

GENERAL

1. The objective in publishing this Annual Report is to produce an analysis into General Staff and Administrative/Logistic matters carried out by Directorates of Army Head Quarters and other establishments during year 2002 and lapses observed due to certain constraints.
2. Assignments completed and proposals for the following year by respective authorities have been included in this report with a view to provide a broad insight into events during year 2002 and proposals for year 2003.
3. Certain programmes pre – scheduled for year 2002 had been amended to suit unforeseen demands specially in the North and East theatres of war.
4. All Senior appointments and Staff appointments at Army Headquarters are indicated at the beginning of the report.
5. The Directorate of Training has played a major role in training troops both locally and abroad to the maximum level possible amidst operational situations. A considerable number of Officer Cadets, Other Ranks and Recruits were trained during the year.
6. A sum of Rs 29,043,959,000/= was allocated in the Annual Budget for both capital and recurrent expenditure.
7. The Sports Control Board has taken a keen interest in developing both sportsmen and sports women and given opportunities to participate both at Local and International level. The Army had achieved higher standards in sports during year 2002.
8. A total number of 4533 Recruits have been recruited and 275 Officer Cadets have been commissioned during year 2002. 209 Other Ranks have been discharged during the period.
9. The Directorate of Welfare with the Insurance Co-operation had implemented a variety of Insurance schemes specially for serving Officers/Other Ranks.
10. Every encouragement was given to Officers/Other Ranks who intended constructing their own houses by way of arranging various facilities.
- ⑪ Arrangements were made to obtain the services of civil specialist Medical Officers in various fields of medical specialities in order to provide the best possible medical & surgical care to the personnel, their families and civil staff in the Army.
- ⑫ * 12. Army Headquarters has co-ordinated Naval/Air/Rail/Road moves for the benefit of all personnel of the Army during year 2002. Officers and Other Ranks were provided with Air fare to attend courses/seminars/ visits abroad.

CONCLUSION

1. All Directorates and other establishments have made a great effort and accomplished pre-scheduled and assigned tasks as expected in spite of numerous constraints.
2. Training and Welfare of soldiers have been given due attention in year 2002 as in other years.
3. All arrangements were made to enhance training and welfare of officers and other ranks despite their engagements in op commitments. Welfare measures extended to family members had also been developed i.e. families living in rural areas were provided with the opportunity of receiving medical assistance from nearest Base Hospital, assist in construction of houses, education opportunities for children etc.
4. Training is considered the best welfare of soldiers. All possible avenues of training locally and overseas were explored in year 2002. Further the Army was able to obtain a considerable number of local non – military courses from civil establishment for serving personnel.
5. All Officers and Other Ranks engaged on operational commitments have given of their best and displayed dedication and high morale. Recruitment had shown a decline and it is expected that the situation would improve with better propaganda and specially with an increase in pay and allowances.
6. Sri Lanka Army Sportsmen and women excelled in their field of sport, and brought fame to the Army as well as to the country.
7. Commanders of all levels had exerted their maximum effort to achieve the required objectives for year 2002.

1. **Operations.** Directorate of Operations issues Directives/Instructions in relation to planning and conduct of offensive/defensive Operations and all other related matters.

a. CRW Operations. No CRW Operations were conducted during this period.

b. Internal Security Operations.

(1) Following troops were deployed in VALACHCHNAI area in order to assist the Police to control the clash between Muslims and Tamils on 21 June 2002.

(2) Following additional troops were deployed to control the disturbances by Tamil civilians in Akkaraipattu due to Special Task Force shooting incident on 09 October 2002.

(3) The following troops were deployed on Internal Security duties in MALIGAWATTA under Overall Operation Commander Colombo to control the clashes between Muslim and Sinhala people in the area.

THE SRI LANKA ARMY**1. **LOCAL TRAINING**

a. **Security Force Headquarters/Divisions Training**. Almost all the Divisions conducted company/platoon training for Regular and Volunteer Battalions in their TAOR. Other courses such as Special Operation Platoon, Assault Pioneer, Basic Marksmanship, Artillery Observer Course, Small Group Training were also conducted in those locations.

b. **Battalion Training**. The total number of Battalions trained under respective Training Centres during year 2002 are shown below;

c. **Marksmanship Training**

(1) Light Machine Gun Gunnery courses were organized at Commando Regimental Training School and Special Forces Training School to improve the shooting standards of the Light Machine Gun Gunners in Infantry Regiments. 40 x 120 Officers/Other Ranks have already followed this course.

(2) Battalion Shooting Coach's courses were organized to improve the small arms shooting standards of soldiers. Initially this was introduced in Security Force Headquarters (Jaffna) and 08 x Officers/Other Ranks from each Battalion were trained as trainers. At the termination of each course they were employed to train the Officers/Other Ranks of respective Battalions. Upto now 39 x Officers and 280 x Other Ranks have been trained under Marksmanship Training School instructors at Security Force Headquarters (Jaffna). Monitoring teams too were nominated to supervise the training and achieve desired standards.

d. **Commando/Special Force Training**. Commando and Special Forces Regiments conducted Group/Squadron training in their respective training schools to enhance individual and collective skills of their personnel.

e. **Officer Cadet Training.**

(1) The following number of Officer Cadets were commissioned from Sri Lanka Military Academy in June 2002 whilst another 146 Officer Cadets were enlisted in the year 2002.

f. **Volunteer Force.** Additional courses for the Volunteer Force personnel, namely Young Officers, Adjutants, Company Commanders and 2 ICs courses were conducted at Combat Training School – Ampara. h. Language Courses.

(1) Sinhala. Teaching of Sinhala language was introduced at Trade School- Sri Lanka Army General Service Corps - Kuttigala for the benefit of Other Ranks who do not possess the required reading/writing ability.

(2) Tamil.

(a) To date 14 x courses have been conducted since the inception of the Tamil Language classes in Colombo. 40 x students attended each course.

(b) Similar classes with the same syllabus are being planned to be conducted in Jaffna, Trincomalee, Batticaloa, Vauniya and Anuradhapura. This will increase the numbers five fold.

(c) 373 x personnel have qualified for Qualification Pay (QP) having sat for the Tamil Language examination conducted by the Department of Official Languages.

(d) 37 x courses were conducted for the year 2002 in Security Force/Division Headquarters. Additional training grant was allocated by the Directorate of Training – Army Headquarters.

(e) 04 x courses were conducted for the year 2002 at the Tri Services Language School – Kothmale and a total of 166 x personnel attended.

(3) English.

(a) Teaching of English Language was introduced by the Directorate of Training for the benefit of Junior Officers as well as for Other Ranks who proceed on courses overseas.

(b) Correspondence courses in English were organised to improve the English knowledge of Junior Officers.

5. **Ex - Balance Style**. 2 X Balance Style Exercises were planned but however only 01 x Balance Style Ex was conducted in four phases simultaneously in liaison with the US Pacific Command Mobile Training Teams. The four phases and respective details are shown below.

6. **USACGSC Team**. A delegation from USA Command and General Staff Course visited Army Command & Staff College from 12 November 2002 to 14 November 2002 under the Subject Matter Expert Exchange Programme. The US team conducted a Computer Simulation Exercise for the benefit of Army Command & Staff College.
7. **Computer Simulation Exercise**. Computer Simulation Exercise (CSE) was conducted by US Marines with 53 Division at Regimental Headquarters Commando Regiment from 05 December to 13 December for the first time in Sri Lanka. This is the first ever largest combined exercise that has been carried out in Sri Lanka. This will continue in the year 2003.
8. **De-mining Team Training (US)**. The US De-mining team visited Sri Lanka for initial survey from 27 September to 10 October 2002. It has been planned to conduct 10 x de-mining courses in Sri Lanka School of Military Engineering in year 2003. A total of 60 students will be trained for a period of 6 weeks in a course and 10 such courses are scheduled to be conducted in year 2003.
9. **US Programme on Explosive Ordnance Disposal Expert Exchange in Improvised Explosive Devices**. This course was conducted with US assistance at Panagoda from 10 to 21 June 2002 under the Subject Matter Expert Exchange Programme. Officers of the Armed services and Special Task Force attended the course.
10. **Non Commissioned Officers Academy - Subject Matter Exchange Programme - US**. A team of Instructors from the United States Non Commissioned Officers Training School visited the Non Commissioned Officers Training School- Kalaoya from 15 August 2002 to 23 August 2002 under the above Exchange Programme.
11. **Defence Management Seminar**. US Embassy in Sri Lanka sponsored a Defence Management Seminar at the Ministry of Defence. This was conducted by a team from the National Defence University (NDU).
12. **Assessment Teams**. US Officials conducted 02 x Assessments on Education, Training & Operations requirements to assist in future to improve the standards of the Sri Lanka Army.

13. **UK Governance and Management of Defence Course**. This course was conducted by 03 x UK Instructors at Palm Beach Hotel – Marawila from 09 – 20 December 2002. 02 x Officers from the Sri Lanka Army, 01 x Sri Lanka Navy, 01 x Sri Lanka Air Force and 01 x Ministry of Defence attended this course. Following number of Officers from foreign countries also attended the course.

The Army Command & Staff College Course No 05 is scheduled to terminate on 12 February 2003.

17. Annual Weapon Training and Battle Efficiency Physical Tests

- a. Annual Weapon Training Courses were conducted successfully except by few Battalions.
- b. Physical Fitness Tests were conducted by the Directorate of Training for Officers, prior to their promotions (Lieutenant to Captain/Captain to Major). Divisions/Brigades were also allowed to conduct these tests according to the Army Routine Order. Battle Efficiency Physical Tests were conducted at Battalion level in majority of Units. Divisions/Units which had not conducted these tests were instructed to conduct same in the 1st quarter of the year 2003.

18. Publication/Video Section. Military pamphlets and important reading material were reproduced by the Publication Section to fulfill requirements at Training Centers as well as for candidates taking up examinations. The Army Video Section functioning under Directorate of Training had carried out video filming of important functions attended by VIPs, Military functions at Training Centres/Formations etc. Filming at wedding ceremonies of Officers/Other Ranks were also undertaken by this section as a welfare measure.

b. Free Medical Scheme - Many families of soldiers do not enjoy the medical facilities from Army Med Establishments as they live in distant rural areas. Directorate of Welfare has identified these needs and has initiated the above scheme where such families are provided with Specialist Doctors services of their choice in the area of their residences. As of 31st December 2002, 1197 Medical Cards have been issued under this scheme. These cards are subject to renewal annually.

c. Welfare Shops - The Directorate of Welfare maintains show rooms with electrical / electronic goods of popular brands of the following locations.

- (1) Colombo
- (2) Anuradhapura
- (3) Trincomalee.
- (4) Kankasanthurai - This Welfare Shop provides all consumer items required by troops deployed under Security Force Headquarters (Jaffna). On receipt of Security Force Headquarters (Jaffna) demand for consumer items, the Directorate of Welfare directly purchases such items from the main agents at special prices and ships same to KKS once a month.

d. Welfare Canteen - Army Headquarters This canteen caters mainly to the military and civil staff working in Army Headquarters. All consumable items including short-eats, tea and chilled soft drinks are made available at concessionary rates. Lunch packets are provided at a concessionary rate of Rs.26.00 a packet with a special menu on every Wednesday with no extra cost to the customer. A *Visitor's Refreshment Parlour* at the Sri Lanka Corps of Military Police Main Entrance is also maintained by this Canteen to cater to the visitors who arrive to meet Officers/Other Ranks for official purposes or use Military Hospital.

e. Wadduwa Holiday Resort - Holidaying facilities are available for Army personnel at this hotel at concessionary rates as shown below. Special functions of Army Personnel /Units such as Wedding Ceremonies & Get-togethers are also undertaken.

- (1) 30% off on Food & Beverages
- (2) 50% off on Room Charges

f. Filling Station Kollupitiya - This Filling Station is situated at Kollupitiya and caters to civil customers.

g. Agency Post Office at AHQ Complex - This Post Office caters to the requirement of the staff of Branches, Directorates, and Establishments of Army Headquarters.

h. Hire Purchase / Loan Scheme - All members are eligible to obtain a loan from the Welfare Society to purchase items of the member's choice to be deducted in 24 monthly installments including a nominal interest of 7 % . 1747 personnel have obtained this facility in the year 2002. The max amount of loan granted under this scheme is as fol. The down payment is dependent on the value of loan. If it is less than Rs: 20,000.00 it will be 15 % and if it is over and above the rate will be 25 %

This loan too is granted to needy members on similar basis to purchase any item not avail in our Showrooms or for any other needy cause such as hospital charges etc. In the year 2002, 249 personnel have obtained this facility.

i. Supply of Newspapers - The Directorate of Welfare is engaged in obtaining a limited number free newspapers for issues to the North and also handles the voted fund allocation for purchase of newspapers.

j. Distribution of Sweets, Delicacies etc - Kokis, Konda Kevum, Mung Kevum and Athirasa worth of Rs. 513,060/= were distribution to troops deployed in Security Force Headquarters (Jaffna), to celebrate Sinhala/Hindu New Year. Funds for this purpose are released from the Army Commander's Welfare Fund.

k. Donations of Welfare Items - It is also a responsibility of Directorate of Welfare to collect items donated by various philanthropists, organisations etc, and distribute to mil/med establishments and tps deployed in op areas.

l. School Admissions - Arranging admissions of children of Officers and Other Ranks to schools of their choice, strictly on a priority basis is another area managed by Directorate of Welfare. On the instructions of Ministry of Education, parents were given the option to name 10 Schools of their choice for admission of their children in year 1 in 2003, irrespective of Districts. Following are the details regarding admission of children of Army personnel: -

Supply of Cellular Phones on Easy Payment Scheme - Army Headquarters initiated action to issue the cellular phones to personnel in there Jaffna and Directorate of Welfare supported this scheme by way of providing credit to the purchasers. A total of 2407 Phones were issued to Troops under Security Force Headquarters (Jaffna), through this scheme during the year 2002.

o. Miscellaneous Services. Directorate of Welfare in liaison with various manufactures/dealers of building materials have made arrangements for purchase of such items as per requests made by individual Officer/Other Rank to construct their houses.

(1) Transfer of Spouses Employed in Government Sector of Officers/Soldiers. Every possible assistance have been given to Officers/Other Ranks for the transfer of their spouses, in the Government Departments as well as in the Private Sector, to the station of their choice.

(2) Priority Connection of Water/Electricity for Officers/Soldiers. Every possible assistance has been given to Officers/Other Ranks to get their Water/Electricity connection on a priority basis.

(3) Payment of Army Death Donation. Reimbursement of death donation money paid by the Regiments are handled by Directorate of Welfare. Details of payments during the period under review are enumerated.




OUTLINE ORGANIZATION - HEADQUARTERS SRI LANKA ARMY


