INTRODUCTION

The department of Agrarian services was established on October 1st of 1957 by abrogating the department of foods for supplying necessary facilities to agrarian. This department was empowered by the Act No. 01 of 1958 and it is running as the department of agrarian development, according to the Act No. 46 of 2000 and its collations.

Objectives and Main Functions

01. Making arrangements to ensure the maximum utilization of agricultural lands in accordance with the government's agricultural policies.
02. Making arrangements to protect cultivating rights of agricultural landlords, agricultural landlord cultivators and occupiers / tenant cultivators.
03. Making regulations regarding registration and functioning of farmers' organizations and to ensure the execution of those regulations.
04. Establishment of Agrarian Development Councils and supervision and guidance of the execution of powers of those councils.
05. Preparation, amending and maintaining registers of agricultural lands within each And every Agrarian Development Council area of Authority Island wide.
06. Making arrangements to solve problems of tenant cultivators and other disputes of farmer community regarding the Agricultural lands.
07. Execution of regulations to ensure the Productivity, Protection, Conservation and Management of minor irrigation systems and water resources.
08. Taking legal actions against the parties who violate the regulations of the Agrarian Development Act and Government's agricultural policies.
09. Rendering Institutional, Legal, Supportive and Management Services to other Institutes in executing Government's Agricultural and Provisional Development projects.

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01. Administration and Human Resources Development.

1.1 Establishment Division.

1.1.1 The Cadre of the Department.

The approved carder of the Department is 15547 including posts of All Island, Combined and Departmental Services. 12568 employees had been working while there were 2979 vacancies by the end of the year 2014.

The post of Commissioner General of Agrarian Development, One post of Additional Commissioner General, 03 Commissioner posts and 43 Deputy/Assistant Commissioner posts have been approved for the Department. At the end of the reviewing year 07 officers of SLAS III have been promoted to SLAS II and 05 officers of them have been appointed to district offices as deputy Commissioners. 28 departmental Assistant commissioner positions were approved and 24 departmental Assistant commissioners were enrolled at the end of the reviewing year from Agrarian development Officers through an examination .

While there were 24 vacancies in the supra Grade positions of Public Management Assistant Service, there were 165 vacancies in the Public Management Assistant Service as at the end of the year. Whenthe new officers were enrolled for the Public Management Assistant Service , 28 officers were appointed to the department.

1.1.2 Staff Organization Structure.

The Commissioner General, who is being responsible for maintaining a required level performance to outmatch the workload of the department, has delegated his powers and responsibilities to his subordinates as the head of the department in order to fulfill those tasks.

- Coordinate the required correspondence related to the Parliament Consultative Committee regarding the Ministry of Economic Development.
- Coordinate correspondence in relation to parliamentary verbal queries.
- Coordinate correspondence in relation to the Public Petition Committee.
- Perform coordination activities in relation to the Ombudsmen Office on Administration Affairs and Sri Lanka Commission of Human Rights.
- Settle all the telephone, electricity and water bills and to pay Assessment and Taxes
- Cover all duties related to the leave of all employees in the Head Office.
- Handle continue maintenance in the Internal Telephone System within the office
- Acquire the rental charges of the official quarters.
- Perform all the duties in relation to the newspapers purchased by the department
- Provide employees with sponsored season tickets for their travelling by train
- Provide railway warrants.
- Maintains the direct telephone lines.
- Maintains the fire extinguishers.

02. Development and Progress Control Division.

2.1 Rehabilitation of Minor Irrigation Systems. (vote - 281-2-2-12-2502)

2.2 Cultivation of Abandoned Paddy Lands. (vote - 281-2-2-0-10-2502)

2300 million rupees were allocated for Rehabilitation of Minor Irrigation Systems and 150 million rupees were allocated for Cultivation of Abandoned Paddy Lands by the treasury. Those two programs were combined and the allocations of 2450 million rupees were preoccupied. It was amended later and it was appropriated as 1274 million rupees. 2614 projects were accomplished covering 17 districts. 1271.2 million rupees were disbursed for them. Financial progresses of those projects were 99.98%.

2.3 Building Rehabilitation (Agrarian Services Centers).

(vote - 281-2-2-0-2001)

450 million rupees were allocated for Rehabilitating Agrarian Services Centers in year 2014 and it was amended as 403.5 million rupees. 04 continuation industries and 134 new industries were repaired by covering all districts. By 5,000,000.00 rupees was allocated for 559 Agrarian Services Centers. Rs. 403.34 million was spent and the financial progress was 99.96%.

2.4 Repairs in Head Office and District Offices.(vote - 281-1-1-0-2001)

Rs. 30 million was allocated under the above vote and Rs. 24.5million was spent. The percentage of expenditure was 91.4%. 01 continuation projects and 23 new projects were completed covering 16 districts. Repairs of Head Office were done also under this vote.

2.5 Building Construction. (vote - 281 -2-2-0-2104)

Rs. 150 million was allocated for this task and it was amended as 77 million rupees later. 19 projects were completed covering 14 districts. Rs. 76.20million was spent in this regard and the financial progress was 99.04%.

2.6 Construction of Fertilizer Stores. (vote - 281-2-2-8-2104)

Rs. 50 million was allocated under this vote for constructing of fertilizer stores, and it was amended as 39.8 million rupees later. Rs.39.8million was spent for 24 new projects and 01 continuation project covering 22 districts while the percentage of the expenditure was 99.92%.

2.7 Farmers Provident Fund.

Rs.12.00million was given under the Farmers Provident Fund by the Ministry of Agriculture for repairing 36 cultivation paths in Mathara district and thereby Rs.1.8million was spent for repairing 13 cultivation paths. Rs.18.4 million was spent for 43 projects of minor irrigations in 06 districts. the total allocation was spent. 2.5 million rupees were spent for 02 Fertilizer Stores in Vaunia and Monaragala districts.

2.8 Agrarian Development Fund.

Rs.61million was allocated by the Agrarian Development Fund for 11 projects in 03 districts.

2.9 Aluth Sahal Mangalyaya.

From ancient time, the main livelihood of Sri Lankan people was paddy cultivation. They consecrated the first fruits of their harvest that get at the proper time to the sacred Sri Maha Bodhi in Anuradhapura. This noble task descends from the past.

It is a glorious boon of the department that the above noble task is continuing annually with the integral government concession as a national ceremony called "Aluth Sahal Mangalyaya".

In its train, according to the guidance of Minister of Economic Development, Deputy Minister and the Secretary to the Ministry of Economic Development, the 47th Aluth Sahal Mangalyaya was wielded splendidly by the department of Agrarian Development with the dominance of Hons. President of Sri Lanka on 2nd and 3rd April 2014 at the sacred Sri Maha Bodhi in Anuradhapura.

All Events, from sacred spilling of milk at “ Satharawahalkada” up to the arrival and offered of Aluth Sahal Pageant in front of the Sri maha Bodhi, were done gloriously. Ancestor Chief Uruwarige Wannile Eththo and his group performed the sacred bee honey and ghee observances. Rice collected and handed over by all Agrarian Services Centers Island wide was observed in this sacred day. Provision of monitory aids and rice was done by the Farmers’ Organizations Island wide. A tremendous contribution was given by the Ministry of Economic Development, Department of Agrarian Development, different Ministries, Departments, Corporations, Authorities, Boards, Local Government of North Central Province and private institutes to succeed this important event. Also, a souvenir named “Jathika Aluth Sahal Mangalyaya” was published.

2.10 Deyata Kirula – 2014.

The “Deyata Kirula” programme of year 2014 was wielded on Puttlam , Kurunegala and Kegalle districts. Rs.4.4million was allocated by the treasury and Rs.4.32million was spent for the creations of the department.

2.11 Supply of Mechanical Service.

2.11.1 Dozers/ Escavators of the department

Mechinery division works in connection with the Development and Progress Control division, and implements its duties under the supervision of a Mechanical Superintendent.

03. Engineering Division.

3.1 Tasks.

- To prepare estimates, technical reports with respect to the construction work of minor irrigation work, Agrarian Services Centers, District Offices and other buildings in the Department, and produce it to the tender board & subsequent analyze.
- To conduct field visits and supply reports in regard to Environmental Technical Assessments which are produced by external government institutes.
- Repaired minor irrigations and developed cultivation path (**attachment I&II**) on the project of CAREP (rapid developing project of war threaded areas) , by the aids of Asian Development Bank Under the Supervision of Ministry of Economic Development.

04. Institutional Development Division.

Objectives and Responsibilities

The tasks carried out by this division during 2014, with the objective of strengthening the economical and social background of the farmers by fulfilling their agricultural needs, are listed below while those tasks were carried out to accomplish the role of a mediator to direct the whole Agrarian Services Centre network.

4.1 Supervision of Agrarian Services Centers.

- Receiving the inspection reports of Agrarian Services Centers

All deputy and assistant commissioners of districts were informed to send inspection reports of supervision of Agrarian Services Centers clearly. 393 inspection reports were sent in this year.

4.2 Supplying Cash / Acreage levy Receipt Books and Cash Books.

Before the termination of book stocks, the books were reprinted and were distributed to district offices.

4.4 Buying potatoes, onions and chilies.

According to the budget proposals of year 2014, the department of agrarian development started to buying potatoes by Lak Sathosa at Agrarian Services Centers. Potatoes were bought under a certified price of 80.00 rupees. The department acted as a facility supplier's role in this case. This process was started on 22/08/2014 and was done continuously. In year 2014, amount of 240,040,480.00 rupees were spent for buying 3,000,506 kg of potatoes by the government.

In this case the compensations were given by Agricultural & Agrarian Insurance Board. The department dose an intermediate task by procuring Farmer's applications to Agricultural & Agrarian Insurance Board through the Agrarian Services Centers.

4.7 Providing services via the Agrarian Services Centers

Seeds, cultivating material, plants, agro equipment and other agricultural things were supplied to farmers via the Agrarian Services Centers and incomes were earned.

All deputy and assistant commissioners have been informed by the circular 2/2013, for keeping the Agrarian Services Centers exemplary. In its train models gardens, fences and gates were created and also a new Agrarian Services Center (Boralu Wewa – Kurunegala district) was opened.

Farmers were persuaded for savings and were given loans for agricultural activities by agrarian banks.

Seeds, cultivating material, plants, agro equipment and other agricultural things were supplied to farmers on year 2014, via the Agrarian Services Centers and incomes were earned. (**Attachment III**)

4.8 Divi Neguma National Programme 2014

- The season 06 of Divi Neguma National Program was activated on year 2014 according to the guidelines of Ministry of Economic Development. In this case, Seeds, cultivating material, plants, agro equipment and other agricultural things were supplied to farmers by the department and farmers were advised for keeping their gardens as model gardens.
- 180 beneficiaries were selected from each Gramaniladari division and 2.5 million of vegetable seeds packs were distributed for 14023 Gramaniladari divisions.
- 100 beneficiaries were selected from each Gramaniladari division and 01 beneficiary was given 09 vegetable plants. Nurserymen were given Plastic trays and refuse of coir. The grown plants were got from nurserymen and they were distributed among beneficiaries.
- Divineguma new year fairs were organized Island wide from 05 April to 12 April, concurrence with the Sinhala Tamil new year festival. Those fairs were organized with the participation of several institutes including Samurdhi Authority and Southern Development Authority while about 150 fairs were organized.
- The Kathurumurunga plants given from the ministry of agriculture and the coconut plants given from the coconut cultivation board, were distributed via the Agrarian Services Centers.

4.9 Acreage levy.

- The Agrarian Development Fund has received Rs. 16,301,476.00 in 2014 as the 20% contribution of acreage levy.
- An Acreage levy week was held from 18/03/2014 to 24/03/2014 and Rs 8,675,896.22 was collected during that week.

4.10 The program of organic fertilizers

- By applying the allocations of agriculture ministry, the program of producing and incenting the organic fertilizers was planned. This program was activated under two categories.
- First activity - 7750 selected officers and leaders of agrarian organizations were concentrated to the agricultural research and developing center of Makandura and they were trained about the producing and applying of organic fertilizers and the systematic applications of chemical fertilizers.
- Second activity – by considering the areas which were more abandoned paddy lands of Sri Lanka, the faddy field owners of Ganpaha , Kaluthra , Kandy , Mathara , Puthlam , Kurunegala , Badulla , Trincomalee , Beticaloa , Mannar and Mulathiv districts were incented to cultivate 850 acres of abandoned paddy fields by using organic fertilizers. According to given inscriptions, composts and dung were bought from fertilizer producers and they were distributed among farmers.

4.11 Receiving and distributing of new agro machineries in year 2014

4.11.1 Agro machineries from China - 280

280 Agro machineries were donated to Sri Lanka by the People's Republic of China. The total value of those machineries was 200 million rupees. This department campaigned regarding with those machineries According to the guidelines of Ministry of Economic Development.

Because of not having a suitable land this matter, the land at Pelawaththa belonging to the Divineguma Development Department was arrogated temporary to the department of Agrarian Development. The assembling affairs were done by engineers of China and the machine operators of the department.

The photo copies of Registration Documents of 199 condemned Tractors and trailers were tried to get from the Department of Motor Vehicles. Only the Documents of 65 Tractors were received and they were sent to relevant districts.

Amount of 1,865,988.00 rupees were credited to the consolidated fund by selling condemned Tractors on public auction. Amount of 27,838.00 rupees were credited to the consolidated fund by selling parts of 06 condemned Tractors to the Industrial Development Board. Those 06 condemned Tractors were received from Sri Lanka army.

Additionally, 26 condemned four wheels Tractors and 05 condemned two wheels Tractors of Rathnapura, Kegalle, Kandy, Mathle and Kurunegala districts were given to vocational training institutes, technical collages and the department of Prison. This activity was done according to the financial circular 438 and by the inscriptions of deputy and assistant commissioners of districts.

In its train 32 four wheels Tractors and 05 two wheels Tractors were abducted on year 2014.

4.12 Annual accounts reports.

410 of The Annual accounts reports of year 2013 were received in year 2014 and arrears have been informed by district wise.

Because of the accounts training programs, there was a significant progress in receiving The Annual accounts reports **(AttachmentIV)**

05. Transport Division.

- The transport division of the department has supplied own maximum contribution for the developing projects of Agrarian Development Department and the Ministry of Economic Development. Additionally, the division has supplied its contribution for legal tasks of the Agrarian Development act and has accomplished all duties which devolved by the administration.
- Maintaining all vehicles of head office and the district offices, allocating the provisions for repairs and fuels, getting the quality control reports of the vehicles, getting free revenue licenses, insuring vehicles, doing investigations about accidents, maintaining the register of damaged and deprivations, preparing appropriation accounts at the end of the year, giving details for audit quarries, giving running details for audit. Issuing the fuels orders, paying bills of fuels, supplying vehicles for official tasks are the basic duties of transport division.
- The especial duties were done by transport division on year 2014.
 1. The transport duties that were assigned by the Ministry of Economic Development.
 - The agro equipment which was donated by people's republican of China was distributed island wide.
 2. Bull dozers and excavators were transported by applying prime movers and Lorries for repairing tanks.
 3. Agro equipment was transported by applying lorries to organic fertilizer production units.
 4. Lorries and light vehicles were supplied for Aluth Sahal Mangalyaya, Deyata Kirula exhibition, Wap Magula and the progrms of agrarian banks.
 5. Worn out vehicles were sold under a procumentary process and the income of it Was credited to the government income.
 6. Light vehicles were caused for transporting officers within the city of Colombo and island wide.
- When allocate vehicles from the vehicle reserve for duties, the division have to face lots of difficulties. Because the lifetime of lots of vehicles in vehicle reserve of head office was surpassed 20 years and always they were under repairs.

06. Legal Division.

The following contributions are being made by the Legal Division to achieve the vision of the Department, of carrying the farmer community towards the sustainable development while achieving an optimum productivity.

- To provide necessary assistance and data to be utilized in preparing Agrarian Law, the necessary regulations used for preparing the same when Sri Lanka Agricultural Policy is made.
- Legal direction for solving the disputes arise between tenant cultivators and land owners.
- Protecting cultivation rights of farmers.
- Providing legal protection with rural irrigation projects and implementing of cultivation regulations.
- Legal consultation on Department Officers and farmer institutes.
- To take legal actions for empowering the Agrarian Law.

6.1 Agrarian Development Act No. 46 of 2000.

The act no.46 of 2000 was amended by the act no.46 of 2011 and it has been in execution from 22.11.2011. Accordingly provisions have been made for Succession of Tenant Cultivators. Accordingly provisions have been made to transfer the tenure rights of farming in an occasion of a tenant farmer is dead, or in a state of permanent disability, while he has been under written or verbal agreements with effect on or before the date of 18.08.2000

The orders that are needed to empower the Agrarian Development Act No. 46 of 2000 and Agrarian Development Act No. 46 of 2011(amendment), are activated by now. The orders that needed to activate the section no 22, 23, 25 and 26 of act are built for cultivating paddy lands with high efficiency and large amount of abandoned paddy lands are re cultivating by now. By this, the actions are taken to build residual orders of the Agrarian Development act and send them for the approval of legal draftsman.

6.2 Solving the farmer issues (Agrarian tribunal).

It has been mentioned around 10 sentences under the Agrarian Development Act that the Agrarian tribunal shall inquire the fact that evicting of tenants by land loads, neglecting of paying of levy by tenants. Laws and regulations, that require implementation of settlement boards which has been formed to appeal against the decisions taken by Agrarian tribunal according to the Agrarian Development Act no. 46 of 2011(amended), have been already gazetted and the actions are being taken to set up settlement boards.

The number of requests which should be forwarded to the Agrarian tribunal have been increased up to year 2014, as follows, due to the delay of establishment of Agrarian tribunal.

6.3 Complaints Made by Farmers (general).

40 investigations about the payments activates of the agrarian service centers, 01 investigation about the payments activates of district offices, 05 investigations about the subsidies fertilizer transactions of the agrarian service centers , 59 investigations about agrarian banks and 03 investigations about the transactions of the agrarian development fund were manipulated on this year.

➤ **Following things were done addisionaly the audit investgations.**

1. Bank reconcilations of all districts were checked and instructions were given forrectifications.
2. Final accounts of Kurunegala, Nuwaraeliya, Galle and Colombo district were checkedand instructions were given for rectifications.
3. Training programs of preparing final accounts were organized in Badulla, Beticaloa, Ampara (Tamil medium) districts.

09. Productivity Development and Sales Division.

This section has been delegated a remarkable task for achieving the vision of the department, "Sustainable Development of all Agricultural Lands and Farming Community of Sri Lanka". That task is "The efficiently land cultivation". Because this division gives its priority for preoccupying paddy lands for another tasks and issuing certificates of not becoming paddy lands, this remarkable task has been subsided by now. But after identifying this valuable service, in 2014, the first step was kept for discharging a duty to the country.

9.1 2015 - the year of minimizing abandoned paddy lands

Preparing a new measure for re-cultivating abandoned paddy lands in wet zone of low country was a major task that done by this division. This new measure will be activated onward from the Yala season on year 2015. Because the implementation of the circular 4/2009, which was established for efficiently land cultivations was detected not at a satisfactory level, The arrangements under this new measure, have been paved the way for doing according to circular 4/2009.

9.2 Amending the circular 4/2009.

All deputy commissioners and assistance commissioners of districts were asked about the difficulties and practically errors that they have to face when campaign according to the circular 4/2009. So also the suggestions for minimizing those difficulties. Agrarian development officers who activated the circular 4/2009 by applying field experiments, were asked about the difficulties and practically errors. A committee was appointed for amending the circular 4/2009 by analyzing the relevant legal conditions and the answers of deputy commissioners, assistance commissioners and Agrarian development officers. This committee started to carry out in store duties by minimizing the practical errors of the circular 4/2009.

9.3 The radio program "Govijana Sandeeshaya"

This program was created for giving awareness to general public about Sustainable Development of all Agricultural Lands and motivating them. Avoiding doing illegal

activities on the paddy lands and dejecting the petitions of paddy lands for another tasks were aimed by this program. promulgating local paddies , introducing the importance of organic fertilizers, introducing the environmental importance of abandoned paddy lands, giving awareness about campaigning on abandoned paddy lands according to the circulars 14/2012 and 15/2012 , demonstrating the unfavorable effects of constructing buildings on paddy lands were done by this program. Legal situations of doing prohibited tasks on paddy lands and do not cultivating on time were demonstrated through this program.

9.4 Applications of traditional local paddies and organic fertilizers.

It was started to study the success of cultivating Traditional local paddies which full of officinal and alimentary things and without poisons on year 2014 and the Kegall district that the co-ordinated district of this division was applied basically for this studies. These studies were done and lot of effective facts about this cultivation were collected by connecting with agrarian development regional officers , agrarian organizations, farmers and other organizations those who had a nice advertencies about traditional paddies. The basic knowledge for prepare a national level program about traditional local paddies on year 2015 was acquired.

9.5 preoccupying paddy lands for another tasks and limiting issuing certificates of not becoming paddy lands,

It was seemed that the propensity of preferring new requests with regarding above topic Increasing rapidly. It was appreciated that the reason for this matter was following a loose standpoint regarding this matter. This situation was a baulk for the vision of the Productivity Development and Sales division. So until to complete the revising of the paddy land register, the adoption of new requests were stopped except few especial occasions, from 01/08/2014. The intention of this was, protect the prevailing paddy lands of Sri Lanka and induce the general public for cultivating lands efficiently.

11.2 Mission of the Water Management Division.

The Mission of the Water Management Division is prepare and execution of programme to ensure the protection and conservation of all minor (rural) irrigation systems in Sri Lanka through increasing the productivity and proper management of those minor irrigation systems, accomplishing the responsibilities that have been transferred to the Department of Agrarian Development under the part 7 “ Irrigation work and the Management of Irrigation Water “of Agrarian Development Act No. 46 of 2000.

In its train, the activities were done by this division on year 2014 as follows.

11.2.1 Deepening reservoirs.

It was surveyed for Deepening 05 reservoirs according to the method of Parshell Desilting in Kallanchiya agrarian service division of Anuradapuraya under the institute of IUCN

11.2.2 Collecting details about crops cultivations.

It was facilitated to getting Monthly cultivation details of 03 kinds of paddies, 11 kinds of fruits, 20 kinds of vegetables and 11 kinds of interim crops through the department web side in agrarian service centers vise .

11.2.3 Quality control

It was able to giving 47 Quality control reports for minor irrigations and soil reports for 04 places.

11.2.4 Issuing the soil health cards

The first soil health card was issued at Ralalage Rotawewa of Mathale district on 21/11/2014.Under this task, 64 farmers were received soil health cards for 32 acres.

11.2.5 Irrigation documents.

File covers were distributed for keeping an especial irrigation document for each irrigations of Sri Lanka

11.2.6 Fixing rain gauges for daily measurements.

The daily rainfalls were measured in 300 agrarian service centers continuously.

11.2.7 Training programs.

A book was edited by combining The Agrarian Development Act No. 46 of 2000 and the Agrarian Development Act no. 46 of 2011(amended).

A compact disk was created by gathering all acts that were influenced to the department.

11.2.10 New introductions.

It was a victory of water management division that we were able to measure the water levels automatically and publish them in the department web side. Because of this project, the early warnings were sent out.

The relevant actions for producing an ombrometer, which can be getting rainfall data such as that, were taken .

11.2.11 Reformation of agricultural land registers.

All relevant formats, advices and posters for reformatting of agricultural land registers were printed and all agrarian service regional officers and agricultural research and product assistants were given awareness of this. In this term, this process was activated in Sri Lanka after 24 year. 1.5 million of paddy lands will be surveyed under this project.

11.2.12 Solve irrigation problems.

It was contributed to solve about 200 irrigation and water management problems of the island.

11.2.13 Exhibitions.

The exhibits about water management have been provided to school Exhibitions.

12. Monitoring and evaluating division.

The duties which were done by the Monitoring and evaluating division on 2014 as below

- The annual action plan of agrarian development department for year 2014 was prepared.
- Progress reviewing meetings were exerted in district wise according to the annual action plan and the progress were reviewed.
