with the approval of the Council to monitor the progress.

5.2 Observations on non-settlement of audit paragraphs

- (a) On the direction of the Secretary of the Ministry of Higher Education, the Council of the university, requested the Aesthetic and Arts university to pay 150 million to transfer the Kohuwala land and building. As there was no response, discussions are in progress to re-acquire the land and building to the university.
- (b) A cabinet paper was submitted to the Director (Development) of the Ministry of Higher Education to obtain approval for the increase of rent of Euro Lanka Hostel. A reminder was sent on 03.10.2012.
- (c) A joint discussion was held with Secretary, Ministry of Higher Education, Secretaries various Western Province Council Ministries, Kesbewa Provincial Council officials, Western Province Land Commissioner, Directorate of the Methsevana and university officials. At this discussion it was agreed to allocate 01 acre 02 roods and 5.95 perches making a total allocation of 06 acres 02 roods and 8.76 perches.

At this discussion it was revealed that it will be necessary to shift the official quarters and build a housing complex for 100 million, a house for visitors for 25 million, build a 12ft. wall separating the university and Methsevana for 20 million. As this project will need the approval of the cabinet, a cabinet paper had been prepared by the Ministry of Higher Education

- (d) Rs. 3010,188,000 had been paid to Water Supply and Drainage Board for land survey and preparation of preliminary plans for the disposal of the waste water of the university. Water Supply and Drainage Board is presently taking action for the disposal of waste material of Maharagama and Boralesgamuwa and once this begins action will be taken to combine it to the waste water project.
- (e) Maharagama and Kesbewa Provincial Council Secretaries have been requested to expedite action regarding this exchange of lands. By letter dated 27.07.2012, Secretary of the Kesbewa had sought a ruling from Western Province, Commissioner of Lands.
- (f) Fixed assets registers were prepared numbered and physical verification made in accordance with the agreement signed with the university and the relevant institutions. The university had paid Rs. 11,447,412 for this work. At present revaluation of fixed assets is being done with the assistance of officials of the

Government Valuation Department and on completion of this task and action will be taken to computerize the assets registers.

- (g) As this is a matter affecting the entire academic staff of the university system, a policy decision will have to be taken by the University Grants Commission.

6. Systems and control

Special attention will be given to fields stated under systems and control.
