Country specific hereditary systems of medicine are used with modern systems of medicine in different countries in the world. China, Korea, Germany, India are some among such countries using traditional systems of medicine. Traditional system of medicine is also preserved simultaneously in such countries although very modern Western system of medicine is used in such countries ahead of the traditional system of medicine.

A particular feature in analyzing the situation in our country is that, along with the Western system of medicine, indigenous system of medicine as well as traditional system of medicine carry means of disease prevention and methods of treatment never inferior to those in the Modern systems of medicine. It is utilized to solve health problems of a vast majority of people in the country. Further, the amount of funds allocated for the system of indigenous medicine is also increasing year by year. This Performance Report analyzes how public funds so allocated have been utilized for up gradation of the field of indigenous medicine.

Patient is our main client and a number of projects and programs were implemented to meet his requirements. Accordingly, attention during year 2015, for the main part, was paid for controlling kidney illnesses. Accordingly, a series of kidney trouble prevention programs and Ayurveda clinics was conducted throughout the year centered on Anuradhapura, Medawachchi. Further, arrangements are being made to open two hospitals created only for prevention of and treatment for kidney illnesses and non-communicable diseases in Medawachchi, Anuradhpura and Ninthavur, Ampara. While construction works in Medawachchi Hospital designed for kidney illness prevention and research are being finalized by now, it is also scheduled to commence construction work of the Ninthavur Hospital designed to conduct researches on non-communicable diseases.

It was also able during that year to allocate a considerable amount of funds for improvement of human resources in addition to physical development and also to direct the relevant staff for foreign scholarships, training programs and postgraduate courses. We managed also to make efficient the office work through modern mechanical and technical methodologies in the world progressing day by day - the information on which is also contained in this report.

I also acknowledge with gratitude the Ministerial staff including the Hon. Minister, Deputy Minister and Secretary to the Ministry who led the way towards this success and the entire departmental staff who worked with dedication for the purpose.



7. Borella Ayurveda Teaching Hospital

Introduction of the Ayurveda Teaching Hospital, Borella

There is historical information that Anagarika Dharmapala launched an Ayurveda Hospital named Poster Robinson Charity Hall under the Mahabodhi Company around 1910.



Thereafter the Ayurveda Medical College and Hospital have been launched in the Bours Building in Cotta Road, Borella on 10th June 1929 and it was declared open by the Governor Hon. Herbert Stanley.

The limited space in this place was a key hindrance and therefore a land was provided near the Toll Gate Junction at the West Southern border of Obeysekerapura under state as well as private sector patronage and the Ayurveda Hospital in Borella was founded with a land space of 21,216 square feet for the New College Building and the Hospital towards latter part of year 1931. (Information is also available that it claimed a land in extent of 06 acres and 47 perches).

The hospital at present is engaged in providing its social service in the areas of OPD general treatments, traditional indigenous medical treatments, OPD specialist clinics, Korean acupuncture treatments, providing residential treatment services, providing facilities for medical student teaching purposes, providing facilities for research work of Postgraduate students and manufacturing drugs etc.

The hospital consists of three Divisions as the Outer Patients Department, Residential Department and drugs manufactory.

➤ Outer Patients' Department

Is engaged in diagnosis of patients and referring them to clinics and residential treatments.

➤ Residential Department

Provision of treatments to patients referred by Outer Patients' Department to the Residential Department.

➤ Drugs Manufactory

Manufactures drugs required for the hospital.






