Having done the prison administration to a wide reformation, the Ministry of Rehabilitation and Prison Reforms was established in 2010 making “Mahinda Chinthana” Policies Statement which was able to introduce new program of solving professional and other problems of prison officers and discharging prisoners to the society, a reality. According to the “Mahinda Chinthana” Vision for the future, the Ministry of Rehabilitation and Prison Reforms has been assigned an significant responsibility in the process of making Sri Lanka a wonder of Asia.

The main ambition of this ministry is to make the process of rehabilitation of inmates more formal and to form a beneficial man to the society full of good values on discharge from imprisonment.

The person convicted by court is branded as a prisoner by the society. Hence, he has to undergo a huge pressure spontaneously. The Department of Prisons does a commendable service with the intention of a alleviating this negative attitude. For this reason, special attention is paid every possible time to uplift the social, cultural and economical abilities of the prisoner. Releasing members on license board, offering privilege of holiday vacation home, making inmates participate in spiritual, religious, consulting, and cultural activities are some of programs of achieving this goal. Therefore, these events could be expressed as special instance of looking at the prisoner a human sight. Another critical obligation of the Department of Prison is coming across some remedies to difficulties in prison congestion. Therefore, actions are being taken to relocate prisons in the cities to more spacious areas.

What should be appreciated is the encouragement of inmates to walk towards lights by showing the correct direction rather than chasing them from dark to dark. In place of punishment with psychological pressure, prison is becoming a place where good people are made. This performance report give brief abstract of programs implemented by the Department of Prisons during the 2012. I wish the Commissioner General of Prisons and the staff of the Department of Prisons the capability of doing their duties dedicatedly more and more.

The Message of the Commissioned General of Prisons

Going on the path of “Mahinda Chinthana” to reform the Department of Prisons, a separate ministry was established in 2010. As the Commissioner General of Prisons, I remind very gladly the mission of socialization of prison inmates by rehabilitating under reformation process done by the Department of Prison in this ministry and the contribution given in prison reformation during 2012.

Prisons built long ago are not adequate to accommodate the present prison population. Also, cadre established in about 1986 were also not up to required present demand. Hence, as a result of finding solutions to these problems in 2012, it was able to get necessary programs to build prison institutions suitable to rehabilitation and to establish a cadre required for relocating urbanized prison institutions to places with adequate space facilities.

Accordingly, under the procedure of relocating urban prisons out of the city limits, a first stage of the Pallekele prison as a substitute of Bogambara prison has been completed. Further, basic activities of constructing a prison institute at Tangalle in a areas of 58 arches at Angunakolapalesse has been started. In addition, basic activities of relocating Colombo Remand Prison and prisons established in town center in Matara, Galle, Trincomalee, Negombo, Badulla and Batticalao, to areas with adequate space, have been initiated.

Amendment of cadre suitable to rehabilitation activities under prison reforms has been finalized by now. Steps have been taken to increase cadre in a way of widening the training and welfare facilities, using information technology to make prison administration easy, and improving health facilities. New Posts of Commissioners for Industries, Training, and Intelligence have been introduced to cadre accordingly. A formal administration in health sector will be achieved in every prison under a Director of Health. Also, a separate division under the Director of Engineering will be established in order to widening the construction activities in prison institutions.

A separate board of officers will be appointed to technical affairs, and modern facilities including getting correct information on inmates, will be given quickly. In addition, for sake of the inmates, I was able formalize the prison administration by filling vacancies of staff of security, intelligence, welfare and other sections. Four hundred twenty three Prison Guards have been recruited by now. It was able to increase of intelligence division made of 62 officers up to 160 officers. Steps have been taken to complete remaining vacancies and promotions.

As a step of more formalizing the prison administration in 2012, I paid attention to introduce modern technological equipments. Here, number of technological equipments to check inmates and officials were introduced to the Department of Prisons, and steps were taken to strengthen the process of intelligence unit as well.

I took some actions to make up minds of detainees paying attention to social development as an step of turning bad apples to good eggs in a way of commemorating special national dates such as prison welfare day, department day, parents day, women's day and religious day, ceremonially. It is my belief that they will abstain from criminal thoughts because of these events.

In addition, there are several attempts I have taken to make prison administration more useful to the country. I would like to kindly remind my staff behind these events, the Honorable Minister, Mr.Chandrasiri Gajadeera in front of all these, and the Secretary including his staff as well.

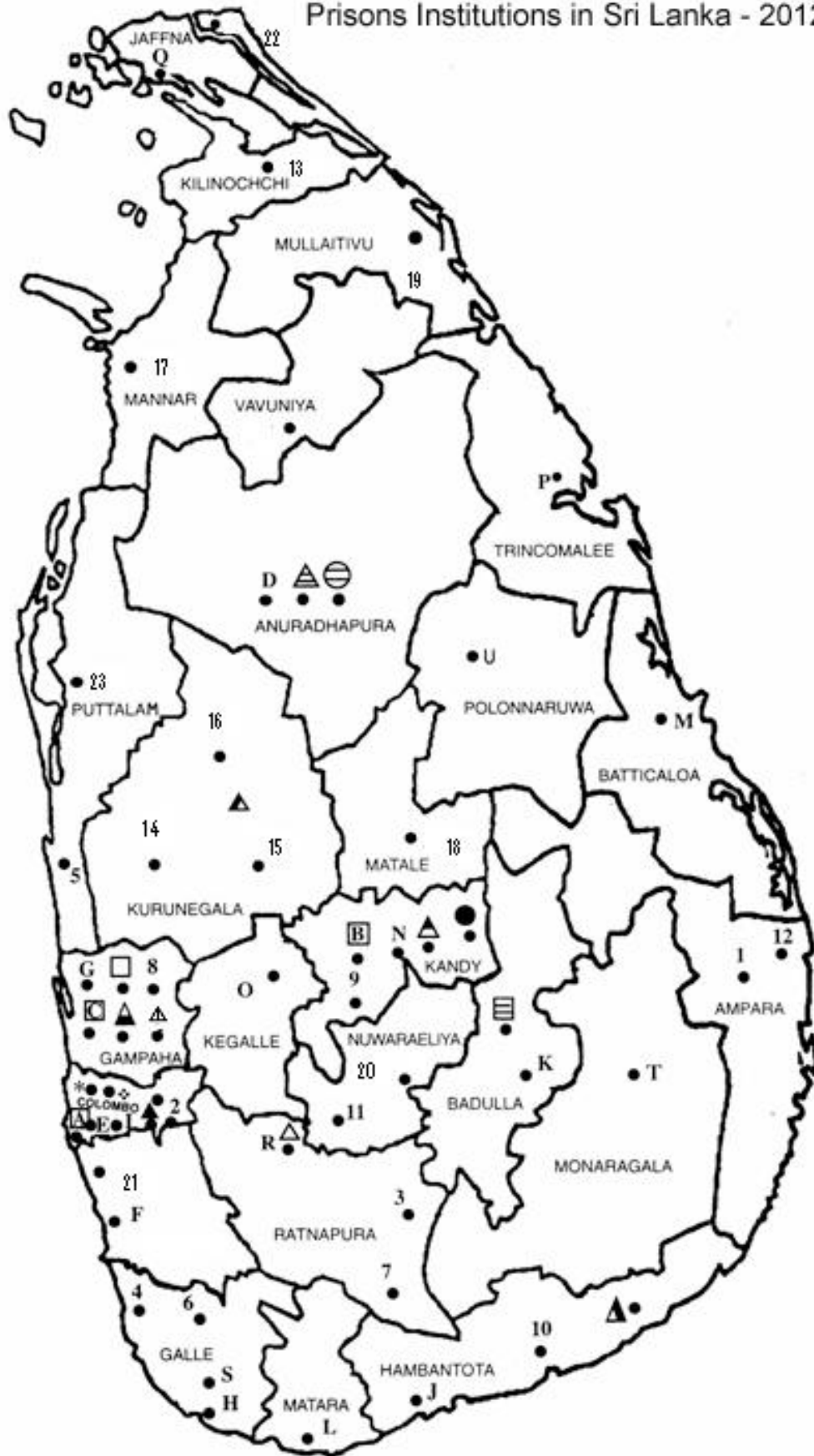
Prison Logo



Prison commenced as a result of the judicial reforms introduced by Kameron in 1832. Welikada Prison was established compatible with British Borstal System in terms of the Legal and Court Ordinance no. 18 of 1844. By the Prison Act no.16 of 1877, this service was structured and regulated under a separate department directly under control of the Commissioner of the Prisons with the effect from 16th July, 1905. With development of the society, this service turn out to be very crucial. As a result, the Mahara Prison was built in 1875 and the Bogambara Prison which was in the form of the “Been Field’ Prison in England was constructed in 1876. Today, the prison evolved this way, has become an essential and specific institute before the complexity of present day society. Accordingly, the Prison system consists of 3 prisons, 20 remand prisons, 2 correction centers for youthful offenders, one training centre for youthful offenders , 10 work camps, 2 open prison camps, and 20 prison lockups and are under the control of Superintendents of Prisons. There are about 23,000 inmates under their custody.

At the beginning, though this department come under the Ministry of Rehabilitation and Prison Reforms cared and secured inmates, today it has gone beyond the limit of it and become a social correction center that rehabilitates inmates. Here, this performance report illustrates the endeavor of rehabilitating and socializing inmates as good citizens by the Department of Prisons as a social adaptation body.

Welfare Division

Following the objective of the Department of Prison, a systemic welfare program is being implemented for prisoners to return to the society as good citizens when they are released. The performance of this division from 01.01.2012 to 31.12.2012 is as follows.

01.Common programs of the institutes

Since these programs are conducted in every prison institute, usually all inmates participate in them

1.1 Spiritual and religious activities

2956 Programmes such as Buddhist programs including observing Sil, buddhist sermons, meditation programs, Hindu religious activities and all programs, Islamic religious activities and all programs, Catholic religious activities and programs and mental development counseling programs have been conducted during the year. Total amount of Rs.506,900.50 has been spent and 61,446 detainees have participated in these programs.

1.2 Educational and Welfare Activities

Literacy programs, vocational training programs, computer training programs, library management, religious studies, cultural activities, health programs, drugs prevention and treatment programs and family get-together programs numbering 6,293 were conducted. These programs were conducted with the participation of 61,446 detainees and spending Rs.390,040.50.

1.3 Sports and other facilities

Rs.396,858.80 have been spent for purchasing sports goods, and holding 720 competitions including inter-prison volleyball/ cricket matches. Total number of detainees participated in these matches were 20,493.

1.4 Presentation of Awards

78 programmes including appreciation of inmates with special skills, prize giving to winners of competitions held on special days (independent day, new year day, literal day, prisoners day, drug prevention day etc) were held during this time and 954 inmates participated in these programmes. Rs.183,600.50 has been spent for these task.

1.5 Aftercare Service

19 Programs such as distribution of vocational training kits to released prisoners and aftercare committee meetings were held and 194 intimates have participated in those programs.

Civil Engineering Section

This section functioned under two engineers supervises all construction activities of prison institutions throughout the island. Constructions are two categories.

1. New constructions
2. Building repairing and improvement

2.1 New Constructions

2.1.1. Amount of Rs.141,459,019.00 has been spent under second stage of relocation of Bogambara prison at Palkekele in 2012 and finalized 95% of kitchen and store room. 45% of prison ward building have been completed. In addition, the requirement of supplying electricity, water, and telephone has been fulfilled as well.

2.1.2. Amount of Rs.48,743,544.00 has been spent to construct Jaffna new prison in 2012 and 16% of the administrative building and 36% of the wall have been completed.

2.1.3 Amount of Rs.9,891,719.84 has been spent to build Anuradhapura prison wards building and 62% constructions have been finalized.

2.1.4. Rs.2.2 million has been given to the Department of Buildings in 2012 to build the quarters of the Superintendent of Prisons- Polonnaruwa and 100% work of the foundation has been completed.

2.1.5. Rs. 1.329 million has been spent to construct quarters to the superintendent of Prisons- Wariyapola in 2012 and 10% work has been done.

2.1.6. Rs. 2.183 million has been spent to build the wall at Watareka Prison and its 50% of work has been completed.

2.1.7 After the agreement signed to get consultation service, action has been taken to pay consultation fees with relevant to the project of relocating of Thangalle prison

2.1.8. Allocation to build the superintendent quarters at Trincomalee prison, the barrack at Vavuniya prison, and prison lockup at Mannar prison, have been spent with the approval of the Department of Budgets on the following activities of finished and ongoing work in 2011

- I. Rs.427,514.00 was spent by the Department of Buildings to build a sewerage system at Polonnaruwa prison. Construction work has been finished by now.
- II. Rs.49,397.86 was spent by the Department of Buildings to build a officers rest room at Mahara prison. Construction work has been finished by now.
- III. Rs.3,450,844.86 was spent by the Department of Buildings to build a kitchen and store room at Vavuniya prison and construction works have been finished.
- IV. Rs.198,706.38 was spent by the Department of Buildings to build a gate room and an administrative building at Wariyapola prison and construction works have been finished.
- V. Rs.1,135,080.00 has been spent to build NIRD technological prison wards building at Wariyapola prison. Installation of columns of first floor was completed and have supplied supporting beams for columns and beams to the upper floor.
- VI. Rs.500,000.00 was spent by the Department of Buildings to build Weeravila prison ward. Construction work has been finished by now.
- VII. Rs.1,807,411.26 was spent by the Department of Buildings to build a water supply system at Kuruwita prison and construction works have been finished.
- VIII. Rs.192,069.23 was paid to the Department of Buildings to build a quarters complex at Watareka prison and construction work has been finished.

Intelligence and Security Division

Functions of the Intelligence and Security Division established in the Prisons Headquarters are taking actions to bring tense situations under control, investigating inmates and visitors who come to visit prison inmates, filing court cases against inmates and visitors who are engaged in illegal matters while investigations are taken place, handing over of illegal items or drugs to Borella Police Station or Drug Investigation Bureau which are found while investigation occur and taking legal actions against them. Also, Matters in relating to money and mobile phones are being handed over to the head of the relevant prison institution (superintendent of prison or assistant superintendent of prison). According to the orders of the ministry and the Commissioner General of Prisons, special investigations are done in prison institutions closer to and out of Colombo. The security to the minister, the secretary, and the Commissioner General of Prisons during the visit to prisons institutions and in official ceremonies is provided by the intelligence and security division of the Department of Prisons. In addition, it is the responsibility of this division to make officers participate in special salutation parades, and providing the security to special type of inmates producing before the courts by the order of the Commissioner General of Prisons. 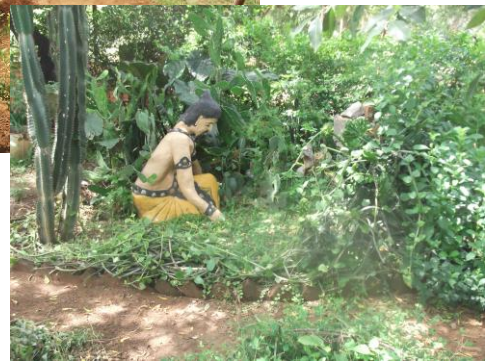

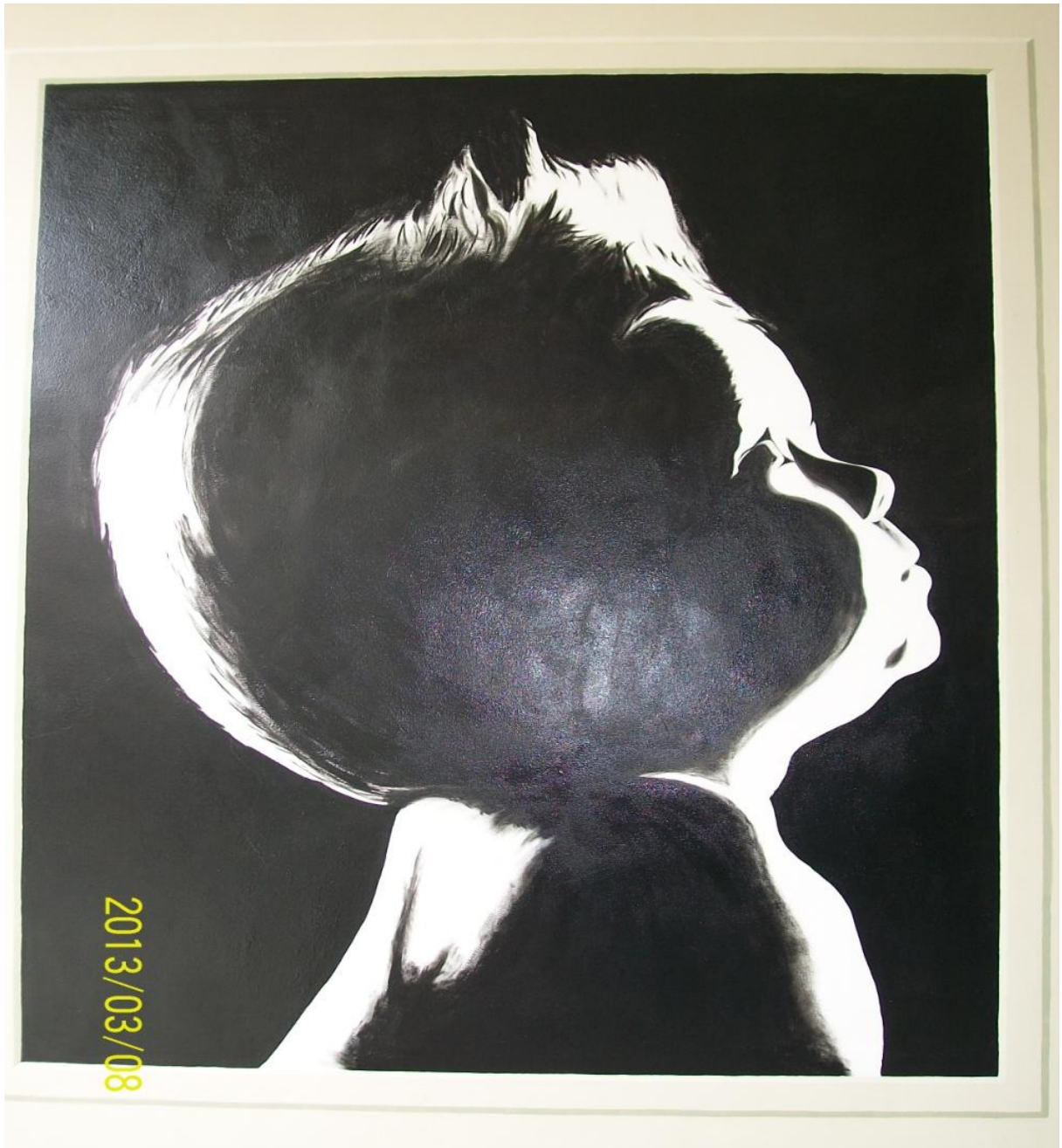
