

GENERAL

1. The objective of publishing this Annual Report is to produce an analysis into General Staff, Administrative and Logistic matters carried out by Directorates of Army Head Quarters and other establishments during year 2003 and also lapses observed due to certain constraints.
2. Assignments completed and proposals for the following year by respective authorities have been included in this report with a view to provide a broad insight into events during year 2003 and proposals for year 2004.
3. Certain programmes pre - scheduled for year 2003 had been amended to suit unforeseen demands specially in Security Force Headquarters(Jaffna), Security Force Headquarters(Wanni) and Security Force Headquarters(East).
4. All Senior appointments and Staff appointments at Army Headquarters are indicated at the beginning of the report.
5. The Directorate of Training has trained troops locally and abroad. A considerable number of Officers, Other Ranks and Recruits were trained during the year 2003.
6. A sum of Rs 30,115,994,000/= was allocated in the Annual Budget for both capital and recurrent expenditure.
7. The Sports Control Board has developed both sportsmen and sports women and given opportunities to participate both at Local and International level. The Army had achieved higher standards in sports during year 2003.
8. A total number of 5675 recruits have been recruited and 167 Officer Cadets have been commissioned during year 2003. 1552 Other Ranks have been discharged during the period under review.
9. The Directorate of Welfare had implemented a considerable number of programmes for the benefit of the Sri Lanka Army. Many Insurance schemes has been implemented in liaison with the Insurance Co-operation.
10. Every encouragement was given to Officers/Other Ranks who intended constructing their own houses by way of arranging various facilities.
11. The Directorate of Army Medical Services had taken steps to provide the best medical attention to Officers/Other Ranks, their families and civil staff serving with the Army.
12. Army Headquarters has co-ordinated Naval/Air/Rail/Road moves for the benefit of all personnel of the Army during year 2003. Officers and Other Ranks were provided with Air fare to attend courses/seminars/ visits abroad.

d. Army Command and Staff College. The Army Command and Staff College commenced its sixth course on 10 February 2003. 32 x officers including 03 x officers from the Sri Lanka Navy, 03 x officers from the Sri Lanka Air Force and 01 x officer from the Police Department were enrolled for this course. The Army Command Staff College course number 06 terminated on 8 January 2004. The course students were offered an opportunity of visiting India and Pakistan on a study tour in two separate batches accompanied by the Commandant and 04 x Directing Staff.

e. 03 x Officers as per their order of merit obtained at the Army Command Staff College course number 04 were offered the opportunity of following Staff Courses in USA, India and Pakistan respectively.

d. The performance of candidates at the Army Command Staff College selection exam for year 2004 when compared with previous years has shown a new trend. For the first time two officers from the Volunteer Force has qualified the examination.

e. The seventh Army Command Staff College course for the calendar year 2004 will commence in February 2004. Allocations of vacancies in this course are as follows:

g. Marksmanship Training

(1) Light Machine Gunnery courses were conducted at Commando Regimental Training School and Special Force Training School to improve the shooting standards of the Light Machine Gunners in Infantry Regiments. 6171 personnel have already followed this course.

(2) Battalion shooting coaches courses were organised to improve the small arms training standards of soldiers. 08 x Officers/Other Ranks from each battalion were trained as trainers with the assistance of Marksmanship & Sniper Training School. At the termination of each course they were employed to train the officers/Other Ranks of respective battalions. Up to date 39 x officers and 280 x Other Ranks have been trained under Marksmanship & Sniper Training School instructors. Summary of the courses conducted are as follows:

h. Language Courses

(1) Sinhala. Teaching of Sinhala language was continued at the Sri Lanka Army General Service Corps Training School - Kuttigala for the benefit of Other Ranks who do not possess the required reading and writing capability. 295 x Other Ranks have completed the course.

(2) English. It was evident that officers and soldiers found it difficult to follow courses abroad as the medium of instruction was English. Therefore a four month course with classes to be held twice a week, on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 1430 to 1630 hrs commenced on 04 December 03 at Army Headquarters.

(3) Tamil. To date 23 x courses have been conducted since the inception of the Tamil language classes in Colombo. A maximum of 40 x students attended each course. 60 courses with the same syllabus were conducted and 2089 personnel followed the courses conducted at Security Force/Division/Brigade Headquarters for the year 2003. Additional training grant was allocated to Tamil courses in operational areas by the Directorate of Training. Four courses were conducted at the Tri Services Language School - Kothmale and a total number of 94 personnel attended it in year 2003. Presently 816 personnel have qualified for Qualification Pay having sat for the Tamil language examination conducted by the Department of Official Languages. Expansion of Tamil language courses from the inception is as follows.

i. Training within Formations. Almost all the divisions conducted company/platoon training for Regular and Volunteer Battalions in their Tactical Areas of Responsibility under the supervision of Security Force Headquarters. Other courses such as Special Operation Platoon, Assault Pioneer, Basic Marksmanship, Artillery Observation and Small Group Training were also conducted at those locations. Security Force Headquarters (Jaffna) started the Special Infantry Operation Team (SIOT) course for Security Force Headquarters (Jaffna) troops and subsequently this course was introduced to all Security Force Headquarters. The number of Officers/Other Ranks who completed the SIOT course was as follows:

- (2) Capt to Major Promotion Examination (Volunteer) for the year 2003 (held from 21st to 23rd October 03).
- (3) Lieutenant to Captain Promotion Examination (Regular) for the year 2003 (held from 31st October to 02nd November 03).
- (4) Lieutenant to Captain Promotion Examination (Volunteer) for the year 2003 (held on 4th and 5th November 03).
- (5) Captain to Major Promotion Exam (Regular) for the year 2003 (held from 14th to 17th November 03).

k. Annual Weapon Training Course. Most of the Battalions had concentrated on marksmanship training to improve firing and due to it except for a few Battalions; all other Battalions had completed the Annual Weapon Training Course for the year 2003.

l. Battle Efficiency Physical Tests and Physical Efficiency Test. Though battalions have completed their Battle Efficiency Physical Tests, they have not concentrated on the importance of PET for officers and men. Divisions and Regiments, which had not conducted these tests, were instructed to conduct it in the 1st quarter of year 2004. The Directorate of Training conducted physical Efficiency Tests for officers, prior to their confirmation of ranks and promotions.

LOCAL TRAINING WITH FOREIGN ASSISTANCE

m. Military Tactical Warfare Simulation (MTWS). The subject course was conducted with the assistance of US instructors from 06 December 03 to 20 December 03 at Regimental Headquarters of the Commando Regiment for 22 Officers x 4 Other Ranks of 55 Division and 25 Officers x 4 Other Ranks of 56 Division.

n. Ex - Balance Style. Ex-Balance Style was conducted at 05 x locations simultaneously under the direction of the US Pacific Command. The respective details are shown below:





OUTLINE ORGANIZATION - HEADQUARTERS SRI LANKA ARMY




OUTLINE ORGANIZATION OF FIELD FORMATIONS


